

Words from the President

HAVE YOU EVER WONDERED HOW 10-10 membership apportions itself among the various call areas? I have, from time to time, and the opportunity to get a handle on that bit of information came as a by-product of preparing the Roster for publication. Here they are, rounded off to the nearest 10: 1: 2220; 2: 2300; 3: 1990; 4: 5680; 5: 3180; 6: 3900; 7: 2430; 8: 2620; 9: 2350; \$\notin : 3300.

Of course, those figures are subject to certain limitations. For one thing, they include SK's, and for another, a "l" doesn't necessarily live in the first call area, even though the manager for that area would handle his membership. Remember also that one continuing problem is that changes in call sign are very often not reported, and may be picked up just by chance, if at all. And, by the way, the total came to nearly 30.000. plus about 4.000 foreign members, of whom more about in the next paragraph.

Among the foreign members, Canada leads the group in number of members, with almost 11,00. Australia has 660, Japan, 250, and New Zealand 167. All of western Europe has 590. The large number of Canadian members tells why we are going to have a manager for Canada, of which more later on.

MENTIONING PREPARATION OF THE ROSTER reminds me that I should tell you it is now ready for distribution. Some of you probably have copies already, if you ordered at the new price and specified the 1982 issue. One of the things that puzzled me is why some people jumped the gun, and sent in orders quite a few weeks ago, assuming that they would get a 1982 version, even though it had not been announced, and we had no idea what the price would have to be.

The 1982 Roster is both longer and heavier than the last one, hence costs more to print and to mail, so it's going to cost you more - \$3.50, rather than \$2.50. All of this was announced in the last issue of the News, but I thought it was worth mentioning again, especially since the copy hadn't then been sent to the printer, even though we did know how long it would be.

There is one little sidelight you may be interested in. For some time, Records Manager Lee Pasewalk, WB6M0M, had been putting together a list of call sign changes, most of which were otherwise unreported. I knew about this, but didn't think it would be ready in time. At the last minute, Lee sent me his list of 96 changes, to which I added two I already had, so I spent a couple of days putting them in.

You may also be interested to know why the Roster costs so much more than the News to print - considerably more than twice as much, even though it is only twice as long in pages. The process consists of photographing the original copy, reducing it in size, if necessary, and then making a plate from the photographic negative. There isn't necessarily a separate plate for each page, but every page has to be somewhere so it will fit into the finished product where it belongs. Then each plate has to be put into the actual printing equipment.

Up to this point, it doesn't matter whether you are going to print one copy or many thousands. All of this preliminary work has to be done, and from this point on the only costs are for paper, ink, and press time. The crux of the situation is that while we print 12,000 copies of the News, we only print 1,000 of the Roster. The reason we only print 1,000 is that 1,000 is all that are bought. In fact, during the last five years or so, 1981 is the first year we have sold all we printed.

IN MANY SHACKS, THE COMPUTER has become a part of the station equipment. I don't have any idea how many 10-10 members own computers, but judging from the number around here who have mentioned having them, I would guess that there are hundreds around the country. Duane Harmeman, W9ARE, has an Apple, and has devised software for a number of purposes related to 10-10. If you are interested, send him an SASE and he'll be happy to provide full information.

Having mentioned that leads me to say that no one has written, to me, at any rate, mentioning the use of computers for 10-10 purposes. Jim Cass, AA6K, who heads the committee that formulates rules for our QSO Parties, has said that if a computer is used for logging and reporting, and properly programmed, it checks for duplicate contacts along the way. One or two others have mentioned using one in the same way. With so many different manufacturers into home computers these days, and in my total ignorance of home computers, it seems reasonable to me to suppose that maybe what will work for the Apple may not work for some other manufacture. If anyone else has gone into this kind of thing and wants to share his knowledge, drop me a line and I'll mention it.

TWO OR THREE ISSUES BACK, these pages carried announcements by both DX Manager Harry Syring and myself that 10-10 was considering appointment of a manager for our members in Canada. Ordinarily, getting applicants for these managerial jobs is not easy. There is work to be done, time away from operating, and very likely some personal expense for which you forget to request reimbursement when you send in a financial statement at the end of each month. In the face of all this (or maybe because they just didn't know about it) the response from Canada was most gratifying.

Those Canadian members who submitted their names and qualifications for consideration deserve the thanks of all of us. All have received personal letters from me. The ultimate selection of the 10-10 Board of Directors was Reg Pearson, VE3RG. Even before I suggested it, Reg had been in touch with his bank to see about the transfer of funds between Canada and the U. S., and my inquiry about any provisions he might be able to make for filing and record keeping brought the reply that he already had such provisions waiting.

