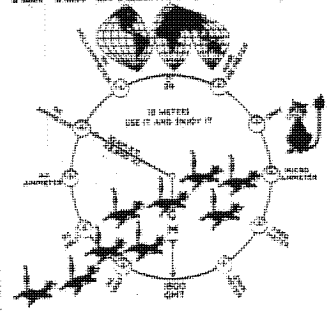

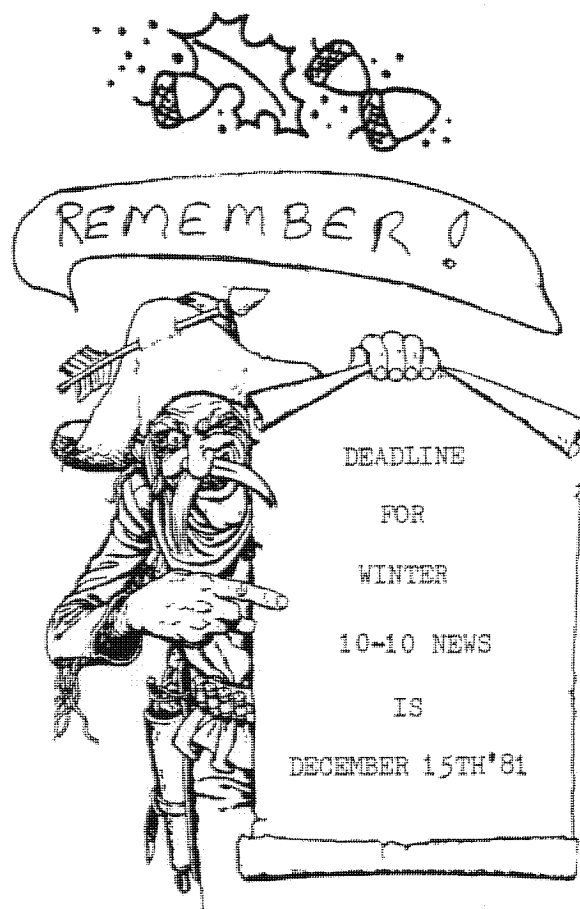

Words from the President

FROM TIME TO TIME over the last year and a half, I have asked on these pages for those of you who felt you could volunteer some time and energy to 10-10 to send along your information to me, and there have been some responses. Unfortunately, most of our needs for volunteer help have been concentrated here in the Los Angeles area, mostly because that's where all our production facilities are located. However, we have managed to come up with someone when we needed him, so the situation has not become critical.

There is a place for local volunteers around the country, however, especially if you live somewhere reasonably close to the District Manager for your area. Some months ago I sent a letter to each District Manager in which I requested that they beat the bushes for standby volunteers, in case of a need for one because of resignation, illness, or for other reasons. Response was rather limited, but a few days ago one of them wrote me to suggest that if we gave the need some publicity through these pages, there might be more response. Maybe so. If you have the willingness to pitch in and lend a hand - and remember, 10-10 is an all-volunteer organization - drop your District Manager a line and let him or her know about it. Names and addresses are on Page 31.

THOSE TWO PARAGRAPHS ABOUT volunteers reminded me to mention that, if you look at the list of 10-10 officials on Page 2, you'll find some changes. Last time we mentioned that force of circumstances had caused the resignation of District Manager Tom Running, KA8BMD, and that he would be succeeded by John Hugentober, N8FU. Both Tom and John live in Cincinnati so it's an easy change to make, and was effective October 1.

There is another that has a bearing on the various 10-10 QSO Parties. For several years, the Rules and Ethics Committee, which establishes the QSO Party rules, has been very capably headed up by Chuck Elliott, WBURK. What with working full time, and trying to establish his own business as well, Chuck has been forced to give up that chairmanship, although he will remain as a member of the committee. Chuck's recommendation to succeed him as chairman was Jim Cass, AA6K. Jim had some reservations at first, but consented to serve. Elsewhere in this issue of the News you will find the rules for the coming winter QSO Party.

