A listing of Chapter Nets is being revised and will be published twice each year starting with the Winter Bulletin. This project is also being handled by Micky, WB5TKR.







We are saddened once again with the addition of another 10-X member and long time amateur radio enthusiast to the list of silent keys. Claude Martin, W6LRY, was one of the founders of the 10-X Net back in 1962 when it was known as "10/10 Net, Los Angeles Area". His continued dedication and belief in the purpose of the net and his many contributions made while serving 16 years as General Manager will be long remembered. His counsel and wisdom will be missed.....

I'm pleased to report that Karl Kopetzky, K9AQJ, has accepted the position as attorney for our organization in F.C.C. matters. In this capacity. Kark recently queried the F.C.C. in regards to over-the-air discussions regarding fee's for joining a prospective club or organization and whether doing so was in violation of F.C.C. Rules and Regulations. The information received from them stated "....a prospective club member may request and receive information, via amateur radio, concerning the requisites of obtaining membership in the club. On the other hand, the club may not use the amateur frequencies to actively solicit members to join the organization." Karl adds, "....it is clear that information on how to join the Ten-Ten organization may be passed via ham bands including information as to dues, etc. It would be illegal for the club to request members to join." Karl continues, "It is therefor my opinion that as long as no officer or authorized person of the Ten-Ten International Net actively solicits hams to join the group, that you may discuss the objects of the club, what it takes to join, etc., and be quite within the F.C.C. Rules and Regulations.

For those interested in contacting the famous passenger liner 'Queen Mary', which is on permanent display in Long Beach, California, listen for ARS W6RO. This is the club call for the Associated Radio Amateurs of Long Beach, Inc. and which is authorized to operate from the radio shack of the ship. An added incentive for contacting the 'Queen' is to obtain the 10-X number 25000 recently issued to W6RO.

I would like to share with you a letter recently received from Ed Tilton, WIHDQ. Explanation is not necessary as I believe it speaks for itself...

Jo, K6AYU, Recording Secretary Ten-Ten International Net, Inc.

Dear Jo:

A professional looking package was waiting for me at the Canton Postoffice today. The firm name on the return address was unfamiliar to me. It was sealed with plastic tape that wouldn't yield to any tools I had in the car so I had to wait until I got back home to satisfy my (and my wifes') considerable curiosity.

Needless to say, sight of the beautiful plaque was a most pleasant surprise. Over the years I've received about a dozen "hard" awards. They are a source of great pride and personal satisfaction. This one is especially so because it is from an organization somewhat outside the field to which I have devoted much of my life. The promotion of "The World Above 50 Negacycles."

When I retired (the <u>first</u> time) in 1972, I decided that I would devote more time to the 10-meter band. I had been interested in Ten since my first QSO on that band, in 1934, but did not always have the time to devote to it that I would have liked. But I made use of it often in keeping in touch with VHF people the world over. This was a tremendous help, and it was largely responsible for the wide international coverage I was able to provide, for many years,

as WHF Editor of QST.

Since November, 1972, when I got a quad 10-meter beam up, I have devoted a large part of my observing and operating time to the 10-meter band. Of course it was immediately obvious to me that the interest generated by the Ten-Ten Net had worked a great change for the better in the 10-meter scene. Hardly a day has passed since that I have not seen evidence of the worth of the Ten-Ten idea.

No matter how hard one works at it, a student of HF propagation cannot get much of an idea of how the 10-meter band is doing if there is no activity. It was always thus in my earlier chosen field, and I wrote countless lines exhorting VHF operators to operate, not just to listen. Ten-Ten provided an almost constant reservoir of daily activity all through the low-sunspot years. If if did nothing else, that day-in day-out activity on 10 was (and still is) a major contribution to the good of all of amateur radio.

I'm proud to be a member, and especially so to be honored with a Life Membership, and the fine plaque. Many thanks, and 73.

I just finished submitting my second report of the Beacon operation to the FCC, including a request for an extension of waiver. During the period of May '78 to Jul '79 I received 6,365 reports (5,331 USA). 89% of the total reports indicated the best reception was with daylight at both the repeater site and at the receiving location. I am planning to create a standard form to be used for reporting. I would like to emphasize the need for stations to report on a continuing basis. So keep those letters coming in.

This was not originally a ten-ten International Net award, but as of October 15, 1979, the net will sponsor this certificate, to be awarded to any "VP" who contacts the required number of VPs.

Founded May 5, 1971 by Frank Orcutt, W4JO, #386, with Grace Dunlap as President and W6LRY as Vice President. 31 VP-100 certificates and 2 VP-200 certificates had been issued at the time of Frank's death. None have been issued since then.

The purpose of the INTERNATIONAL 500 OF-THE-World was to use more of the ten-meter band. This is still the purpose, and the reason why contacts must be made in sections of the band other than those most frequently used.

Any member of the ten-ten net who has earned the 500-bar is automatically a member of the INTERNATIONAL 500 OF-THE-WORLD, with a VP number issued by WB60MH. Net Awards Manager.

