... your editorial in the Summer Bulletin may serve as a warming to those of us who also operate the OSCAR satellites. Specifically, the band plan submitted by K3CMY, about moving AM operators into the portion of the band used by AMBAT as one of it's down-link freq, is obviously in conflict. I can see no reason why those who chose to operate AM can not restrict themselves to 28.9 to 29.3mhz. Those who operate SSB will then be using 28.5 to 28.9mhz. If K3CNY's C.B. conversion band plan is 29.-405 to 29.695 as you stated in the 10-X Bulletin then no thought was given to the OSCAR Program or the FM'ers. OSCAR-6 has an output from 29.-45 to 29.55 & OSCAR-7's output is 29.4 to 29.5. To keep from interfering, the FM'ers have picked 29.6 as their national calling freq (most are xtal controlled). Ever wonder why QST lists so few 10 meter repeaters? Try to build one in 100 kcs or less of space. The FCC allows FM operation from 29.0 to 29.7mc but the FM'ers respect OSCAR. Many thanks to the Ten-Ten International Net for giving us this space to pass along our suggestions regarding the conversion of 11 Meter Transceivers to 10 Meters.

A lot of hams have already made such conversions, and for a very simple reason: the rigs are CHEAP and they put out enough power for 10 Meter Mobile DX, QRP. While we strongly encourage anybody who plans to do it to start with a SSB radio, there are a lot of AM sets that are bound to be converted because of the very low prices.

First of all it's obvious that one nationwide band plan is mandatory, but no plan will work if the converted sets invade either the FM band segment or Oscar's passband; likewise, putting AM signals near 28.5 would create chaos. So, we try to irritate the smallest number of people by suggesting the following which we feel is the most practical. Please let us have your comments by writing (with SASE, please) to Phil Kogel, W6MRQ, 1245 N. Laurel Ave., West Hollywood, CA 90046.

- 1. Raise all channel frequencies of the 11-M <u>SSB</u> sets by <u>1.595 Mhz</u>; this provides operating frequencies from 28.560 to 28.850 (23 chans.)
- 2. Raise all channel frequencies of the <u>AM</u> sets by <u>1.795 Mhz</u>.; this gives AM operation from 28.760 to 29.050 (again, 23 channels).

With the above plan, users of AM rigs can talk to the SSB users (who can also operate AM) the overlap is channels 17 - 23 on SSB rigs, and channels 1 - 8 on AM rigs.


For Novice and Technician <u>CW</u> operation, raise eight channels (we suggest channels 1 through 8) by <u>1.14 Mhz</u>.. This way, there will be eight frequencies for <u>CW</u> operation from 28.105 to 28.195.

One other item: even if you don't use that converted AM rig for CW operation, please install a BFO; it's cheap and easy, and it will help out a lot. You'll be able to talk to SSBers who can't get on AM, plus you'll be able to understand an SSB operator who might be asking you to clear a frequency for a net operation or even for emergency traffic. The BFO circuit shown uses an IF transformer and other parts from an old transistor radio; the one transistor can be almost any small-signal NPN type. Component values aren't critical.

The summer months have been the greatest yet for the 10-10 Net. In June, July and August, we set a new record in attracting 1712 new members and 777 renewals. June 1977 was phenomenal with 725 new members qualifying. The trend continued with the 10-10 Summer QSO Party serving to stimulate a rash of renewals. The activities of the local chapters are on an upswing and our Net Coordinator George W6ENC receives at least one inquiry a week concerning the formation of new chapters. This growth is fantastic considering that the past five years has averaged about 2000 members per year. As a consequence, we are proceding with this bulletin and with the

publication of a new membership roster in October. Here's a breakdown by call area: new members/renewals for June, July and August 1977: call area 1: 71/46; 2: 131/62; 3: 120/39; 4: 323/139; 5: 205/73; 6: 182/105; 7: 91/37; 8: 124/55; 9: 166/72; Ø: 188/96; DX (includes VK/ZL): 111/53.

