

with the Ten-Ten Booth upon arriving so plans can be made for introductions at the Forum. I'm looking forward to meeting you at the convention. Members are reminded to write to their District Vice President/Manager (see page 30) for addresses) for the following: A-To report a change of address.

B-To renew (or re-instate) your membership, C-To order copies of the Ten-Ten Membership Roster.

D-To report non-receipt of Quarterly Bulletins.

A reminder, also, that the new Editor of the Ten-Ten Certificate/Net Guide is now Susan Levy - WA2SID (XYL of WB2MAN, Net Co-Ord) address on page 2. Send your 9X4" SASE (15¢) to her for current up-dates and Guide. Quarterly Reports should be sent to Rich Levy - WB2MAN (Net Co-Ord). Send news items and photos to me at my new address shown on page 2. I have been getting a lot of mail involving some of the above mentioned Ten-Ten services that are NOT within my area of responsibility. This creates the need for me to forward mail. With the recent increase in postage, forwarding of mail thus caused is an unnecessary drain on the Ten-Ten Treasury. When I asked for reader response to my "poll" (pro or con...mailing certificate number lists) I found out that people DO read the Editorial Page, HI HI. BUT!... too many members misunderstood the intent of my "poll". It was my own idea to see just how members felt. No one at Headquarters asked for the poll. In most cases I was told not to be, "setting up new rules"...so I would like to make a few points clear:

A-Ten-Ten International would not have any reason, or, authority to set up such

rules (much less try to enforce them).


B-The exchanging of certificate numbers by mail is the concern of the members that are involved. Chanters who are not in favor cannot know in award applications if numbers were exchanged by mail. In all fairness I would hope that the list that is exchanged contain only those 10-10 awards held at the time of the QSO. As an example...if there has been some delay after the QSO before lists are exchanged it is conceivable that additional awards might be added to the lists that were not held during the QSO in question. I hope that members will realize that I did not intend to create such a stir...only to get your pro or con vote for reader intrest. I take no stand for or against mailing lists. As I write this editorial the results of my poll stand at: AGAINST-11 (including 7 chapters), FOR-40 (including 1 chapter) for a total of 59 replys. I do thank those that responded with their interesting comments and observations. The chapters voting AGAINST were: All American City, Cradle of Liberty, City of Lights, Sky Blue Waters, Plainsman, Houston Shot and Q.R.P. Chapter, voting FOR: Bay Area.

On my return trip back to Denver from the National Convention I plan to visit with The Thunderbirds, Grand Canyon State and 7-Land VP/Mgr in Phoenix. Then in ElPaso to visit with the people of the Ten-Bar-X Chapter, followed by the Tamale Chapter in Albuquerque. Photos taken at the Convention and my visits to chapters will be featured in the Winter Quarterly Bulletin due out in January 1979. --As you can see by the "centerfold" in this issue the response from Chapters and members with photos has been wonderful and I thank them. However, there are many of our chapters who have never sent photos. To them I say don't be shy ... let us see what you folks look like! --In the summary of the 1978 Winter QSO Party it was mentioned that 12 chapters had only one member participating: They were-Tamale, Ten-Bar-X, Orange County, Hiawatha, War Eagle, HOOT, Mark Twain, Down Under, World Tail End, Beale Street, Powell River and Choctaw-Hatchie Bay. Space limitations prevented listing these in the summary.

The member's response to the 50 Year Special Spring 10-10 Bulletin was fantastic and I thank you all for your kind compliments. Well that about wraps it up until the next Quarterly Bulletin in October. See you at the convention. 73-Chuck, WAGYNQ 10-10 #8105.



Words from the President



George Elliott 10-X 1774

The number one subject that the present administration must face is the resignation of Grace Dunlap K5MRU who has been the Contest Manager for the past seven years. There is a lot of work attached to the job and Grace has done a wonderful job. The results of the various Contests have been sent to the Editor ready for the printer. The Net Co-ordinator, Richard Levy WB2MAN, is working on the problem and will have more to say on the subject in his article in this Bulletin. Look for the Net Co-ordinators report and help solve the problem. The Ten Ten Net is sorry to hear that Grace has found it necessary to resign.