Reg's appointment is being announced in this issue of the News, but will not become effective until September 1, 1982. This delay will give time for the word to get to Canadian members of 10-10, and for Harry Syring to make needed transfers of records and materials. Reg lives at 23 Judith Drive, Toronto MLJ 283, Canada, and may be found on 10 regularly. He is an old-timer in 10-10, No. 959, and well acquainted with how the organization operates.

EVERY TWO OR THREE WEEKS DURING THE WINTER I received a letter from someone with a complaint about the daily 10-10 net (1800Z, 28.8 MHz). Very often there was a misunderstanding about the function of the net, and I was usually able to set this straight. However, there was no single complaint made by more than one person, from which I surmise that, in the main, the net is doing what it intended to do.

I do have one personal observation. Because of my location, communication with net control stations five of the six days of the week is marginal at best. That means I usually have to ask for a relay. The observation is this: if a recent member checks in, and I request a relay at the end of his transmission, there is usually no reply. I have done this as many as four or five times during a net session and received no response until someone who recognizes my call or voice breaks and informs control.

CHAPTER COORDINATOR CONNIE HAUCK, K6EXQ, works as hard on behalf of 10-10 as anyone I know. What most members don't know is that she attends many club meetings and hamfests to publicize 10-10 -- entirely at her own expense. She has an enviable collection of certificates from chapters around the world, and a group of these always accompanies her.

A few weeks back, Connie went to Saroc, in Las Vegas. After she had done her usual fine job, and everything was over, Connie went to check out of the hotel. Her brief case, with more than 125 of her most precious certificates, was in her hand. At the check-out counter, she left it for a few moments while she talked with someone who had called to her from a few feet away. When she turned back to the counter, the case was gone -- and so were the certificates.

Connie has since written to the chapters involved, enclosing a check for the replacement. Some chapters have returned the check; others have not.

TREASURER GERRY GROSS, MA6POZ, has had a continuing problem with checks received from members outside the U. S. who renew through DX Manager Harry Syring, WB1FTQ. Most members are very cooperative, and have sent checks payable in U. S. dollars. However, Gerry has found that the problem still remains. It is, simply, that both the U. S. bank and the foreign bank involved charge fees for the processing involved. Very often, the sum of these fees is considerably greater than the face value of the check.

Gerry told me of one example: he received a renewal check from Harry Syring, and the name of the member involved rang a bell. He looked it up and found that the member's original check for membership had just been returned to him by the bank, with a note to the effect that the total cost for processing would amount to more than twice the face value of the check. Here's an overseas member who will have enjoyed two years of 10-10 membership, with no funds having been drawn from his bank to cover the checks!

To combat this, 10-10 must adopt some rather rigorous procedures. Effective September 1, 1982, members processing any order through DX Manager Harry Syring, must make payment by sending an international postal money order. This, of course, does not apply in Australia, Canada, or New Zealand, where members place orders through managers for those countries. However, even in the three countries named, members should take note of the current rate of exchange, and determine the equivalent in U. S. funds. For example, recently, it took something a bit under \$1.25 Canadian to buy \$1.00 U. S. That means Canadian members would have paid over \$6.00 U. S. for a year's membership. Members in other countries should adjust payments similarly.

FOR A LONG TIME, BILL RISHER, WB60MH, who handles 10-10 awards, has been complaining about free loaders -- those who apply for 10-10 awards, but are not paid-up members. Regional managers around the country are agreed that there should be some restriction, and the Board of Directors has voted to establish one. Effective September 1, 1982, all those applying for 10-10 awards -- Bars, Plaques, WAS, Countries Award -- must submit proof of current, paid-up 10-10 membership. Proof may be in form of Xerox or similar copy of current membership card or address label from recent issue of the News.

And, to remind you, there are some items which require double first-class postage for the return: certificates, and plaques, to name two. If, as some do, you send in an extra-long list for a Bar award, and it requires double postage to be sent in, it will also require double postage for it to get back to you. By the way, I manage to get my lists on one side of one sheet of typing paper. You should be able to do it in two at the most.

Ten-10 QSO Parties are open to all amateurs, but only members are eligible for awards. They are intended to encourage interest in 10 meter operation rather than to be a demonstration of technical or endurance abilities. Members may use the 10-10 numbers collected for the bar awards; others may use them to qualify for membership.

