## UPPER LEVEL QRM

Gosh it seems like I just opened my news a couple days ago; matter of fact it was. I have to start this article about a month early so it gets to the Editor first. This makes my article faint memories by the time I read it in print.

As I mentioned in my initial article, one of my goals was to make sure that the membership data was recompiled into an SQL compatible database. Using this format, the data will always remain accessible and allow web-based controls to access the data. This format has become the industry standard and several data manipulation programs are available to access the data. Of course, any data that is of a private nature will be controlled and not accessible as public information.

Our retiring Data Manager, Gerry Gross (WA6POZ \#21274), is working with our new Data Manager, Mike Steele (W4ZYD \#69769). Getting a new Data Manager up to speed on membership processing and renewal is a large task in itself, but to work with him on the data conversion is really a major undertaking. As I type this, they have been working together for several weeks and are making great progress. Considering that Gerry has served in this position since 1993, most of his tasks have become second nature. Because of Gerry's skills, it has been difficult to replace him. Mike is our second candidate.

Since we did not realize the enormity of the data, this first effort was not successful. This position is time-consuming and labor-intensive. Because of the time constraints, response to members' requests cannot be instant. With over 75,000 memberships
issued and monthly activity that can exceed 100 transactions, this is quite a busy position. One of the major issues is creating an on-line application to make renewals easier. Because of PCI (Payment Card Industry) compliance, Ten-Ten can no longer do off-line credit card processing. This means that we now have to use a gateway to process credit cards on the shopping cart; we contracted PayPal to handle this function. Our current Shopping cart will transport you the PayPal site for credit card transactions. One confusing issue is that you do not have to have a PayPal account to use your credit card; just click on the PayPal image. We hope to quickly make this process a bit more user -friendly. The one process that requires human intervention remains the membership application; since the ten contacts have to be submitted. The renewal process is now almost automatic and efforts are underway to notify the member and update the records in a timely manner.

The new Data Manager is also being tasked with a better way for members to update their information that located in the database. It will be impossible to create one application that will do everything; but every effort is being made to provide the very best customer service possible. We do urge you to contact us if you have any issues with our web applications.

Recently we had an issue with someone gathering email addresses from the web site to send an advertisement to all of the officials. As always, one rotten apple spoiled the whole barrel. The Internet Director, N7YG, Jeff Steinkamp \#65084 went through all the pages on the site and replaced the text containing an email address with a graphic. This makes it impossible to actually copy the address. There were other ways to accomplish this, but this was the one that could be easily maintained. We do regret having to do this, but the privacy of our members is a priority.

By the time you get this edition of the News, the Dayton Hamvention will be a few weeks away and the St. Louis Convention will be less than 90 days away. At the current time, there are still many convention items in the works. We are trying to arrange at least one tour for the family members; hopefully we will be able to arrange more. The problem is trying to keep the cost
down on such an event. The current economy makes cost an important item.

Over the past few years it seems that the TenTen Convention has become an event catering to the members that place chapter certificate awards as their priority. It is true that this group tends to support the organization no matter what the band conditions are. On the other hand, there are several dozen members that are on the air and active that could care less about awards and certificates. Perhaps we need to make an effort to create a convention event that provides to all the members. Ten-Ten has very good awards aimed at the general membership. We have 15 awards based on contacts with the general membership and all of these awards are free. Many members will only work towards achieving these awards. Also, we have a great number of active members that will make efforts during the QSO Parties and not participate in any type of awards program. I encourage you to express your thoughts along these lines. Maybe it is time to push that wheel out of that rut.

With this issue, we can no longer attach the News to an email and send it to those members that have elected to receive the News via electronic media. Now that the News has grown in size to over four megabytes, sending it as an attachment creates problems. We currently have 433 members that have chosen the electronic News and many desired it attached; but we are having an increasing number of ISPs that are rejecting the mail or marking it as spam and deleting it. Sometimes when a member does not get the electronic News, they become perturbed with Ten-Ten when it has in fact been sent. We are now using an announcementtype list to send the link information to our electronic subscribers. Because of this large group of members that allow Ten-Ten to send the News electronically, we are able to save funds on postage that has recently risen for $6.5 \%$ for US mailings. One point is that this latest postal increase will mean that the cost of mailing the News will have increased $40 \%$ since the last Ten-Ten membership fee increase in 2003. Every possible effort has been made to keep our membership fees at their current level, but the USPS does not seem to consider the economy when they make their decisions.

