










Map for those needing guidance to The Odyssey Restaurant for the Summer Quarterly Meeting (page-29).

Our cover person this quarter is BERT AYERS - W6CL who continues to give his time as printer for 10-10 International. In 1977 Bert donated 35,000 membership cards to the Net (page-5 of the Summer Bulletin for 1977). Thanks, Bert, for your outstanding service to 10-10. (see page-22 for more photos)

It has been said, "A chain is as strong as it's weakest link." I say 10-10 is as strong as it's weakest chapter. In the last 10 months there have been 19 chapters declared "extinct" by the 10-10 Chapter/Net Co-Ordinator. Reason being that they had not bothered to send in any activity report for over a year. It is interesting to note that most of them are of the "one person" concept. That is to say only one person (in the chapter) performs the duties of Chapter Head, Certificate Manager, NCS, etc etc. It is further interesting to note that these "one person" chapters had the required 7 members when they were recognizied by 10-10 Headquarters, but, only one person has the ambition to keep the chapter going.

10-10 members have been complaining to me of non-receipt of chapter certificates from these "one person" chapters. I received a letter recently from a 10-10 member in England indicating he had never received a certificate from a "one person" chapter for which he had applied. Now the problem is that these irate 10-10 members are blaming 10-10 International for these problems instead of the chapter at fault. In view of all this, I would hope that all chapters recognize their reponsibility to maintain proper response in issuing awards to applicants so as to prevent hard feelings toward 10-10 International.

Take the case of the Father & Son Chapter (now extinct) which came to a screeching halt when their Chapter Head was hospitalized. It is hard to comprehend why other local members of this chapter failed to step-in and keep things going. Then to top it off, the chapter folded without advising the Chapter/Net Co-Ordinator. In the meantime 10-10 members continued to apply for the award and then complained on non-receipt. Again, this had a bad reflection on 10-10 International.


I am pleading to groups planning to form 10-10 chapters to ascertain first:

- A: Does the person whom you have selected to be Chapter Head honestly desire to lead the Chapter and will he report regularly to the 10-10 Chapter/Net Co-Ordintor?
- B: Will your Certificate Manager faithfully answer award applicants promptly?
- C: Will all charter members <u>agree</u> to <u>share</u> responsibilities when officials are ill or otherwise incapacitated?
- D: Will the local members agree to support a local chapter net?

If you cannot answer all four of the above questions with a resounding and sincere YES, then your group has NO business applying for 10-10 chapter status!

And thats the way it is this Summer of Seven-Nine on Ten-Ten. See you on Ten and in the Fall Bulletin. 73, Chuck

# Words from the President

Time passes quickly and I expect that by the time you read this issue of the bulletin another QSO Party will have taken place. Hopefully, band conditions were favorable and goals of high point scores were achieved. Certainly, contests are a medium whereby propagation characteristics can be appraised and band activity Unfortunately, except during contests, when band conditions are 'less than favorable', we tend to sit back and listen and when nothing is heard we say to ourselves.... 'the band is dead again'. In reality, there may be band openings and a number of us are only listening and few are calling CQ to get QSO's started. A conclusion that can be reached is that if in doubt, turn on the xmtr switch and let others know that you are ready to do your part in helping to further the purpose of the 10-X; namely, to "MAINTAIN ACTIVITY ON THE 10 METER BAND". For those outside of the So. Calif area, remember W6IRT's beacon on 28.888 Mhz. This operates QRP around-the-clock and is useful in determining propagation characteristics. Norm (W6IRT) would appreciate your sending him signal info to help with his propagation study. Speaking of QRP, although not summarized (or spotlighted) in the Spring Bulletin as to winners in the Winter QSO Party, I would like to congratulate W6IRT for winning first place honors, WB7RBV 2nd, NØAKJ 3rd, WDØBZH 4th, and N5AYH 5th.

I have received several comments (and some complaints) in excessive delays (sometimes months) experienced by some members in receiving certificates issued by chapters of the 10-X. It is incumbent upon the chapter heads and certificate managers to be aware of these concerns and strive to be responsive to applicants requests.