- RULES:

 1. All contacts must be made on 10 meters between 28 and 28.5 MHz.
 2. Exchange call sign, name, city, state and 10-10 number.
 3. Novices sign /N; technicians sign /T.
 4. A station may be counted only once.
 5. Single operator stations only (no multi-op) are acceptable.
 6. CW and RTTY modes are acceptable.
 7. All contacts must be within the 48 hour contest period.
 8. QRP class limit is 10 watts output.
 9. Logs must be in UTC (Greenwich or Julu time).
 10. Chapter assignment of scores may be only by a chapter member to a local chapter (one workable via ground wave).
 11. Itiegible or improperly submitted logs will be rejected.
 12. Anyone failing to comply with these rules may be disqualified, and the judges' decision is final.

- SCORING:

 1. Two points for each contact with a 10-10 number exchange.
 2. One point for contacts without 10-10 number exchange.
 3. One additional point if contact is a novice or technician.

AWARDS:
FIFST place certificates, and first place QRP class certificates
to all U.S. call areas, KL7, KH(), all VE districts, South America,
Central America and the Caribbean, Europe, Africa, Asia, Australia,
New Tealand and South Pacific, Individual and chapter scores are published in the 10-10 International News.

This USU Party is open to RTTY mode as an experiment. If enough logs are submitted, RTTY will be given separate scoring and awards. Suggested baud rates are 45-Baudot and 110-ASCII.

LOG SUBMISSION:
Logs are accepted from members only and must be legible, in UTC, and complete. Each entry must include call sign, date, time, name, QTM, and 10-10 number (if any). A cover sheet is required, showing your name, call, QTM, 10-10 number, chapter assignment (if any), total contacts, total points claimed and mode. If QRP, class is, lotained, note that and the output power. If there are more than 200 contacts a dupe sheet is required. Send logs to the tallying chapter as early as possible but not after the final submission date. LOG SUBMISSION



Pictured above is the 10-10 Countries Award. The certificate is 11"x 14" and is printed on a very attractive buff colored stock. The endorsements are small yellow circles with numbers imprinted and are located in the center of the certificate around the compass points. Information about this award may be found on page 30 of this issue.

Editors Note: My curiosity took over for a while and I wondered about the history of the chart illustrated on the award. It appears to be of the circa 1600 A.D. and is probably a Portolan chart which was commonly used for Mediterranean voyages. The area covered by the illustration is apparently a segment of the west coast of Portugal. The illustrations of the ship and dividers seem to bear that out. However, the compass rose is not oriented in accordance with practices of that era in as much as North should be at the top of the chart. Here it has North on the left side of the chart. On occasion I receive outgoing QSL cards from U.S. members. They must be confused as to the function of this job. I am not a bureau for use in either direction.

A DX-pedition will be conducted to Monaco (3AØ) from November 11 through November 14, 1982. It will include Paul F6CXB, Bernard F6FIO, Christine F6HBK, and Maurice F6FWD. They will operate exclusively on Ten Meters and will try to work only Ten-Ten members for the purpose of exchanging numbers. They are especially interested in working as many U.S. members as possible. Their working frequency will be 28.850 MHz. The callsigns for the stations will not be issued until November but the operators will be using the Ten-Ten numbers that are assigned to them using their home calls in France. Be sure to show both calls when applying for bars and other awards. A special QSL card will be issued for the event and will count for the Countries Award. Almost everyone who had been with 10-10 for more than two or three years knew Mary. Her expertise was invaluable to new officers because she knew the background of and reasons for almost everything the organization had done during these past few years of tremendous expansion. Last April 21 we lost her.

Mary was a native of Kansas, moved briefly to Colorado with her mother, then came to California. An early marriage ended in divorce, and left her with a small son. In 1948, she married Alvin Grancell, W60EJ. who, in 1972 became interested in 10-10 and became No. 5200.

That had whetted Mary's interest in amateur radio. In 1972 she became a novice, but allowed that call to lapse. In 1975 she

earned her general class license, became WA6MOF, and 10-10 No. 11,900. Not long afterward she became 10-10's treasurer, an office which she held for several years, only declining it when her health began again to deteriorate.

During the years that she held office, she was also 10-10's problem-solver. That time of growth was also one of financial problems for 10-10, as well as problems with records. Mary worked intensively at solving them, helping dozens of members with her expertise. From her hours on the air, she was so well-known around the world that members turned to her when things went wrong.

