

is located in the Special Services building between the bowling alley and the ceramics shop. Every now and then the radio operators can hear a bowler get a strike and the ceramics shop ovens keep the shack warm in the winter.

Kodiak Island is called "Alaska's Emerald Isle" due to the thick spongy mosses, fems and Sitka Spruce. The island is unique in that its rain forest is the only unmixed stand of Sitka Spruce in the world. Kodiak Island lies only 600 miles from the Arctic Circle yet the island takes on a tropical look in the summer when green grasses fringe the coastline and carpet the hillsides. Glaciers scraped across the face of the island during the last ice age chiseling its mountaintops into sharp peaks and carving its rocky coastlines and bays.

The livelihood of the island residents depends on the marine life. Several salmon canneries built around the turn of the century still stand in some of the bays abound the island. Kodiak ranks among the top three largest fishing ports in the United States. Kodiak Island archipelago is a string of mostly unexplored islands that stretches 260 miles in a northeast/southwest direction 90 miles off the tip of the Kenai Peninsula in the gulf of Alaska. Kodiak Island, 3,588 square miles, is the second largest island in the United States.

On the northeast coast of the island is the city of Kodiak, 252 miles from Anchorage. Kodiak lies in a region known as the "Banana Belt" of Alaska. The Japanese current, which travels along the west

coast of the United States and warms the beaches of southern California, also provides Kodiak with a mild maritime climate. Island dwellers enjoy winters with temperatures averaging 30 degrees and summers of 50-60 degrees. Average rainfall is about 74 inches providing for the large growth of vegetation. Even though the average winter temperatures are about 30 degrees, Kodiak gets their share of snowfall and low freezing temperatures.

Kodiak Island is home to an abundance of wildlife which include red fox, weasels, brown bats, river and sea otters, whales, deer and beaver. The name Kodiak brings to mind the largest land carnivore in the world - the Kodiak Brown Bear. Males can weight up to 1,600 pounds and stand nine feet tall. Kodiak's environment provides these giants a rich diet of grasses and sedges in the spring, salmon during the summer and berries in the early fall months. At last count there were approximately 2,500 bears roaming on the island.

Amateur radio from Kodiak is probably just about the best it can ever be. Propagation changes from season to season. Although 20 meters stays active almost all year, John looses 10 meters during the summer and regains it again in the winter months. John says "Whenever I get on the bands I can never get off without talking to at least 100 people at one sitting." As Alaska is hard for some, John tries to stay up as much and as long as possible for those who need Alaska for one of the many awards, including 10-10 numbers, counties (Alaska does not have any counties, they have judicial districts - Kodiak is in the third judicial district). Worked all States, etc.

The club station, KL7HKX uses a Kenwood TS-940 and TS-950 and a 60 foot crank up tower with stacked beams. You can usually find John around 28.360 to 28.380 when he is on the air. If you should be lucky and contact John using either his own call, NL7WA #57526, or using the club station call, KL7HKX #59282, you can QSL to PO Box 191648-USCG, Kodiak, AK 99619-1648.

As John says, "Kodiak has a lot to offer, you only have to look around the next tree and of course "watch out for the bears".

We thank John for the information about Kodiak island and his amateur radio activities. If you have an interesting story to tell, please send the information and pictures to the Editor.

Minutes of 1992 Board of Directors' Meeting

Marge Smothers, WA6ZPX, #36007 Secretary

The Board of Directors convened in Seattle, Washington in a closed

meeting on August 8, 1992, at 9:00 AM. A moment of silence was observed in memory of our Silent Keys.

All officers and directors were present with the exception of Gary Ward, KD7UZ. Officers attending were President Norm Lefcourt, W6IRT; Vice President Hugh Sullivan, WA4QZU; Secretary Marge Smothers, WA6ZPX; and Treasurer Gerry Gross, WA6POZ. Directors attending were Peggy Pinnell, G4MAE; Dave Prichard, KA5OVO; Linda Barnes, KJ4FM; Elaine Nickoloff, N8CBE; Pete Matson, KC1CP; Jack Miller, W9WYN; Marv Hagan, WB2SJQ and Don Weaver, KOJPW.

