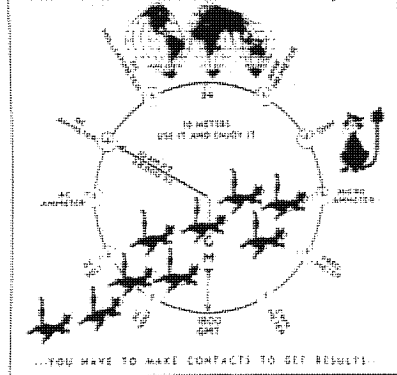

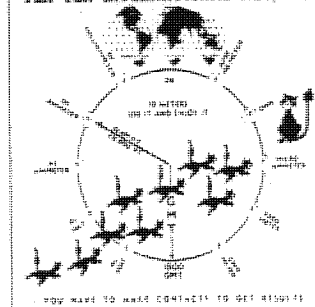

Words from the President

THERE'S AN EPIGRAM WIDELY QUOTED which reads, "The more things change, the more they are the same." For quite a number of years, now, 10-10 has changed a number of procedures relating to its operations, but one thing has remained unchanged, which is its constant request to members to make all checks sent in to managers payable to 10-10 International Net, Inc. In recent weeks, I have had a number of managers who have told me that they get checks made payable to them, personally. And, of course, there are still those trusting souls who send cash.

There are several reasons why a check made personally payable is not a good idea. One, of course, is that you don't then have a verifiable record. But another is that when you do it, you're costing the manager to whom you sent it some amount of expenditure of extra time and energy. Any such check must then be endorsed by the manager, "Payable only to 10-10 International Net, Inc.," and signed. If it is sent to Treasurer Gerry Gross simply endorsed, it runs the same risk of being stolen that cash would if sent through the mails.

Having written the foregoing, I am also reminded that there are some other things you should bear in mind when sending in checks. Most important, so far as you are concerned, is that the manager has no crystal ball. Even though the check may be properly prepared, and imprinted with your name and address, that doesn't necessarily tell the manager what he needs to know. A check generally has a short line with the label, "Memo" or something akin to that. Use that line, or, if there isn't one, a clear space elsewhere, to write in (1) your 10-10 number, and (2) your present call sign. Of these two, by far the more important is the 10-10 number.

EACH QUARTER, WHEN WE UPDATE the information in 10-10's computer files, managers receive copies of those portions appropriate to their call sign areas. A few months back, we ran an experiment in which managers voluntarily sent postal card reminders to individuals whose dues were overdue by not more than a year or so. From reports I have received from various managers, it appears that there has been about a 25% favorable response to the procedure. That is, about one-fourth of those to whom cards were sent responded with letters and checks in payment of dues.

Obviously, there are some costs attached to such a program. Printing, transportation to the managers, and postage are the most obvious ones, but there is also a great cost in the time and energy of those managers who participated. One basic problem remains -- we don't know whether 25% represents a good return or a miserable one. If there is anyone out there who is or has been in the magazine publishing business, I'd appreciate some dope on this. Of course, with virtually all magazines, the circulation volume determines the rates charged for advertising. The News doesn't carry advertising, so what may apply to most magazines or other journals doesn't necessarily apply to 10-10. Nevertheless, some information would certainly be preferable to our present complete ignorance.

EVERY TIME I COMPLETE THESE PAGES I send the editor for each issue, I wonder what is going to happen between the time everything is locked up and the actual mailing date.

Very often, something does happen about which we should comment, but can't. More important, it is something about which members should be alerted. The only avenue we then have is through various nets, principally the 10-10 daily net and the Coordination Net run by Connie Hauck each Sunday, although chapter nets can certainly make their contributions.

What happened this last time was that two district managers were forced by personal circumstance to resign. They were Don Grantham, WA6BCN/9, and John LaFontaine, NØADJ. Both have served you well and faithfully, and deserve your gratitude, as well as mine. They have my deep thanks.

It has been 10-10's policy for years to get input from areas involved when a new manager must be chosen. Sometimes, however, the time element is such that there just isn't a great amount of involvement possible. When that happens, we must rely on the judgment of the manager who is concluding his stint. He or she has an extensive knowledge of the area - certainly much better than any of us widely separated from it.