There is one bright star in the Contest line. There has been a lot of requests for a CW contest. There will be a CW only Contest starting at 0000 July 22, 1978 and ending at 2400 July 23, 1978. WAIZXB Daniel Rubin has volunteered to run the Contest, tabulate the scores and do this once each year. The rules are that CW only must be used, all contacts must be 28.5 MHz, or below. If a Tech or Novice contact is made the call sign must be followed by /T or /N. The log must show thr RST, 10-10 number, date, time and QTH. Send the logs to WAIZXB Daniel Rubin 12 Princeton St.-Danvers Mass. 01923. We are very grateful to Dan. In future Contests there will be notices in the various magazines but there was not time enough to get the copy to the publications. The notices must be in the hands of the publishers three months in advance of the effective date. The deadline for the logs to reach Dan is September 15,78. Everyone should get on the air for the QSO party, which will be the final Contest by Grace KSMRU and the first for Dan. There will be no dry throats on CW.

Howard W6QIR has been working on the production of a new roster of the membership. It was mentioned in a previous letter to some of the Vice Presidents that it would be necessary to produce the roster in two parts that will printed separately. Roster "One" will be from number one through number fifteen thousand (15,000). Roster "Two" will be from 15,001 through all numbers that were issued and included in the April 1978 report to the Treasurer. The Rosters are mailed by Howard W6QIR although the orders are sent to the District area Vice Presidents.

During the last quarterly meeting it was mentioned that the Ten Ten Net should sponsor an Auxiliary for the silent, (on the air), xYLs and YLs of the OMs who are on the air and do have an active part in the operation of the Ten International Net. The xYLs and YLs deserve a lot of credit for the work they do behind the scenes. Their work is appreciated by all of that are involved in the Net. Some of the things that the "Gals" do is addressing the Bulletins, taking the tickets at the quarterly meetings, typing and various other duties that the OM often gets credit for. The officers appreciate the jobs they do. We admit there are some OMs who are in the same catagory.

The "SANDARC" San Diego County Amateur Radio Council Inc. Spensored ARRL National Convention will be held in Sandiego September 22-23-24, 1978. The Ten Ten Net will have a Booth and also a forum. The Officers invite all the Members, who can, to attend the Convention and take part in the Forum.

The Ten Ten Net Radio Station W60I/6 will be on the air from the convention Charles (Chuck) Albrecht WADYNQ will be there and be the MC of the Forum. Chuck will also set up the station. Look for more details on the Convention doings by the Editor.

One of the Ten Ten Members is or has been on a visit to the Soviet Union USSR and will try and set up a Chapter of the Ten Ten Net in Leningrad. The plan is for him to operate from the Club Station in Leningrad. K4BE W. O. Conrad will have Ten Ten Bulletins and other material necessary to start a Chapter. The permission of the USSR must be favorable in all cases. It is hoped that there will be no opposition to the plan. Who knows the Ten Ten Net may be get behind the "Iron Curtain" via Amateur Radio.

The Ten Ten Net is planning to have a new "Hand-out that will be available for the use at the various Conventions and Amateur Radio gatherings. The new "Hand-out" will give a short history of the Ten Ten Net and tell how to become a Member of the Net. There will be an application blank and space to list the required ten or five mambers as required. The sheet may save the member, man in the booth, a lot of time answering questions. The new "Handout" will be a single sheet.

It was mentioned in the past that the members that renewed their dues was very small compared to the new members. The last report that was received from the Treasurer was a different story. In some of the reports the renewals were more that the new members. We are certainly glad to note that we are able to hold our membership. The Ten Ten Net needs both the new members and we like to hold those that have been with the Net for some time and in many cases years. I am sure that the District Vice Presidents are doing their best to keep the members and entice new ones to join. Our thanks to them. The Vice Presidents do a lot of work for the Net. It may seem that at times there is a long time from the time an applicant sends in the required lists and the certificate is received. Some of the VPs process from twenty five to in excess of one hundred applications per month. Please be patient if you do not receive your certificate and card the next day. They are doing the best they can.








EDITOR'S NUMBER ONE PROBLEM!



I am glad to announce that the FCC has given me permission to operate a beacon on 10 meters for propagation study only. Authorization expires September 30, 1978.