As I mentioned earlier, finding replacements for critical positions seems to be a challenge. The VP Award Manager is no exception. Before I came on board WOHIK, Carl Fisher \#40678 had asked to be replaced due to health issues. We have been working with KM5EH, Marcus Lieberman \#71103, the Awards Director to resolve this. There were several candidates available and WA4TC, Ted Cook \#61819, was chosen and has accepted this position. Now the problem is that WOHIK does not have the ability to use email and has to use a third party. It never ceases to amaze me how dependent we have become on the internet services. We have located an amateur local to Carl that is working to assist in this effort. We are doing our very best to complete this transition.

On March 8th, the solar flux index was 153, a record for Cycle 24. The index will be 120 by the weekend. The last time the index was this high was back in mid-July of 2004.

The four new PJ entities: St. Eustatius and Saba (PJ5), St. Maarten (PJ7), Curacao (PJ2) and Bonaire (PJ4) are now accepted as new DXCC entities by the ARRL DXCC and 1010. DXCC credits started being posted on LoTW about March 5th. All of the new countries have been worked with 10-10 members. So the 10-10 country count has increase by four and the count of worked 1010 countries increased to 319 . Twenty-nine Countries remaining to be worked for a new 10-10 entity.
The DXpedition to South Orkney VP8ORK was a great success. Posted online logs are not showing all the Q's but this may be the next New 10-10 Country as only 1161 contacts were made on Ten out of 63643 total!

## 10-10 Software by Jim Hardy, K4HAV - Hardy Data Systems

Win1010 is the flagship of the HDS software for the 10-10 membership. It is a Windows-based package of four individual programs: Contest, County Hunter, Daily Log and Certificate Chaser. The Contest Program supports all the major 10-10 Contests and prepares an ASCII log for emailing the results. The County Hunter keeps records on all the 10-10 Awards and prepares applications. The Daily Log is available for everyday logging. The Certificate Chaser is a program to keep track of all the Chapter information and lists and make applications for upgrades. The Win1010 Suite is sold in three versions: (1) The Contest and Daily Log, (2) The County Hunter, Daily Log and Certificate Chaser (3) The entire package. Pricing and more detailed info can be seen at the http:// hds.net web page. Payment by PayPal is available.

The K4HAV 1010 DOS Contest Program was developed and first used during the 1990 Summer Phone 10-10 Contest. A Windows version has replaced the DOS version. The Win1010 Contest Program was written and first used in the August 1998 Summer Phone Contest. It is now in use by hundreds of 10-10 Contesters. The K4HAV Win1010 Contest Program was not designed to give its users an unfair advantage, but to make operating more fun and to take the pain out of filling out the log and dupesheet.

A recent addition to Win1010 includes automatic downloading and installing updated databases and program files. Win1010 logs onto the Internet and compares the file dates of the databases in use to those on the web page and will download the latest copy for you upon the click of a button.

A nice feature of the Certificate Chaser was the addition of the ML List. One of the time-consuming chores of Paperchasing is manually entering all the updated chapter/seal info received via a printed list. The Win 1010 ML routine will create your own list in ASCII format which can be emailed to your fellow paperchasers. If he is a Win1010 user, then he can import the ML List and in a matter of seconds, all the Chapter and Seal points and upgrades are updated by the computer, thus saving hours of manual work.

A stand-alone program named MLMaker was designed for those who did not use Win1010 but wanted to be able to have a ML List to swap with other paperchasers using Win1010. This does the same thing that the Certificate Chaser does, but adds a few bells and whistles. After it is installed it will work as a demo for 30 days and can be registered for $\$ 10.00$.

