From The President

UPPER LEVEL QRM

Dayton 2011 was an experience I had not attended since 1996 due to business commitments, therefore it was all new. From time to time I have been to shows as a vendor and thought I knew what to expect, wrong. This type of event gives a new meaning to public relations. We had 214 sign the log, 63 renewed their membership and 2 new members were added. Several of the renewals used the 3 year renewal option. The volunteers that assisted in the booth were WA6POZ, KA6SPS, WN4AMO and WA0CKO. This did make it a bit crowded at times, but it did allow for me to spend time with visitors. It was a learning experience and it will take me several events to reach the level of Gerry and Linda after 10 years in the booths. The experience I gained from being in the booth with that level of proficiency is something that could not be learned in a school. One thing I did miss is going through the flea market, but that is the price one pays for being famous. As for overall attendance I don't know exactly what the figures were or what impact the price of fuel had if any. There never appeared to be intense crowding so maybe the numbers were down a bit? One thing that I did find out was that some of the major dealers were having disappointing sales. The economy once again becomes an issue. I was able to find some very good pricing for some of the door prizes for the Convention, but there was very little discount for the major purchase.

Since personal contact with the membership is a very good method of encouraging renewals, I have encouraged all of the officials to plan on attending major events in their areas. I will be at Ham-Com in TX, WA6POZ and N0TW are planning to go to the Huntsville, AL event. Hopefully we can expand this in 2012.

Now on the Convention issue. Many of you are aware that I founded the 10-10 Convention and hosted the first one 24 years ago here in Shreveport. Since the

beginning two opinions have been expressed on how the Convention should be held. One was to hold it in conjunction with another major Amateur Radio event; the other was to depend on a local chapter to host the event as a Ten-Ten convention. The second option has been the prevailing method in recent events. This has created an event that has very little attraction for the normal Amateur and has become an event primarily for certificate chasers. The event has done very little in promoting the use of the Ten Meter Band for the average Amateur. This edition of the News may not be in your postal box by the time the Board of Directors meet in St. Louis, but this item will be on the agenda. There will be forum input requested on this and other issues. One thing that may be new to the members, your input will determine the Board of Directors output. This is my policy since this is your organization.

The News, well all of us are aware that the postal rates are increasing almost with the time of the seasons. I suspect this will continue as long as the postal service functions in the current manner. As customers we do not have any control so we have to adjust to continue service to our membership. In February 2003 Ten-Ten increased the membership fees for the US to \$15.00 a year and for DX postal zones \$18.00 a year. This increase under normal circumstances would have been sufficient for at least 10 years. Well things are not normal when it comes to the postal service. As you may know there are 9 postal zones outside of the US and these are the zones which have been affected the most. The rate for mailing the News to US zip codes has only increased 28% since 2003. There was a small increase in the weight, due to postal regulations, and printing cost. Even with these increases the US zip code mailings are still within reason. The other postal zones have created a major problem, the following increases have occurred since 2003. Zone 1 (Canada) has increased 75%, zone 2 (Mexico) increased 130%, zones (3-5 Europe, VK, BV) increased 202%, and zones (6-9 S & C America, Middle East, Asia, Pacific, Africa) increased 157%. These percentages are increases over the US rate. It is not difficult to realize that it cost us more to service zones 3-9 than ten-ten receives in dues from the same zones. This is complicated even further when it is a new member and the New Member Packet is sent. Additionally renewal notifications add to postage cost. This is the primary reason that the Data Manager encourages electronic distribution of the News. The new system notifies the subscribed member when the News is available for download and the procedure to accomplish the download worked without a hitch when used for the first time. Some

minor details concerning the message title did require an adjustment. Please consider this method. Contact either myself or the Data Manager if you would like to subscribe.