Pete made a motion, seconded by Dave, that the 1991 minutes be accepted as published. Unanimously approved.

Norm reported that 10-10 will go ahead even with dead band conditions. The election has taken place and it's gratifying that sufficient candidates are available. Volunteers need to be commended. Our Chapter Coordinator and the new editor are doing outstanding jobs.

Hugh Sullivan, Vice President and Marge Smothers, Secretary, had nothing to report.

Gerry Gross explained his revenues and expenses report. Mary made the motion and Linda seconded that we accept the report as presented. Unanimously approved.

The Ad Hoc Committee for a General Manager Plan found no justification for going further, and therefore was disbanded at this time.

Gerry Gross withdrew his agenda item on a proposal for replacing the current data processor and mailing operations and explained the direction in which he is working. No details are available at this time but he hopes to be able to present something to the Board within this calendar year.

The Communications Committee presented the following resolutions:

Effective August 8, 1992, all new affiliated 10-10 chapters and newly initiated certificate programs offered by existing affiliated chapters must offer an applicant the option of a certificate for a fee or a number for a self-addressed envelope and postage. It is strongly urged that existing programs adopt the aforementioned policy.

Moved by Don, seconded by Marv. Unanimously approved.

Any certificate program requiring a 10-10 number may be

listed in the official Awards Guide. Unaffiliated programs will be so noted.

Moved by Marv, seconded by Hugh. Unanimously approved.

A legal 10-10 contact must be a two-way contact exclusively on 10 meters. A legal contact consists of the call, 10-10 number, name and QTH (state or DX country). At no time is it acceptable for a 10-10 number to be relayed.

Moved by Don, seconded by Pete. Jack opposed. All others approved.

The subject of Product Reviews in the 10-10 News was discussed. The Communications Committee Chairman will send a note to the Editor and to various column writers that the Board concurred in banning Product Reviews.

The following report of the Communications Committee was given:

The new Ten Ten Awards Guide was published during the year. It was suggested that any specials or chapter changes be sent to the Editor of the Awards Guide with a copy to the Chapter Coordinator, if desired.

The Committee explored the possibility of paid advertising in the <u>NEWS</u>. After much discussion it was felt that it would not be feasible.

The Committee is presently working on an Operations Manual which would contain such things as job descriptions, policies, etc. It is a lengthy procedure and requires looking back in the archives to determine exactly what policies have been approved or disapproved in the past. When completed it will be a simple way to answer questions as to who is responsible for an item or what our official policy is regarding a multitude of things.

It was the desire of the entire Board that names and addresses of Directors be included in each issue of the 10-10 News.

The Finance Committee presented a proposal from an insurance company for liability insurance. However, it was recommended that a little additional information be obtained before voting on this subject.

It was moved by Pete, seconded by Hugh and unanimously approved that the Treasurer of 10-10 and all others having signature authority shall be bonded.

The Membership Committee presented operating guides for managers of supplies, areas, silent keys, and records.

The motion was made by Linda, seconded by Dave and unanimously approved to accept the new guides.

The Operations Committee reported the following:

With reference to Awards, the motion was made by Hugh, seconded by Pete, and unanimously approved that all new certificates will be time sensitive with regard to the initial batch of applications. The effective date of all new 10-10 awards will be 120 days after publication date announcing the award is available. All

applications received prior will be held and numbers will be assigned by lot.

Hugh Sullivan would like to retire as Chapter Coordinator by January 1, 1993.

Jack presented the following resolution:

Whereas the ARRL and IARU have again admirably represented all Radio Amateurs at WARC92, the Board of Directors, for the 10-10 Members, wish to acknowledge and thank them for their efforts on our behalf. We offer our continued support and encourage all members of 10-10 not already affiliated with ARRL to consider joining in these programs.

> A motion was made by Jack, seconded by Don, and unanimously approved. A commendation certificate will be issued by 10-10 to both ARRL and IARU.

The 1991 Petition, subject "Removal of Officers" was discussed. It was determined to be unnecessary as the subject is covered by Roberts Rules of Order.

