



EDITOR'S APOLOGY ..........

The year 1978 has come to an end and 1979 has started. The year has passed all too rapidly, Where the time went seems to be a mystery, the time passed very rapidly. The past year was enjoyable in some ways and trying in others. The Ten Ten Net has continued to increase in Membership. In most reports the renewals has equalled or exceeded the new Members. This is a most welcome sign. The Ten Ten Net needs new Members but also needs to retain the Members that joined the Net in days gone by. The Net needs all the Members both new and those that have belonged for some time. It must be realized that only 35 or 40 percent of the Members on the roll are active and pay dues. Oft times the question is asked, where does the money go from 22,000 Members? It must be realized that only 35% of that number, approximately 9000 pay dues. This presents a different picture as far as income is concerned. There is also the idea that the Ten Ten Net is not needed now that the ten meter band is on the upswing and the World can be worked with low power or QRP rigs. This, however is not the case. A great many of us can remember when ten meters was not the band to use and local contactswere all that ten had available. The same thing will happen again in a few years. None of us should forget that the WARC, Radio conference will be held in 1979 and the allocation of frequencies to the various services, including the Amateurs will take place. Hopefully the Amateurs will not lose to much. We hope that the ten meter band will remain the same as now. The Amateurs are not the only service that will be represented at the Conference. The commercial and industrial companies will be well represented. The Ten Ten Net and other Amateur organizations must work together, both locally and abroad.

One of the high lights of the year was the National Convention that was held in San Diego. The Ten Ten Forum was well attended and of interest to all who attended the meeting. The Speakers on the panel were well versed in their subjects and gave interesting and informative lectures. The, Editor, Chuck Albrecht WAGYNQ was the MC as well as one of the speakers. The Ten Ten Net Club Station W601/6 was on the air from Chuck's room on the 10th floor of the hotel. The Station a TS-520 and a dipole worked stations in the USA and some DX with good signal reports. There were Chapter Heads from several Chapters in attendance at the Forum and all were recognized by the MC. One member was from Mexico City and will start a Chapter in that area. He informed the group that ten meters was not used very much in Mexico and there are few Ten Ten Members but he will start a Chapter and get others to join. Jim picked up the ball and kept the wheels turning and doing a fine job. Frank Orcutt, the Awards Manager was hospitalized and unable to continue the program. The Officers had the records sent to the West Coast and cleared the back log. I want to thank all those that helped mailing out the bars. Wm. (Bill) Risher WB60MH has taken over and is doing an excellent job. Both of these replacements deserve our thanks.

It has been a pleasure to work with the Officers and Members during the past year. Seasons greetings and a happy new year to all members and officers of the 10-X International Net! I'm happy to say that I will be serving as your Net Co-Ordinator for another year, and I hope that we will accomplish many of the things we set out to accomplish last year, as well as get some new things started this year.

Net Co-Ordinator's Net. One of the new things I'd like to get started early in the year is a net where we (Chapter Heads and officers) can get together on the air, and discuss some of the successes and failures of the Chapter operations, and help each other with our various problems. So, starting Sunday, January 7, 1979, and operating every Sunday from then on (if we get the activity) will be the Net Co-Ordinator's Net. The net will meet at 1800 Z., on a frequency of 28.895. I invite all 10-X Chapter Heads (or an appointed representative of the Chapter) to check-in and participate with this operation. I'm not exactly sure how the net will be organized at this point, but I'm sure we'll all getthe feel of the operation once we get it rolling. I will need some alternate net control stations as well as relay stations for this operation, so any Chapter Head who is interested in one of these jobs, please make it known to me, either on one of the sessions of the net or by mail. I'll report on the success of the Net Co-Ordinator's Net in the Spring Bulletin.

Endangered and Extinct. We started the Endangered Species and Extinct Chapter listings in the last edition of the Bulletin, and will continue it below. If your Chapter name appears on the Endangered list, it means that the Net Co-Ordinator has not received a report from your Chapter in over a year, and unless a report is received before the deadline for the next quarterly Bulletin, the Chapter will be placed on the Extinct Chapters list. Those Chapters placed on the Extinct list will be dropped from our records as being no longer a Chapter of the 10-X International Net, Inc. They will also be dropped from the Certificate and Net Guides, will be ineligible to participate as a Chapter in any 10-X function, and will have to reapply for Chapter status as if they were a newly formed organization (which includes meeting the requirements for new Chapter formation) should they wish to be installed as a 10-X Chapter again. I've received many comments regarding the idea of these: lists from the last edition of the Bulleting some pro, some con. However, the best thing I can say in their favor is that about half of the Chapters listed on the Endangered Species list last time have reported in, and we again know how things stand with these Chapters. (All of them report a healthy operation incidentally.)