Now back to the Data Manager subject. This has become a real experience and a bit painful. As many of you are aware that I spent a great part of the last 21 years in what can be considered an IT career. That leaves a lot of slack time in my 47 years of work. Two active duty tours in the military and the rest of the 33 years in active reserve status still make for a void. My grandfather and my father were skilled machinists and at the age of 15 I began to learn the trade. Over the years I have gained the experience and acquired the tools to perform as a journeyman machinist. To make this thread relevant is quite easy; I could not expect you to produce precision machined products at my level without the training and tools. Basically this is what has happened in the last two attempts to replace WA6POZ as Data Manager. I watched it take place at Dayton and I realize it takes place with every transaction Gerry makes. He has become so proficient that he is not aware of the actual steps needed to complete the process. The steps involved have become second nature after 18 years. On the 29th of April the new Data Manager of only 4 months resigned. This was due to personal problems, work demands, lack of high speed internet access, and issues beyond his control. This once again put the Data back in the capable hands of WA6POZ. Before we attempt the third effort, tools are going to be created to accomplish the duties and documentation is going to be in place so any member with normal data skills can assume the duties of Data Manager.

DX NEWS

The country of **Southern Sudan** is expected to declare its independence from Sudan on July 9, 2011. If Southern Sudan is to become the next new DXCC Country, they need to be recognized by the UN or get a prefix assigned by the ITU. The old ST0/S.Sudan prefix was deleted in August 1998 when ST/Sudan got credit for the area.

Sudan has two call sign blocks that could be broken up for S. Sudan to use: SSN-STZ and 6TA-6UZ. The ITU does not have to reissue the ST0 prefix, they could use 6T0 or some other combination. Remember, the dates that you work them become important as the last ST0 credits ended the year of 1994 for DXCC. UN recognition will probably determine the new DXCC credit date when it happens later this year.

A waiting DX group will immediately put on this new DXCC entity for three weeks. Paul **N6PSE** #68859 is one of the co-leaders and Dave **AH6HY** #33750 who was on PJ5 St. Eustatius and Flo **F5CWU** #71812, will be the 10-10 members among the 18 operators. On June 15th the solar flux was 99, the A index was 8 and K index 2. Expect the best conditions on **July 6-9th, Aug 2-4th and 29-31st and Sept 25-28th.** Over the next three months, for USA stations, expect a 15% chance of DX in the mornings to Europe or Africa and a 40% chance into South America or the Pacific in the late afternoon. To tell what DX paths are open, listen for the beacons from **28.175-28.300 (especially 28.200).**

which I purchased over there.. I retired from the US Army at the end of February 1976, and we then resettled back in Leslie County, KY, where I operated again as WB4FBS.

I went back to school and got my BS in Elementary Education, followed that up with an MA in Reading and a sixth-year program in School Administration. I taught school in Leslie County for 7 years and then we moved to here in San Antonio, TX, where I taught for 10 years and then retired in December of 1995. While county hunting I made almost 50,000 contacts from my mobile. I have worked all the counties of the US 3 times and I decided that for the 4th time, I would count no 20 meter contacts. I need only 17 counties to finish, and I have needed those 17 for years. I hold the first award for working 1500 counties on 5 different bands. I am a charter member of the Mobile Amateur Awards Club, the servicing organization for the county hunters, and I was the Newsletter Editor for three years.

The reason that I still need those counties is because I got into the 10-10 International Net, Inc. I came up to 10 meters in December of 1995 looking for counties and have been on 10 meters ever since. I have been a member of the organization since 1988, but didn't become active in it since the above date. I have always had a love of paper-chasing, and I liked the way that 10-10 was structured with the chapters and all. I now hold all of the organization's awards and am an active member of almost all the chapters. My first volunteer position was that of the WAS Awards Manager. Next was the 1000+ Bar Awards Manager and, lastly, I have been a Director, with the primary duty of the Chapter Coordinator. I am into my third 4-year term as a Director I changed my call to K5FBS in the early 2000's when I discovered it was open. I retained the FBS because everyone remembered Fired Bologna Sandwich. I feel that the hams that I have become acquainted with in the different organizations to which I have belonged are the greatest in the world, and I have enjoyed being a volunteer in some capacity in all of them. I hold one Public Service Commendation from ARRL. There was a freak snowstorm in Southern Illinois on February 25, 1976, and the travelers were snowbound and had to be housed in schools, etc., to wait for the snow to end and the roads to be cleared. I was able to pass health and welfare messages from a snowbound mobile station to relatives in the Chicago area.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my 44+ years in amateur radio and I am sure that I will continue to enjoy it. I have also enjoyed my two careers, military and teaching, and I hope that, along the way, I have made a difference in a few lives.