> Dave made the motion, seconded by Pete and unanimously approved.

Resolutions were presented to amend the bylaws as follows:

ARTICLE VI: BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 7. Remove existing text and insert the following: In the event of vacancies on the Board of Directors, with the exception of the President, the President shall appoint replacements with the approval of two-thirds of the Board of Directors.

> The motion was made by Linda, seconded by Gerry, and opposed by Pete. All others approved.

ARTICLE VIII: OFFICERS' DUTIES

Section 2. Remove existing text and insert the following: The succession to the office of President shall be Vice President, Secretary. Treasurer.

> The motion was made by Gerry, seconded by Dave and approved unanimously.

Section 5. Linda made a motion, seconded by Mary, that the second sentence be deleted. Unanimously approved.

ARTICLE IX: ELECTION PROCEDURE

Section 3. Insert the word "chairman" after "committee" in the first sentence.

The motion was made by Pete, seconded by Dave and unanimously passed.

ARTICLE XII: AMENDMENTS

Section 3. Remove existing text and insert the following: The full members of 10-10 shall be notified of any amendment or changes in these bylaws no later than the second issue of the 10-10 News following the Board action which resulted in changes.

> The motion was made by Elaine, seconded by Don and approved unanimously.

ARTICLE XIII: EFFECTIVE DATE

Remove existing text and insert the following: These revised bylaws were adopted by the Board of Directors in session on August 8, 1992, and shall become effective immediately.

> It was moved by Elaine, seconded by Don and approved unanimously.

Discussion was held regarding the difficulty of sponsors for 10-10 conventions. A resolution was presented which would authorize the President to appoint with Board approval, a National 10-10 Convention Manager. It was moved by Hugh and seconded by Gerry that this resolution be tabled. Unanimously approved.

Hugh made a motion, seconded by Elaine, that Grace Dunlap should be listed as the Silent Key Manager in the 10-10 Information Guide. Unanimously approved.

A motion by Linda, seconded by Don, covered the following resolution:

> Whereas the Air Capital Chapter has offered to sponsor the 1993 10-10 International Convention, in conjunction with the Wichita Amateur Radio Club's ARRL State Convention at Wichita, Kansas on September 25 and 26, 1993 and provide separate facilities for our activities, we do hereby accept and thank them for their proposal. Ed Redwine, K5ERJ, is therefore appointed as 1993 Convention Manager, and Bob Crawshaw, WAONGV, as Assistant Convention Manager.

Gerry Gross and Pete Matson abstained from voting. All others voted favorably.

The following motion by Peggy, seconded by Pete was approved unanimously.

> The 1993 Board of Directors' meeting will be held Thursday, September 23, 1993, in Wichita,

The subject of classes of membership and special structure for members with disabilities was discussed. The matter was dropped for lack of a motion.

An offer was received to hold our 1995 convention in the New England area. This will be considered for future discussion.

A motion to adjourn at 5:00 PM was made by Marv, seconded by Linda, and unanimously approved.

I hope everyone in the **US** is enjoying the **great** band conditions this winter! We have been hearing **Europe** since August 20th, except for a few days of poor propagation. Conditions during the summer were below par and I suspect many have been surprised at just how good the band has been this winter. Last time I told you that this Solar cycle is expected to reach bottom in **March 1996**, so keep tuning for that new country.

The big news is 3 New DXCC Countries! The ARRL Awards Committee voted to accept Croatia, Bosnia-Hercegovina & Slovenia as separate DXCC countries. Croatia and Slovenia are added for contacts made June 26, 1991 and after. Bosnia-Hercegovina is added for contacts made October 15, 1991 and after. The DXCC cards will be accepted after Jan. 1,1993. At this time a recommendation to add 4N5, YU5, which is Macedonia to the Countries list remains under study by the ARRL Awards Committee. The vote will be sometime early in 1993. Check QST magazine for more detailed information.