THE LAST ONE WE WANT to mention is not a complete change, but a partial one. For quite a few years, all 10-10's awards were handled by the late Frank Orcutt, W4JO. When Frank became a Silent Key, Bill Risher, WB6OMH, took over. Bill has done the job, with the help of his XYL, but 10-10's growth, plus the fine band conditions that have promoted such great activity, have loaded him to the point where it is just impossible for one man to handle it.

The first, and most obvious, thing to be split off was the WAS Award, which doesn't have anything to do with Bars anyhow. The WAS Awards are being capably handled by Larry Wilker, W4ORH. Of course, there are some non-readers among us who still send their cards and applications to Bill, who, of course, has to send them back to Florida to Larry. Maybe, however, they just hadn't seen the summer News yet, so I suppose I was premature in accusing them of being non-readers. In any case, Larry now handles all WAS applications, and his address appears on Page 30.

There will be another change coming up on January 1, 1982. On that day 10-10 will split the Bar Awards themselves into two sections. The first section will include the 100 through 900 Bars, and the second will be composed of the 1,000 Bar and above, including the plaques.

That first section - the 100 through 900 Bars - is going to be handled by Willie E. Madison, WB7VZI, No. 27856, who lives at 10512 W. Butler Dr., Peoria, AZ 85345. Willie was sold on his own ability to do the job, and put in toll calls to both Bill Risher and to me to make certain we understood his interest. He was willing to take over right away, but we convinced him that we had to give notice to members through these pages so that we wouldn't have a gigantic foul-up. Even so, it will probably be some months before everyone remembers that an application for any Bar up to and including the 900 Bar will go to Willie, and everything above that to Bill.

THERE IS SOME FURTHER INFORMATION you will not like as well - I guarantee it! The 10-10 plaques, awarded for 1000, 2500, and 5000 contacts, have been rising steadily in cost. So have the 500 and WAS certificates. With the latter two, trouble is that people want more attractive certificates, which 10-10 can no longer provide free. Add to this the fact that some who apply haven't even paid their current dues, and you have a situation which can no longer be ignored. Plaques cost 10-10 more than \$3.00 to make and mail, and certificates just under \$1.00.

With great reluctance, the Board of Directors decided that it would be necessary to set fees for these awards. Accordingly, the fee for any of the plaques will be \$3.00, and for either of the certificates, \$1.00. All fees are effective January 1, 1982, and your check should be made payable to 10-10 International Net, Inc. Plaque applications go to WB6OMH, and for the WAS certificate to W4ORH. Their addresses are on page 30. Application for the 500 certificate goes to WB7VZI, whose address is on the preceding page. In the case of either a plaque or the 500 certificate, if you just send your list of contacts and an SASE, you'll still get the Bar. In other words, effective January 1, 1982, no fee, no plaque or certificate.

TO GET TO A DIFFERENT SUBJECT, let me tell you something many of you have already surmised, namely, that we had a mailing glitch at the time the summer edition of the News went out. There were so many contributing causes that it would take all my space just to mention them. One, of course, was the Canadian postal strike, and the fact that the U. S. Postal Service wouldn't accept mail for Canada for some time after the strike was settled, so the back-log could be cleared away. A more serious problem arose from a computer programming error, so that more than a thousand copies were mailed very late.

Related to this mailing problem is the fact that we have no good way of telling just exactly how many paid-up members we have, and we're working on a solution to that. But, for the time being, I can say that I do get letters from District Managers which inform me of, and sometimes even enclose letters from, paid-up members who simply aren't getting the News. It wouldn't be very bright of me to say here something like, "If you're a paid-up member and don't get this issue of the News, drop me a card and let me know." However, I can say to all of you that if you know someone or talk to someone on the air who ought to be getting this issue but hasn't, please encourage that member to send a letter or card either to his District Manager or to me directly. Chapter net control officers may wish to make inquiry among those who check in on this point. And it'll be faster and more productive if the letters or cards come to me, since it will give me some up-to-the-minute ammunition, although my postman will probably hate me. Just for your information, our order for the summer edition mailing was prepared by Morrie Goldman, W6EHH, who has done it for years, and it was very specific in saying that the mailing was to include all members whose expiration dates were 0381 or later. Morrie's order for this issue will specify the inclusion of all whose expiration dates are 0681 and later, so if you know someone who falls in that group, he should receive a copy.

