### THE VOICE OF ST, PAUL

From the mike of KØMG Dick, comes this bit of information. Dick was instrumental in having the following printed in the "GROUND WAVE", a periodical of the "ST. PAUL RADIO CLUB". With their permission, reprint follows:

A group of amateurs out in California have formed a 10-10 net, and this is really putting some action on ten meters. The local 10-10 net here in Minnesota call themselves, "THE SKY BLUE WATER CHAPTER" of the 10-10 net. They meet at 2100 hrs local time (9:00 pm) on 28.715 MHz. Monday thru Friday. On Sunday at 1800 hrs ZULU (12 noon local time) on 28.775 MHz. for SSB and near 2900 MHz for AM stations.

The purpose of the net, in addition to traffic, emergency and proof of capability is to increase the use of the 10 meter band to preserve it for Amateur use.

Those wishing to become members need only to record at least 10 contacts with members. When you become a member you get a 10-10 number. The net boasts at least 2000 members at this time. Instructions as to the application to the club are given by net control. The International 10-10 Net meets daily (except Sunday) at 1800 hrs ZULU Monday thru Saturday at 28.775 MHz for SSB and 28.800 MHz for AM. This section does not meet on Sundays.

# WILLIAM G. FULLER - SSB Net Control

#### THE SSB FREQUENCY

The Single-Sideband sequent of the 10-10 net prior to October 1, 1970 was not regularly activated, due mostly to the lack of local member stations willing and capable of taking it over. In many cases, family life conflicted seriously with a daily schedule of any particular station. In other instances, many of the parent chapter stations lacked SSB capabilities. It proved out that SSB prior to October 1, 1970 must remain purely in the hap-hazard stage.

Now I am somewhat hesitant to continue with this report to the general membership, fearing that the facts will tend to make me seem boastful and egotistical, but the facts remain and can be supported.

My membership card and certificate show that I came into the organization July 24, 1970. My background of 4 years Air Force MARS and finally 2 years Navy MARS, give me a slight edge on proper net procedure and international traffic handling.

I was asked if I would take over the SSB frequency and I accepted, partly, I suppose because I have always had a soft spot in my heart for net participation. This was October 1, 1970. Three months later, I was nominated and elected your president. Ever since the afore-mentioned date, I have tried to keep the SSB frequencyactivated. Also since that date, we have experienced a steady and rapid growth. Consequently, this day to day involvement on my part as net-control has given me the right to speak with some authority concerning the SSB frequency. Also I would like to reserve the right to direct it's policy and regulations: A right aimed at improved progress and efficiency.
