## Words from the President

THERE WERE A COUPLE OF THINGS I wrote about last issue which might have been controversial in nature, but which turned out (so far, at least) to have caused little reaction one way or the other. One was the comment that we might have to start charging for awards, especially the more costly ones, such as plaques. The other had to do with the amount of space given to various portions of the News, such as photographs, chapter news, contest results, and so forth.

These opening paragraphs are being written toward the end of February - a month or so since the last issue went into the mail. Thus far I've had a half dozen responses, so I guess no one cares very much. I've been amused, however, by letters from two or three members who undertook to analyze my character, attitudes, education, and probable occupation from what I have written. While my correspondents may have been right about the first two of these, they were dead wrong about the third and fourth. Don't get me wrong, though. I was delighted to get those letters, and wish I would get more. I try to answer most of the letters I get, if an answer is required, and always if an SASE is enclosed. I most especially reply to those letters which make unwarranted assumptions about how 10-10 is operated, because they are usually incorrect.

MY REPORT ON AWARDS MANAGER BILL RISHER has had some added results. Bill felt that one aspect of his work that could be done by someone else was that of handling the WAS applications and awards. At the last quarterly meeting, I was told that Larry Wilker, W4ORR, of Dunnellon, FL was willing to take on a job, and approached him about this one. He and Bill are now in the process of completing arrangements, and we hope, and expect, that as of May 1, 1981, Larry will be handling WAS applications. Bill will make the announcement on his page. The same rules will apply, of course. You'll just send your cards and application to Larry instead of Bill.

While we were talking on the telephone, Bill told me something else that really points up the need for having someone else help Bill with the Bar awards. In one mail, just following the winter QSO Party, Bill received fifty-one Bar applications, which put a total of 120 applications to be processed on his desk. We kicked around some ideas for splitting up Bill's task, and about the only thing we came up with that made any sense at all was to have someone take the Bar awards up to the 500 Bar, and have Bill handle the rest of them. Whatever plan we finally come up with, there's one thing we do know for certain: we must have relief on the Awards Manager's load. If anyone out there has an idea or a suggestion, send it to me. Especially, if you want to volunteer for such a job, let me know.

KEEPING TRACK OF THE 10-10 MEMBERS YOU HAVE WORKED can become a real chore, especially when the newer call signs may carry numbers you've worked years ago. I started a card file when I first became active in 10-10, with a 3 x 5 card for each contact, filed alphabetically by the suffix. However, it didn't help if the person with whom I was talking had moved to a different call area (in the old days) or upgraded (more recently). An exchange of letters with Clint Paine, K4EKX, reminded me that W4JO, who was Awards Manager until his death a few years back, had used a series of numbered sheets on which to keep records of the numbers applicants had used in applying for Bar awards.

I doped out a numbered sheet which I could use for my own purposes, and had them Xeroxed. They've worked fine, so far. Clint has a comparable, but not identical, kind of sheet which he has had reproduced and can make available at his cost, which is not very much. If you hear KLEKX on the air, or want to drop him a line (with an SASE, of course), ask him about it.

GETTING BACK AGAIN TO THE MATTER of how much we print of what in the News, let me say that one of the letters I received outweighs, in my judgment at least, the four or five others that have come in. The reason: it summarizes the conclusions reached by a dozen members of one chapter who met for breakfast and talked over the question I had raised. I don't for a moment believe that the conclusions were reached unanimously. In my experience a group of hams rarely turns out to have a unanimous opinion on anything. However, they do represent what most of them thought, and that is good enough for me. The letter came from WAØHQQ, Al Tirevold, Mo-Kan CH, and for that I thank him. I wish I would get some others like it.

THERE IS A PRACTICE FOLLOWED BY MANY paper-chasers that has turned out to be somewhat controversial, and that is the policy of mailing out reproduced sheets of chapter award numbers, including various upgrades. Some of our members hold firmly to the belief that such numbers, to be 'legitimate,' must be exchanged on the air, rather than through the Postal Service. I know of one chapter that insists on air contacts under specified conditions, and that is their prerogative. I guess that my top-of-the-head reaction is that if the list of numbers is so long as to require a typewritten page or more, I'd rather see it exchanged by the mail than read off on the air. However, there is an informal net which meets daily and is devoted to the exchange of such numbers. I can't recall that I have ever heard anyone read off an entire page of them, however.