Don had a volunteer all ready to replace him when he wrote me of his necessary resignation. Thus, the new ninth district manager is Berniece Tielemann, N9CDO, whose address is Rte. #1, Lenzburg, IL 62255.

John didn't have a for-sure volunteer when he called me, but one speedily made his presence known, so the tenth district slot goes to Kevin Schleicher, WDØBXU, 469 Main Street, Lino Lakes, MN 55014.

Welcome aboard, Berniece and Kevin! And all the best of luck to Don and John.

FROM TIME TO TIME I HEAR COMPLAINTS about chapters, or about groups that solicit applications for certificates purporting to be 10-10, but which really are not, except that those involved may be 10-10 members. 10-10 places few restrictions on the operations of chapters. To function as a genuine 10-10 chapter, a group must apply to Connie Hauck, K6EXQ, who is Chapter Coordinator. She can supply the rules, but the main requirements are for a minimum of seven members (DX:5), a scheduled weekly net, and at least an annual report to the Chapter Coordinator by the Chapter Head.

Chief problems seem to arise with respect to certificates and upgrades. The By-Laws say only that fees charged may not exceed the amount required to recover administrative costs. Paper chasers generally recognize that printing and postage for certificates generate substantial costs; what they can't understand is the stiff fee charged for an upgrade for which the preparation and mailing costs are obviously low.

Then there is also the group or individual who issues what purports to be a "10-10 Certificate," but which really isn't. Off-hand, I can only think of a few that are issued by 10-10 as an organization. One is the certificate you get when you first become a member, and two others which represent achievements, the WAS Award, and the Countries Award. There's also another, given to those who work 500 members. At any rate, if someone tries to peddle what he says is a "10-10 Certificate," ask him if it is one that has actually been approved by 10-10.

DURING THE FALL QUARTER, there were eight Silent Keys reported in the News. For the same period, more than forty were reported to the Records Manager. Not all those mentioned in the News appeared on the records list. The principal reason is that the reporting sources vary widely. We can live with that, but it does point up a problem for the Editor. If you have suggestions, let's have them.

I TRY TO CHECK IN TO the daily net most days, but sometimes don't make it. When I do, I am struck by what sounds like a DX pileup. That gives the NCO a problem: How does he know whom to call, or how does he recognize a call sign? It's a tough job, so let's try to give him a break. I don't know how we'll do it, but give it some thought, and let's see what we can do to help out.

BILL RISHER, WB6OMH, who handles Bars from 1000 and up, as well as the plaques, says he still has a postage problem. Most applicants are fine about the SASE matter, but some forget that return postage on a plaque is 37¢, and that the fee is \$3.00. Your enclosed check, therefore, may stay at three bucks, but your SASE must have 37¢ postage on it. And don't forget the Xerox of your membership card or current addressing label, showing paid-up membership.

EVERY TIME WE HAVE A CHANGE in responsibility for an area or function - that is, a managerial change, we run into some problems connected with the transfer of records and mail. Reasons vary, but this last Christmas season was especially bad with respect to mail delivery, and particularly packages. Just remember that everyone in a 10-10 job is a volunteering worker, and he or she is spending a lot more time on it than most of you are just exchanging numbers. Let your manager know what's wrong, and it will get straightened out, but please don't get too upset about it. After all, it's just a hobby.

DURING THE PAST SIX YEARS - three as Roster Manager and three as President - I have been privileged to be a part of the central operations of 10-10. There have been many little problems, some of which turned out to be quite time-consuming, but no massive ones. Now it is time to pass things along to a new crew. Your new President will be Carl Winter, W6OAW, who has done a splendid job as Supply Manager, and the Vice-President is to be Jim Cass, AA6K, who winds up a stint as Rules and Ethics Committee Chairman. New Secretary is to be George Joy, WB6SYJ, who has done many things for 10-10. Gerry Gross, WA6POZ, continues as Treasurer.

I would be less than grateful if I did not thank those many people who have rendered service to 10-10 during the past years. You will understand that I cannot mention them by name -- there are just too many and I would be certain to forget someone. I can say, however, that without them I could not have carried on my responsibilities. Whenever asked, they responded nobly. They made my work lighter, and I am deeply thankful for that, as I am to all of you who wrote me.