HIAWATHA (WBØPTB): Their certificate fee is only .50¢. C.H. Brian says when you send \$1 it costs extra to refund the money. SKY BLUE WATERS (WØRBB): New C.H. Frank replaces WBØFKR. WAR EAGLE (WØWFB): C.H. Art reports the "deadest" 10 meter band in 30 years for Iowa until DX came crashing through in October.

BIUE MOUNTAIN LAGOON (VK2APD): C.H. Mac says that disappointment reigns supreme because the VK's wait so long to receive their Bulletins, (Ed's note: DX stations should add \$2,50 to their yearly dues for airmail return of the 10-10 Bulletins. After all, \$3 per year does not cover air mailing four Bulletins each year. It is interesting to note that Mac asks that applicants for their award add \$1 for air mail return.) DOGWOOD (VE7CBM): New award, "Surrey Centennial" requires 5 contacts (10) & \$1. Net freq changed to 28.675. EDMONTON AREA (VE6ATT): Basic award now requires 5 contacts (1C or 2FS or 2L). FLAGSTAFF (VK3NOF): New award, "Peacock" (NP) 15pts with 1C & \$2. 10M GRUPPE DL (DK5UG): C.H. August reports 10-10 EURONET on 28,777 Sun 1500Z & Sat 1000Z on 28,510. He says the continuing drop of the dollar has postponed the introducing of their award. JOHNNY CANUCK (VE2BQN): Net changed to Sun 1000L (1500Z) 28.650. VIF award requires 76pts. WELCOME STRANGER (VK3NIQ): Net changed to Sun 0000Z 28.530. C.H. Leo states that he is confused on the meaning of "local" members...well, Leo, with 180 10-10 chapters, each with different ideas, your best bet is direct correspondence with the Chapters in question...Ed. WESSEX (G4BHE): Barry reports excellent conditions in England. Their "King Alfred" award requirements have changed to 20pts (2 C's). WESTPAC (KG6JIP): Dave informs that Japan civilian stations cannot work KA's (& vice-versa) due to JA regulations. He also points out that their chapter has been having problems with lack of net discipline with European stations. YUKON GOLD PANNERS (VY1AU): Vic-VY1AM is Q5Y'g to VE?-Land. C.H. Bill reports that the pretty voice being heard in VY-Land is Janet-VY1BP.

## How to become a Ten-Ten Member

Work ten present members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, date worked, operator's name, and location. Submit this list to your Call Area Vice-President, with \$1 Initiation Fee and \$3 for your first year's dues. Novices need not pay the Initiation Fee, and DX applicants need work but 5 present members. You will receive a Certificate and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the Quarterly Bulletin, and participate in 10-10 activities.

# How to earn Bars and Plaques

As a member, log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters. You may wish to mark your Roster to avoid duplicates, and to develop a filing system to record 10-10 contacts. All contacts must be bona-fide number exchanges on the air. When you have 100 contacts (including your first 10), list 100 only (never more, never less, and no duplicates) as follows:

- 1. Your list must be in serial order of 10-10 numbers.
- 2. You may submit only one list at a time.
- 3. You may not submit log books or copies of log book pages,
- 4. You must give your name, address, call sign, and 10-10 number and state which Bar you are requesting (i.e., 100 Bar, 200 Bar, etc.).
- 5. You must enclose an SASE (large size about 4 1/4" x 9 3/8").
  6. Mail your materials to: Wm. (Bill) Risher Jr. WB60MH Awards Manager

When you have attained your 500 Bar, you will be assigned an Honorary V. P. Number, and will be entitled to participate in additional activities. In addition, plaques are awarded for 1,000, 2,500, and 5,000 10-10 contacts.

#### How to earn WAS

When you have worked at least one 10-10 member in each of the fifty states, and have QSL card confirmation, mail your cards to WB60MH (address above), and apply for the Ten-Ten WAS Certificate. Include sufficient postage to return your cards to you.

### Chapter Activities

Many Ten-Ten Chapters issue Certificates which may be earned by following rules established by those Chapters. See your Guide to Chapter Certificates and Nets. Croups wishing to organize local Chapters should write to Net Coordinator RICH LEVY, WB2MAN, at 30A Arleigh Road, Great Neck, NY 11021.