The FCC uploads a 100 MB file of raw Amateur Radio data that is converted and condensed every Sunday and posted on the Win1010DL web page. These FCC database files are used by Win1010 to automatically insert Counties, States, Grid Squares and other info into the logs. They also provide data for finding the azimuth and distance to the station contacted. A stand-alone basic FCC Search Program is provided with Win1010. The registered version provides additional searches such as finding all hams with a designated last name, finding all hams in a certain zip code or finding all hams born on your birthday. Note: the FCC no longer has the DOB in the FCC files and the FCC DOB database used is several years old and may not be correct for some vanity calls

The Win1010 program can be downloaded from the http://hds.net/win1010dl.htm web page. Without the registered UserID file, the program will run in the demo mode with a limit of 25 records. A free UserID file will be provided for your club station, XYL or other family member.

# TEN-TEN QSO PARTY RULES 

### 6.2 10-10 QSO PARTIES

10-10 QSO Parties are events that are held for fun and to meet old, new and prospective members around the world. The rules listed here are for all general QSO parties The Anniversary, Meet the Volunteers, and Mobile QSO Parties are specialty events and do have additional rules.

### 6.2.1 WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

QSO Parties are open to all amateurs with operating privileges on the 10 meter band, however, logs will be accepted only from active members as of the date of the event with the following exception: Open Season event logs will be accepted from all amateurs. Other logs received will be handled as ckecklogs. Checklogs are used to validate (check) other logs but do not receive awards.

### 6.2.2 WHEN ARE THE QSO PARTIES?

There are currently ten QSO Parties held throughout the calendar year:
Winter Phone - held on the first full weekend in February 0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.
Mobile - Held on the 3rd Saturday in March
0001 UTC through 2359 UTC.
Spring Digital - held on the last full weekend in April.
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.
Spring CW - held on the first full weekend in May.
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.
Open Season (PSK) - held on the first full weekend in June
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.
Sprit of 76-7 day, 6 mode event centering around 4 July each year
Summer Phone - held on the first full weekend in August. 0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.
Sprint - a 24 hour event held on October 10th (10-10).
0001 UTC through 2359 UTC.
Fall CW - held on the 3rd full weekend in October.
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.
Fall Digital - held on the 2nd full weekend in October.
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

### 6.2.3 FREQUENCY AND MODES

Direct unassisted contacts only are permitted. Repeater, Satellite, IRPL or any other similar types of assisted contacts are NOT allowed. Based on the appropriate band plan for the country of operator, CW QSO Parties should be operated in the CW area of the 10 meter band and operated using CW only. Digital QSO Parties should be operated in the digital area of the 10 meter band and operated using Digital modes only (RTTY, PSK, etc). Phone QSO Parties must be operated in the PHONE area of the 10 meter band and may be operated using any approved method (SSB, FM, AM).
The SPRINT utilizes all operating modes in the 10 meter band.
NOTE: A QUIET ZONE between 28.490 and 28.510 shall be in effect during QSO Parties using the Phone portion of the 10 meter band to allow for others to use the band.
6.2.4 ENTRY CLASSIFICATION

Entrant may submit a log in ANY of the following
classifications:
INDIVIDUAL: Includes single station operators and can also include $O M / X Y L$ teams or any families or groups of people using individual call signs and 10-10 numbers.
QRP: same as an individual as listed above except that output power does not exceed 5 watts with CW/Digital operations and/ or 10 watts with Phone operations during the entire event.
CLUB: A Club must have a valid club station license issued by their National Licensing Authority and must have active 1010 membership. Club entries must list the call, name, and 1010 number (if any) for all operators using the club call. Club operations will take place at one location using one set of equipment.

### 6.2.5 TRANSMITTER INFORMATION

An operator may operate mobile, portable or fixed. If they change their exchange QTH during the QSO Party, the operator must show same in their log. The operator may enter a log from one call district, province, or DX country. Multi-transmitters (two or more transmitters operating simultaneously, sharing one call sign) are NOT permitted in any QSO Party. If a single transmitter becomes inoperable, it is permissible to change to a replacement transmitter.

### 6.2.6 EXCHANGE

10-10 members send call sign, name, 10-10 \# and QTH (State, Province or Country). If received exchange does not have a 1010\#, then record a zero(0) in the log.

### 6.2.7 QSO POINTS

Two (2) points are awarded for contacts WITH a 10-10 number. One (1) point is awarded for contacts WITHOUT a 10-10 number. Duplicate entries should be retained in log and show a zero (0) for points. Any log showing 10\% or more errors may be handled as a checklog. A station may be counted only once regardless of mode.

