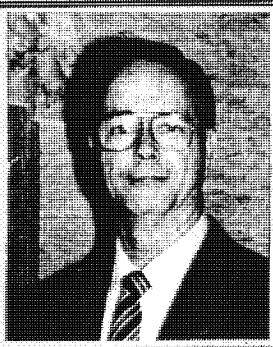

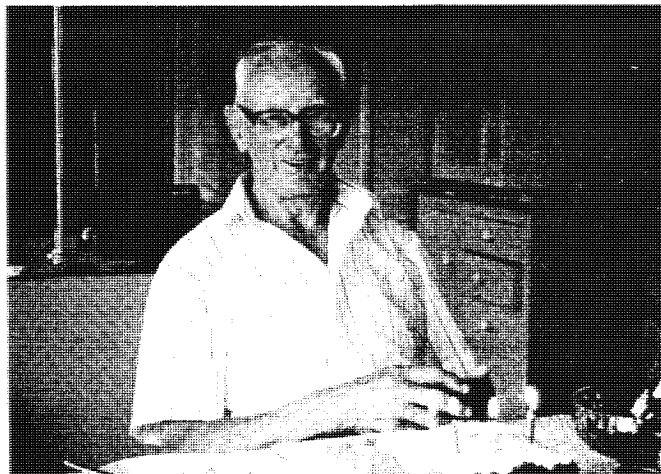

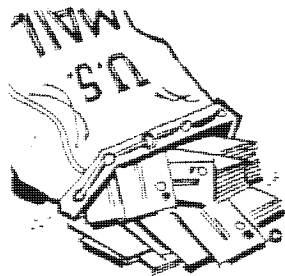
Congratulations.....

"Letter to the Editor and to All Interested CM's:

I have done a lot of thinking since the Las Vegas get together in August about the attitudes that seem to be becoming prevalent among the high power paperchasers these days. Cheating has gone on to some small degree for years as any CM can attest to but it seems to be on the rise.

I had a conversation in the hospitality suite that dealt with a YL that had very recently become licensed but is showing several chapters with the exact same points as the OM. When I commented that I could not accept that as being fair to other paperchasers who earned their points I was told that "what difference does it make as it is only a game". I said that several people that he had legitimately worked had since then become SK and that she would never be able to work them as a licensed ham and the comment was the same "it's only a game and the as a CM he would do it for any team". He also stated that he would encourage this thinking among any of the chapters. I will state that any chapter that feels it is okay to take credit for stations never worked will no longer appear on my lists of actively pursued chapters. Most of the older established chapters I think will not condone this thinking but the ones that do are either new chapters with little experience or chapters that have had new CM's who have a very different outlook.

Since the main purpose of 10-10 is to utilize the band to the utmost this new outlook certainly cuts into that. It seems that by allowing this type of thinking to grow that the paperchasing aspect will continue to deteriorate and that the paperchasers with any type of ethics will continue to drop away. When the paperchasing game went point crazy starting with the White Mountain chapter (which I enjoyed thoroughly myself) it seems the mighty hunt for First Country and First State on the many, many seals caused an attitude of anything goes if it gets that person their FC or FS. It has gotten to

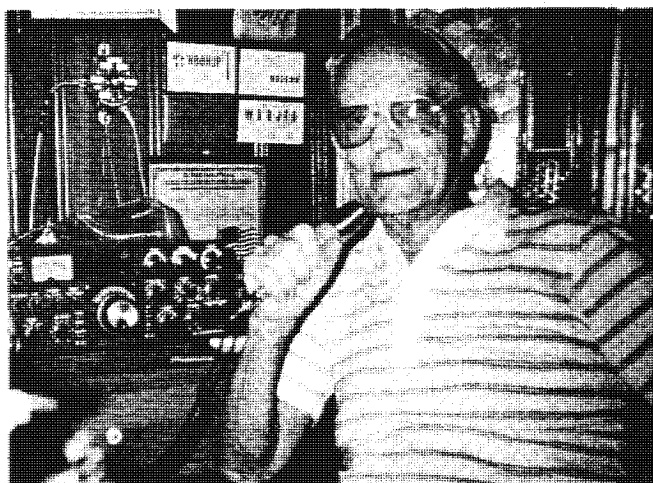
the point that if one has no new upgrades to offer they are quickly pushed off to one side and people no longer care to chat a little along with the points and specials. I have had several letters in the past year from former paperchasers giving the same reasons for dropping out. I was told recently that one paperchaser who has had to give it up due to health problems was told she should no longer get on 28.345 as that is for paperchasers only! Others say no one wants to talk to me since I have stopped upgrading. A sad, sad day when the friendship gets forgotten in the feeding frenzy over points.