I am delighted to announce the special election of Les W8ATK #3976 as Vice Pres. Call Area 8, Bob W6WPY #14949 Vice Pres. Call Area 6, Lee WB6MGM #213 Vice Pres. Membership Records and the appointment of Howard W6QIR #4509 as Roster Manager. Bob WB8FCX #5380 regrets that he must resign because of travel commitments. Thanks, Bob, for your valuable service as our first manager district 8 and then as V.P. You have proved that we could decentalize the 10-10 Net and make it work! My congratulations to the new officers.

Claude W6LRY has forwarded a letter from S. Faurez F6EEM with information that the R.E.F. (Réseau des Emetteurs Français) has set up a 10 meter group to develop traffic, study propogation and sponsor contests in the 10 meter band. Since we have a common goal in promoting amateur activity in the 10 meter band, I have invited S. Faurez F6EEM and Le Groupe 10m du R.E.F. to join our organization as a special chapter.

Received a letter from Bill Welsh W6DDB chairman of the 13th Annual L.A. Amateur Radio Convention to be held May 20-21, 1978 in Burbank. With the consent of all the members who checked in on 28.8mhz 1800GMT Aug. 28,1977; we will go ahead with plans for a 10-X Booth and Forum at SAROC 78 and for the Lucky 13th in Burbank. (*NOTE: After Jan 1st'78, \$3 for dues & \$1 for initiation fee)

HOW TO OPERATE 10-10, EXCHANGE NUMBERS AND GET AWARDS: As a member, log all contacts as noted above. Circle the call in your roster to avoid duplicates. When you have a total of 100 (including the first 10-10 numbers allowed for membership) apply for your first Bar Award. Check mark the 10-10 numbers in your roster to avoid repeat reporting. Except for the first 10 allowed for membership, all other contacts must be bona-fide NUMBER EXCHANGES. List all information as required for membership (do not send log books). Our Awards are only for bona-fide number exchanges; one point allowed for each number.






On Thursday evening, July 14th, after hurriedly packing our gear into two cars, Theresa (WB4BQC), Ken (WA4OBO), Ken's son, Paul and I started driving north from Charlotte, N.C... Our destination: Trap Pond State Park in Southern Delaware. It was blind luck that led us to Trap Pond. I had selected four private campgrounds and two state parks from my list of camping locations and wrote them a letter. After receiving five refusals, along came a phone call from the Park Superintendent of Trap Pond (who turned out to be Dave Cretty-K3ZXP) inviting us up.


Arriving at 0530AM we met Dave who showed us where to setup. We located on Cypress point with our beam right next to the water and the rigs under a picnic shelter. Our gear lineup was a SB-401 and SB-303, Ken's SB-220, the club's 32 foot tower and rotor, and my neighbor's TA-33. Everything went according to plan with no breakdowns or surprises. Evidently "Murphy" does not know where Trap Pond is located.

Theresa is one of four hams in her family and had just upgraded to general the day before we left and she was eager to get started on 10 meters. Paul, who could probably pass his general whenever he wanted to, helped supply a strong back and some weak humor for our trip.

Why did we go to Delaware? Delaware was one of the last three states Ken & I needed on 10 meters for W.A.S., and both of us had heard frequent "CQ Delaware" calls on 10. After returning back home, we listened to the other hams in Charlotte bragging about having finally worked Delaware on ten. Ken, Theresa and I still needed a Delaware contact for WAS: HI HI! 






ATOP Squaw Mountain 11,500 FEET ABOVE SEA

My goal for the Summer QSO Party was to find a high point, have 110V AC & not have to climb. Squaw Mountain filled the bill to a "T". It's high (11,500ft), It's the home of WØWYX (with all the power you need) and a road all the way to the top. Squaw is the site for several repeaters including the 34/94 machine providing 2 meter coverage from Denver to Cheyenne, Wyoming.