Beacon Statistics:

- 1. Location: North Hollywood, Ca. 118°28' 25" W longitude, 34° 12' 55" N latitude.
- 2. Power output: 7 watt (QRP).
- 3. Frequency: 28.888 MHz. Temperature controlled Xtal Osc.
- 4. Mode: Al (CW) solid state, ID: W6IRT, Message: Repeats every 100 sec. (12 wpm).
- 5. Antenna: 1/4 aground plane with 3 drooping radials. Radials 15 ft. off roof and about 30 ft. above ground.

The beacon went on the air (24 hour) on May 6, 1978. Dr. Vaughn Cable, K6ZTA, Professor of Electronics and Computer Engineering at California State University, Northridge, and I are establishing a propagation study group to correlate and reduce data received from beacon monitors and listeners. We at this time are going to study all types of propagation, including ground wave in Southern California as well as various skip, reflections, refractions, scatter, back scatter, bounces, and whatever else we can learn about our favorite ham band.

To start, the data needed is: Type and height of Antenna, Receiver, time-date GMT, RST (in microvolts if accurate equipment is available), QSB or flutter, local weather, direction best signal is coming from (for beam owners). Try to listen daily, keep a log and send a report monthly, M/M reports are especially solicited and valuable, DX pse QSL W6 Bureau. Results will be published. Sorry, at this time we do not have plans to QSL from the beacon. Perhaps in the future.

Hopefully, the Commission will extend permission to allow this to be a continuing and long term study. We would like to install several fixed beacon monitors (24hr.) with strip chart recorders around Southern California to correlate ground wave with local WX and other factors. Any Who interested in spending a few \$ to put in a monitor and recorder, contact me. 11M converted AM receivers would do well in this case.

The IARU has a region 1 10 meter beacon band plan of 28.2 to 28.250. ARRL also backs this plan. However, I decided to go it alone. I wanted a beacon in the phone band around 29 MHz. I chose 28.888 MHz as a more practical location than 28.200. To my knowledge and observation, most 10M operators (USA) tune only 28.5 to 29.0 to check band propagation and ground wave paths. Most are not interested in a MUF (Maximum Usable Frequency) of 28.2, especially with the mass quantities of transceivers in use which use 500 KHz increments. If you hear the beacon you will know the MUF is to that frequency and you can judge how well by knowing where it is and how strong. Try calling CQ or QRZ California. In the Los Angeles area, 28.780 is used by QRP Chapter, 28.810 by the Hoot Owls and 28.6 and 28.8 by everyone. You will know if a path is open; we have no way of knowing. Since going on we have worked Japan, Canada and lots of short skip at midnight to 2 AM local time. Those stations heard the beacon and got on and called. The beacon should also show what 7 watts output with a gain of l antenna can do on 10M CW. Also the signal source can be used to plot antenna patterns and gain.



There it is, fellow 10X members. 10 is never dead, it only needs more activity. The beacon is ON (28.888) - use it, enjoy it, and please HELP us get enough data together to prove 10 is the very best.

As a newcomer to 10-X International and an avid QRPp operator, I feel the need to respond to a letter by Mark Morris that appeared in the Winter 1978 Bulletin.

First, I agree and will lead the fight to keep the 10-meter band unchanged. Most of us like it the way it is now.

But as far as Mr. Morris' unkind remarks about QRP is concerned....I'll fight.

First, I enjoy QRPp work and currently use a converted Radio Shack TRC-449 AM-SSB 40-channel phase-lock-loop transceiver...

***I am still working South America with ease and am closing on WAS QRPp flea power. Conditions since the detuning have not permitted a strong opening into Europe or the VK and ZL areas.

During the first 20 days on the air with the 900 milliwatt rig, I worked 16 states, 11 DX countries and held more than 100 QSOs. Only one time during the 100 plus contacts did my signals fade completely out.

I don't use any bird dogs leading the way and asking other stations to standby for me. I call and answer CQs and do a lot of tail-ending.

I also fight pileups head-to-head with the power stations and am successful more times than not.

I do not want a QRP frequency. I can fight for my share of stations with nine-tenths of one watt PEP.

Mr. Morris said, in his letter, "I find it very defficult to believe that anyone interested in amateur radio will settle solely for operating QRP..."