I wish I could offer a solution to the problem but that will only come when the chapters stop this offering ridiculous points and too many seals for too little effort expended. I think if they go back to the contact system of awarding seals for contacts as Battle Road has done it will help somewhat. Their points are higher than would have been common 8 or more years ago but are much more reasonable than those that exceed 10,000 very quickly.

For now I am not closing the door on paperchasing but I am not going to propagate chapters that allow cheating or corner cutting when there are too many good chapters to choose from. I know that 10-10 can not dictate the behavior of it's chapters or members but I hope it can at least suggest a code of ethics. I have always enjoyed paperchasing for the challenge it offered but there is no challenge in competing with cheaters and I refuse to come down to that level of participation.

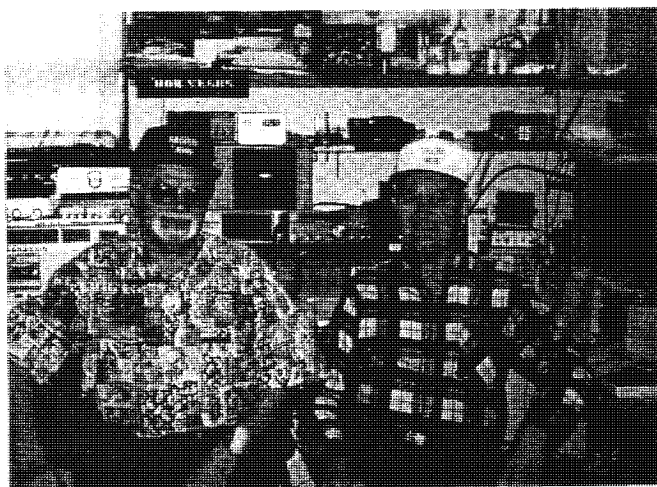
Here is a chance to win one of the greatest little radios that has come on the market in a number of years. Will you be the lucky one?

An-Ten-Ten-nas

In each issue of the News, we shall try to clarify a significant cluster of ideas used in antenna work. Our object is to help you make the best decisions about the antennas you buy or build with out imposing our own prejudices on you. The more you understand, the better your choices will be.



No. 5: What Difference Does Height Make?

The general rule for antennas that we always hear is "The higher, the better." Is this true? Generally speaking, and for 10 meters, the answer is "Yes" in terms of antenna performance. (The answer may be "No" in terms of tower, rotator, antenna, and cable maintenance.) Why?

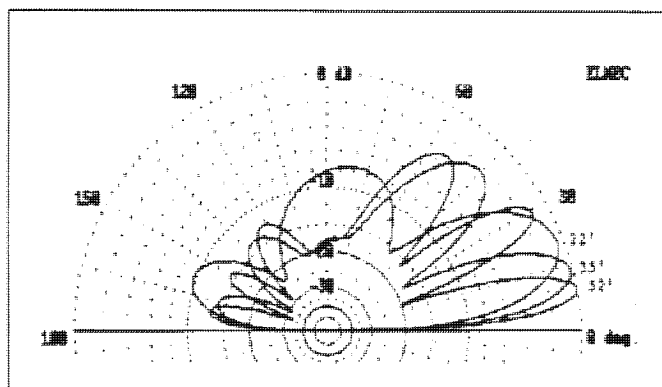


Fig. 1: Elevation plot for a beam at 22', 35', and 52'

"Why" always takes more time and space to answer, but the general principle is this: the higher the antenna, the lower the take-off angle. We can get a hold of the idea of "take-off angle" by looking at Fig. 1. It shows one antenna, a two element Yagi, at heights of 22, 35, and 52 feet. These correspond to heights of 5/8 wavelength, 1 wavelength, and 1 1/2 wavelength respectively. If you extrapolate these ideas to other bands, remember that the principles apply in terms of height in wavelengths or fractions thereof.

We are interested in the lowest forward lobe to the right, the direction in which the beam is pointed. That is the main lobe, where the power is greatest (or the receiving gain is greatest). The angle of maximum radiation or gain is the take-off angle. At 22 feet, the angle for this antenna is 21 degrees;

for 35 feet the angle is 14 degrees, and for 52 feet the angle is 9 degrees.

There is a second principle to consider. Most of the time, the longer the path to a distant station, the lower the angle at which the signal bounces between the antenna and the ionospheric (skip) layer. On 10 meters, many dx stations require an angle under 10 degrees, especially during marginal conditions.