Jeff - WBØMZG (second op) and I set up our equipment (TS 520, tent, sleeping bags, dipole, etc etc)at the base of a 100 foot pile of rock (see photo 4) at the very top of Squaw with the dipole antenna mounted on the peak. WØWYX (Bob) allowed us to also use his 5 element quad (see photo 1). Photo 3 shows Jeff - WBØMZG hard at work with the pile up on 10 meters. Photo 2 is a view of Squaw Mountain looking Southwest with Mt Evans in the background.

During the first hours signals from 4-land seemed to be the loudest (all were 9+) and, of course, ground wave into Denver was fantastic. I think they would have heard us on a coat hanger, HI HI. As the hours wore on it became apparent that "Cld Mother Nature" was not going to co-operate and by midnight 10 meters became very quiet (except for locals) and stayed that way the rest of the night and most of Saturday. It was amazing to me that even at two miles high I could not break through. Nevertheless, Jeff and I had a fun time on Squaw. The sunrise over Denver made it all worthwhile.

Thanks to Bob-WØWYZ for putting up with us at his QTH and the use of his power. You might listen for his AREC 10 meter net every Sunday at 0900L MST (1600Z) on 29.634 This net has been going on for many years.

THE NUMBERS GAME

I offer a quick, accurate and easy way to keep track of 10-X numbers worked. The key to the scheme is an 81x11 inch bound, three hole punched, notebook called "Number Checking Record". The form is the "AICO-Utility Line Form #65-010". It can be found at commercial business supply stores @ \$1.75 each. It has 500 numbers to the page with sufficient space to record "Date Worked" by each number, and red dot when the number is submitted for a 100 bar. The date is the key to your log for complete information on the 10-X contact. The scheme for utilization of the forms is mine, but, I would like to give credit to Judy-WA6HEL and Fred-WB6MQL for digging the forms up. *(9762 Mistletoe Ave, Fountain Valley, CA 92708.)

If you send a zerox or carbon copy of your log, please be sure it is legible. Some copies are so faint as to be almost impossible to check. In the future these will be disqualified. And one more thing! Please put enough postage on your envelopes. Rather than refusing to accept logs with a "postage due" notice at the postoffice, the Net has been paying the extra postage.


Congratulations to all the winners, and thanks to all who participated and sent a log. We'll all be in there, trying again, next February.







Co-Ordinator

The Net Co-ordinator has been busy during the last quarter with applications for starting new Chapters and requests for information on how to start a Chapter. The requests for information were received from several DX Countries as well as local (USA) areas. There have been very few DX Chapters started in recent years and the applications are certainly welcome. I am sure that there will be more DX Chapters with improvement in ten meter band conditions.

The new or soon to be Chapters in DX areas are as follows. The "Canterbury ZL3 Chapter" in Christ Church New Zealand is a "go getter" Chapter. Dick ZL3KE the Chapter Head is doing every thing possible to get the ZL3s on ten meters. The Chapter edits a news letter and gives the frequency on the cover sheet. The President invites all ZL3s toget a 10-10 number and gives ZL1BEB, VP Manager in New Zealand as the one to contact for details. The call-up of the Chapter is on 28.575 MHz and the time is 1000 Hrs. NZT. It might be well for everyone to listen on the frequency and at the time. Who knows the band may be open. There soon will be a Chapter in Germany. August Gihr DK5UG is going to start a Chapter and get things going in Germany. August sent a card that has a unique quote which is as follows "it's one if by land***two if by sea...and three if ten meters opens". There will be more details on the German Chapter later. A letter has been sent to S. Faurez F6EEM in Rennes, France inviting him to start a Chapter in France, There is a lot of activity on ten meters in France according to correspondence received. The President , Morrie, is going to get involved in the "French Connection" so we can't fail. Three applications have been received from Canadian members wishing to start Chapters. There two Chapters being formed in Quebec and one in Ontario. The "Johnnie Canuck" Chapter in Ste Therese, Quebec is in operation. The other two are in the formation stages.