Don't knock it if you haven't tried it. Amateur radio is many things to many people. To me, it's QRPp--working DX on less than one watt.

IMPORTANT!!! PLEASE NOTE. GRACE/K5MRU RESIGNS AS CONTEST MANAGER. Many of you have already heard by now (via word of mouth) that Grace has resigned as manager of the 10-X Contests. Those of you (like myself) who've operated the contest for a number of years realize just how much the work load has increased on her. Still, her resignation leaves a gaping hole in our organization. Grace will manage this summers contest, but then we will need someone or some group to replace her.

What to do? This is what I have in mind. I'd like to have two committees. One, which would be a rules and ethics committee, made up of twelve members (one from each US call area, one ve, and one DX representitive) plus a Chairman. It would be the job of this committee to put together the complete rules of each contest, and to act as judges on any disputed entries. The members of this committee should be 10-X'ers who are interested in operating contests, and who have operated at least two 10-X contests in the past. It would not be necessary for the committee member to have placed high in the contest, just that she or he operated enough to get a good feel about how the contests have gone in the past.

The other committee could be a single individual, a Chapter or a group of individuals whose task it would be to receive the logs, tabulate the results, type up the results for printing in the newsletter, and send certificates to the winners.

WE NEED VOLUNTEERS FOR BOTH OF THESE COMMITTEES IMMEDIATELY!!! If you would like to serve on either one of these committees contact me immediately by mail. If you are applying for a position on the Rules & Ethics Committee, include a brief rundown on what contests you have participated in in the past (10-X or otherwise), and any brief ideas you may have about our contests. If an individual, a Chapter or a group of individuals (in the same area) would like to volunteer to handle the logs, they would have to be willing to serve for at least one year (two contests) preferably longer. Again, if you'ld like to volunteer for either of these committees contact me as soon as possible.

I would just like to take this opportunity to express my thanks to Grace for the outstanding job she has done over the years. I've operated many contests other than the 10-X contest, yet the 10-X Contest has consistently given me the most pleasure. I've operated 10-X Contests since 1972 and the rules have changed to meet the growing number of participants, and this is due to her leadership.


OPERATION ELBOW-ROOM is progressing nicely, I'm happy to say. We now have just about every five KHZ from 23.64 to 28.9 being used by at least one Chapter, and a lot of the frequencies in between are also in use. There are still a couple of "hot spots" but these will be cleared up eventually. Thanks go to the City of Lights, Bauxite, Chief Anderson, KY Plughorse, Wild Burro, Furniture Capital and the Cradle of the Confederacy Chapters for agreeing to change their net frequencies and help spread activity throughout the entire band. I would like to ask those Chapters who have received letters from me asking them to move frequencies, and those Chapters who will be getting similar letters in the future, to give it consideration as a move which would benefit to meters.

MORE NET OPERATIONS. The following are more excerpts from letters received telling how the various Chapters go about running their nets. It's interesting to see how techniques vary from one Chapter to the next. Maybe you'll come across an idea which you think might work well on your net.