### 6.2.8 CHAPTER SCORE ASSIGNMENT

Any entrant who is a chapter member and whose operating location is within 150 miles of the primary net location of that charter, may assign the entrant's score to that chapter. QSO Party scores for the Sprint may not be assigned.

### 6.2.9 QSO PARTY ENTRIES

Logs shall be forwarded to the QSO Party Manager as identified in the 10-10 NEWS or on the 10-10 web site. It is strongly suggested that logs be sent as soon as possible after the close of the event. It is also recommended that DX logs should be sent AIR Mail to insure they are received in good time. Any logs received with a postmark date AFTER the deadline date will be handled as a checklog. Any logs received more than 15 days after the entry deadline, regardless of postmark, will be discarded. All logs may be sent via Email. Please no .Q95 or .adif files.

### 6.2.9.1 ENTRY DESCRIPTION

Entries must contain a Cover Sheet, Log and Dupe Sheet as described here:
COVER SHEET will list the Event Entered, Entry Classification, US Call Area (W0-W9
or DX Country), Chapter Score Assignment (if any), number of contacts and points with 10-10\#, number of contacts and points without 10-10\#, and total contacts and points claimed. LOGS must be listed in date/time order and list UTC Date, UTC Time, Call, Name, 10-10\# (zero (0) if none), QTH and Contact Point Value.
ADUPE SHEET is required for any logs exceeding 50 contacts. It may be either a list of all calls contacted in call sign order or hand entered on a dupe sheet grid.

### 6.2.9.3 ENTRY DEADLINES

Entries for all QSO Parties listed EXCEPT the Sprint shall be postmarked no later than 15 calendar days (this will always be a Monday) after the close of the event. Mailed entries for the Sprint (held on $10 / 10$ ) shall be postmarked no later than October 25th, unless that day falls on a Sunday, than the postmark deadline shall be October 26th.

### 6.2.10 QSO PARTY RESULTS AND AWARDS

QSO Party results will be posted on the $10-10$ web site about 15 days after the closing deadline for the event and also printed in the 10-10 NEWS in the appropriate issue.
Awards will be issued by the certificate manager for Top Ten Individual scorers in the World, the top Individual scorer in each US Call Area (W0-W9), each DX Country, and for top QRP, CLUB and CHAPTER. Electronic certificates will be sent to the 2 nd and 3rd place scorers in these categories.
6.2.11 ANNIVERSARY QSO PARTY and MEET THE VOLUNTEERS
These events run from January 10001 UTC to December 31 2359 UTC.
In the Anniversary QSO Party, entrants may submit a log of contacts with members that have 10-10\# anniversary year contained in their membership number.
Example: 2011 is the 49th anniversary year of $10-10$ International Net, Inc. Contact with members containing a "49" in their membership number (i.e.,72048, 69485,64854, 48126, 00487) would count toward the event. Each year the anniversary number changes, making a new group of members the focus of the event and promoting the use of the 10-meter band. All general rules are applicable with the following exceptions:
During the calendar year (January 1 through December 31) make legal 10-10 contacts with 10-10 Number, Date, Call Sign, QTH with members containing the anniversary year in their membership number as described above.
In the MEET THE VOLUNTEERS event, entrants may submit a log of contacts with members listed in the 10-10 NEWS as being a 10-10 volunteer. One contact per volunteer is permitted, regardless of mode of contact.
In both events, contacts must be made on the 10-meter band with any legal mode (AM, SSB, FM, PSK, CW, etc.).
All submitted logs must contain only one entry for each 10-10 number contacted. Contacts MUST be listed in 10-10 number order and each entry must list the 10-10 Number, Date, Call Sign, Name, QTH and Mode, in that order.
These events are for Individual entries as described in section 6.2.4 and certificates will be awarded for the TOP Ten, however all entrants will be listed in the 10-10 NEWS. Logs MUST be postmarked no later than January 15th of the year following both the Anniversary and Meet the Volunteers QSO Parties. Only members in good standing (with dues paid) are allowed to submit logs.