In the USA Chapters are either in operation or in he forming stages. The locations are-Metropolis, Illinois-Athens and Dothan, Alabama, Deville, Louisana-Buffalo, New York-St. Paul, Minnesota-Ft. Wayne, Indiana-Anderson, Indiana-Phoenix Arizona-Tri-County, Kentucky-Long Island, New York-Campbellville, Kentucky. In most cases the above list will be in operation soon. Some of the new Chapters will have certificates available.

It is the policy of the Co-ordinator to try and avoid one Chapter interfereing with another that may be in the same area. This has been done but in nearly all cases the other Chapter Heads in the area have approved the new Chapter. There has been some correspondence received that state that the requirements to start a new Chapter are too easy and that the number of members required to start a Chapter should be a greater number than the five (5) now required. The point is well taken and some thought will be given to an increase in the number of members required. Comments are welcome and appreciated. In the past there were no requirements to start a Chapter and there were not many members either.

The number of Chapters that offer certificates has been on the increase and many new Chapters have or plan certificates. It is not necessary for a Chapter to offer a certificate or any kind of an award to start a Chapter. Names for the Chapters are not required but may be desireable.

It has been brought to the attention of the Co-ordinator that the "Fifty year Anniversary" of the ten meter band will be some time during 1978. It might be well for the Ten Ten Net to give some thought to some kind of a special edition of the bulletin on or about the date the band was authorized in 1928. One member K4WP has done some research and come up with an item from one of the past issues of the ARRL Handbook that stated that the "28 MHz band would be open for amateur use at the request of the ARRL but the exact date was not given. We all know that the

ten meter band has been in use for a long time. If there are any of the members that can supply any information on the date or any other details that may be of interest they would be most welcome. The story of the "Ten Meter Band" will be of interest to all the members of the Ten International Net Inc. in as much the organization has done more than any other group to keep the band in use.

The band conditions generally have been very poor although some of the Chapter reports have reported an increase in check ins from out side their immeadiate area. It may be that the band is jumping around. Good in some places and poor in others. We all are waiting the day when the band will come to life and ten will be the band to use as it was in days gone by.

There have been many changes in the officers of various Chapters. Some of the Chapters have an election of officers each year and as a result there is a new president and sometimes another Chapter Head. The editor, Chuck, trics to keep up with the changes but can't unless I get the information to him and it must be received before it can be sent to the editor.

There are various groups in all parts of the world that are converting the CB units to ten meter AM. There does not seem to be any pattern of the changes. Many of the groups that make the changes have been using 28.8 MHz as one of the frequencies. The So. Calif. Net was asked to move so the AM CB rigs could use the frequency as they were xtal controlled. It is my opinion that the ten meter band is large enough that there is room for all. The Southern California 10 meter AM/SSB QRP Planning Council is trying to get all the AM QRP groups to convert to the same frequencies. This group, most are 10-X members, have a good idea and are willing to supply the information to any individual or net. The So. Calif. QRP group do not use 28.8 MHz although the changes made will hit that frequency. If anyone wishes information on the frequency that is proposed it can be obtained from WoIRT Chairman of the committee.

One of the most popular and oldest certificates will no longer be available. The Yodar Kritch and the Sweethart certificates have been discontinued. The cost of a reprint is given as the reason. The Yodar Kritch WAS awards will not be cancelled but be available until all have been won. It is possible that Jim WA3NCQ may find some way in the future to get "The face that only a mother can love" back on the available list. The last certificate directory has the correction.

My thanks as usual to all the Chapter Heads and the NCSs for the fine job they have been doing. Some day I hope to meet all the "Guys & Gals" that are Chapter Heads, NCSs that take the time to send the reports and news to the Editor and myself.