I first became interested in amateur radio in 1966 when I was stationed in Germany. My immediate supervisor, Joe Rezek, and the maintenance man where I worked, Ross Allen, and a friend from across the street, Tom Knight, were

all hams and the bug bit me when I saw what amateur radio was all about. Tom gave me the volunteer exam and, as I passed both parts of it, I subsequently received the callsign WB4FBS in January, 1967. I then was issued the German callsign, DL4BO. I operated with this callsign during the period 1967-1969. I got real heavy into the Certificate Hunters Club (CHC) and started chasing certificates and DX. I also became a member of the International SSB Network. My first station was a Heathkit HT-100 and a 5-band dipole antenna in the attic. After we were given larger quarters in another housing area, I was permitted to install a 5-band vertical. I then upgraded my station with a Heathkit SB-101 and Heathkit SB-200. During this period I worked 154 countries and confirmed most of them. As I said before, I was heavy into the CHC, so I ran the European CHC net on 20 meters and one of the regular check-ins was Brother Amram, HV3SJ, from the Vatican. One evening he asked me if I had worked Father Moran, 9N1MM, in Nepal. I told him that I hadn't so he told me that he had a weekly sked with him, so if I just let him know that I was on their sked frequency at the sked time, I could work him. The QSO with Father Moran was real DX. Before I left Germany, I also started chasing counties, so I shipped my SB-101 and an antenna to my home of record so that I could put Leslie County, KY on the air. (At that time, I was the only licensed amateur from that county.) I was then stationed at Goodfellow Air Force Base, TX. As the regulations said that if one had a temporary location then one must get an additional station call. I was issued WA5ZUV and operated with this call during 1969-1970. From Goodfellow I went on a year's vacation to sunny South Vietnam, and afterwards, I was stationed at Fort Meade, MD, where I operated WB4FBS/3 until 1975. As I was going to retire in 1976, I took an unaccompanied tour in Okinawa. I applied for a Japanese license and was issued KA6CT. My station was a small Yaesu rig and a small vertical antenna

QSL Bureau News

Are you wondering if you have QSLs and/or envelopes at the QSL Bureau?

On the 10-10 Webpage is a tab for "Resources". Under that is a tab for "QSL Bureau". On the QSL Bureau page is a box that if you type in your callsign, it will tell you the number of cards and envelopes that are at the bureau.

With poor band conditions the past few years, QSL activity has been slim. With the current band improvements, I expect activity to pick up. With this improved activity, I recommend that you get 1 or 2 envelopes on file at the bureau.

Before sending QSLs to the bureau, it is a good idea to check to see if those hams have envelopes at the bureau. You can do this by using the box mentioned earlier in this article. If you send QSLs to hams without envelopes at the bureau, your QSLs will just sit at the bureau.

It should be noted that you do not have to be a current paid 10-10 member to use the QSL Bureau.

You can make QSOs on any band with other 10-10 members and use the bureau for your QSLs.

TEN-TEN QSO PARTY RULES

6.2 10-10 QSO PARTIES

10-10 QSO Parties are events that are held for fun and to meet old, new and prospective members around the world. The rules listed here are for all general QSO parties. The Anniversary, Meet the Volunteers, and Mobile QSO Parties are specialty events and do have additional rules.

6.2.1 WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

QSO Parties are open to all amateurs with operating privileges on the 10 meter band, however, logs will be accepted only from active members as of the date of the event with the following exception: Open Season event logs will be accepted from all amateurs. Other logs received will be handled as checklogs. Checklogs are used to validate (check) other logs but do not receive awards.

