

Shortly after each issue of the News is mailed, we begin receiving phone calls and letters with the question "Where is my copy of the News?", or "I haven't received my copy of the News - has it been mailed?". First, the News goes to the printer usually early in the week of the date of the issue. For example, this issue, July, will be at the printer on or about July 5th or 6th. It takes about one week plus to print, address and deliver to the post office by the printer. That is for US ZIP codes. For DX, Gerry, WA6OZ, our Data Manager, places each DX copy in an envelope, and mails them via First Class, which is surface mail to DX countries. For those DX members who wish their copy via Air Mail, our DX Manager Carol, K8DHK, sends a copy direct via air mail. For this service, the DX member pays an extra Air Mail fee to Carol.

All US members should know the *News* is mailed via BULK mail. The cost for each issue is 23 cents US. The post office does not forward bulk mail if you move even though you have a "forwarding notice" on file. Bulk mail is "trashed".

Now to the real problem. Last issue we did something we have not done before. That of placing ADDRESS CORRECTION REQUESTED on the address side of the *News*. The post office told us that there was a 35 cent charge for address corrections for bulk mail address corrections. OK, we decided to give it a try. Well, guess what? We received over 300 address corrections! Yes, at .35 each that totals over \$100.00 added expense, plus the data service to correct the data base. The data base is not an added expense as we would expect to do that for anyone that moves.

What does all this add up to? First, over 300 members had moved, and did not advise 10-10 of their new address. Second, this cost 10-10 over \$100.00 additional expense, and third, those 300+members did not get what they paid for, a copy of the *News*. Also, it is most likely those over 300 members did not notify the FCC of their new address. The new computer programs now available, that list all US calls, name and address, which get their information from the FCC will also be wrong!

Gerry updated the data base for each address correction received prior to the mailing of the 10-10 Election Ballots in early June. The ballots were mailed first class to US ZIP codes and air mail to DX members. With all of the address corrections made, we have now received almost 60 more address changes from the ballot mailing.

You can help 10-10 by notifying us when you move. It is simple, either a note, QSL card to the 10-10 address in Omaha, NE, listed in every issue of the *News* or by sending a packet message to Gerry, WA6POZ, packet address is also listed in each issue.

The Officers, Directors and Net Officials are dedicated to serving the membership in every way possible, but your help in certain areas is necessary. One such area is the notification of address changes.

Lastly, if you miss an issue of the **News**, back issues <u>are</u> available, as long as supplies last, for \$1.00 and an address label. Send your request to the 10-10 address in Omaha, and be sure to note the copy you are requesting.

An-Ten-Ten-nas

In each issue of the News, we shall try to clarify a significant cluster of ideas used in antenna work. Our object is to help you make the best decisions about the antennas you buy or build




with out imposing our own prejudices on you. The more you understand, the better your choices will be.

No. 3: Where Does the Gain Come From?

Earlier, we looked at 3 antennas modeled in free space: a dipole, a 2-element Yagi, and a 3-element Yagi. All were made from aluminum tubing and all were monoband antennas with no traps or other lossy components. The patterns we showed made it clear that the 3-element Yagi had the most gain and the highest front-to-back ratio. But that does not make it very clear from where the gain comes, given a constant transmitter output.


Fig. 1 repeats the azimuth patterns to refresh our memory. An azimuth pattern is like standing over the antenna and seeing its radiation. For free space patterns, we use 0° elevation, since the pattern is strongest straight on.



The azimuth pattern does not give a whole picture

of where the power is going. It does show that the beams project more power in the forward direction than the dipole, while "robbing" power from the rear. In reception terms, signals from straight ahead are strongest and weaker to the rear. However, they are weakest off the sides of the antennas.

To accurately see the power pattern of an antenna, we must also look at it from the side in an elevation pattern. An elevation pattern is like standing beside the antenna and looking through the aluminum tubes, while seeing the radiation. Fig. 2 gives an elevation pattern in free space for the same 3 antennas (3, 2, and D). Notice the displacement of the beam antenna patterns to the right, which corresponds to the forward lobe of the beam antenna azimuth patterns.