IN THE SUMMER ISSUE, I mentioned that I had a theory why some people give out 10-10 numbers that simply don't belong to them. It has happened to me twice. Once, several years ago, I worked a chap in Pennsylvania who gave me a number that turned out to be the one issued to a member in Washington. Just this last summer, during the summer QSO Party, I worked a VE7 who gave me a number that turned out to belong to a member back in 2-land. Of course, the Pennsylvania contact was several years back, but the VE7 was a recent one. So far as memory serves, each of them seemed perfectly sincere in giving the number to me. And, no, it wasn't just a case of misreading a digit or so. Both call signs were legitimate and checked out with other information I was given, and neither actually held (or even does to this day) a 10-10 number.

As I said, I have a theory about this, based mostly on what I have heard said on the air when a member works a non-member. Of course, it is just a theory, and there isn't the slightest bit of evidence to back it up, but I'm stuck with it until something better comes along. It goes something like this:

Ham A (a 10-10 member) is on the air, calling CQ, and is answered by Ham B (a non-member). Ham B, in the early stages of the QSO, gives his name and QTH. Ham A, in responding, says something like, "Say, OM, what's your 10-10 number?" Ham B, coming back promptly, says, "Sorry, OM, I don't have a 10-10 number." Ham A goes back to him again, gives his handle and QTH, and says, "Let me give you my 10-10 number. It's No. 4509." Ham B comes back again and says, "Gee, thanks, OM, I'm sure glad to get that number. I can use it."

Ten minutes later, Ham B gets involved in another QSO, this time with Ham C, who says to him, "Say, OM, what's your 10-10 number?" To this the reply is, "Oh, I forgot to give it to you. It's 4509!"

Now, after all of that, I must admit several things. The first is that I know it's not the correct way to write dialogue, but I do have a space limitation; the second is that 4509 is my number, so don't anyone try to use it; and the third is that the whole thing is just a theory, and probably nonsensical anyhow.

FROM OUT OF THE MAIL BAG, WB5RQM sends me a copy of the July-August issue of the Republic Texas Charter newsletter, which has as good a 10-10 recruiting form as I've seen anywhere. I've had it around a couple of months or so, and the more I look at it, the better I like it. But don't send Jack a letter asking for a free copy. Those things cost money to print and mail, just as do most other items, from whatever source and unless there is some statement that this, or any other item you may want, is free for an SASE, don't make that assumption.

Another letter came from Art Ford, W2HAE, in response to my words about using some kind of phonetics to prevent misunderstandings on the air. Art tells me about a phonetic alphabet that was used by navy brasspounders up to early in WWII, which starts out Affirm, Baker, Cast, Dog, Easy, Fox, George, Hypo, etc. Art stopped at that point, which left me in the lurch, since I hadn't heard of this one, although some of the words were used in other arrangements. Guess I'll have to ask K6UQ, who is an old USN brasspounder.

A third came from Dexter Anderson, W4JRM/K3KWJ, now back in the U. S. after a long stay in Switzerland. Dex suggests a comprehensive plan, with some good arguments, for 10-10 calling frequencies, both 'phone and CW. If you have any ideas, send them along.

That's not all the mail, but it's all I have space for here, so

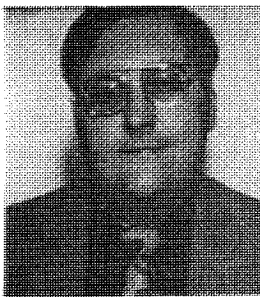

DX SOAPBOX

The following are the complete unabridged rules for our new award:

