# EDITORIAL

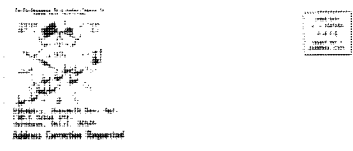

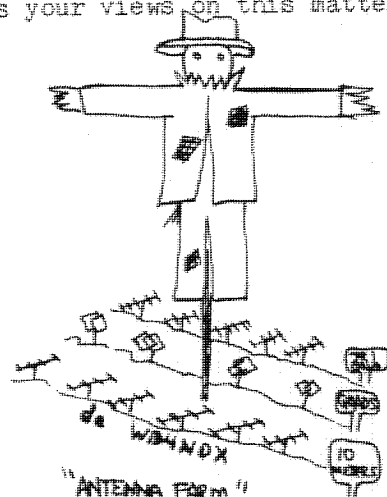

## Words from the President

OL' K SIX CHARLIE QUEEN NEVADA, alias Joe Plumb, has decided to retire and devote himself to a life of ease and relaxation, far from the care he has had for the past three years as 10-10's Treasurer, and before that for as many years with as many different jobs as 10-10 could get him to take. I have no idea what the total number of jobs was, and much less of the number of hours he and his XYL, Helen, have put in on 10-10 affairs. I do know that he has been at various times, President, Historian, Bulletin Manager, Net Control Operator, and a lot of other things, and that 10-10 owes him a lot it can never repay.

Joe came to California in 1957 from Atchison, Kansas, where he had been originally licensed as KØIDP, changed the call sign to K6CQN, and has been making a lot of use of it since then. He holds No. 7999, and has been active in 10-10 affairs ever since he became a member. He and Helen have three daughters, and seven grandchildren, and his retirement from employment at the end of October will make it possible for them to do many things they could not do before that. Because he will probably be dividing his time between California and Kansas, Joe chose not to be a candidate for re-election.

Gerry Cross, WA6POZ, who will succeed Joe as 10-10's Treasurer, is a native New Yorker, but came to California when he was seven. He went to school here in Los Angeles, and in nearby Covina, and is a graduate of the California State University in Pomona. He has worked in the field of banking for the past dozen or so years, and is, at present, Systems and Programming Manager for a large banking institution. He and his XYL have a son and a daughter and live in Canoga Park, California.

THERE IS A LOT OF MISUNDERSTANDING about who is responsible for what in 10-10's organization, and Editor WAØYNQ often gets blamed by someone who doesn't get his copy of the News. Chuck's responsibility begins and ends with getting the News ready to be printed. He does not make 10-10 policy, and he has absolutely nothing to do with getting the News printed and distributed. When Chuck has the copy ready, he sends it to me for a last-minute check to be sure than we didn't inadvertently make some gross error in it. Up to that point, it's still possible to make changes, although we usually don't.

I get the copy to our official printer, Bert Ayers, W6CL, who, in turn, gets it to another printer who has the necessary high-speed equipment to get the printing job done. That printer delivers the completed copies to our mailing service.

Meanwhile, those of you who have had changes of address, call sign, or expiration date have reported these (we hope) to your Area Manager. In turn, the Manager has reported them to Records Manager Lee Pasewalk, who assembles the data. Just prior to the publication of each issue of the News, Lee supplies these data to the mailing service, which has a contract with a computer service bureau. The service bureau updates our records, and supplies the various outputs we need, including the mailing labels. Once the labels have been applied, the copies of the News are delivered into the tender mercies of the Postal Service, and matters are completely out of our hands.

10-10 policy is the responsibility of the elected officers and the Board of Directors. And, of course, there are some matters which require a vote at a membership meeting, such as the amendment to the By-laws which is reflected in the increase in annual dues. Usually, there is no problem in distinguishing between those matters which require such a vote, and those which may be implemented through the collective judgment of the Directors. An example of the latter is our decision to accept no further orders for air mailing of the News to overseas members, at least until various problems associated with that service have been solved.