We have been advised by the ARRL that they no longer will publish announcements of 10-X QSO Parties in the QST magazine. There policy requires that events listed be open to all amateurs and that certificates awarded be available to members and non-members alike. As you know, only 10-X members are eligible for contest awards;

therefore, we do not meet ARRL requirements. I submitted a ltr to the FCC, on behalf of the 10-X, regarding Petition RM-3317. This petition, sponsored by the Washington State CB Radio Association, seeks authorization of a 'hobbyist class' license with operating privileges in the 27.41 to 28.00 MHz portion of the radio spectrum. My response objected to this application on the grounds that: 1)"....past experience suggests that some of these 'hobbyists' will illegally migrate into the amateur radio frequency spectrum of 28.00 to 29.70 MHz, much the same as they are doing now into the proposed 'hobbyist' frequencies. Our members are firm in their dedication to the maintenance of authorized amateur radio activity on the ten meter band and not the provision of a convenience for illegal operation by those who continually ignor rules and regulations and, I suspect, have little concern (or fear) of any legal repercussion. 2) If the Commission feels justified in providing additional frequencies for Citizens Band or hobbyist purposes, we recommend they be assigned in the higher frequency (i.e., 900 MHz) region. This would isolate their operation from close proximity to amateur radio frequencies and prevent simple modifications or adjustments

to equipment from placing operation within the ten meter amateur radio band. Also, with assignment to higher frequencies there will be less opportunity of causing interference as a result of favorable propagation phenomena.

Finally, it is our belief that sufficient opportunity currently exists for the serious technician to become involved with more extensive communication systems with present F.C.C. classes of amateur radio licenses and see no need or useful purpose for the proposed 'hobbyist'

license,"

Congratulations to Clint Paine, K4EKX, our 4th District V.P., and his staff for bringing aboard 143 new 10-X members during the month of April. Also, thanks to W6QIR and his committee for their fine work in completing work on proposed changes to the 10-X By-Laws--a copy of which is printed in this bulletin.

We are saddened once again by the unfortunate departure of one of our members and a past officer of the 10-X. Rollie Hall, WØLST, served with distinction and dedication as V.P. for the tenth call area until he requested replacement because of health considerations.

Rollies passing will be missed by all.

Finally, you will find in this bulletin a copy of the minutes for the January 10-X business meeting held at Marina Del Rey, CA. It was felt that all of the 10-X membership should share in information discussed and decisions reached at such meetings. After all, as a member, this was your meeting as well as those who were able to attend and, hopefully, your are in agreement with accomplishments. We will continue to provide such information to you in subsequent bulletins.

#### ROSTER REVIEW

On the evening of May 21 we received the new 1979 Rosters, and by noon of the following day the 128 back-orders we had been holding for about three weeks were in the mail. As announced in the last Bulletin, we had expected to have them printed by May 1, but the usual glitches prevailed to cause a three week delay.

One revolting, but not entirely unexpected, development was that the increased size of Roster II has resulted in the packages of both Rosters combined falling into a higher (and consequently more costly) postage classification. Nevertheless, either Roster I (10-X Numbers 1 - 15,000), or Roster II (Numbers 15,001 and up) is still available for \$1.50, and both, when ordered at the same time, for \$2.50, postage paid. See the order form elsewhere in this issue.

Third class mail, which is currently used, seems reasonably expeditious in the U. S. and Canada. Not so overseas, however. Surface transportation is miserably slow, and this led us to experiment with the printed matter air rate. We sent ZL3RK, in Christ-church, New Zealand, a set of Rosters by the printed matter air rate, plus a regular air mail letter. They arrived in the same delivery, five days later!

This leads us to make an offer to overseas members. Any who order both Rosters at the same time, and who wish to take advantage of air delivery, may do so by remitting an extra amount. The rules are as follows:

The air rate for printed matter is not available in the U. S. or Canada. It is 50¢ extra to addresses in Mexico, Central America, the Caribbean, and to Colombia and Venezuela. To addresses elsewhere in South America, it is \$1.10 extra, as it is to Europe west of the U. S. S. R., to Turkey, and to those African nations which border the Mediterranean. To all other parts of the world, it is \$1.75 extra.