Only an astronaut can have a pattern radiating below the antenna site. Antenna gain over real ground also makes use of radiation reflected from the ground. Fig. 3 shows elevation patterns for the three antennas over real ground at 35' feet, about 1 wavelength above ground. The azimuth patterns would resemble those of Fig. 1, but they would not be taken at horizon level. Instead, they would use the angle of maximum power, sometimes called the take-off angle. The elevation patterns display this angle clearly and show that horizontal antennas above a real ground have a number of higher angle lobes as well as the main lobe. The complex pattern results from adding subtracting reflected radiation from the aboveground pattern, depending on its relative phase.

Comparing Fig. 2 to Fig. 3 can lead to a misunderstanding, since the apparent radiation pattern is the same size; that is, the radiation just reaches the outer ring. However, that way of styling our drawings is just a convenience for making comparisons within each drawing. actuality, the power in the lowest lobe of Fig. 3 for each type of antenna is much greater than the power in just the horizontal direction of Fig. 2. Expressed another way, all of the power represented by the spheres or near-spheres in Fig. 2 is flattened, thus putting greater power into the lobes that extend horizontally. The total power in the lobes is a result of adding reflections to the main or incident power going that way. The net result is gain over free space and gain of one antenna over another. And since the gain can be both calculated and controlled by good antenna design, we can--within limits--achieve a good bit more success than early radio pioneers in making and maintaining radio communications.

TenX DX NEWS

The 1010 CW QSO Party has just ended as I begin to write this column and conditions were poor. I only worked a few DX stations for a total of 21 contacts. In a letter from VK6PP Tony #38922, he worked a few JA's, JD1 Ogasawara, HS Thailand and BV4 Taiwan but no one with a 10-10 number! I have been operating mostly on the weekends where I was able to get enough material to put together this Spring article, but the number of DX contacts was much lower this quarter.

The count of 10-10 Countries is still 269, as no new activity has been reported this past quarter. We missed an opportunity to add 1S Spratly Isl. by 9M0A operated by JA1QHO #61599 and others, but a large Solar storm in April changed propagation. They stayed mostly on 15-80 and I do not think there was any 10-10 activity from Spratly. We had 21 DX stations join 10-10 this past quarter and the majority were from Japan.

Propagation: Solar flux will average 78-96 in 1994 which will be lower this DX season than last and solar flare activity will produce disturbances and no skip. Expect dips down to 68 and high A indexes greater than 20 and the K index greater than 5 will occur about 25% of the time. I expect future DX Propagation will be limited to North & South paths into S. America and the Caribbean areas. Expect sporadic stateside E Layer conditions to be one hop short skip with fading, which will last until the winter DX season brings back better conditions in October. Expect this to last two more years until we begin the next Solar Cycle in the spring of 1996. Remember to listen for the (28.2-28.3) beacons when you want to check band conditions.

D3C Angola by Chris D2SA (ex-TR8SA) #45817. Chris used this special call for a limited time as he mostly operates as D2SA. I have worked Chris several times and recently received a card from his QSL manager F6FNU Antoine Baldeck, Agru 1, Rue Abdre Lamande, F-64200 Biarritz, France. Look for Chris around 28500 at 1500-1600.

XX9AS Macao by Alberto #63429 and a Finish group operated XX9TR & XX9TZ during Easter.

Feature DX Station: A35CT Tonga is Craig WD0AHX #39172.