I have been doing research on the 23 members that live in the Yugoslavia area. Croatia YU2, now 9A, has 8 members and I know that 9A1HDE is still active. Slovenia YU3, now S5, has 5 members. Bosnia has no members. All of the other areas of old Yugoslavia will count as YU until the ARRL votes differently. Thus, Serbia not yet recognized, counts as Yugoslavia, and we have 8 members in YU1 & YU7. Montenegro YU6 has none, Kosovo YU8 has none, YU8 & YU9 are special and federal calls and no members exist. In Macedonia YU5, we have YU5JA who is now 4N5JA and YU5RK now 4N5RK. I expect YU5 and YU7 will be the next two new ones next year, so just wait!

QSL for these new countries should go direct to the callbook address with a green stamp or the QSL Bureaus listed last issue. Good luck and please send me info you pick up on YU members. I want to update call signs if possible.

Here at my station I have been able to work five new 10-10 countries since the summer but none of the new ex-YU as yet. I did talk to 4N5JA Venco #23427 but he still counts for YU and not Macedonia yet! Club station 9A1HDE has been on 20 cw and hopefully he will be on 10 this winter.

The ARRL Ten Meter Contest has ended and it was great! I had 700 QSO's & 206 mults for 400,000 points. If you missed this event you missed several 10-10 stations that were active! FW/Y58IO Holger on Wallis Isl. asked if I wanted his number when we worked on cw, and this was the first 10-10 activity I have ever heard from Wallis! They believe that Eritrea should be a separate DXCC country. Eritrea will have the right to decide its own future now that rebel forces have won control of Ethiopia. Eritrea is presently a deleted DXCC country. The people of Eritrea will vote sometime in 1993 as to their status. If they become a separate country they may get UN membership. I expect that will help the ARRL DX advisory committee consider Eritrea for DXCC status.



month for life." I agree...future lists should only be sent after a <u>new</u> contact made later on. For example; I work a station in January and we exchange lists...then that station gets a lot of new awards and upgrades in the following months and even tho we do not make contact afterwards, the station sends me an upgraded list. This would not be playing the game fair.

Pete, KC1CP #37190 pleads that new dark ribbons be used in your printers when you send lists and upgrades. I agree...like Pete I have eye problems and it gets to be quite a chore to read some of the lists. Also when applying for upgrades please list previous, new and total points/contacts. Be sure to indicate if you want return of your upgrade lists. If you do, add proper postage to your SASE so the CM (Certificate Manager) is not stiffed for the return postage.

The News Editor has asked me to explain about upgrade points, scores, numbers, seals, etc., etc. Well that's hard to do as each and every 10-10 Chapter has a slightly different program/structure. When you receive your BASIC Certificate from a chapter, it will also include an explanation sheet outlining that chapters program. Keep these sheets on file so you will always know the system. Some chapters upgrade by number of contacts and others by points acquired over the air from other members. Some upgrade seals are collectable and some are not. Many paper chasers are using PC's to keep records and as a suggestion I would say to make sure that your software printout and/or dupe by both chapter number and callsign.

That's about it for this time...hope to hear you on 10!

Propagation

Taking up where we left off in the last issue, lonospheric waves are those which are refracted by the ionosphere. These include F layer skip, auroral scatter, and meteor sporadic-E.



Line of sight is how far your signal will go on a straight line before literally running into the side of Earth. Usually there is some bending of the waves in the troposphere (sometimes more than others), so line of sight is slightly farther than the horizon. Tropospheric waves are those that are bent and carried farther than normal. This mainly happens on VHF and UHF, but slight effects can be noted on 10 meters.

There are several generalizations which can be made with F layer propagation. These can be plainly listed:

- 1. F Layer propagation is strongest and occurs most often in the equatorial regions of earth. The closer you are to the equator, the better the F₂ you will be able to observe. This is why North America can hear South America so often, even in times of low sunspot activity. This last July was a good example. Even though sunspots were at the lowest levels since 1988, during many days South America could be heard.
- 2. For us in the northern hemisphere, the May-August period is usually the worst for F layer propagation, while October-February is usually best.
- 3. F layer propagation is always in a cycle, averaging out to 11 years per cycle. During the peak of these cycles, we can expect 3 to 5 years of good conditions. Currently, we are in Cycle 22, which peaked in the 1989-1990 time period.