### 6.2.12 MOBILE QSO PARTY

This event is held on the third Saturday in March from 0001 to 2359 UTC. All general rules are applicable with the following exceptions:
This is a mobile QSO Party, therefore only mobile stations will submit logs, however, fixed stations are encouraged to participate to help give out points and collect counties. Mobile applies to car, truck, RV, motorcycle, boat, airplane or other mode of transportation. If in doubt, contact the QSO Party Manager. A station operating a mobile entry must be a true mobile. Sitting in the driveway and using the base station antenna or amplifier, or using commercial power is not permitted. RV generators are permitted only if the generator is used while in transit (moving).
Operation while your vehicle is parked across a county line, occupying two counties, counts as two counties and two contacts. Marine and aeronautical mobiles must be able to establish counties of operation. Safety is paramount while operating mobile. If you are unable to park near multiple county lines due to safety issues (i.e. on a bridge, on a freeway, etc.), please move to the closest area which would provide the best operating conditions and still be able to give out multiple counties.
The on-the-air exchange shall be Call, Name, QTH, 10-10 Number (if available) and County. Scoring will be the same as other 10-10 QSO Parties. 2 points awarded for contacts with a 10-10\# and 1 point awarded for contacts without a 1010\#. Duplicate entries are allowed when working in multiple counties. (i.e. if K4HAV is a on 3 county line and he works K4JPC, That would count as 3 contacts, one for each County).
Logs must be in date/time order and list Date, UTC time, County worked from (If applicable), Call, Name, 10-10\# (zero 0 if none), County Worked, QTH and Contact Point Value. Fixed stations may submit logs as check logs only.
Logs MUST be postmarked no later than 14 days after the end of the event. Only members in good standing (with dues paid) are eligible for awards.
6.2.13 SPIRIT OF 76 (7 Days, 6 Modes) QSO PARTY

This event will run for 7 days and be around July 4th of each year. Make as many contacts as you can during the week using 6 modes. The modes that will be used are as follows as well as the suggested frequencies to monitor:

Scoring will be as normal for QSO Parties, 2 points for members and 1 point for non-members. Dupes will be allowed once for each mode. It will be possible to work the same call 6 times in each of the various modes for a maximum total of 12 points per call. All other normal rules apply. Logs shall be forwarded to the QSO Party Manager.

### 6.2.14 FOR MORE INFORMATION

Current information about 10-10 and upcoming 10-10 QSO Parties is always available on the $10-10$ web site. Cover sheets, logging forms and dupe sheets are also available for downloading or printing. The address is http:/www.ten-ten. org. Any unanswered questions regarding the QSO Party rules may be forwarded to the QSO Party Manager.

2. Your valid amateur operator license MUST authorize or qualify you for unsupervised transmitting operations in the ten meter amateur band under your own personal call sign.
3. You must make contact with ten members of 10-10 on ten meters and submit a log listing all contacts, their 10-10 number, call sign, name, date of contact, and QTH (state/province/country). A new member application and contact log is available in Section 1 below.
4. You must remit dues for one or more years full membership. Fee schedule and payment information can be found in Section 2 below.

## TYPES OF MEMBERSHIPS

## Primary Membership

Primary membership is available with yearly dues, although there is a special incentive available when you pay for three years at once.

## Family Membership

Family membership consists of a primary member and one or more family members who qualify as a 10-10 member (has made the necessary 10 contacts) and who reside at the same location and postal address. Family memberships run concurrently with that of the primary member. Add $\$ 5.00$ for each additional family member for each year. Only the primary member will receive a copy of the 10-10 News.

## Life Membership

Life membership is available and may be paid in one lump sum or spread across two or three yeas. For information refer to the "Life Membership Application" form on the web or contact the 10-10 Data Manager.

## Senior Life Membership

Senior life membership is available to anyone who is currently 65 years of age or older. Payment can be made as one lump sum or within a one year period. For information refer to the "Life Membership Application" form on the web or contact the 10-10 Data Manager.

Family Life Membership is no longer available

## Club Membership

Club Membership is available to any Amateur Radio Organization which holds a valid Amateur Radio License. Application must be made by the club trustee. No Family or Life Memberships are available. Membership is available with or without the 10-10 NEWS.