6.2.2 WHEN ARE THE QSO PARTIES?

There are currently ten QSO Parties held throughout the calendar year:

Winter Phone - held on the first full weekend in February
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Mobile - Held on the 3rd Saturday in March
0001 UTC through 2359 UTC.

Spring Digital - held on the last full weekend in April.
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Spring CW - held on the first full weekend in May.
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Open Season (PSK) - held on the first full weekend in June
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Sprint of 76 - 7 day, 6 mode event centering around 4 July
each year

Summer Phone - held on the first full weekend in August.
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Sprint - a 24 hour event held on October 10th (10-10).
0001 UTC through 2359 UTC.

Fall CW - held on the 3rd full weekend in October.
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Fall Digital - held on the 2nd full weekend in October.
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

6.2.3 FREQUENCY AND MODES

Direct unassisted contacts only are permitted. Repeater, Satellite, IRPL or any other similar types of assisted contacts are NOT allowed. Based on the appropriate band plan for the country of operator, CW QSO Parties should be operated in the CW area of the 10 meter band and operated using CW only. Digital QSO Parties should be operated in the digital area of the 10 meter band and operated using Digital modes only (RTTY, PSK, etc). Phone QSO Parties must be operated in the PHONE area of the 10 meter band and may be operated using any approved method (SSB, FM, AM).

The SPRINT utilizes all operating modes in the 10 meter band.

NOTE: A QUIET ZONE between 28.490 and 28.510 shall be in effect during QSO Parties using the Phone portion of the 10 meter band to allow for others to use the band.

6.2.4 ENTRY CLASSIFICATION

Entrant may submit a log in ANY of the following

classifications:

INDIVIDUAL: Includes single station operators and can also include OM/XYL teams or any families or groups of people using individual call signs and 10-10 numbers.

QRP: same as an individual as listed above except that output power does not exceed 5 watts with CW/Digital operations and/or 10 watts with Phone operations during the entire event.

CLUB: A Club must have a valid club station license issued by their National Licensing Authority and must have active 10-10 membership. Club entries must list the call, name, and 10-10 number (if any) for all operators using the club call. Club operations will take place at one location using one set of equipment.

6.2.5 TRANSMITTER INFORMATION

An operator may operate mobile, portable or fixed. If they change their exchange QTH during the QSO Party, the operator must show same in their log. The operator may enter a log from one call district, province, or DX country. Multi-transmitters (two or more transmitters operating simultaneously, sharing one call sign) are NOT permitted in any QSO Party. If a single transmitter becomes inoperable, it is permissible to change to a replacement transmitter.

6.2.6 EXCHANGE

10-10 members send call sign, name, 10-10 # and QTH (State, Province or Country). If received exchange does not have a 10-10#, then record a zero(0) in the log.

6.2.7 QSO POINTS

Two (2) points are awarded for contacts WITH a 10-10 number. One (1) point is awarded for contacts WITHOUT a 10-10 number. Duplicate entries should be retained in log and show a zero (0) for points. Any log showing 10% or more errors may be handled as a checklog. A station may be counted only once regardless of mode.

6.2.8 CHAPTER SCORE ASSIGNMENT

Any entrant who is a chapter member and whose operating location is within 150 miles of the primary net location of that charter, may assign the entrant's score to that chapter. QSO Party scores for the Sprint may not be assigned.

6.2.9 QSO PARTY ENTRIES

Logs shall be forwarded to the QSO Party Manager as identified in the 10-10 NEWS or on the 10-10 web site. It is strongly suggested that logs be sent as soon as possible after the close of the event. It is also recommended that DX logs should be sent AIR Mail to insure they are received in good time. Any logs received with a postmark date AFTER the deadline date will be handled as a checklog. Any logs received more than 15 days after the entry deadline, regardless of postmark, will be discarded. All logs may be sent via Email. Please no .Q95 or .adif files.