The test antenna at all three heights has some power radiated under the 10 degree angle, but obviously that power increases as we raise the antenna height. When the band is wide open, that is, when skip is very strong, the differences may make no difference in the ability to make long distance contacts. The differences begin to show up under marginal conditions or in competitive situations, such as contests and dx pile-ups. Many dxers favor heights above 100 feet, especially for their 20 meter antennas (that is, about 1 1/2 wavelengths at 20, 3 wavelengths at 10).

These principles are not absolutes. Skip conditions have many variables that can alter situations. Moreover, in some applications, we may want power in the high angle lobes. State-wide 75-meter SSB coverage conveniently calls for low antennas with high skip angles, and few of us can get a 75-meter dipole very high in terms of a wavelength. On 10, the secondary lobes of the beams are useful for using shorter skip paths.

Take-off angles do not vary much among antenna types. At very low heights (about 1/2 wavelength), 3-element Yagis and quads have a couple of degrees advantage over dipoles and 2-element Yagis, but the difference in take-off angles washes out at 1 wavelength antenna heights. Hence, a dipole at 100' might outperform a 4-element Yagi at 25' for some dx paths.

Height, especially at levels below 2 wavelengths, can make some subtle differences in performance as well. The gain, front-to-back ratio, and feedpoint impedance of an antenna are not constant as we raise it. Rather, for dipoles and Yagis, gain peaks at about 5/8 wavelength and again at 1 1/4 wavelength, 10 meter heights of about 22 and 44 feet. Gain dips at 7/8 wavelength, about 30 feet up. In some antenna designs, the dip may be almost a full dB below the maximum gain at favorable heights. Of course, if you have a multiband antenna, one band's maxima may be another band's minima, so some sort of compromise is in order. These subtler differences in antenna performance also complicate antenna comparisons.

Front-to-back ratios in 2-element beams show a variable pattern of change, but director designs peak just where reflector designs dip and vice versa. Curves are smoother for 3-element Yagis. The ups and downs in gain and front-to-back ratio that parasitic beams show demonstrate the complex interactions not only directly among the elements, but also with ground reflected power that plays such an important role in real antennas.

The exact phase difference between the radiated power and the ground reflected power adds or subtracts from the antenna's total in both calculable and measurable ways. How the ground reflections add or subtract varies from one kind of antenna to another.

Antennas composed of 2 elements about 1/4 wavelength apart and fed 180-degrees out of phase show a bidirectional pattern with very significant gain over a dipole. They also display an immunity to the effects of height, general showing a smooth curve of gain increase with height. Another feature of these antennas is that they have a strong vertical null, that is, negligible radiation straight up. Hence, the interactions of ground reflected power with the antenna are largely eliminated.

These subtler interactions, of course, do not negate the first principle of antennas. Get the thing as high as you can legally and safely maintain. Then start operating.

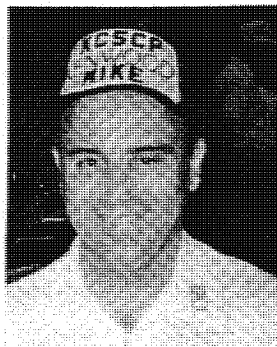

TenX DX NEWS

The band conditions have not improved much with the change of season. In the US we are getting skip into Europe three days a month, which is less than expected. During the **CQWW** contest, I was able to work Europeans with my beam pointed to the southeast in the mornings, which is 90 degrees off the short path heading to Europe. To work into Japan in the late afternoon, I had to beam southwest, again 90 degrees off. Since we will not get many DX openings this winter, you need to watch for these openings. I observed stations in Central and South America working into Europe with much less effort during the **CQWW** contests. Skip conditions were below average both weekends and a minor storm occurred during the CW contest.

The count of 10-10 Countries has changed to 270. I discovered that one of the deleted countries (DL Germany) occurred after several members in Germany had received their 10-10 numbers and were operating prior to September 17, 1973 when E. Germany was recognized. Now both countries have rejoined creating another deleted country (Y2). We now have 57 deleted countries and my records show that there was 10-10 activity from 6 deleted countries (7O, DL, OK, Y2, ZS0, ZS9). I have updated my DXCC list and copies are available for an SASE with 2 oz. postage. I compared a DX list from Bill K9EHP #2847 to update my 10-10 DXCC list. If anyone has a 10-10 DX stations worked list, I would like a copy.