In connection with the increase in dues, the question has already arisen as to what we mean by "U. S. Members." The answer is a reasonably simple one. If your mailing address has a U. S. Zip Code attached to it, you are a "U. S. Member." Thus, the many overseas members who have APO or FPO or similar addresses qualify. If you live overseas and have an address which can only be served by Postal Union mail, you are considered a "Foreign Member." Considering the cost of the envelope that must be used, it costs about five times as much to mail a copy of the News to an overseas member as to one in the U. S. And, if you members in Canada and Mexico are curious as to why you are considered to be "overseas," don't ask me, ask the Postal Service. Also, if anyone is interested, I have just put down the telephone after calling Postal Information to inquire about the overseas rates scheduled to go into effect on January 1, 1981. They still can't tell me what they'll be. I have thought for some time that I needed one of those 'Plan Ahead' signs, but the Postal Service seems to need one more than I do.

FAMILY MEMBERSHIPS constitute the kind of a reasonable little matter that turns out to be quite unreasonable when one gets into it. There have been quite a number of letters and other communications from members who ask why more than one copy of the 10-10 News has to be sent just because both husband and wife, or some other two or more family members happen to be 10-10 members. Generally, they propose a family membership plan which would cost more than a single membership, but less than two, and which would involve sending only one copy of the News to the family.

Of course it's a wholly reasonable suggestion, and one I wish we could implement (although it wouldn't save nearly as much money as people seem to think). Under present circumstances, there's just no feasible way of doing it. Probably the biggest single problem is that we have no way of knowing just who these family members are. Off-hand, I don't recall a single one of those letters that mentioned who the other family member was, what his or her call sign was, or his or her 10-10 number.

Even if we had all that information, or could easily get it, we'd then have to dope out some way of letting the stupid computer know that all members concerned should be shown as paid-up, but that an address label should be prepared for only one. I would be a bit wary of that procedure; we get enough errors from the computer as it is. However, I suppose I shouldn't call the computer 'stupid.' So far as I know, it is of legitimate descent and adequate capability. I don't know that I can say as much for those who tell it what to do.

ALL OF US SHOULD REMEMBER that whatever "news" there may be in each issue of the 10-10 News is available to everyone as much as a couple of weeks before he receives his copy of the News, and even much further in advance for foreign members. Reason for this is that Morrie Goldman, W6EHM, performs a noble chore as soon as each issue is off the press. Morrie picks up a couple of hundred copies and mails them out, first class, to all chapter heads, area managers, net control operators, etc. Thus, if some time-critical matter is involved, such as a contest announcement, or a deadline of some kind, the word is available to you some time before you get your News. And, by the way, the call signs of the net control stations for the daily net are now shown on page 2, along with other information.

AND BEFORE I FORGET IT, I should mention that W6OI, No. 109, is licensed to the 10-10 International Net, Inc., and that Morrie Goldman, W6EHM, is the trustee. W6OI was the call sign of Jim Paine, who was, for many years, extremely active in 10-10 affairs. Under appropriate circumstances, W6OI can be made available for special events. When the "Old Indian" passed away a few years ago, he was 10-10's Secretary-Treasurer, and the call sign is held as a memorial to him.

THE AWARDS GIVEN TO MEMBERS by 10-10 have always been free. However, the disclosure in the financial statement that appeared last issue that the awards program had cost nearly \$1500.00 over the preceding fiscal year was a bit of a shocker, and encouraged some further inquiry. That inquiry has produced some favorable things and some that are unfavorable.

The favorable item, and one that is highly appreciated by Awards Manager Bill Risher, is that many members applying for Bars or other awards send contributions, as well as return postage. Mary Grancell, WA6MOF, who prepared the financial statement, tells me that funds so received were included as "Revenue - Received from members." Had they been applied directly against the costs of the awards program, they would have reduced it somewhat. Another favorable item is that some of the expense was incurred as a consequence of the re-design and printing of certain certificates. The design expense is non-recurring, and Bill had enough certificates printed to last some time.

However, there are some unfavorable aspects to which we need to give some attention, as follows:

1. The cost of the "1000 10-10 Contact" plaque is a big item. More and more members are attaining the 1000 mark, and 10-10 plunks out about \$2.50 for each plaque.
2. While the certificates (500 contacts, WAS, etc.) cost far less than the plaques, they still represent rather tangible costs.
3. There are still those who don't follow directions and include return postage when applying for awards.
4. Worst of all, there are always some few 'free loaders.' These are the people who don't think enough of 10-10 membership to continue to pay dues, but who do continue to apply for the free awards.