Craid and I worked in April and I had to look up his 10-10 number for him on the computer, he had misplaced his number. 
Board of Directors Actions





10-10 Historian



The first mention of the Star and Bar Awards is in a letter of congratulations sent to new members by Claude Martin (SK) W6LRY #437, Certificate Manager (CM) in 1969, when we had about 400 members. A GOLD bar was issued for QSO's on 10 meters with 100 different members. The qualifying list must contain the same log information as for new members, i.e. 10-10#, name, call letters, QTH, date and time. A February Bulletin (former name of the 10-10 International News) encouraged new members, "A '10' STAR is already attached to your certificate, so go for 25, 50, and 75 STARS. 100 contacts qualifies for the GOLD bar." STAR awards were eliminated in 1973, but the CM's continued to issue BAR and PLAQUE awards.

Frank Orcutt (SK) W4JO #486, was appointed as our first 10-10 Awards Manager in 1974. He was succeeded by Bill Risher, WB6OMH #6608, in 1978, and then in 1982 we had two Awards Managers, Willie Madison, WB7VZI #27856, for the 100-900 BAR Awards and Bill Risher, WB6OMH continued with the 1000+ BAR Awards. We have had several Award Managers since then and the time of QSO's is no longer a qualifying requirement. Twenty years have passed since our first Awards Manager was appointed and today we have 11 different managers for our very popular award programs.

In the last issue of the *News*, we paid special tribute to Elizabeth E. Knauff who made a generous contribution to the 10-10 Scholarship Fund in memory of her late husband Donald R. Knauff (SK), KA1BCF #25425. Received a letter from Don Ruf, KB0ON #29849, who notes that KA1BFC when operating from South Africa was issued the call sign ZS6ATX. Our records are corrected accordingly:

Propagation

Mike Hawk NOOSY #58788



We've discussed the major modes of 10 meter propagation - aurora, F region skip and sporadic-E. There is one other "common" mode. While it's more of a novelty than it is useful, there are some who use it, spending hours to make just one or two contacts.

Meteor scatter is actually more common than any other mode of propagation. It occurs every day, as millions of meteors bombard earth's atmosphere. Certain meteors with just the right size, speed, and velocity are able to ionize a column in the E region of the ionosphere. This ionized area may last for less than a second, to as long as a minute or two. Signals reflected off of ionized trails usually fade in and out rapidly, due to phase cancellations. Signals are being reflected at two slightly different areas of the column, back to your shack. The two signals arrive at slightly different times, creating a difference in phase. The fact that the ions are moving creates possible distortion and doppler shifts. This is caused by ionospheric winds, which twist the column around.

Meteor scatter is especially useful in the VHF bands, where long distance propagation is less common, and high gain antennas are more common. Many VHF operators have set up schedules with other amateurs in order to make contact with new states or grid squares, exchanging only a few seconds worth of information with every burst. It may take hours to finally complete the contact, but there's nothing quite like the sense of accomplishment you feel.

When is meteor scatter most likely? Usually, the rotation of the Earth tends to pull in more meteors late at night and during the early moming. Also, there are several meteor showers which occur annually. These showers, named for the constellation in which they appear to originate, are well known to those who enjoy working distant VHF stations. The Quadratids peaks January 3 and 4. It is a very strong shower, with a short peak. The Perseids may be the best known shower,

peaking August 10-13. The Orionids is a consistent shower, peaking about October 22. The Geminids is probably second only to the Perseids in terms or intensity, peaking December 11-15. Many other smaller showers also exist.

Why hasn't meteor scatter become popular on 10 meters? The answer is simple. Sporadic-D is so common that spending the time to make a meteor scatter contact isn't worth while - for the most part.

The average distance propagated by sporadic-E is 500-1300 miles. Meteor scatter propagates about 200-1300 miles. Also, making the contacts usually require that one use a yagi or quad, and/or extra power.

However, if you're working on Worked all States, and need just one or two states in the 200-1300 mile range which seem to constantly elude you, maybe meteor scatter is a worthwhile alternative. Simply get in touch with an amateur in the desired state, set up a schedule on the night of a shower, and using WWV, alternate calling each other in 15 or 30 second intervals. After anywhere from a few minutes, to an hour or two, all information may have been exchanged. It may sound difficult, but if you've been looking for that one state for years, it will be worth the trouble.