Feature DX Station:

TG7ITH Guatemala by Richard #64671 was worked in the **CQWW** phone contest in late October. In my last article I mistakenly listed Richard as TG9AGY. I have worked Guatemala three times now but this last contact should produce a new 10-10 country! The only active 10-10 station is Richard who is a missionary in Guatemala. QSL to Richard Hood, El Trebol, San Benito, Peten, Guatemala, Central America.

555 DX Net Sunday on 28.555 at 1400-1530 UTC:

Poor band conditions have resulted in few checkins on the new DX net. The DX net will close in March 1995 and open again in November 95.

Z32JA Macedonia by Venco (ex-4N5JA, YU5JA) #23427. I received 10-10 country #235 when Venco sent me his QSL and a short letter with his photo. He has a nice station with a Kenwood TS930 and good antennas. QSL to Stojcev Venco, Ivo L. Ribar 92, 92000 Stip, Macedonia, Europe.

In researching 10-10 Countries, I found a list of callsigns used by **W6KG** Lloyd #21227(now a silent key) & **W6QL** Iris #21226. They have made more than 1.1 million contacts, traveled in over 210 countries, received 650,000 QSL cards, worked DXCC under 110 different calls and received their 10-10 numbers in 1976. They have proven to be the most active duo in Amateur radio up until his death and they have provided us with more 10-10 countries than anyone! My research shows that they could have given out the following additional 10-10 countries: **Qatar (A7)**, **Abu Ali (AA)**, **Benin (TY)**, **Reunion (FR)**, **Mayotte (FH)**, **Togo (5V)**, and **Nepal (9N)**. Since I do not know if they operated any ten meters from these countries and dates, I can not add them to my 10-10 Countries list. Can anyone provide me a photo copy of any QSL cards with this information? Now that Lloyd is a silent key, will Iris retire from Dxing?

Propagation: Solar flux will average 74-92 in the Spring of 1995 which is a lower average than last year. Before the **CQWW** CW contest, the Solar flux was 82 and the A index 1. During the contest a solar flare occurred, producing a disturbance and sent the A index to 20, that resulted in no skip on ten for several hours. Expect flux dips to 68, high A indexes greater than 20 and the K index greater than 5, will occur 30% of the time. Expect a 15% chance of DX propagation in the US to be East-West paths into Europe, Asia & Africa as we change from winter to spring. Expect sporadic E Layer conditions to be one hop skip with fading, when long DX skip is not open and this will last 2 more years until the next solar cycle begins. Remember to listen for the beacons (28.2-28.3) when you want to check band conditions.

BYLAWS, 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NET, INC.

AS ADOPTED JULY 23, 1994

ARTICLE I: ORGANIZATION NAME

The name of this organization is: 10-10 International Net, Inc. Another form of the name is Ten-Ten International Net, Inc. The name may also be abbreviated, for example, 10-10, 10-10 Net, Ten-Ten, Ten-X. In these bylaws, the abbreviation "10-10" will be used.

ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

The purposes of 10-10 are to promote activity on the 10 meter amateur band, to handle traffic, and to assist radio amateurs in improving their technical skills and operating procedures. The operation of 10-10 shall be for charitable, educational, and scientific purposes related to amateur radio. A news publication will be published by 10-10 on a regular basis and mailed to all full members.

ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP

Section 1.

Any licensed amateur radio operator, who has operating privileges on 10 meters, may apply for membership. The requirements shall be established by the Board of Directors and published in the *10-10 News*. Upon acceptance of membership, the applicant will be assigned a unique 10-10 number, however, no individual or club station will be issued more than one 10-10 number.

Section 2.

The classes of membership for 10-10 are:

- (a) U.S. MEMBER
- (b) INTERNATIONAL MEMBER
- (c) FAMILY MEMBER
- (d) LIFE MEMBER
- (e) HONORARY MEMBER
- (f) CLUB STATION

Section 3.

Classes of membership are defined as follows:

- (a) U.S. Members are those members residing within a United States postal zip code area.
- (b) International Members are all members whose mailing address is not within a United States postal zip code mailing address.
- (c) 1. Family Membership consists of a primary member (U.S., International or Life member) and one or more relatives who qualify as a 10-10 member and who reside at the same location and postal address.
2. Family Membership shall run concurrently with that of the primary member.
- (d) Life Membership will be granted to those members whose dues have been paid for life, or granted by action of the Board of Directors.
- (e) Honorary Membership may be granted by action of the Board of Directors in recognition of outstanding services rendered to 10-10.

f) Club Station.

1. Effective June 8, 1991, club stations with a unique government issued call may apply for membership, subject to the restrictions in 3 & 4 of this section.