There are a couple of obvious things we could do. One would be to require a paid-up membership of anyone who applies for an award. Another would be to charge for the more costly items. Maybe we'll have to do one or both of these, but if everyone includes the return postage, and more generous members send contributions, as do some already, we can defer it for a while.

NEITHER EDITOR CHUCK NOR I has any idea of what your general reactions are to the makeup of the News. In the last issue, Connie Hauck had six pages on chapters and chapter news, four pages were used to report on results of the summer QSO Party, and there were six and one-half pages of pictures.

What we do not know is how well this space allocation meets your needs and expectations. Those pages of pictures represent about 20% of the available space. Is anyone interested in them other than those who were in them, or whose friends were in them? Is there any point in taking four pages to list everyone who participated in the QSO Party? Do even ardent chapter members read all the chapter news?

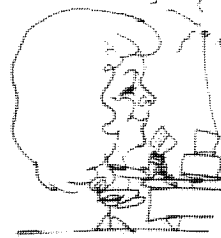
I certainly don't know the answers to those questions, and I'm not sure I want to know. However, if any of you are interested enough to write and let me know your views, I will welcome your letters.

The Annual Meeting of 10-10 International Net, Inc. was held on November 2, 1980. President Howard Bowman, W6QIR, presided. Secretary Jo Moise, K6AYU, read the minutes of the summer quarterly meeting, and these were approved as read.

There were a number of introductions and announcements, including one that the winter quarterly meeting will be held on February 1, 1981.

Proposals for modifying the By-laws so as to eliminate the reinstatement fee and to increase 10-10's annual dues were next brought to the attention of the meeting.

By unanimous action, Article IV of the By-laws was amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE IV. MEMBERSHIP DUES AND FEES

- A. The registration fee is \$1.00. It applies to all new applicants except novices.
- B. Membership dues are \$4.00 annually, payable in advance, for members residing in the United States; for members residing in other countries, membership dues are \$5.00 annually, U. S. funds, payable in advance.

By motion, the above amendments were made effective on April 1, 1981.

Nominating Committee Chairman Mary Grancell, WA6MOF, was introduced, and asked that committee member Bob Hartley, W6WPFY, conduct the election. He presented the following slate of candidates for the elective offices for the 1981 - 1982 term.

President:	Howard Bowman, W6QIR
Vice-president:	Norm Lefcourt, W6IRT
Secretary:	Jo Moise, K6AYU
Treasurer:	Gerry Gross, WA6POZ

There were no other nominations, and the above candidates were declared elected.

Brief reports were presented by Awards Manager Bill Risher, WB6OMH, Roster Manager John Pomeroy, K6UQ, and Chapter Coordinator Connie Hauck, K6EXQ. Connie announced the new frequency of the Coordination Net as 28,967 kHz. It meets each Sunday at 1800 Z. Jim Michaels, W6PGM, reported on progress in tallying logs for the CD contest, and Jim Cass, AA6K, of the Rules and Ethics Committee, announced that next year's contests would be handled by the Trotters and Pacers Chapter.

Morrie Goldman, W6EHM, trustee for memorial station W6OI, reported that the license expires in January, 1981, and that he is applying for renewal. Morrie also continues to work on problems connected with 10-10's non-profit status as applied to mailing privileges.

There was no further business, and the meeting was adjourned.

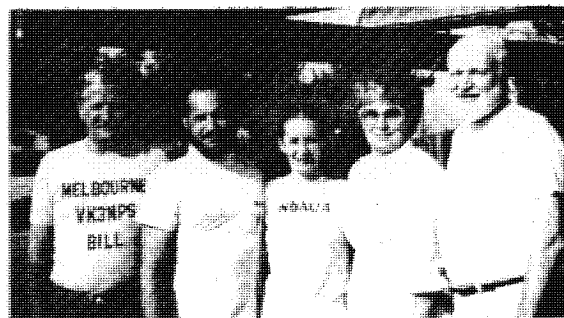


Bill-VK3NPS and his XYL-Frances spent a fantastic 12 weeks on vacation touring the USA with their Greyhound Bus pass.