The Rosters are printed from a computer listing. When we receive it, we must add an introduction, page numbers, and last-minute changes and updates supplied by Records Manager Lee Pasewalk, WB6MGM. With nearly 25,000 entries, it simply is not feasible to conduct an item by item check for accuracy; even if it were feasible, we have no known error-free original list against which to check. That's why we ask Roster users to report errors. Even so, how did I miss an entry that reads "ST)PHE?" Below are listed the known errata. Most were not received until after the Rosters had gone to press, which is some salve to our feelings.

In the fall of 1978, it became evident that some revision of the 10-10 By-laws was needed. President George Elliott, W6ENC, appointed a committee consisting of Hans Tromholt, WB6YYI, Norm Lefcourt, W6IRT, and the writer, Howard Bowman, W6QIR, as chairman. The committee was augmented by the addition of past President Morrie Goldman, W6EHM, President-elect Bob Hartley, W6WPY, and President Elliott himself. During the ensuing months, the committee met several times to analyze the existing By-laws, compare them with the Articles of Incorporation, consider new or revised By-laws, and, finally, to prepare the proposed By-laws which accompany this statement.

Among the many matters considered by the committee were the following:

- \* Nowhere did the By-laws mention amateur radio or amateur radio operators. (II)
- \* "10-10 Numbers" have been issued for years, but there was no mention of them. (III)
- \* Although "Chapter Heads" were mentioned, there was no provision for the affiliation of chapters, nor was there mention of the relationship of chapters to the parent organization. (VIII)
- \* Some offices mentioned no longer have any practical significance. (IX)
- \* There was no mention of a Board of Directors, or of how many directors there were to be. (X)
- \* No calendar date was set for the commencement of terms of office for elected officers. (XII)
- \* The duties of elected officers were not specified. (XIII)

The foregoing partial list of items which merited consideration indicates that the committee had a large amount of work to do. In some cases, a minor re-wording or rearrangement of an existing section was sufficient; in other instances the revision was extensive, and Articles VIII, X, XII, XIII, XV, and XVI are essentially new. The Roman numerals in the list above indicate relevant Articles.

Article VIII is an example of the reflection of existing practice. There is, at present, no mention of chapters, even though chapters have been granted affiliation. Article VIII attempts to set forth the minimum requirements for a chapter, and to establish the relationship between a chapter and the parent organization. The Chapter Coordinator, with the approval of the Board of Directors, may establish additional requirements.

Notice that Article XII calls for elected officers to serve two-year terms, rather than one-year, as at present. The present rule requires officers to devote most of their energies to coping with immediate problems, with little time left over to plan ahead. Hopefully, the two-year terms will permit some of that planning to be done.

The committee does not claim to have solved all of 10-10's problems. The more the committee studied them, the more it became apparent that whatever problems 10-10 may have now can only be compounded in the future unless steps are taken to ward them off. The revised By-laws are believed to incorporate progress in that direction.

# PROPOSED BY-LAWS, 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NET, INC. 3 May, 1979

#### ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of this organization shall be: 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NET, INC. Acceptable variations for "10-10" are "Ten-Ten" and "10-X." In these By-laws, the abbreviation "10-10" will be used.

#### ARTICLE II: PURPOSES

The purposes of 10-10 are to promote amateur radio activity on the 10 meter band, to handle traffic, and to assist present and prospective radio amateurs in improving their technical skills and operating procedures.

#### ARTICLE III: QUALIFICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP

A licensed amateur radio operator wishing to become a member of 10-10 must qualify as follows:

- A. Submit a qualifying list of contacts with members of 10-10 on the 10 meter band. This qualifying list must number 10 contacts for all station operators, other than novices, located in the contiguous 48 states of the United States, and for all others, including United States novices, 5 contacts.
- B. Each entry on the applicant's list shall include the operator's 10-10 number, call sign, name, station location, and the date of contact. This list, with applicable registration fee, and dues for a period of at least one year, shall be submitted to the appropriate officer of 10-10, who will issue a membership card and certificate, and assign to the applicant a unique 10-10 number.