There is another daily informal net which confines itself to the exchange of 10-10 numbers. Net control stations vary from day to day, and there always seem to be relay stations available. However, so far as I have been able to observe, exchange of 10-10 numbers has been legitimate - that is, direct contact between the two stations involved, and not by relay. And of course, as everyone knows, there is absolutely no way of policing claimed 10-10 number exchanges. What it boils down to is this: you must be honest with yourself.

I'M GOING TO ASK YOUR HELP with something again. First I'll have to give you a long-winded explanation, however. Every three months, 10-10's computer file is updated, and several items are produced from that file. One is what we call the "Directory." It is a complete listing of all 10-10 members in numerical order, with names, calls, addresses. Another is the mailing label on your copy of the News. The two should agree as to name, call sign, expiration date, and address. If they don't, something has gone awry.

In recent months, several cases of disagreement have been brought to our attention. In almost every case, it has been a lack of agreement in call sign. While we don't like to have this happen, it is really not especially serious, so long as the correct call sign is in the Directory. After all, the only one who will see the incorrect one is the person who receives it. Recently, however, we have had a couple of cases in which the expiration date has not been changed upon renewal, and that is rather serious since it is usually easier for you to determine your membership expiration date by looking at the mailing label, than by hunting up your membership card.

When you read this, take time to look at the mailing label on your copy of the News. Labels on this issue of the News will be based on updating done after March 28, 1981. If you have renewed your membership or reported a call sign change to your District Manager sufficiently before March 28, 1981 for him to include it in his March 28 report, it should show up on the mailing label of this issue. If it does not, please report it to your Manager at once. I have asked the Managers to report to me any variations between what appears in the Directory and what appears on the mailing labels, and I will try to take it from there.

MEMORIAL STATION W6OI, Number 109, has had its license renewed to January, 1986. Trustee Morrie Goldman, W6EHM, had a minor problem with the renewal because 10-10 has changed its corporate name since the license was obtained. However, this obstacle was readily overcome, and the license renewal has arrived. The call sign has been used on a number of occasions for special events, and it is expected that there will be even more occasions during the present license term.

ROY ACKERMAN, W6DFM, has been 10-10's Supply Manager for a couple of years, now. For the past several months, he has performed the duties of that position under very considerable difficulties. Despite his ill health, Roy has, along with his XYL, Eleanor, performed faithfully all the chores associated with that assignment, and has also acted as net control for the 10-10 International Net each Friday.

Roy called me a few weeks ago to let me know that he now felt his physical strength to be such that he could no longer do the job as he felt it should be done, and asked to be relieved of both assignments. "Smitty" Smith, K6EPT, has agreed to take over the Friday net control assignment. Smitty is an old hand at this, and will do a fine job. Temporarily, Bob Hartley, W6WPY, and Jim Michaels, W6PGM, will work together on the supply job.

Unfortunately, neither Bob nor Jim is in a position to take over permanently as Supply Manager. Each of them has other obligations that stand in the way. We desperately need a volunteer. He (or she) should be someone who lives within easy driving distance of Bert Ayers' print shop, where our materials are stored, and which is located in north Long Beach. We are especially looking for someone who is retired, and can thus get to Bert's shop on a week day.

If you live in the Los Angeles-Long Beach-Carson area and wish to volunteer, call me at 645-7205, Bob Hartley at 324-5182, or Jim Michaels at 425-5577. Please don't let 10-10 down on this one. We know that there are many members around this area who meet the requirements, but we don't know who they are. If you are one, or if you can suggest someone, please call one of the three numbers listed.

TRYING TO PREDICT THE IMPACT of new postal rates on 10-10's finances continues to be a problem. As of this writing, the new first class rates will be going into effect in just a few days, but the Postal Service still cannot tell me anything about the rate structure on other classes of mail. The cost of mailing the News to foreign members went up 7½% a few weeks ago (surface mail), and the cost of domestic mailing is certain to rise soon, but we don't know by how much or when.

And, by the way, don't forget that those first class rate increases will have an impact on those SASE's you send in. I imagine that the postage fees for WAS applications, and for return of your QSL cards will also increase, so look for that one on the Awards Page. Also, many chapters ask for a couple or three stamps with each application, so don't forget that one, as well.