2. Club stations authorized for membership prior to June 8, 1991 may continue their membership subject to the restrictions in 3 & 4 of this section.

3. Club stations will not be entitled to vote.

4. Club stations will not be eligible for Family or Life membership.

Section 4.

A member whose dues are current shall be referred to as a "FULL" member and shall have all rights and privileges of membership, except that the relative members of a family membership do not receive the *10-10 News*.

Section 5.

Membership in 10-10 shall be cancelled upon:

- (a) The revocation, cancellation or suspension of his or her amateur radio license privileges.
- (b) The dues becoming delinquent more than two months following the renewal due date.
- (c) Conduct not becoming amateur radio in general or 10-10 in particular, as determined by the Board of Directors. This cause for membership cancellation may result in revocation of an individual's 10-10 number.

Section 6.

A member whose membership is cancelled shall be referred to as a "NOMINAL" member, and shall lose all rights and privileges of membership.

ARTICLE IV: DUES

The Board of Directors will establish dues for the various membership classes, which will be published in the *10-10 News*.

ARTICLE V: GOVERNMENT

Section 1.

The general management of the affairs of 10-10 shall be vested in the Board of Directors.

Section 2.

The officers of 10-10 shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary, and a Corporate Secretary.

Section 3.

The Board of Directors shall consist of: President, Vice President, Secretary, the immediate past President, ex-officio, of 10-10 for 2 years after he or she is succeeded and no more than 10 Directors. Each member of the Board shall without exception have one vote, with no proxy votes permitted.

Section 4.

The Corporate Secretary shall reside in the state of California.

Section 5.

Robert's Rules of Order shall govern all regular meetings as well as meetings of the Board of Directors and of 10-10 in all cases applicable.

ARTICLE VI: BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1.

The Board of Directors shall control the property and affairs of 10-10 and shall establish its policies. It shall have the power to hold meetings and take all necessary steps to carry out the purposes of 10-10 and promote its best interest. It shall have the authority to:

(1) hire employees as may be considered necessary;

(2) enter into contracts as required.

The Board shall appoint a qualified Treasurer who shall serve at the will of the Board. The Treasurer shall be accountable to the Board of Directors. He or she shall be responsible for the funds of 10-10 and shall prepare and submit a proposed operating budget to the Board of Directors prior to each annual regular meeting of the Board of Directors. He or she shall make available all financial records for audit at the conclusion of each fiscal year.

Section 2.

No officer or Director shall receive remuneration for his or her services to 10-10. However, documented and approved 10-10 expenses may be reimbursed.

Section 3.

Each officer and Director except the immediate past President shall serve for a term of four (4) years or until his or her successor is duly elected and installed in office.

Section 4.

No Director shall hold a position on the Board of Directors if he or she could gain financially or further his or her own aims or those of his or her employer because of his or her position in 10-10.

Section 5.

The Board of Directors shall hold a meeting at least once each year or at the call of the President. At least 50% of the board members shall be present to constitute a quorum.

Section 6.

Special occasional meetings of the Board of Directors may be convened at the call of the President. Action taken may be by mail or telephone communications as necessary.

Section 7.

In the event of a vacancy on the Board of Directors with the exception of the President, the President shall appoint replacements with the approval of 2/3 of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VII: MEETINGS

Section 1.

10-10 shall hold an annual general membership meeting at a time and place to be designated by the Board of Directors, and published in the 10-10 News.

Section 2.

The purpose of the annual general membership meeting shall be a report of the Board to the general membership, and any other business as may be deemed necessary.

ARTICLE VIII: OFFICERS' DUTIES

Section 1.

The President shall preside at all meetings of 10-10 and of the Board of Directors. He or she shall carry out the directives of the Board of Directors. The President shall appoint such committees as he or she or the Board of Directors may consider necessary. The President shall be a member *ex officio* of all committees except the nominating committee.

Section 2.

The succession to the office of President shall be: Vice President, Secretary.

Section 3.

The Secretary shall record the proceedings of regular meetings of 10-10, and meetings of the Board of Directors.

Section 4.

The Corporate Secretary shall be responsible for maintaining the Corporate status of 10-10.

Section 5.

Upon the termination of his or her term of office, each officer shall send to his or her successor, within 30 days, all property, correspondence and records in his or her custody which belong to 10-10.

ARTICLE IX: ELECTION PROCEDURE

Section 1.

The election of officers and one-half of the Directors shall take place every four years in an even-numbered year. The election of the other half of the Directors shall take place the following even-numbered year.

Section 2.