Aside from these generalizations, accurately predicting F layer propagation in both short and long term can be done. Although 100% accuracy cannot be obtained, there have been great advances in recent years. This is mainly due to recent advancements in space technology.

Predictions of F layer propagation centers around the sunspot. Sunspots are important because of the increased UV/EUV radiation that surrounds the

perimeter of them, leading to higher ionization levels in the lonosphere here on Earth. It stands to reason - more sunspots lead to more ionization, and thus, better conditions. There have been records of sunspots for hundreds of years, with the first in the 1700's. After a few years, it was noted that there was a definite cycle occurring as to the number of sunspots. In 1775, Solar Cycle 1 officially began. As mentioned above, these cycles occur in approximately 11 year periods. This isn't a constant, as cycles can last anywhere from 9 to 13 years. A cycle begins after the previous cycle has reached a low (called a solar minimum), and begins to "turn around" in an upswing. During a solar minimum, there may not be any sunspot activity at ail! This usually doesn't last long, though.


After the solar minimum is reached, the sunspots begin a rapid increase. This increase continues for 3 to 5 years, then it usually levels off for about a year. Somewhere in this period, there will be a peak in the sunspot number, called the solar maximum. After this, the sunspot numbers begin to drop, usually more gradually than the rise.

Solar Cycle 22, which we are now currently in, peaked in 1989 and stayed about level into early 1992. The International Sunspot Number (ISN) peaked in the 150 to 165 range. Of course, this is the smoothed average. On numerous occasions, there were upwards of 220 sunspots, but this normally doesn't last more than a few days or weeks. To give you an idea, Cycle 22 was a well above average cycle. The mid and late 20th century has had several spectacular cycle peaks, so Cycle 22 wasn't all that impressive in comparison to others in this century. Cycle 22 was to have peaked with lower numbers of sunspots than it did.

The cycle to which all others are compared is Cycle 19, which had its legendary peak in 1958. It peaked with a 203 smoothed mean sunspot number! To give you an idea as to how spectacular Cycle 19 was, Cycle 18 peaked in 1947 at 152, and before that, no other cycle had reached 150 since 1780! Following Cycle 19, Cycle 20 peaked in 1969 at 120. This was disappointingly low compared to the 2 previous cycles, but was still no worse than average. After being disappointed with Cycle 20, most predictions on Cycle 21 were pessimistic. These predictions turned out to be wrong, as Cycle 21 was one of the 3 best ever! On the other side of the scale, Cycle 14 only peaked at 60 in 1907.

Next issue, we'll continue with sunspots and solar cycles. Also, we'll talk about the wealth of information available from the invaluable broadcasts of WWV and WWVH. As always, questions and suggestions are welcome. My address is 10212 P Street, Omaha, NE 68127-2130.



10-10 QSO Parties are open to all amateurs, but only paid-up 10-10 members are eligible for awards and chapter assignment of scores. They are conducted to encourage 10 meter operation and interest in the Net. Non-members may use numbers collected to qualify for membership; members may use them for awards.

RULES

- 1) PHONE contacts must be in the 10-meter phone band on SSB, AM or FM. CW contacts must be in the 10-meter band on CW or RTTY.
- 2) Exchange Calisign, Name, State or Country and 10-10 number. Some stations may also request your County.
- 3) A station may be counted only once.
- 4) Single operator stations only are acceptable.
- 5) All contacts must take place within the 48-hour contest period.
- 6) Logs <u>must</u> be kept in UTC (Universal Coordinated Time).
- 7) A DUPE sheet <u>is required</u> of all participants. Computer duping is OK. SASE to the Contest Manager for a sample DUPE sheet.
- 8) Chapter assignment of scores may be made only by a paid-up member belonging to that chapter as a <u>local</u> member and be able to work its Net via ground wave from the contest station.
- 9) Illegible or improperly submitted logs will be rejected.
- 10) Failure to comply with these rules or their intent may result in disqualification.
- 11) SCORING: Two (2) points per contact with 10-10 number exchange. One (1) point per contact without a 10-10 number exchange.

AWARDS


