Oct. 27, 1974: Resolution passed to assign Cert. Nr. 10000 to W30HI, the AMSAT Amateur Sattelite OSCAR-7. ARRL wants us to poll all our members to show over 50% belong to ARRL, as a condition for affilliation. We may poll our active members in a questionnaire in a future Bulletin. The March 1975 membership status is a projection based on the rate of sequiring new members and renewals in the period from March 1974 to Oct. +974. With the recent improvement in 10m band conditions, both new membership applications and renewals have shown a significant improvement. With the continued enthusiastic support from our Chapter Heads and individual members, we may yet issue Cert. Nr. 12000 in March 1975. The renewals resulting from the Sept. 74 Bulletin have already dwindled. We hope the Feb. 75 Contest will encourage an increase in renewals and new members. Butsince Mar. 173, the number of inactive members is growing at an alarming rate. To reverse this disastrous trend we must provide strong incentives to return our inactive members to active status. As a first step, members in arrears of dues 6 months or more, will be reinstated to active status by only paying a \$1.00 reinstatement fee. As a second incentive Grace K5MRU has consented to run a second Contest in July 1975. We had two Bulletins in 1973 and only one in 1974. Our experience in 1973 and 1974 showed it was impossible to publish the Bulletin more frequently with the too few volunteers available to keep pace with the growth of our Net. The decision was made to mail these Bulletins to all members; paid-up or not because of the intolerable delay in sorting out the mailing labels. With the present Bulletin expense at over 30¢ per copy, we do not have the financial resources to publish the Bulletin for all our members on a quarterly basis. In the mert quarter we plan to computerize our records. This will permit us to mail the June 1975 Quarterly Bulletin only to paid-up members as of Jan. '75. Our goal for 1975, again is to publish a first rate periodical for our paid-up members on a subscription basis. The March '75 Bulletin is being mailed to all our members since this represents a drastic change in our past practice. We now have twice as many inactive members as active members. Our goal for 1975 is to reverse this unfortunate ratio, provide a worthy Bulletin en a quarterly basis and inflation not withstanding-no increase in duest

From our VP in 1974-Gene W6DQH: It's astonishing to me how many hams I talk to on other bands from 2 to 40m are completely amazed when I tell them how many contacts are made from the West Coast to all U.S. Districts and to all foreign countries. "My gosh! I haven't been checking ten," they tell me. "I thought ten was supposed to be dead for a few more years. "Ten is dead only to those who don't use it. Suggestion: Let's each of us be a self-spointed Alert Station dedicated to alerting the hams we work on other hands to whatever activity we're hearing on ten meters. After all, isn't that our reason for having a Ten-Ten Net--to promote activity on the ten meter band? Talking it up is one way to do it!

# EXTRACTS FROM W4JO'S MONTHLY NEWSLETTERS

June 1. 1974 "INTRODUCTION-Starting as the 500 Club in early May 1971, we have progressed beyond our fondest dreams, with 100 members in 33 different areas of the world. Conditions on the 10 meter band have reached the highest level of improvement that anyone could have prophecised 10 years ago. Starting out as a 100% AM group, one-by-one changing over to SSB, our first 25 members found the newcomers coming up the ranks with 100% SSB gear. In the early days we crowded around 28.8 with all modes including CW. Now we have a gentlemens agreement to operate around 28.6 with SSB only......"

"OBJECTIVES: Our objective from the first was to relieve the crowded net frequency by moving up to 29.5 since we had already worked "our 500". Today our objective is pretty much the same, i.e. "Full Band Occupancy" on 10 meters. 42 of us have passed the 1000 mark and looking for more. Our calling frequency on SSB is now 28.5 (plus 500). We should still monitor 29.5 for AM contacts and encourage young newcomers who cannot afford SSB gear. We must also respect the AMSAT program and watch for OSCAR fly-by on this frequency.

Dec. 1, 1974: "FLASH: On this date (Nov 16th) the AMSAT Amateur Sattelite OSCAR-7 was successfully launched from Vandenburg AFB. The Ten-Ten Net has just announced that W30HI OSCAR-7 has been issued the Ten-Ten Number 10000 (10K)."
"OCT 12th CW CONTEST: Has been extended to Oct 12, 1975, due to slow start, but promises to catch up before the year is over. Watch 28.5 for CW."

Jan. 1. 1975: "FLASH: FCC announces a change in our license structure, known as Docket 20282. Study this carefully. This may affect every U.S. amateur and might eventually go international. LO meters would be divided at 29 mhz. We keep 28 to 29. 29 to 29.7 would go to an "Experimenter Class" license. Advance class may reclaim this territory but Generals would lose out, unless they take the new Experimenter Class examination...."