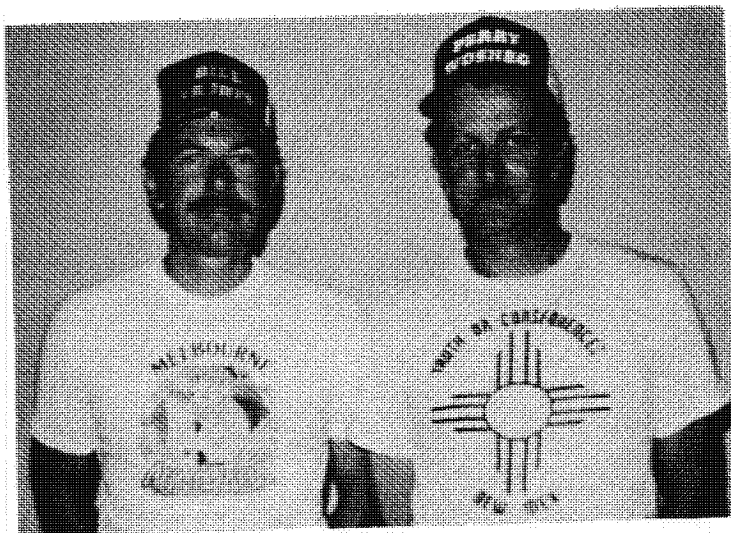

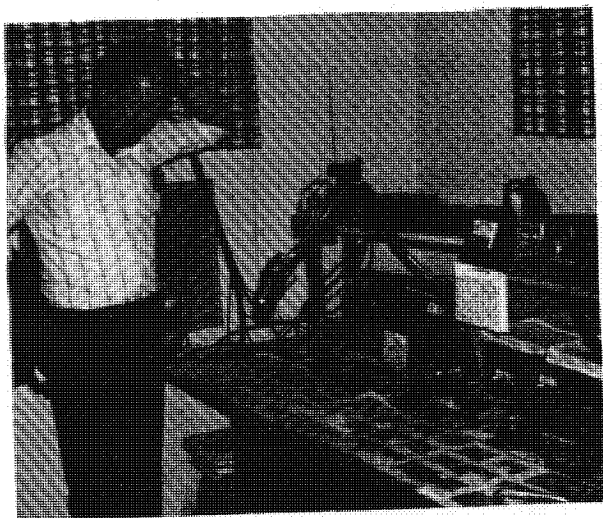

# 10-10 International Net Winter QSO Party - 1981

STARTS: 0000Z (UTC) Feb. 7, 1981  
ENDS: 2400Z (UTC) Feb. 8, 1981

QSO Parties are open to all amateurs, but only 10-10 members are eligible for awards. All contacts must be made on 10 meters. Modes acceptable are AM, SSB and FM. QSO Parties are not intended to demonstrate technical or contest endurance abilities, but to encourage interest in 10 meter operation. Members may submit 10-10 numbers collected for bar awards; non-members may use them to qualify for 10-10 membership.

## RULES:

1. Exchange call, city, state, name and 10-10 number
2. All station logs must be in UTC
3. A station may be counted only once
4. An operator may credit his/her score only to a local chapter of which he/she is a member. A local chapter is one that can be worked ground wave when the band is closed.
5. One may work any 24 hours of the 48 hours available. They need not be consecutive, but must be in a minimum of one-hour increments starting with the first contact. Any portion of a clock hour must be counted as a full hour. Example: you operate from 0130Z to 0229Z. This counts as two hours of operation.

## CLASSES OF OPERATION:

1. Single operator
2. QRP (20 watts PEP output SSB; 10 watts AM)

## SCORING:

1. Each contact is worth one point
2. Add an additional point if the station has a 10-10 number

## AWARDS:

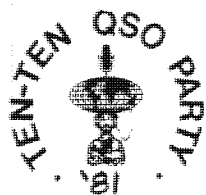
In each class, a first place certificate to each U.S. call area, KL7, KH6 and other U.S. Pacific islands, each VE district, Central America and the Caribbean, South America, Europe, Africa and South Atlantic, Asia, Australia, New Zealand and South Pacific.