6.2.9.1 ENTRY DESCRIPTION

Entries must contain a Cover Sheet, Log and Dupe Sheet as described here:

COVER SHEET will list the Event Entered, Entry Classification, US Call Area (W0-W9

or DX Country), Chapter Score Assignment (if any), number of contacts and points with 10-10#, number of contacts and points without 10-10#, and total contacts and points claimed. LOGS must be listed in date/time order and list UTC Date, UTC Time, Call, Name, 10-10# (zero (0) if none), QTH and Contact Point Value.

A DUPE SHEET is required for any logs exceeding 50 contacts. It may be either a list of all calls contacted in call sign order or hand entered on a dupe sheet grid.

6.2.9.3 ENTRY DEADLINES

Entries for all QSO Parties listed EXCEPT the Sprint shall be postmarked no later than 15 calendar days (this will always be a Monday) after the close of the event. Mailed entries for the Sprint (held on 10/10) shall be postmarked no later than October 25th, unless that day falls on a Sunday, than the postmark deadline shall be October 26th.

6.2.10 QSO PARTY RESULTS AND AWARDS

QSO Party results will be posted on the 10-10 web site about 15 days after the closing deadline for the event and also printed in the 10-10 NEWS in the appropriate issue.

Awards will be issued by the certificate manager for Top Ten Individual scorers in the World, the top Individual scorer in each US Call Area (W0-W9), each DX Country, and for top QRP, CLUB and CHAPTER. Electronic certificates will be sent to the 2nd and 3rd place scorers in these categories.

6.2.11 ANNIVERSARY QSO PARTY and MEET THE VOLUNTEERS

These events run from January 1 0001 UTC to December 31 2359 UTC.

In the Anniversary QSO Party, entrants may submit a log of contacts with members that have 10-10# anniversary year contained in their membership number.

Example: 2011 is the 49th anniversary year of 10-10 International Net, Inc. Contact with members containing a "49" in their membership number (i.e., 72048, 69485, 64854, 48126, 00487) would count toward the event. Each year the anniversary number changes, making a new group of members the focus of the event and promoting the use of the 10-meter band. All general rules are applicable with the following exceptions:

During the calendar year (January 1 through December 31) make legal 10-10 contacts with 10-10 Number, Date, Call Sign, QTH with members containing the anniversary year in their membership number as described above.

In the MEET THE VOLUNTEERS event, entrants may submit a log of contacts with members listed in the 10-10 NEWS as being a 10-10 volunteer. One contact per volunteer is permitted, regardless of mode of contact.

In both events, contacts must be made on the 10-meter band with any legal mode (AM, SSB, FM, PSK, CW, etc.).

All submitted logs must contain only one entry for each 10-10 number contacted. Contacts MUST be listed in 10-10 number order and each entry must list the 10-10 Number, Date, Call Sign, Name, QTH and Mode, in that order.

These events are for Individual entries as described in section 6.2.4 and certificates will be awarded for the TOP Ten, however all entrants will be listed in the 10-10 NEWS. Logs MUST be postmarked no later than January 15th of the year following both the Anniversary and Meet the Volunteers QSO Parties. Only members in good standing (with dues paid) are allowed to submit logs.

6.2.12 MOBILE QSO PARTY

This event is held on the third Saturday in March from 0001 to 2359 UTC. All general rules are applicable with the following exceptions:

This is a mobile QSO Party, therefore only mobile stations will submit logs, however, fixed stations are encouraged to participate to help give out points and collect counties. Mobile applies to car, truck, RV, motorcycle, boat, airplane or other mode of transportation. If in doubt, contact the QSO Party Manager. A station operating a mobile entry must be a true mobile. Sitting in the driveway and using the base station antenna or amplifier, or using commercial power is not permitted. RV generators are permitted only if the generator is used while in transit (moving).

Operation while your vehicle is parked across a county line, occupying two counties, counts as two counties and two contacts. Marine and aeronautical mobiles must be able to establish counties of operation. Safety is paramount while operating mobile. If you are unable to park near multiple county lines due to safety issues (i.e. on a bridge, on a freeway, etc.), please move to the closest area which would provide the best operating conditions and still be able to give out multiple counties.