That's all for this time. See you on 10!

Awards Chairman WB6OMH-Bill Risher requests checks or IRC's only made out to 10-10 International Net, Inc. in place of cash to be sent for awards.

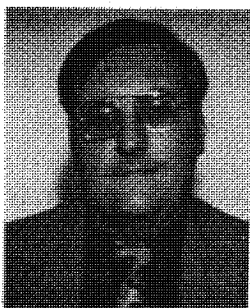

Dex, HB9BRQ, suggests that a CW Ten-Ten calling frequency be established at 28.185 MHz. Look for members using Charley Whiskey here on the half-hour. On Weekends, Dex monitors this frequency from 4U1ITU and he is very happy to QSL direct or through the Buro!

For the uninformed, this is an informal daily net strictly for the exchange of Ten-Ten Numbers Only. QSO Parties are open to all amateurs, but only 10-10 members are eligible for awards. All contacts must be made on 10 meters. Modes acceptable are AM, SSB and FM. QSO Parties are not intended to demonstrate technical or contest endurance abilities, but to encourage interest in 10 meter operation. Members may submit 10-10 numbers collected for bar awards; non-members may use them to qualify for 10-10 membership.

**RULES:**

1. Exchange call, city, state, name and 10-10 number
2. All station logs must be in UTC
3. A station may be counted only once
4. An operator may credit his/her score only to a local chapter of which he/she is a member. A local chapter is one that can be worked ground wave when the band is closed.
5. Note that the contest period is forty-eight hours.

**CLASSES OF OPERATION:**

1. Single operator
2. QRP (20 watts PEP output SSB; 10 watts AM)

**SCORING:**

1. Each contact is worth one point
2. Add an additional point if the station has a 10-10 number

**AWARDS:**

In each class, a first place certificate to each U.S. call area, KL7, KH6 and other U.S. Pacific islands, each VE district, Central America and the Caribbean, South America, Europe, Africa and South Atlantic, Asia, Australia, New Zealand and South Pacific.

**LOGS:**

Logs are accepted from members only, and are due by Aug 19, 1981. Mail to Trotters & Pacers Chapter, in care of John W. Raczek, K2HLC, 22 Lake Ave., Eatontown, N.J. 07724. Each entry on log must include call sign, date, time, QTH, Name, 10-10 number (if any). Submit a separate cover sheet showing your name, call, QTH, 10-10 number, chapter affiliation (if any), total contacts and total number of points claimed. Logs not properly submitted may be rejected. Chapters submitting bulk mailings must divide them into two or more mailings, spaced several days apart.

Last Nov. we all remember the earth quake that devastated Naples, Italy but most of us busy with our own work were sorry and that was it. Not so with Joe Evans, K3KJZ of Glen Burnie, Md. Joe was able to contact I8ULL, Gino in Naples and find out first hand the damage. Each day Joe met Gino and received casualty and damage reports which he passed on to the many people who had telephoned him seeking information about friends or relatives. The many hours that Joe put in at the rig was not the end because he realized that the need for money was great so he was able to raise \$500,000 with the help of friends. Joe said that his XYL was a big help in handling the phone for him. Joe is retired and he puts his time to good use to help his fellow man with traffic and phone patches whenever he is needed. I am sure that were another addition to RADIO ANGELS be written that it would most certainly include the above. Thank you Joe., this is what it is all about.

I would like to ask the net control stations for the various 10-10 chapters to please listen on the frequency before starting your net. There are two nets which are manned daily for the sole purpose of passing 10-10 numbers, certificate numbers, helping for WAS and passing any other 10-10 information that comes along. Morning Backscatter starts daily at 1300Z on 28.825 and After Hours Backscatter daily at 2300Z on 28.900. Various stations are net control as time allows but most afternoons WB4MXW is at the mike to keep the After Hours Backscatter net going. Thanks to all of you.

I have had a request from a new chapter to suggest ways to help a net run more quickly. I have checked into several and this seems to be a very good way. The net control station will take his/her charter and local checkins and have them give the basic information and then take visiting statings along with their basic information. Since the net control has contact with each station checking in, it is not necessary that he qsl each station again so the charters and locals make any calls and exchange the needed information. Many thanks to all of you who took whatever steps that were needed to clear your backlog of certificates. I have had some letters that certificates have been received. I realize that your job, like mine, is a thankless one but is very necessary to keep things going.