## LOGS:

Logs are accepted from members only, and are due by March 7, 1981. Mail to Trotters & Pacers Chapter, in care of John W. Raczek, K1HLC, 22 Lake Ave., Eatontown, N.J. 07724. Each entry on log must include call sign, date, time, QTH, Name, 10-10 number (if any). Submit a separate cover sheet showing your name, call, QTH, 10-10 number, chapter affiliation (if any), total hours of operation, total contacts and total number of points claimed. Logs not properly submitted may be rejected. Chapters submitting bulk mailings must divide them into two or more mailings, spaced several days apart.

# 10-10 International Net Spring CW Party - 1981

STARTS: 0000Z (UTC) March 7, 1981  
ENDS: 2400Z (UTC) March 8, 1981

CW Parties are open to all amateurs, but only 10-10 members are eligible for awards. All contacts must be made on 10 meters. All contacts must be CW. CW Parties are not intended to demonstrate technical or contest endurance abilities, but to encourage interest in 10 meter operation. Members may submit 10-10 numbers collected for bar awards; non-members may use them to qualify for 10-10 membership.

## RULES:

1. Exchange call, city, state, name and 10-10 number
2. Novices sign /N; technicians sign /T
3. All station logs must be in UTC.
4. A station may be counted only once
5. All contacts must be between 28.0 and 28.5 MHz
6. An operator may credit his/her score only to a local chapter of which he/she is a member. A local chapter is one that can be worked ground wave when the band is closed.
7. One may work any 24 hours of the 48 hours available. They need not be consecutive, but must be in a minimum of one-hour increments starting with the first contact. Any portion of a clock hour must be counted as a full hour. Example: you operate from 0130Z to 0229Z. This counts as two hours of operation.

## CLASSES OF OPERATION:

1. Single operator
2. QRP (10 watts output)

## SCORING:

1. Each contact is worth one point
2. Add an additional point if the station has a 10-10 number.
3. Add an additional point if the station is a novice or technician.
4. Total points each contact, three maximum

## AWARDS:

In each class, a first place certificate to each U.S. call area, KL7, KH6 and other U.S. Pacific islands, each VE district, Central America and the Caribbean, South America, Europe, Africa and South Atlantic, Asia, Australia, New Zealand and South Pacific.

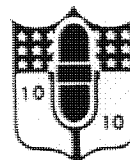
## LOGS:

Logs are accepted from members only, and are due by April 4, 1981. Mail to Cincinnati Area Ten Tuners (C.A.T.T.), in care of Bill Labermeier Sr., W8PJY, 9807 Daly Road, Cincinnati, Ohio 45231. Each entry on log must include call sign, class of license (if additional point is claimed for novice or technician) date, time, QTH, name, 10-10 number (if any). Submit a separate cover sheet showing your name, call, class of license, QTH, 10-10 number, chapter affiliation (if any), total hours of operation, total contacts and total number of points claimed. Logs not properly submitted may be rejected. Chapters submitting bulk mailings must divide them into two or more mailings, spaced several days apart.

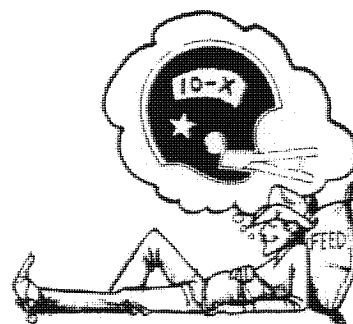

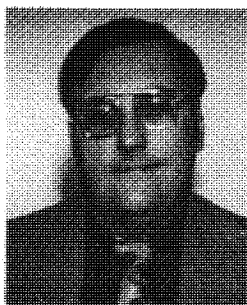

## DX SOAPBOX

When I became DX Manager in January 1980, I had no idea that our non-U.S. stations make up more than 20% of our active membership. As far as I am concerned, our DX members are the most important members of Ten-Ten and their numbers are growing larger all the time. In order to give the best service possible, I have a few guidelines and suggestions for our present and future DX members to make life easier for them and also for me. Hi!

1. IRC's. Some DX stations pay dues in IRC's as U.S. dollars are either unavailable or illegal to them. Please note that the U.S. cash value of one IRC is \$.20 and it takes 5 IRC's to equal 1 U.S. Dollar. Some stations incorrectly use their purchase price in figuring the exchange rate and then are disappointed when they do not get all they requested. One year of dues (\$5.00) takes 25 IRC's.