EDITOR JIM MICHAELS has asked me to continue to contribute to the News, and I have said that I would, so keep your letters coming.

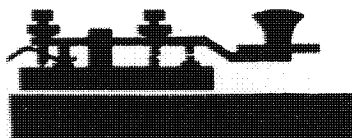

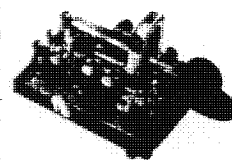

Dear Jim



CARL WINTER, -W6OAW, 10-10 No. 10947, is our President for 1983-1984. Born in Youngstown, Ohio, he attended school there. His family later moved to South Bend, Indiana, and in 1930 he went to work. Carl enlisted in the U.S. Navy in Los Angeles, and served six years as a torpedoman. He then worked as a telephone cableman for Los Angeles' Department of Water and Power, from which he retired in 1973. MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING

November 7, 1982

The meeting was opened by President Howard Bowman, and followed by the customary opening formalities. Since a picnic had replaced the summer meeting, there were no minutes. Instead, Joan McDonnell, WA6QKC, 10-10's first secretary, read the minutes of the organization's first meeting, April 29, 1962, noting that 10-10's first official QSO had been on February 9 of that year.

The meeting was then turned over to Bob Hartley, W6WPF, Chairman of the Nominating Committee. Committee members were W6EIM, W6ENC, and AA6K. The Committee presented the following recommendations: President, Carl Winter, W6OAW; Vice-President, Jim Cass, AA6K; Treasurer, Gerry Gross, WA6POZ; and Secretary, George Joy, WB6SYJ. Two floor nominations, for Bob Hartley and Norm Lefcourt, both for President, were declined. The four candidates presented were then elected by unanimous vote.

A recommendation was then made, and motion presented that the Board of Directors be increased by one, and that the outgoing president always be that member, ex officio. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

REPORTS: Gerry Gross, Treasurer reported that 10-10's net worth has increased, in part due to the work of district managers in reminding delinquent members. Connie Hauck reports that we now have more than 160 chapters. Net manager, Sherm Sherman says that control stations feel like rare DX, with 70-+ checkins daily. Awards manager Bill Risher reports that requiring payment for Bars and Plaques is working, and reminds everyone not to send in original membership cards, but rather a Xerox when making an application for an award. Jim Cass thanked the Sky Blue Waters Chapter for the efficient work done in summarizing the last contest, and reminded future contest participants of the dupe sheet requirement.

Lee Pasewalk, WB6MGM, Records Manager, was commended for his fine performance in keeping master membership records for 10-10.

Carl Winter, newly elected president, is eagerly searching for a volunteer living within 20 miles or so of Long Beach, CA (where Bert Ayers, W6CL graciously makes storage space available to 10-10) who can take over his present job of supply Manager.

BY-LAWS, 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NET, INC.,
AS AMENDED

ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of this organization shall be: 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NET, INC. In these By-laws, the abbreviation "10-10" will be used.

ARTICLE II: PURPOSES

The purposes of 10-10 are to promote amateur radio activity on the 10 meter band, to handle traffic, and to assist present and prospective radio amateurs in improving their technical skills and operating procedures.

ARTICLE III: QUALIFICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP

A licensed amateur radio operator wishing to become a member of 10-10 must qualify as follows:

- A. Submit a list of contacts with members of 10-10 on the 10 meter band. This list must number 10 contacts for all station operators, other than novices, located in the contiguous 48 states of the United States, and for all others, including United States novices, 5 such contacts.
- B. Each entry on the applicant's list shall include the operator's 10-10 number, call sign, name, station location, and the date of contact. This list, with applicable registration fee, and dues for a period of at least one year, shall be submitted to the appropriate officer of 10-10, who will issue a membership card and certificate, and assign to the applicant a unique 10-10 number.

ARTICLE IV: MEMBERSHIP DUES AND FEES

- A. The Registration Fee is \$1.00. It applies to all new applicants except novices.
- B. Membership dues are \$4.00 annually, payable in advance, for members residing in the United States; for members residing in other countries, membership dues are \$5.00 annually, payable in advance.
- C. The treasurer's annual budget forecast shall include any recommendations for changes in dues and fees which have had the prior approval of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE V: BULLETINS

Periodic bulletins will be mailed to all members not considered delinquent with respect to payment of dues. A member shall be considered delinquent if his dues are in arrears more than three months. The expiration date of membership shall be shown on the mailing label of each bulletin addressed to him.