COUNTRIES AWARD

1. The Ten-Ten International Net, Inc. Countries Award is available to paid members only.
2. All contacts must take place on the Ten Meter band and must involve a genuine exchange of Ten-Ten numbers.
3. All stations claimed must be contacted from the same country and have occurred since January 1, 1975. Contacts must have been made on or after the dates on which both stations had received their own Ten-Ten numbers.
4. All stations claimed must be "land stations". Contacts with ships or aircraft cannot be counted.
5. The ARRL Countries List will serve as the final authority as to what constitutes a country. Deleted countries may be claimed for endorsements only.
6. Member stations operating "portable" from countries on the ARRL Countries List will count as a contact with that country as long as a QSL card is provided for that contact.
7. Applications:
 - A. All applications must be submitted on official forms provided by the Awards Manager or photocopies thereof. Forms will be provided if a business sized SASE is sent. Awards Manager is K1AS, Alan Sherman, RR2 Box 662, Danielson, Conn. 06239 U.S.A.
 - B. Claims for a total of 25 or more countries must be submitted with the first application.
 - C. Confirmations (QSLs) must be submitted to the Awards Manager, or a designated checkpoint, for all countries claimed.
 - D. QSL cards must be arranged alphabetically by Prefix and must show the station's Ten-Ten number.
 - E. QSL cards must be accompanied by a list of claimed countries to be used for record-keeping. These lists are not returnable.
 - F. The country of residence of the applicant will count as one country toward the award. It is not automatically assumed and must be claimed as any other country.
 - G. Applications for endorsement stickers must be in multiples of Ten and submitted on the form provided or photocopy thereof.
 - H. All applications must include sufficient funds for safe return postage (for QSLs) in the form of U.S. Currency, Check, or Money Order, Payable to Ten-Ten International Net, Inc.
8. Fees:
 - A. The cost of the award is \$5.00, including the basic certificate and any future endorsements.
 - B. Fees payable as in 7H above.

Any applications for the award received between September 1 and October 31, 1981 were treated as if they were received on the same day. In this way, we have eliminated any advantage due to favorable mail routes, etc., in getting the applications to the awards manager. The serial numbers for all the applications received during this period were assigned on a lottery basis. Subsequent to October 31, certificates will be numbered according to postmark.

10-10 INTERNATIONAL NET WINTER PHONE QSO PARTY -1982--

STARTS: 0000Z (UTC) February 6, 1982
ENDS: 2400Z (UTC) February 7, 1982

Ten-10 QSO Parties are open to all amateurs, but only members are eligible for awards. They are intended to encourage interest in 10 meter operation rather than to be a demonstration of technical or endurance abilities. Members may use the 10-10 numbers collected for the bar awards; others may use them to qualify for membership.

RULES:

1. All contacts must be made on 10 meters.
2. Exchange call sign, name, city, state and 10-10 number.
3. A station may be counted only once.
4. Single operator stations only (no multi-op) are acceptable.
5. SSB, AM and FM modes are acceptable.
6. All contacts must be within the 48 hour contest period.
7. QRP class limit is 20 watts PEP output SSB, 10 watts AM.
8. Logs must be in UTC (Greenwich or Zulu time).
9. Chapter assignment of scores may be only by a chapter member to a local chapter (one workable via ground wave).
10. Illegible or improperly submitted logs will be rejected.
11. Anyone failing to comply with these rules may be disqualified, and the judges' decision is final.

SCORING:

1. Two points for each contact with a 10-10 number exchange.
2. One point for contacts without 10-10 number exchange.

AWARDS:

First place certificates, and first place QRP class certificates to all U.S. call areas, KL7, KH(), all VE districts, South America, Central America and the Caribbean, Europe, Africa, Asia, Australia, New Zealand and South Pacific. Individual and chapter scores are published in the 10-10 International News.

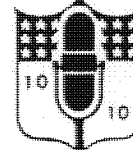

Bet that the Trotters & Pacers were surprised at the number of logs that came in. A big thanks to the Trotters and Pacers for a job well done in tabulating the logs for this year. It is no easy job and always there will be difficult decisions to make that will leave someone unhappy but it has to be done and I am sure that it is with much thought that these decisions are made. The mail always seems to make a mess of things too and that is the fault of no one. The Sky Blue Waters will do the tabulations for the next year (1982) and I am sure that John and his crew will be happy to help in any way possible.