#### ARTICLE IV: MEMBERSHIP DUES AND FEES

- A. The registration or reinstatement fee is \$1.00. It applies to all new applicants (except novices), and to those members who have become delinquent in their dues (more than three months in arrears), and who wish to be reinstated.
- B. Membership dues are \$3.00 annually, payable in advance.
- C. The treasurer's annual budget forecast shall include any recommendations for changes in dues and fees which have had the prior approval of the Board of Directors.

#### ARTICIE V: BULLETINS

Periodic bulletins will be mailed to all members not considered delinquent with respect to payment of dues. A member shall be considered delinquent if his dues are in arrears more than three months. The expiration date of membership shall be shown on the mailing label of each bulletin addressed to him.

#### ARTICLE VI: MEMBERSHIP ROSTER

A Membership Roster will be published from time to time, and will be made available for a fee to be announced in the most recent bulletin.

#### ARTICLE VII: CANCELLATION OF MEMBERSHIP

An individual's membership in 10-10 shall be canceled if he loses his privileges as an amateur radio licensee.

#### ARTICLE VIII: CHAPTER ORGANIZATION AND OPERATION

10-10 International Net, Inc. may authorize chapters to be formed as affiliates of the parent organization, but with no financial relationship. Such chapters should enhance the purposes of 10-10 by providing scheduled nets.

An officer of 10-10 shall coordinate chapter net frequencies and operating schedules, and shall maintain a record of active chapters, showing net frequencies and times of operation. Requirements for chapter affiliates are as follows:

- A. Each chapter must consist of at least 7 members (DX: 5) of 10-10 in good standing, with expressed willingness to conduct a scheduled net at least once each week, and to support the objectives of the parent organization.
- B. Each chapter shall select a Chapter Head, who shall report on chapter activity to the Chapter Coordinator at least once each calendar year. Failure to report for a period of one year shall be cause for deleting the chapter from the list of active chapters.
- C. Chapters may issue certificates to members. However, any fees charged for such certificates shall not exceed the amount required to recover administrative costs.

#### ARTICLE IX: ADMINISTRATION

- A. The elected officers of 10-10 International Net, Inc. shall be:
  - 1. President
  - 2. Vice-president
  - 3. Treasurer (and Corporate Secretary)
  - L. Recording Secretary
- B. The appointed officers of 10-10 International Net, Inc. shall be:
  - 1. Regional managers for call sign areas in the contiguous 48 states of the United States, and for geographic areas outside the continental United States.
  - 2. Awards Manager
  - 3. Bulletin Editor
  - 4. Chapter Coordinator
  - 5. Contest Manager
  - 6. Records Manager
  - 7. Roster Manager
  - 8. 10-10 International Net Manager
  - 9. Other managers as required

#### ARTICLE X: BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- A. The Board of Directors shall consist of seven members. Four of these members shall be the elected officers of 10-10. The remaining three members shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the membership.
- B. The term of office of an appointed Director shall be three years. However, the initial appointments shall be made as follows: one Director for a one year term of office, one Director for a two year term of office, and one Director for a three year term of office.

#### ARTICLE XI: BUSINESS MEETINGS

- A. The ongoing business of 10-10 shall be conducted by the Board of Directors.
- B. There shall be at least one membership business meeting per year, to be held during the last quarter of the calendar year.
- C. The President may call a special meeting at any time, or if such a meeting is requested in writing by at least ten members.
- D. The quorum required for a special meeting is ten members, of whom at least two must be elected officers.