ARTICLE VI: MEMBERSHIP ROSTER

A Membership Roster will be published from time to time, and will be made available for a fee to be announced in the most recent bulletin.

ARTICLE VII: CANCELLATION OF MEMBERSHIP

An individual's membership in 10-10 shall be canceled if he loses his privileges as an amateur radio licensee.

ARTICLE VIII: CHAPTER ORGANIZATION AND OPERATION

10-10 International Net, Inc. may authorize chapters to be formed as affiliates of the parent organization, but with no financial relationship. Such chapters should enhance the purposes of 10-10 by providing scheduled nets.

An officer of 10-10 shall coordinate chapter net frequencies and operating schedules, and shall maintain a record of active chapters, showing net frequencies and times of operation. Requirements for chapter affiliates are as follows:

- A. Each chapter must consist of at least 7 members (DX: 5) of 10-10 in good standing, with expressed willingness to conduct a scheduled net at least once each week, and to support the objectives of the parent organization.
- B. Each chapter shall select a Chapter Head, who shall report chapter activity to the Chapter Coordinator at least once each calendar year. Failure to report for a period of one year shall be cause for deleting the chapter from the list of active chapters.
- C. Chapters may issue certificates to members. However, any fees charged for such certificates shall not exceed the amount required to recover administrative costs.

ARTICLE IX: ADMINISTRATION

- A. The elected officers of 10-10 International Net, Inc. shall be:
 - 1. President
 - 2. Vice-president
 - 3. Treasurer (and Corporate Secretary)
 - 4. Recording Secretary
- B. The appointed officers of 10-10 International Net, Inc. shall be designated by the president with the approval of the Board of Directors, and shall be:
 - 1. One regional manager for each call sign area in the United States
 - 2. Awards Manager
 - 3. Bulletin Editor
 - 4. Chapter Coordinator
 - 5. Contest Manager
 - 6. Records Manager
 - 7. Roster Manager
 - 8. Supply Manager
 - 9. 10-10 International Net Manager
 - 10. Such other managers as required

ARTICLE X: BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- A. The Board of Directors shall consist of eight members. Four of these members shall be the elected officers of 10-10. The immediate past-president shall be a member, ex-officio. Three members shall be appointed by the President, with the approval of the membership.
- B. The term of office of an appointed Director shall be three years. However, the initial appointments shall be made as follows: one Director for a one year term of office, one Director for a two year term of office, and one Director for a three year term of office.

ARTICLE XI: MEETINGS

- A. Annual Meeting: The annual meeting of the 10-10 International Net, Inc., for the election of officers and for such other business which may properly come before the meeting, will be held on the first Sunday of November of each year. Advance notice of said annual meeting, giving time and place, will be provided the membership through the regular 10-10 Bulletin or the 10-10 Nets at least 30 days before the annual meeting date, and if via radio, will be repeated daily or as often as possible on said 10-10 Nets.
- B. Other Meetings: Advance notice of other than annual meetings, which may be called by the President at any time, or if such a meeting is requested in writing by at least ten members, will be placed in the 10-10 Bulletin whenever possible so as to provide 30 days notice. When not possible, advance notice of such meetings, giving date, time, and place, will be provided through the 10-10 Nets via amateur radio with as much advance notice as possible, except that if amendment to the By-laws and/or election of officers is on such meeting agenda, then a minimum of 30 days advance notice via amateur radio on the 10-10 Nets, or otherwise, must be provided.
- C. The quorum required for the annual meeting or for any other meeting is ten members, of whom at least two must be elected officers.
- D. The routine business of 10-10 shall be conducted by the Board of Directors.
- E. The presence of a quorum is required to conduct business at any meeting.