I have been very pleased with the response that I have had from the non chapters as well as the chapters about issuing a number only for an SASE to those who for whatever reason would rather have that than a certificate. You will note in the Chapter Chatter that it will be mentioned. The Penn. Dutch has discontinued the bonus point program but if you have the 6 bonus points you may keep them. Now they offer a contact program using contacts to earn different bridges and you may use your previous contacts to count on this. When certificates are announced, I wonder if it would be wise to hold off on announcing the upgrades for awhile. It is possible to earn the basic and all of the upgrades and then interest will fall but if one did not know the requirements for the upgrades and had to wait for them to become available then interest in your net might last longer. I, of course have and still do stress that a certificate should not be the reason to check into a net. I feel that the good fellowship of another group of 10-10ers is reward enough but many are there just to grab the number and run. Think about this.

There may be an African Chapter. I have had two interested people but so far nothing is firm.

At the last 10-10 quarterly meeting we were pleased to welcome Laverne/KH6HQ and Jolly/KH6INK. It is always so nice to welcome our friends with whom we talk.

The Co-Ordination Net is in operation on Sundays at 1800Z on 28.967. This net is for the 10-10 officials, district managers and chapter heads so that we can work out any problems, announce new information etc. I invite all of you involved to join us. QRM is another thing that continues and will continue to bother us. I know that if a net moves frequency too much that stations looking for them may not be able to locate them but then it is not fair to start a net on a frequency that is in use. One solution might be for a net member to get on the frequency early and call CQ and then explain that a net will meet there a little later and at net time invite the contact to join them but turn the frequency over to net control. One might break a qso and ask if they would mind moving for the net but this should be very tactfully done. We have so many nets and we don't want to get those who are not interested upset to the point that they will qrm just to heckle us. When we do have qrm that seems to be deliberately, if we refrain from comments, maybe the station will think that it is not doing any harm and will go away. Comments will encourage qrm.

Thanks to all of you for your support. So many of you sent in reports just to let me hear from you even though you had no special information. I do appreciate this because it keeps us in contact. Just one request, when you fill out the Chapter Report, please be complete. I am going to redo the report form and ask for different information and I hope that you will fill it in. I will be asking for telephone numbers and if they are unlisted let me know and I will respect that.

Until next time remember, support your local net.

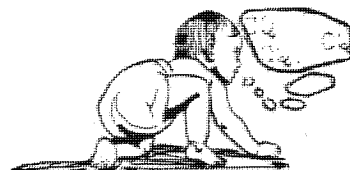

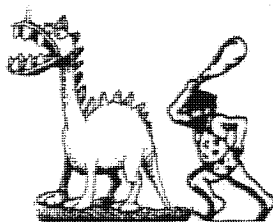

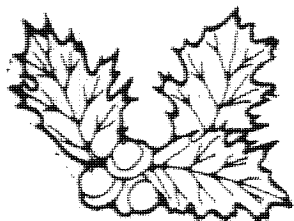

How to become a Ten-Ten Member

Work ten present members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, date worked, operator's name, and location. Submit this list to your Call Sign Area Manager, with \$1 Registration Fee and \$4 for your first year's dues. Novices need not pay Registration Fee, and Novices and DX applicants need work but 5 present members. You will receive a Certificate and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the quarterly 10-10 International News, and participate fully in 10-10 activities.

How to earn Bars and Plaques

Log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters. You may wish to have a record system for such contacts. All must be bona-fide number exchanges on the air. When you have 100 contacts, list 100 only, never more, never less, no duplicates, as follows:

1. Your list must be in serial order of 10-10 numbers. Show call sign, handle, location.
2. Submit only one list of 100 at a time.
3. Log books or copies of log book pages are not acceptable.
4. Give your name, address, call sign, and 10-10 number, and state which Bar you are requesting (i.e., 100 Bar, 200 Bar, etc.).
5. Enclose a large size SASE.
6. Mail materials to: Bill Risher, WB6OMH, 10542 Loch Avon Drive, Whittier, CA, 90606. After Jan. 1, 1982, Bars from 100-900 will be handled by Willie Madison, WB7VZI, 10512 W. Butler Dr., Peoria, AZ 85345.

Your 500 Bar earns an Honorary V. P. Number, and eligibility for other activities, and plaques are awarded for 1,000, 2,500, 5,000 contacts. Effective January 1, 1982, \$3.00 for plaques, \$1.00 for 500 certificate, but Bars are still free for an SASE.