#### ARTICLE XII: ELECTION AND APPOINTMENT OF OFFICERS

- A. The terms of office of elected officers shall be two years, and shall commence on the first day of the calendar year next following their election.
- B. The terms of office of appointed officers shall coincide with that of the President.
- C. Within sixty days of his assumption of office, the President shall appoint a Nominating Committee Chairman, whose function shall be to search out and propose for election or appointment candidates for any office for which a vacancy may occur.
- D. So far as possible, the designation of a nominee for a position in any geographic area shall come about as the result of a selection process conducted within that area.
- E. The election of officers and confirmation of the appointment of directors shall occur at a membership business meeting.

#### ARTICLE XIII: DUTIES OF ELECTED OFFICERS

- A. The duties of the President shall be:
  - 1. To act as the chief executive officer of 10-10.
  - 2. To preside over the annual meeting, and over all meetings of the Board of Directors.
  - 3. To perform other duties as specified in the By-laws.
- B. The duties of the Vice-president shall be:
  - 1. To assume the duties of the President in the event of the inability of the President to serve.
  - 2. To perform such other duties as may be assigned by the President.
- C. The duties of the Treasurer (and Corporate Secretary) shall be:
  - 1. To receive and disburse all funds.
  - 2. To act as Corporate Secretary; to prepare and submit such reports as may be legally required by the state or federal government.
  - 3. To prepare, each fiscal year, a proposed budget for submission to the Board of Directors.
  - 4. To make periodic reports to the general membership on the financial status of the organization.
  - 5. To make all financial records available for audit at the conclusion of each fiscal year.
- D. The duties of the Recording Secretary shall be:
  - 1. To maintain a continuous record of all actions taken by the Board of Directors or by the general membership at a regular or special meeting.
  - 2. To prepare for publication in the Bulletin reports of actions taken by the Board of Directors or by the general membership.

#### ARTICLE XIV: AMENDMENTS TO THESE BY-IAWS

A. Amendments to these By-laws may be suggested to the Board of Directors by any member of 10-10.

B. Adoption of amendments to these By-laws shall be submitted to a membership meeting by the Board of Directors, with an affirmative vote of at least four directors being necessary for such submission.

#### ARTICLE XV: FINANCES

A. Expenses other than those forecast in the budget may not be incurred, except on a majority vote of the Board of Directors.

B. The financial records of 10-10 shall be audited annually by an individual or by a committee appointed by the President with the concurrence of the Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE XVI: 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NET

A. As a corollary to the purposes set forth in Article II, 10-10 shall conduct a daily (except Sunday) net at 1800 hours, UTC, at a frequency of 28.800 mHz. This shall be known as the 10-10 International Net.

B. Management of the operations of the daily net is the function of the 10-10 International Net Manager.

#### ARTICLE XVII: COMMITTEES

A. The President is authorized to appoint such ad hoc committees as may, from time to time, appear to be desirable.

B. The President shall be a member, ex officio, of any committee.

#### ARTICLE XVIII: PARLIAMENTARY RULES

Procedures not covered by these By-laws shall be governed by Roberts' Rules of Order.

#### ARTICLE XIX: DATE OF EFFECT

This revision of the By-laws of 10-10 International Net, Inc. was adopted at a regular membership meeting held on \_\_\_\_\_\_, and shall become effective on January 1, 1980.

W6WPY-Bob gave a verbal commendation for all the ongoing officers who are the backbone of the success of the 10-X International Net. Inc. I won't list them all here because I don't think Bob forgot one in his credits!!!!

WB6YYI-Hans suggested we consider if the responsibilities of the 10-X be shared worldwide. These issues will be discussed by the By-laws committee, and finalized by the Board of Directors. The Committee consists of W6QIR-Howard, WB6YYI-Hans, W6IRT-Norm, W6EHM-Morrie, W6WPY-Bob and W6ENC-George. Howard W6QIR requests all suggestions go to them for "reconscrugelation".

We were reminded that a letter of inquiry to the Secretary of State states that the officers may reside anywhere, however the place of business must be here in california-which certainly limits the possibilities.

W6Enc-George and W6EHM-Morrie were nominated and approved as mem-

bers of the Board of Directors.

Our new President reminded us of upcoming activities and looks forward to personal contact so he can help anyone with 10-X problems.