2. New members can receive their certificate much faster if they include extra postage for Airmail return. Please mention this to a new prospective member when giving him all the other Ten-Ten info. Unlike U.S. members, DX stations wait up to 3 months for their certificate. 4 or 5 IRC's are fine.

3. Messages can be sent to the DX Manager via the International Net at 28.800 Mhz or via any Nutmeg Chapter member on 28.690 Mhz. International Third Party agreements permitting.

4. Mail received by me is processed immediately and is back in the mail on the next business day. It normally takes a total of three weeks after a DX station first mails his application for him to receive some notification of his new number. However, Nutmeg Chapter members on 28.690 Mhz have daily lists of new numbers issued so listen here if you wish to have numbers passed over the air.

5. Please PRINT your callsign, name, and complete address clearly on all correspondence.

6. Please advise the DX Manager of any address changes as soon as possible. Also please advise us whenever someone you know becomes a Silent Key.

7. Contest logs should be sent to the contest committee as indicated in the latest NEWS. All contests are listed in the two prior issues so there should be no reason for not having the correct address. Contest logs sent to the DX Manager are delayed and may be excluded if they are late.

8. DX Members are encouraged to send good, Black & White photos of themselves or their chapters. Clearly identify all subjects by callsign. Mail these photos to Chuck, WAØYNQ or to the DX Manager.

That's all for now from this station. I'll be seeing you on Ten!

As you read this the holidays will be behind us and I hope that we can all settle down to supporting our chapters again. It is sad to see that each time chapters go extinct because of local interest. Our chapters play a big part in 10-10 and really to check into your local net takes a very little time. Most chapters have nets once a week and that is a very little time.

Monita, AK5H, wrote that even though the chapter is extinct, she is going to continue issuing certificates from her new qth in Fla. Monita was kind enough to include her new address but I let it at home and am finishing this at my office. Mail will be forwarded to her so you can use her old address or pick it up off the air. Do send postage for the return of the certificates but otherwise they are free.

Complaints continue to come in about the non deliverance of certificates and not answering an inquiry about same. This is really something for which there is no excuse. # NEW YEAR Greetings



## How to become a Ten-Ten Member

Work ten present members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, date worked, operator's name, and location. Submit this list to your Call Sign Area Manager, with \$1 Registration Fee and \$3 for your first year's dues. Novices need not pay Registration Fee, and Novices and DX applicants need work but 5 present members. You will receive a Certificate and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the Quarterly 10-10 International News, and participate fully in 10-10 activities.

## How to earn Bars and Plaques

As a member, log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters. You may wish to mark your Roster to avoid duplicates, and to develop a filing system to record 10-10 contacts. All contacts must be bona-fide number exchanges on the air. When you have 100 contacts (including your first 10), list 100 only (never more, never less, and no duplicates) as follows:

1. Your list must be in serial order of 10-10 numbers. Show call sign, handle, location, and date worked.
2. You may submit only one list of 100 at a time.
3. You may not submit log books or copies of log book pages.
4. You must give your name, address, call sign, and 10-10 number, and state which Bar you are requesting (i.e., 100 Bar, 200 Bar, etc.)
5. You must enclose an SASE (large size - about 4 1/4" x 9 3/8").
6. Mail your materials to: Wm. (Bill) Risher, Jr., WB6OMH

When you have attained your 500 Bar, you will be assigned an Honorary V. P. Number, and will be entitled to participate in additional activities. In addition, plaques are awarded for 1,000, 2,500, and 5,000 10-10 contacts.

## How to earn WAS

When you have worked at least one 10-10 member in each of the 50 states, and have QSL card confirmation, mail your cards to WB6OMH (address above), and apply for the 10-10 WAS Certificate. Enclose also an alphabetic list of the states, with full information on each station worked, plus \$1.08 return postage.

## Chapter Activities

Many 10-10 chapters issue certificates which may be earned by following rules established by those chapters. See "A Guide to 10-10 Nets" for days and times when chapter nets meet. Groups wishing to create local chapters may get information from Chapter Coordinator Connie Hauck, K6EXQ, 794 W. 23 St., Upland, CA 91786.