How to earn WAS

When you have worked a member in each of 50 states, and have confirmation, mail cards to Larry Wilker, W4ORH, 1479 Austin St., Dunnellon, FL 32630 to apply. Enclose alphabetic list of states, full information on each contact, plus \$1.38 return postage. Effective January 1, 1982, WAS Certificate will cost \$1.00 more.

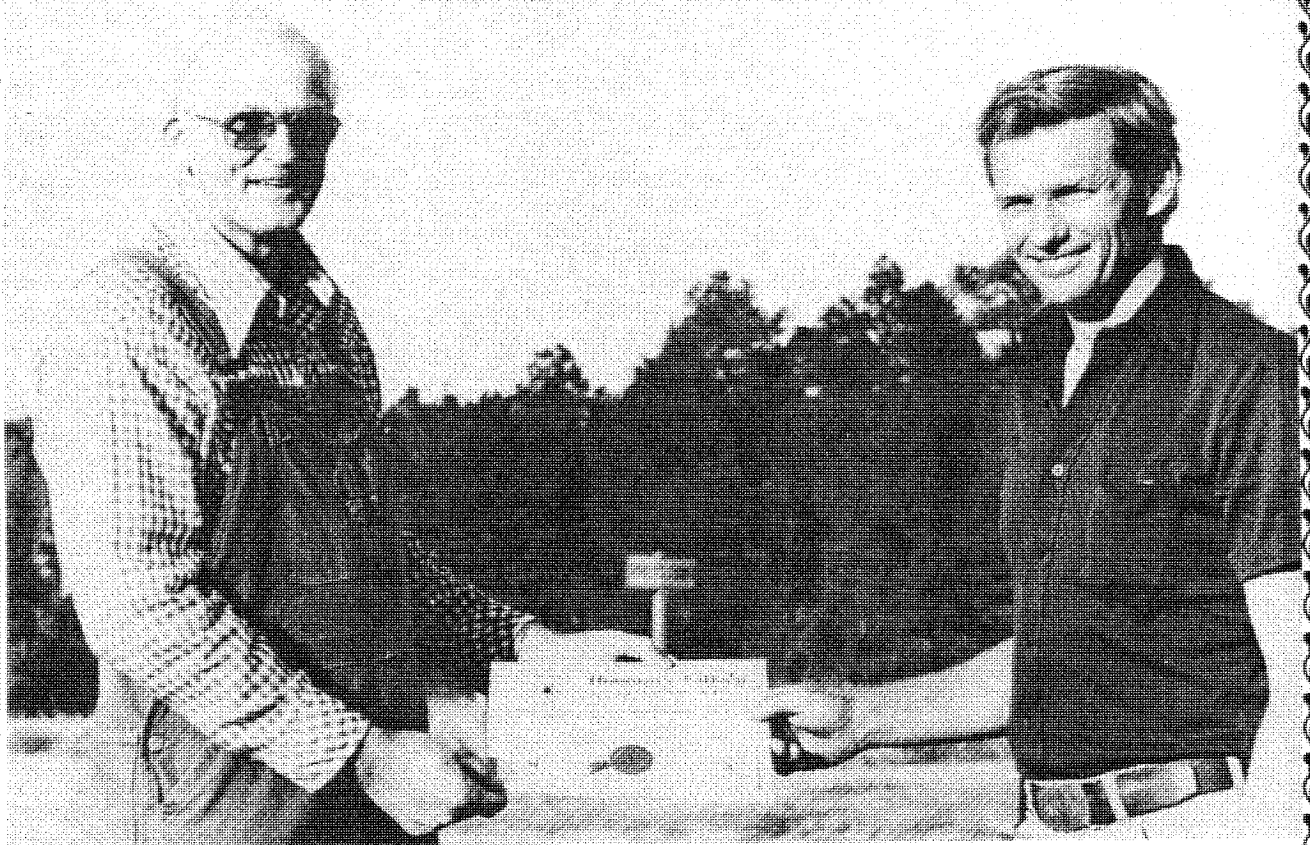