As a LIARS Chapter project, we are continually updating a list of stations who have converted various CB rigs to ten meters. The list is a means of getting people in contact with each other concerning the conversion of these rigs. More input is needed to make this a success. If you have converted a CB rig or if you know of anyone who has done so, I would appreciate it if you would drop me a line and let me know the model of the rig converted. Perhaps each chapter could take a poll of its members. If you have written up anything on the conversion of your rig I would appreciate having a copy. A copy of our list is available for an S.A.S.E. to WA2SUE.

It is announced by the Net/Chapter Co-Ordinator that the 10-10 Certificate/Net Guide will be discontinued. The Quarterly Bulletin (as in the past) will feature information on a new chapter's basic award when the chapter is first formed. The Bulletin will also publicize any changes to chapter awards. However, for chapters with extensive award programs and complicated scoring systems, it is suggested that interested members send a SASE to Certificate Managers concerned for latest information.

Susan-WA2SID will continue to maintain an updated listing of Chapter Nets and this will be published twice a year in the 10-10 Quarterly Bulletin.

This major change by 10-10 International was caused by the ever increasing number of 10-10 Chapter certificates, indorsements,  $VIP^*s$ , seals, etc etc and complicated scoring systems that follow  $\underline{no}$  standard system.


Issuing certificates has <u>never</u> been criteria for a chapter to be formed. 10-10 International's basic requirements to form a chapter are:

- 1. At least seven local 10-10 members.
- 2. A weekly net.

During it's hey-day, the "Yodar Kritch" award reached the 2,500 mark. Currently the "Colorado Centennial" award is approaching the 2,200 mark. The average certificates are under the 1,000 mark. So when you consider we are over 25,000 strong it would indicate a very small percentage who are real avid paper chasers.

Some chapters have caused many to become discouraged with non-receipt of awards after they applied. One chapter (now extinct) had their Certificate Manager abscond with collected cash causing the chapter's demise in 1977.

Before we become buried beneath tons of paper, let us not forget the original intent and mission of 10-10 International when it was formed seventeen years ago; To use and enjoy the ten meter band with QSO's and net operation.

## Net Co-Ordinator

RICH LEVY - WB2MAN (10-X// 4368)

What is a 10-X Chapter? Does this question seem a little obvious? Well, maybe so, but I think it's a good idea to review just what goes into making a successful 10-X Chapter, and I'll tell you why I think we should review this. I took over the job of Net Coordinator in Jaunary of 1978. Since that time we've added about 100 new Chapters to the 10-X Organization. Now here it is, not even two years later, and I have to put the name of one of the Chapters I first approved when I took over on the Extinct Chapter list. This is a real dissapointment to me because I thought this Chapter had everything going for it. It had good leadership; a number of activities for its local members including a newsletter, contest and certificate program. But then activity fell off locally, particularly when band conditions faded so the Chapter Head was forced to tell me to delete the Chapter from 10-X records.

This points out what the new Chapters have to be careful about. While it seems easy for a group forming during good band conditions to get the necessary activity together to form a 10-X Chapter, and it seems like you'll be really popular with your brand new certificate, it's not so easy to keep up this activity once the band folds or once you've issued a couple of hundred certificates. Ind it's at this time of poor band conditions that a 10-X Chapter is most needed.

Too much importance is placed on the Chapter Certificates. It's very clear to me that many of the groups wishing to form 10-X Chapters want to do so merely so that they can issue a Certificate of some sort. Well even though these groups do meet the necessary requirements to form a Chapter and receive permission from me to go ahead with their operations, it won't be too long after the hard core of certificate chasers have applied for their certificates from this kind of Chapter, and the popularity of this group falls off that their name will show up on the Extinct list.

So, remember what a 10-X Chapter is all about. The job of a 10-X Chapter is to increase the activity on the ten meter band locally; whether the band is open or closed. While there is certainly nothing worns with having a certificate program, and to some extent it does increase activity on ten meters, it's not very important to the 10-X International Net that you've issued 1000 or so certificates. We will know that you've done your job well when you report to us that 10 more members have joined your local net, or that you're averaging about 15 to 20 check-ins per net meeting. It's easy to populate an open ten meter band. What 10-X is all about is populating (and populating fully) 10 meters during all parts of the sun spot cycle.