No member may qualify for nomination to be an Officer or Director of 10-10 unless he or she has been a full member for more than two years immediately preceding his or her nomination.

Section 3.

The President shall appoint a chairman of the nominating committee no later than 1 June of the year preceding the election year. A call for nominations will be issued in the second and third issues of the 10-10 News. Information regarding eligibility and information to send the nominating committee will be included. The nominating committee shall develop a slate of eligible qualified candidates by 30 November in the year preceding the election. Members wishing to be selected must have their information in to the nominating committee prior to 15 November in the year preceding the election. Members who are not selected by the nominating committee will be informed by December 15 by the chairman of the nominating committee, in writing, of the proper method of petition. Nominations of the

nominating committee will be announced in the second issue of the *10-10 News* of the election year.

Section 4.

Members and nominees not selected by the nominating committee may petition for candidacy. Such petitions shall be signed by 50 full members and submitted to the Secretary by 15 February of the election year. The Secretary shall verify the validity of the petitions and the eligibility of the candidates and place the names of the candidates on the ballot, along with those submitted by the nominating committee. Information regarding this process will be printed in the *10-10 News* second and third issues in the year preceding the election. Whereupon, having completed their task, the Nominating Committee shall be considered discharged.

Section 5.

Candidates seeking nomination by petition are required to submit a biographical information form to be provided by and returned to the Secretary. This biographical outline shall be printed in the second issue of the *10-10 News* of the election year.

Section 6.

Election shall be by written ballot. Ballots shall be mailed the first week of June during the election year to each full member. The polls shall close August 31 of that election year. Ballots received after August 31 will be invalid and they will not be opened or counted in any way.

Section 7.

The President, with the approval of the Board of Directors, shall appoint two or more tellers to count the ballots. The tellers shall certify to the Secretary, in writing, results of the ballot count for each office. If a candidate does not receive a majority, a plurality of the votes cast for each office will determine the candidate elected for each office.

Section 8.

All candidates shall be notified by the Secretary of the results of the balloting via telephone within 48 hours of the certification by the Secretary. Results of the election will be published in the fourth issue of the *10-10 News*.

Section 9.

Officers' and Directors' terms of office shall commence on the first day of January following their election.

Section 10.

The President with the approval of the Board of Directors, shall appoint the Corporate Secretary.

ARTICLE X: CHAPTERS

Chapters may be formed from time to time. The requirement for a chapter shall be established by the Board of Directors and be published in the *10-10 News*.

ARTICLE XI: FINANCIAL DEBTS

Any and all obligations incurred by 10-10 shall be solely corporate obligations. No personal liability whatsoever shall be attached to, or be incurred by, any member,

Officer, or Director of 10-10 by reason of any corporate obligations.

ARTICLE XII: AMENDMENTS

Section 1.

These bylaws may be amended, as deemed necessary, by a two-thirds vote of the Board of Directors at any annual or special meeting of the Board of Directors.

Section 2.

Petitions to change the bylaws may be submitted to the Secretary upon signature of at least 20 full members. The Board of Directors must consider and vote upon said petition at the next succeeding meeting of the Board of Directors.

Section 3.

The full members of 10-10 shall be notified of any amendment or changes in these bylaws no later than the second issue of the *10-10 News* following the Board action which resulted in changes.

ARTICLE XIII: EFFECTIVE DATE

These revised Bylaws were adopted by the Board of Directors on July 23, 1994, and shall become effective immediately.

Former Head of CBS News becomes SK at 78

Bill Leonard, W2SKE, 10-10 #41975, former head of CBS News became a SK on October 23, 1994, in a Laurel, Maryland hospital of a stroke. He was first licensed as W1JHV some 60 years ago while a student at Dartmouth College.

Bill retired about a decade ago as President of CBS News where he was credited with beginning many innovative news concepts including the magazine format programs "60 Minutes" and "Sunday Morning".

In 1979, Bill was named Executive Vice President and CEO of the CBS news division. Later that year he was named President of CBS News. He retired three years later at age 66. During his four decade career at CBS, he constantly provided favorable publicity for amateur radio and amateur satellites.

Bill will forever be listed in the records of 10-10 as number 41975.