## Is it That Time?

Look at the mailing label on this issue of your 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NEWS. In the center of the top line there is a four-digit number which tells you the expiration date of your 10-10 membership. The first two digits indicate the month, and the last two the year. If your membership has expired or is about to expire, RENEW NOW. Send your annual dues to the Manager for the Call Area that has the same number as in your own call sign. Foreign members should send renewals to the appropriate DX AREA Manager. RENEW NOW!

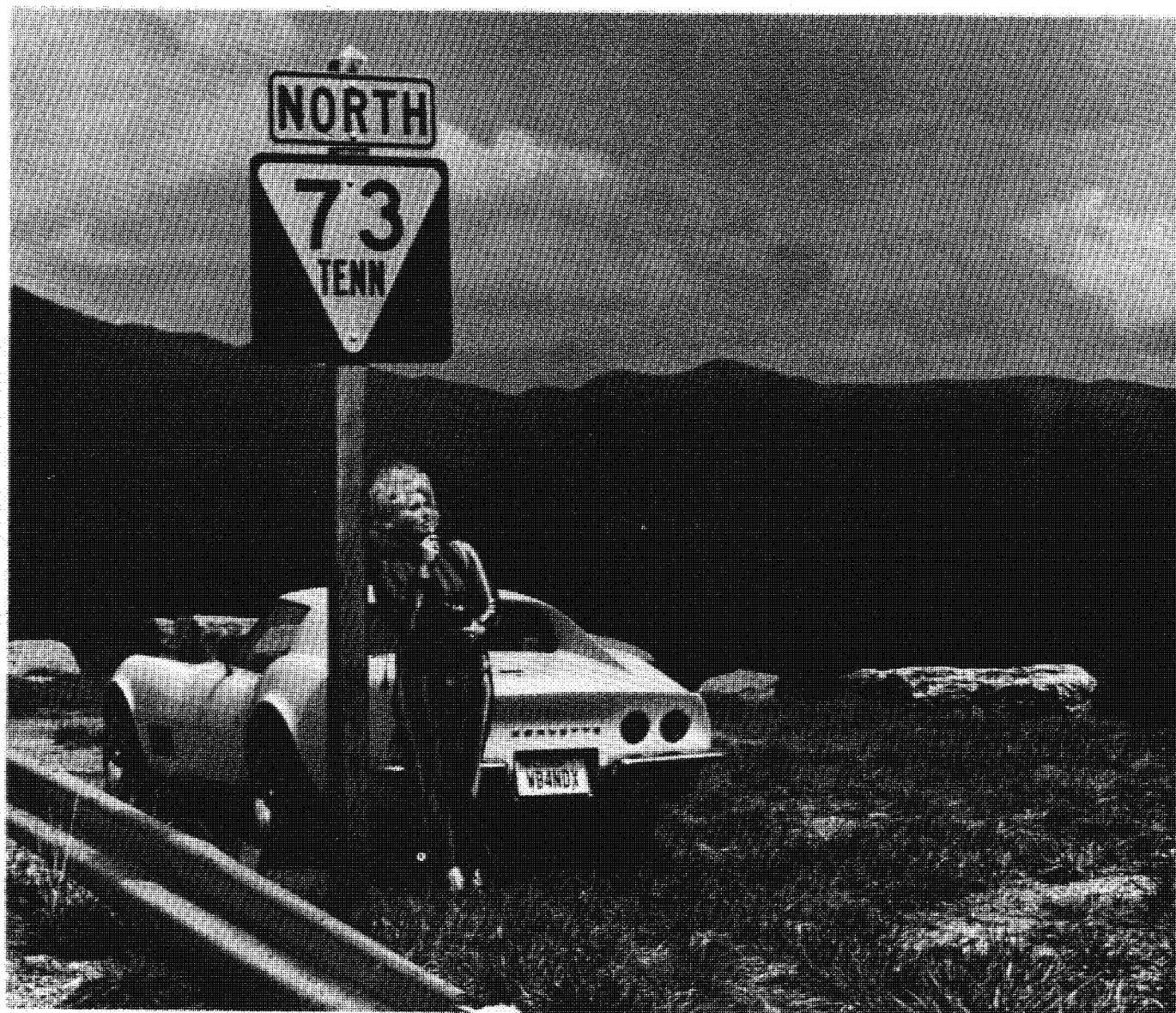