To qualify for the VP-Certificate, the following rules must be adhered to:

- 1. A Net member must have a VP number to participate.
- 2. Make contact with 100 other 500-club members and list them according to VP number.
- 3. All contacts to be made between 28,500 and 28,550 Mhz, or above 29 Mhz, with the contact lasting at least 5 minutes.
- 4. Information required: date, frequency, 10-x number, VP number, call, first name, qth.
- 5. Return postage required stamps (15¢) as special size envelope used.
- 6. Send application with above information to: Grace Dunlap, Box 445, La Feria, Texas 78559 (during summer months to: Box 13, Rand, Colorado 80473).

No application accepted with postmark prior to October 15, 1979.

RICH LEVY - WB2MAN (10-X# 4368)

Comments from the Chapter Heads. I've received a number of very interesting letters this quarter indicating that some of our Chapter Heads are really taking an interest in our organization by suggesting ways to make it better. Some 10-X'ers thought it was a bad idea to discontinue the Certificate and Net Guides -- some thought it was a good idea. The mail went 50/50 for and against. However, there a number of 10-X'ers who do utilize these guides and to fulfill their needs, one of our 10-X members has volunteered to put out both guides himself. He is Mickey Principe/WB5TKR, former Chapter Head of the Republic of Texas Chapter. An announcement as to what Mickey requires from members in order to receive a copy of the guides should appear somewhere else in this issue of the Bulletin. In order to clear up some of the misunderstanding as to why we discontinued the guide in the first place let me explain it a little further. The 10-X International Organization has no possible way to control how a Chapter goes about issueing its certificates and hence has never layed down any rules to govern this part of the Chapter's organization. Up until this point, the Certificate and Net Guides have been an International sponsered project which indicated to the membership that 10-X International should be responsible for the individual. Chapters action when non-delivery or late delivery of a certificate occured. Obviously there was no way we could help those who had applied for certificates and not received them. Now however, these guides will be put out by an individual and not connected with the International organization so the only people to complain to now are the Chapter Heads and Certificate Managers of the individual Chapter involved. All certificate chasers, I know, will appreciate the work Mickey is now doing, but by the same token they should still not hold Mickey or the 10-X International Net responsible for the actions of individual Chapters in regards to their certificates.

Jerry Miller/WD9ACE wrote to suggest that it might help new Chapter5(as well as some older ones), if 10-X would supply a list of suggestions as to how to make a certificate program successful and how to maintain activity within a Chapter. He further suggested that I solicate suggestions from the Chapter Heads and Certificate Managers themselves to work up this guide. So, that is what I will do. Any Chapter Head or Certificate Manager who believes that they have a successful program within their Chapter is invited to help the rest of the Chapters to obtain thatsame success by writing to me and explaining just how you do it. If enough information is submitted I will put it together in the form of a guide. Jerry also understood why it was not a good idea to have Chapters rely solely on Certificates to maintain interest, but he wondered what else is there for the Chapters to do. Well the Chapters have been around a lot longer than this Certificate craze has, and by the same token, the Chapters were ingenious enough to come up with the idea for Chapter Certificate programs so they should be able to come up with other good ideas as well. I told Jerry that any Chapter which was looking for other things that they might do in addition to putting out a certificate write to me and I would suggest three options they might consider as group projects. In order to fulfill my promise to him I will need the help from the rest of you to suggest things which the Chapters might do-to maintain interest in their local organizations. It is also made up of Chapters which have indicated that they have suspended net activities or suspended some other requirement of a 10-X Chapter. Chapters listed on the Endangered list have until the deadline for the next 10-X B'ulletin to correct their present situation. The Extinct list is made up of 10-X Chapters which have not corrected the Endangered situation or have indicated that they wish to be dropped from 10-X records as a Chapter. Those listed on the Extinct Chapter list are no longer 10-X Chapters and if they wish to become a Chapter again must reapply just as if they were a new group just forming a Chapter.



How to become a Ten-Ten Member

Work ten present members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, date worked, operator's name, and location. Submit this list to your Call Area Vice-President, with \$1 Initiation Fee and \$3 for your first year's dues. Novices need not pay the Initiation Fee, and DX applicants need work but 5 present members. You will receive a Certificate and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the Quarterly Bulletin, and participate in 10-10 activities.

How to earn Bars and Plaques

As a member, log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters. You may wish to mark your Roster to avoid duplicates, and to develop a filing system to record 10-10 contacts. All contacts must be bona-fide number exchanges on the air. When you have 100 contacts (including your first 10), list 100 only (never more, never less, and no duplicates) as follows:

1. Your list must be in serial order of 10-10 numbers.

2. You may submit only one list at a time.

3. You may not submit log books or copies of log book pages.

4. You must give your name, address, call sign, and 10-10 number and state which Bar you are requesting (i.e., 100 Bar, 200 Bar, etc.).

5. You must enclose am SASE (large size - about 4 1/4" x 9 3/8").

Roster II will begin at 15001, and will include all numbers assigned as of the date of going to press. See the Order Form below.