FCC HIGHLIGHTS

News and Information from and about the FCC

The FCC announced that beginning December 20, 1994, the following amendments described as "nonsubstantive procedural changes" will become effective:

1. To permit electronically filed data from VEC's (paper applications will still be accepted);
2. Authorizes operation as soon as the new license appears in the amateur service license data base, rather than the present wait for the license document to be delivered. Details of how the new licensee can determine his/her call sign will be announced later;
3. To add a new rules section entitled "Examine Conduct", to emphasize that an examine must comply with the instructions given by the administering VE's;
4. To treat "Technician Plus" as a license class;
5. To provide for a "renewal short form" which the FCC states will be mailed in advance of the license expiration date, beginning sometime in 1995. The FCC again stated that renewal applications will not be accepted more than 90 day in advance of the expiration date.

Because of the "nonsubstantive" nature of these rule amendments, there is no notice or comment period required by federal law, and they will take effect on December 20, 1994

.....Worldradio

The FCC observed its 60th anniversary last October and hosted a cake cutting ceremony complete with Commissioner Rachelle Chong reading "A poem to the Communications Act."

In 1934 President Franklin D. Roosevelt approved legislation establishing the FCC. It replaced the old Federal Radio Commission and expanded its duties to include telegraph and telephone. Now, some sixty years later, the Communications Act of 1934 continues to be the backbone of our nation's telecommunications regulation structure.

In 1934, the FCC was an agency with 233 employees, including seven Commissioners, and a budget of \$1.4 million. It regulated a broadcast business which then consisted of 623 radio stations and a telephone industry with 14 million phones and total \$940 million. Today, there are five Commissioners, 1964 employees and a

budget of \$160.3 million.

The FCC's task has increased enormously. The broadcast industry has now grown to 21,640 stations (radio, TV and Low Power TV). And there are more video programming outlets than we can count. Spurred on by FAXes, 800/900 numbers, digital data transmission and fiber optics, this year the total revenues of the telephone industry will approach 200 billion!

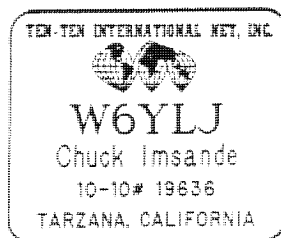

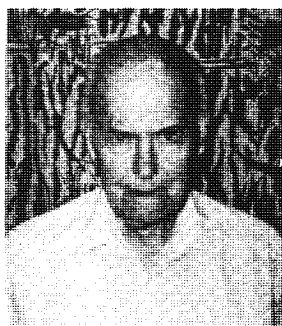

Many thanks to Bob Plunkett, WA4FWH #1568, for his gracious letter and for enclosing a copy of a 4 page **10-10 Bulletin** dated February 1971. It had been mailed to him with a 6 cent stamp. Here are some items extracted from that issue (Volume 4, Number 1):

"President William Fuller, #1279 appointed George Elliott, W6ENC[SK #1774] as Net Coordinator. The 10-10 Net boasts 2000 members and meets at 1800Z on 28.775 MHz SSB and 28.8 MHz AM. SSB must remain in the haphazard stage because many stations lack SSB capability. Comments were reported from four chapters, Philadelphia, Northern New Jersey, Massachusetts Minute Man and District of Columbia Chapters."

"FLASH! Grace, K5MRU #218, has just received her award for 1000 contacts. Congratulations Grace! You are number one."

And that's how it was back in 1971. It seems such a short time ago that SSB was just being introduced! 2,000 members in 1971 - over 66,000 in 1994! 10-10 just keeps growing.....

I recently visited with Lee, WB6MGM #213, and his XYL Edith at their home. Lee has suffered a massive stroke and Edith is his constant care giver. I was amazed to see so many volumes of 10-10 records organized by Lee through the years for submittal to the mailing service. Lee received his 10-10 number 213 in 1968, six years after 10-10 was founded. When 10-10 was swamped with new member applications, he volunteered to serve as manager of districts 1, 2 and 3. He served until 1975 when he agreed to serve not only as manager of district 6 but also as the 10-10 Records Manager. The membership had then exceeded 12,000. Lee has devoted thousands of hours to the monumental task of maintaining accurate records. 10-10 owes Lee a huge debt of gratitude. He is now at home receiving therapy and would appreciate a card or QSL card expressing your good wishes. His QTH is listed on page 2 of this issue.

A request for information on the origin of the 10-10 logo came up at the 10-10 Forum conducted at the San Diego ARRL Convention recently by Chuck, W6YLJ #19636, our Editor and now Vice President. As I recall, Claude Martin, W6LRY #437, made a report about 20 years ago at a 10-10 Quarterly Meeting. Several members were at a park trying to design a 10-10 Certificate in the summer of 1962. A black mother cat was seen waiting patiently for her nine kittens to cross the road. This was the inspiration Leoma Martin, Claude's XYL, needed to create the logo. The first logo appeared on black and white certificates issued to new members starting in September 1992.