You will note that my chatter is shorter this time. Chuck told me that I was getting a little broad and I thought that was what he meant so I took the hint. I would like to use every word that is sent but that is impossible so I try to do the best that I can in cutting it down.

Please do the following when sending information for the 10-10 NEWS. If you have pictures that you want used, those should go directly to Chuck, W4DYNQ so that he can get them processed and ready for use asap. If you are having any special event that is too be listed other than in the chapter chatter section that too should go to Chuck. Anything that pertains to your chapter should come to me. If you have a call change, qth change, not getting your 10-10 News or anything pertaining to your membership, contact the district manager for your district, that is the person to whom you send your 10-10 dues. If you send the information to the wrong person, it will be taken care of but it just slows things down. 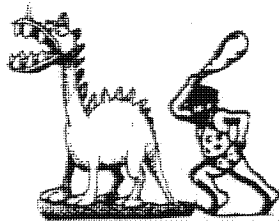

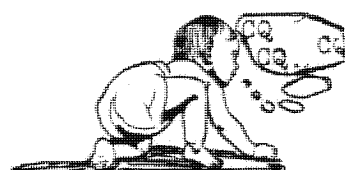

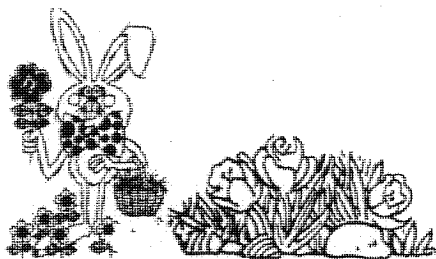

## How to become a Ten-Ten Member

Work ten present members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, date worked, operator's name, and location. Submit this list to your Call Sign Area Manager, with \$1 Registration Fee and \$3 for your first year's dues. Novices need not pay Registration Fee, and Novices and DX applicants need work but 5 present members. You will receive a Certificate and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the Quarterly 10-10 International News, and participate fully in 10-10 activities.

## How to earn Bars and Plaques

As a member, log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters. You may wish to mark your Roster to avoid duplicates, and to develop a filing system to record 10-10 contacts. All contacts must be bona-fide number exchanges on the air. When you have 100 contacts (including your first 10), list 100 only (never more, never less, and no duplicates) as follows:

1. Your list must be in serial order of 10-10 numbers. Show call sign, handle, location, and date worked.
2. You may submit only one list of 100 at a time.
3. You may not submit log books or copies of log book pages.
4. You must give your name, address, call sign, and 10-10 number, and state which Bar you are requesting (i.e., 100 Bar, 200 Bar, etc.)
5. You must enclose an SASE (large size - about 4 1/4" x 9 3/8").
6. Mail your materials to: Wm. (Bill) Risher, Jr., WB6OMH

When you have attained your 500 Bar, you will be assigned an Honorary V. P. Number, and will be entitled to participate in additional activities. In addition, plaques are awarded for 1,000, 2,500, and 5,000 10-10 contacts.

## How to earn WAS

When you have worked one 10-10 member in each of the 50 states, and have QSL card confirmation, mail your cards to WB6OMH (address above), or, after May 1, to W4ORH, and apply for the 10-10 WAS Certificate. Enclose an alphabetic list of states with full information on each station worked, plus \$1.08 return postage.

## Chapter Activities

Many 10-10 chapters issue certificates which may be earned by following rules established by those chapters. See "A Guide to 10-10 Nets" for days and times when chapter nets meet. Groups wishing to create local chapters may get information from Chapter Coordinator Connie Hauck, K6EXQ, 794 W. 23 St., Upland, CA 91786.

## Is it That Time?

Look at the mailing label on this issue of your 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NEWS. In the center of the top line there is a four-digit number which tells you the expiration date of your 10-10 membership. The first two digits indicate the month, and the last two the year. If your membership has expired or is about to expire, RENEW NOW. Send your annual dues to the Manager for the Call Area that has the same number as in your own call sign. Foreign members should send renewals to the appropriate DX AREA Manager. RENEW NOW!