From Bill/K8J2N Chapter Head of the Stark County Mutial Aid Net:... "Since the Novice and technicians now have 10 meter priveleges, we also take checkins on 28.150 at 11:15AM. This is for checkins only and to accept any info they wish passed along on the main net which starts at 11:45. I open the net after checking with WWV prior to net call up. We use a roster and anyone that checks in 3 times in a row, has their name on the roster. Failing to check in for 3 weeks gets a check mark by their call, and they are skipped over till they again start checking in with regularity. Mobiles are called first, followed by acknowledgements of early checkins. Then the 28.150 checkins are listed. We then start roll call in alphabetical order by call, starting with "A" one week and "Z" the following week. This is followed by a call for late checkins. Upon completion of roll call(and the secret for the success of our net) I follow with a three week report on all amateur activities, including club meetings, auctions, flea markets, hamfests, contests and birthdays and anniversaries of our members for the coming week."... This is part of a guide for net controls written by Harry/K4WP Chapter Head of the Suncoast Chapter: Call Up: Before starting the call up, check your exact time, your rig for correct tuning and freq. and the antenna for direction etc. and have a roster, paper and pencil handy. Start promptly by 'Calling all members of the Suncoast Chapter of the 10-X Int. Net. This is _____ your net control for this evening, located in ___. Please zero beat this frequency. Repeat this for one or two minutes. Then designate your relay station for the evening. Before calling for checkins, stand by "for any station that may have urgent messages or announcements." As the stations check in acknowledge each one, write the calls down in the form of a list. Identify yourself again and ask for any latecomer members. Acknowledge any skip stations briefly, asking them to stand by until the end of the second round when your will call on them to exchange numbers with the members of our net... From Hugh/WB5GLZ, Secretary of the Cowtown Chapter: "A brief run down on our net operation is to Keep It Simple. We alternate our NCS each week. We run down a roster of the predeeding weeks checkins, however each NCS is free to run the net as his experience dictates. Our net is mostly a information and roundtable discussion of almost anything. If we can pass traffic into our area it is done. As far as passing 10-X information on a crowded net, the NCS usually directs the stations to move off frequency and return when finished. We make it a point to try to finish the net in one hour. "... Grant Miller/VE3GFM, Chapter head of the Big Nickel says his net is run as a round table under the control of a designated net control station, and he will handle the net, taking into consideration the activity requesting to check-in, as he sees fit... Neil McMillen/ WBØSNG, the Jackpine Chapter head says: "...we have had good experience using the 10-X number roll call with the NCS asking for check-ins from 0 - 4000, 4000 - 8000, etc. which has eliminated quite a bit of confusion. Contacts are sometimes handled the same, but usually the NCS asks if there are any contacts by asking for the last 3 letters of the call for ID ... From Robert Macauley/WB8WVF, CHapter Head of the Michigan Water Wonderland Chapter: "... we try to operate the net on a formal basis. We open the net with a minor briefing on net. proceeding, and then ask for charter members only to check-in, and then check-in any other stations" ...

FINAL NOTE. Most of you know that the qualifications for forming a 10-X Chapter do not include the issuing of a Chapter Certificate. We leave this up to the individual Chapte If the Chapter wishes to issue a Certificate it may; the Chapter may decide on the requirements for the certificate; the cost of the certificate; the certificate manager. But, if the Chapter does decide to issue a Certificate it must take on the responsibility of seeing that the Certificate is returned to the applicant before a reasonable period of time has elapsed. If for some reason the certificate manager can not perform his function for an extended period of time, arrangements must be made for someone to take over his responsibilities, or that the applicants are notified that there will be a delay in fulfilling their applications. 99% of the Chapters do a fine job in getting their certificates out quickly. There are a few Chapters, however, which take an inordinate amount of time for processing. It is that 1% I am addressing.



How to become a Ten-Ten Member

Work ten present members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, date worked, operator's name, and location. Submit this list to your Call Area Vice-President, with \$1 Initiation Fee and \$3 for your first year's dues. Novices need not pay the Initiation Fee, and DX applicants need work but 5 present members. You will receive a Certificate and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the Quarterly Bulletin, and participate in 10-10 activities.

How to earn Bars and Plaques

As a member, log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters. You may wish to mark your Roster to avoid duplicates, and to develop a filing system to record 10-10 contacts. All contacts must be bona-fide number exchanges on the air. When you have 100 contacts (including your first 10), list 100 only (never more, never less, and no duplicates) as follows:

- 1. Your list must be in serial order of 10-10 numbers.
- 2. You may submit only one list at a time.
- 3. You may not submit log books or copies of log book pages.
- 4. You must give your name, address, call sign, and 10-10 number and state which Bar you are requesting (i.e., 100 Bar, 200 Bar, etc.).

 5. You must enclose an SASE (large size - about 4 1/4" x 9 3/8").
- 6. Mail your materials to: FRANK ORCUTT, WLJC, Awards Manager 110 Leisure Mobile Park 28501 SW 152 AVE. Leisure City, FL 33033

When you have attained your 500 Bar, you will be assigned an Honorary V. P. Number, and will be entitled to participate in additional activities. In addition, plaques are awarded for 1,000, 2,500, and 5,000 10-10 contacts.

How to earn WAS

When you have worked at least one 10-10 member in each of the fifty states, and have QSL card confirmation, mail your cards to FRANK ORCUTT (address above), and apply for the Ten-Ten WAS Certificate. Include sufficient postage to return your cards to you,