Endangered and Extinct. It's unfortunate, but most of the Chapters on both lists are fairly recent additions (within two years) of the 10-X Chapter organization.

Coordination Net. Because of poor band conditions we have been unable to hold many meetings of the coordination net during the last quarter. Towards the beginning og the quarter, a couple of QRM free sessions were held on our new frequency (29.025) but then the band folded. Look for us again in the fall.

Announcing the 10-X Closed CD contest. He e's a chance for you to meet the officers of the 10-X International Net, and for them to meet you. The contest is open to 10-X members only. Here's how it will work: On Saturday September 8, 1979 from 0001 to 2359 Zulu try and contact as many members and officers of the 10-X International Net as possible. All contacts should take place between 28.8 and 29.0 MHz.

Scoring: Member=1 point; Certificate Manager or other Chapter official=2 points; Chapter Head=3 points; District Managers (VP's), members of contest committees, Cert & Net Guide Editor, and all other International Net officers (President, Treasurer, Secy's, Coordinator, etc.)=4 points. Maximum number of points for any one QSO is 4 points. If you hold more than one position in the net you may add your point worth together as long as you do not exceed four points.

Log: Date, time, name, QTH, 10-X number and position (i.e. Certificate Manager, Bull. Editor, etc.) if any. Mail logs by October 8, 1979 to Net Coordinator, 8 V lleywood Dr., Huntington Station, NY 11746.

Awards: Certificate to highest scoring official and non-official in each US and Canadian call district, and each DX country.

This contest is meant to be short and fun so give it a shot. Have fun meeting the various officers of the 10-X International Net. Remember, only 10-X members will count during the contest.



### How to become a Ten-Ten Member

Work ten present members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, date worked, operator's name, and location. Submit this list to your Call Area Vice-President, with \$1 Initiation Fee and \$3 for your first year's dues. Novices need not pay the Initiation Fee, and DX applicants need work but 5 present members. You will receive a Certificate and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the Quarterly Bulletin, and participate in 10-10 activities.

### How to earn Bars and Plaques

As a member, log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters. You may wish to mark your Roster to avoid duplicates, and to develop a filing system to record 10-10 contacts. All contacts must be bona-fide number exchanges on the air. When you have 100 contacts (including your first 10), list 100 only (never more, never less, and no duplicates) as follows:

- 1. Your list must be in serial order of 10-10 numbers.
- 2. You may submit only one list at a time.
- 3. You may not submit log books or copies of log book pages.
- 4. You must give your name, address, call sign, and 10-10 number and state which Bar you are requesting (i.e., 100 Bar, 200 Bar, etc.).
- 5. You must enclose an SASE (large size about 4 1/4" x 9 3/8").
- 6. Mail your materials to: Wm. (Bill) Risher Jr. WB60MH

When you have attained your 500 Bar, you will be assigned an Honorary V. F. Number, and will be entitled to participate in additional activities. In addition, plaques are awarded for 1,000, 2,500, and 5,000 10-10 contacts.

#### How to earn WAS

When you have worked at least one 10-10 member in each of the fifty states, and have QSL card confirmation, mail your cards to WB60MH (address above), and apply for the Ten-Ten WAS Certificate. Include sufficient postage to return your cards to you.

### **Chapter Activities**

Many Ten-Ten Chapters issue Certificates which may be earned by following rules established by those Chapters. See your Guide to Chapter Certificates and Nets. Croups wishing to organize local Chapters should write to Net Coordinator RICH LEVY, WB2MAN, at 30A Arleigh Road, Great Neck, NY 11021.

When an appropriate opening came about, I broke and was acknowledged and shortly thereafter picked up by Chuck when he signed with WB2MAN.


I wanted to talk 10-10 with the fellow on the other end, since he seemed well informed. I had no idea who he was until we got into our conversation.