Received a letter from Pete Matson, KC1CP #37190, reporting about the 10-10 exhibit arranged by the Niantic Bay Chapter at the Boxborough ARRL Convention in October 1994. It was highly successful mainly due to the announcement of this event on W6OI/1 when it was on the air in the month of September. Congratulations Pete on your election as 10-10 Director for the next four years and to all the officers and directors who were elected to serve commencing January 1, 1995.

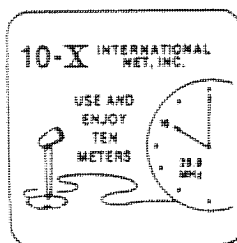

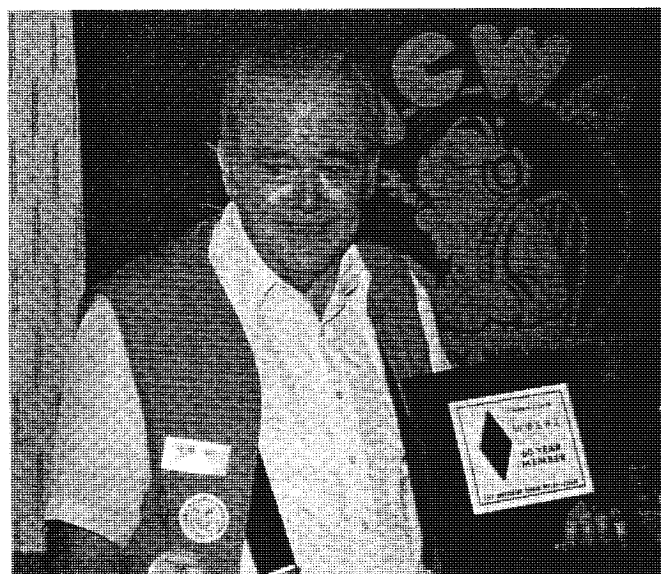

New, Improved 10-10 Data Base Roster Program

The new, improved version of the 10-10 data base roster program is now available. For those who want more information on 10-10 membership data than is available on the XXIQ program, the new program, known as **XXIP** (10-10 Inquiry PLUS), will provide the information that members have been requesting. The new **XXIP** provides the following features at this time:

- Call from 10-10 Number
- 10-10 Number from Call
- Name, Address, City, State (or Country) and ZIP Code
- Membership Status (Life, Full, Family, Club)
- Membership Expiration Date
- Silent Key Status - Yes or No
- Label printing of displayed call at the press of an "F" key

The following additional features will be available in the future:

- Edit capability for Name and Address
- Logging provisions and BAR applications
- Listing of County (by ZIP code)
- VP Number
- Notes (a field that the user can add any information such as phone number, XYL/OM name, birthday, chapter information, etc.)
- Several other additional options are being investigated






The program will run on any IBM compatible computer with DOS 3.3 or later and requires 16 MB of hard disk and comes on three high density 3.5" disks. The label printing will address most pin printers (Epson compatible). **XXIP is not available on 5.25" floppies.**

One terrific advantage of the new **XXIP** program over other "call book" programs is that the name, address and call is current. Because 10-10 monitors the address of all current members through the mailing of the *10-10 News*, we maintain a **current address list**. The accuracy of other "call book" program lists are only as good as the FCC data base. It is a known fact that many hams **do not** notify the FCC via a 610 Form when they move. Therefore, these "call book" programs are

far behind the accuracy of the **XXIP Program**! We believe that this gives the 10-10 membership a terrific advantage with the use of **XXIP**. Current calls, current addresses, membership status, expiration date and the capability of maintaining contact records provide necessary information to operate efficiently as a 10-10 member.

The initial release of **XXIP** is available now. The cost of the program is \$10.00 per release for US members and \$13.00 for DX members. Updates will be issued quarterly and the additional capabilities noted above will be included as soon as complete.

It is planned to continue to issue XXIQ, the program that cross references calls to 10-10 numbers and 10-10 numbers to calls for those who only desire that information. The price for the single disk XXIQ is \$5.00 per quarterly release or \$17.50 per yearly subscription for US and \$7.00 per quarter or \$25.00 per yearly subscription for DX members. 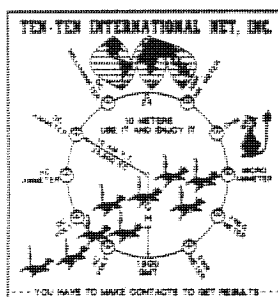