Although her dozens of friends around the Los Angeles area knew that she was seriously ill, and had not been on the air for two years, it was still a shock when we learned of her passing. She has been, and will continue to be, sorely missed.

ROBERT "BOB" G. HOLMES, WA6NOP, No. 5771

Bob, WA6NOP, the "Nice Old Plumber", as we all knew him, passed away suddenly on June 2, 1982. He was Net Control for the Wednesday session of 10-10 International. His amateur radio career started in 1970 and he joined 10-10 in August 1972. All of us who checked in with Bob on Wednesdays will remember his warm sense of humor and his sincere concern for his fellowman.

In 1975, Bob was presented the 10-10 Humanitarian Award for his devoted service to Jim Elder, WA6NOG, #5842 (SK) during Jim's disabling hospitalization. Bob is the only recipient of that very special award. We are going to miss the "Nice Old Plumber".

CONNIE'S LETTER-



This last quarter has certainly been an up, down and up one for me. I was so very much looking forward to attending the SAROC convention in Las Vegas and after all of our plans were made health problems with various members of my family arose but not to the degree that I had to change plans but now I wonder if it was a warning that I should. I went to Las Vegas and had the pleasure of a long visit with Art/WB7SBL, chapter head of the Silver Dollar chapter. What a worker Art is. He spent so much time in the 10-10 booth and we do thank you for it. On Saturday Hoss/K7ZGE came down and what a joy to talk with out my having to climb into the receiver to hear him. All of you know how much I enjoy collecting certificates and it breaks my heart if one comes out that I am not able to get. 10-10 INFORMATION

How to become a Ten-Ten Member

Work 10 present members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, date worked, op's name, location. Send list to your Call Sign Area Manager, with \$1 Registration Fee, \$4 for first year's dues (foreign: \$5). Novices, foreign applicants need work only 5 present members; novices pay no Registration Fee. You will receive a Certificate, and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the News, and participate fully.

How to earn Bars and Plaques

Log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters, all bona-fide number exchanges on the air. Then list 100 only, no more, no less, no duplicates, thus:

1. List in serial order of 10-10 numbers. Show call, handle, location.

2. Submit only one list of 100 at a time.

- 3. Log books or copies of log book pages are not acceptable.
- 4. Give your name, address, call sign, 10-10 number, and state which Bar you are requesting (i.e., 100 Bar, 200 Bar, etc.)

5. Enclose a large size SASE.

6. Mail as follows: 100-900 Bars, Willie E. Madison, WB7VZI, 10512 W. Butler Dr., Peoria, AZ 85345. 1,000 Bar and up, Bill Risher, WB60MH, P. O. Box 277, Twin Peaks, CA 92391.

With your 500 Bar comes an honorary V. P. Number, and other activities. A 500 Certificate costs \$1. Plaques are awarded for 1,000, 2,500, 5,000 contacts, and cost \$3 each. Make checks payable to 10-10 Int'l Net, Inc. Please do not send cash.

How to earn WAS

After working and getting QSL card confirmation on one 10-10 member in each of 50 states, prepare an alphabetic list by states with full data on each contact. Mail cards and list to Larry Wilker, WhORH, 1479 Austin St., Dunnellon, FL 32630. U. S., Canadian, Mexican members send 32.42, U. S. funds, for certificate cost and return postage. Overseas members may save about half the postage cost by sending non-returnable copies of QSL cards (Fax, Xerox, etc.). More than one card per sheet is OK, but all required information must appear, including 10-10 number. Show both sides of card only if necessary for complete information. Also include alphabetic list of states with full information on each contact, your own complete information, including 10-10 number, and \$2.60 U. S. funds for cost of certificate and return postage. Address application to WhORH, as shown above. Please do not send cash.

Countries Award

The Countries Award is given for confirmations (QSL's) of QSC's exchanging 10-10 numbers with members in 25 or more countries. Cost is \$5.00, U. S. funds. For complete rules and application form, send SASE to Alan Sherman, KlAS, RR#2, Box 662, Danielson, CT 06239, U. S. A.

Effective 1 Sept.1982, award applicants must show proof of paid-up 10-10 membership by enclosing Xerox or similar copy of current membership card or address label from a recent issue of the 10-10 News.

The first two digits indicate the month, and the last two the year. If your membership has expired or is about to expire, RENEW NOW. Send your annual dues to the manager for the call area that has the same number as in your own call sign. His or her name and address may be found on p. 31. Foreign members should send renewals to the appropriate DX area manager. There is no penalty for reinstatements. Look at your address label and RENEW NOW!