The on-the-air exchange shall be Call, Name, QTH, 10-10 Number (if available) and County. Scoring will be the same as other 10-10 QSO Parties. 2 points awarded for contacts with a 10-10# and 1 point awarded for contacts without a 10-10#. Duplicate entries are allowed when working in multiple counties. (i.e. if K4HAV is a on 3 county line and he works K4JPC, That would count as 3 contacts, one for each County).

Logs must be in date/time order and list Date, UTC time, County worked from (If applicable), Call, Name, 10-10# (zero 0 if none), County Worked, QTH and Contact Point Value. Fixed stations may submit logs as check logs only.

Logs MUST be postmarked no later than 14 days after the end of the event. Only members in good standing (with dues paid) are eligible for awards.

6.2.13 SPIRIT OF 76 (7 Days, 6 Modes) QSO PARTY

This event will run for 7 days and be around July 4th of each year. Make as many contacts as you can during the week using 6 modes. The modes that will be used are as follows as well as the **suggested** frequencies to monitor:

1. USB (28.345) 2. RTTY (28.086) 3. CW (28.050)
4. FM (29.600) 5. PSK (28.120) 6. AM (29.000)

Scoring will be as normal for QSO Parties, 2 points for members and 1 point for non-members. Dupes will be allowed once for each mode. It will be possible to work the same call 6 times in each of the various modes for a maximum total of 12 points per call. All other normal rules apply. Logs shall be forwarded to the QSO Party Manager.

6.2.14 FOR MORE INFORMATION

Current information about 10-10 and upcoming 10-10 QSO Parties is always available on the 10-10 web site. Cover sheets, logging forms and dupe sheets are also available for downloading or printing. The address is <http://www.ten-ten.org>. Any unanswered questions regarding the QSO Party rules may be forwarded to the QSO Party Manager.

WOULD YOU LIKE TO JOIN 10-10?

Here is what you need:

1. You must hold a valid amateur operator license.
2. Your valid amateur operator license MUST authorize or qualify you for unsupervised transmitting operations in the ten meter amateur band under your own personal call sign.
3. You must make contact with ten members of 10-10 on ten meters and submit a log listing all contacts, their 10-10 number, call sign, name, date of contact, and QTH (state/province/country). A new member application and contact log is available in Section 1 below.
4. You must remit dues for one or more years full membership. Fee schedule and payment information can be found in Section 2 below.

TYPES OF MEMBERSHIPS

Primary Membership

Primary membership is available with yearly dues, although there is a special incentive available when you pay for three years at once.

Family Membership

Family membership consists of a primary member and one or more family members who qualify as a 10-10 member (has made the necessary 10 contacts) and who reside at the same location and postal address. Family memberships run concurrently with that of the primary member. Add \$5.00 for each additional family member for each year. Only the primary member will receive a copy of the 10-10 News.

Life Membership

Life membership is available and may be paid in one lump sum or spread across two or three years. For information refer to the "Life Membership Application" form on the web or contact the 10-10 Data Manager.

Senior Life Membership

Senior life membership is available to anyone who is currently 65 years of age or older. Payment can be made as one lump sum or within a one year period. For information refer to the "Life Membership Application" form on the web or contact the 10-10 Data Manager.

Family Life Membership is no longer available

Club Membership

Club Membership is available to any Amateur Radio Organization which holds a valid Amateur Radio License. Application must be made by the club trustee. No Family or Life Memberships are available. Membership is available with or without the 10-10 NEWS.

Fill out fee schedule and method of payment in Section 2 below and forward as indicated to Data Manager. Please make sure you include a copy of your address label with form. WinIQ

WinIQ is a Windows based program that is updated monthly and is a cross reference between the call and 10-10 number. It can be found on the 10-10 web.

XXIP

XXIP is a DOS based program that is updated monthly and is a roster of 10-10 membership through 10-10 #75001. It is available free at www.ten-ten.org/xxip.

SECTION 1 - MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION AND CONTACT LOG