ARTICLE XII: ELECTION AND APPOINTMENT OF OFFICERS

- A. The terms of office of elected officers shall be two years, and shall commence on the first day of the calendar year next following their election.
- B. The terms of office of appointed officers shall coincide with that of the President.
- C. Within sixty days of his assumption of office, the President shall appoint a Nominating Committee Chairman, whose function shall be to search out and propose for election or appointment candidates for any office for which a vacancy may occur.
- D. So far as possible, the designation of a nominee for a position in any geographic area shall come about as a result of a selection process conducted within that area.
- E. The election of officers and confirmation of the appointment of directors shall occur at an annual meeting, and shall be by majority vote of the members present.
- F. Only paid-up members of 10-10 are eligible to be nominated or elected or appointed to office.

ARTICLE XIII: DUTIES OF ELECTED OFFICERS

- A. The duties of the President shall be:
 - 1. To act as the chief executive officer of 10-10.
 - 2. To preside over the annual meeting, and over all meetings of the Board of Directors.
 - 3. To perform such other duties as specified in the By-laws.
- B. The duties of the Vice-president shall be:
 - 1. To assume the duties of the President in the event of the inability of the President to serve.
 - 2. To perform such other duties as may be assigned by the President.

- C. The duties of the Treasurer (and Corporate Secretary) shall be:
 - 1. To receive and disburse all funds.
 - 2. To act as Corporate Secretary; to prepare and submit such reports as may be legally required by the state or federal government.
 - 3. To prepare, each fiscal year, a proposed budget for submission to the Board of Directors.
 - 4. To make periodic reports to the general membership on the financial status of the organization.
 - 5. To make all financial records available for audit at the conclusion of each fiscal year.
- D. The duties of the Recording Secretary shall be:
 - 1. To maintain a continuous record of all actions taken by the Board of Directors or by the membership at any annual or other meeting.
 - 2. To prepare for publication in the Bulletin reports of actions taken by the Board of Directors or by the general membership.

ARTICLE XIV: AMENDMENTS TO THESE BY-LAWS

- A. Amendments to these By-laws may be suggested to the Board of Directors by any member of 10-10.
- B. Amendments to these By-laws shall be submitted to a membership meeting by the Board of Directors, with an affirmative vote of at least four directors being necessary for such submission.
- C. Advance notice of any proposal to amend these By-laws shall be given as specified in Article XI, Sections A and B.
- D. These By-laws may be amended by a majority vote of the members present at any membership meeting at which the proposed amendment is properly submitted.

ARTICLE XV: FINANCES

- A. Expenses other than those forecast in the budget may not be incurred, except on a majority vote of the Board of Directors.
- B. The financial records of 10-10 shall be audited annually by an individual or by a committee appointed by the President with the concurrence of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XVI: 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NET

- A. As a corollary to the purposes set forth in Article II, 10-10 shall conduct a daily (except Sunday) net at 1800 hours, UTC, on a frequency of 28,800 MHz. This shall be known as the 10-10 International Net.
- B. Management of the operations of the daily net is the function of the 10-10 International Net Manager.

ARTICLE XVII: COMMITTEES

- A. The President is authorized to appoint such ad hoc committees as may, from time to time, appear to be desirable.
- B. The President shall be a member, ex officio, of all committees of which he is not the designated presiding officer.

ARTICLE XVIII: PARLIAMENTARY RULES

Procedures not covered by these By-laws shall be governed by Roberts' Rules of Order.

ARTICLE XIX: DATE OF EFFECT

This revision of the By-laws was adopted at a regular membership meeting held on November 4, 1979, and shall become effective January 1, 1980.

How to become a Ten-Ten Member

Work 10 present members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, date worked, op's name, location. Send list to your Call Sign Area Manager, with \$1 Registration Fee, \$4 for first years dues (foreign \$5). Novices, foreign applicants need work only 5 present members; novices pay no Registration Fee. You will receive a Certificate, and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the News, and participate fully in all activities.

How to earn Bars and Plaques

Log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters, all bona-fide number exchanges on the air. Then list 100, no more, no less, no duplicates, thus:

1. List in serial order of 10-10 numbers. Show call, handle and location.
2. Submit only one list of 100 at a time.
3. Log books or copies of log book pages are not acceptable.
4. Give your name, address, call sign, 10-10 number, and state which Bar you are requesting (i.e., 100 Bar, 200 Bar etc.)
5. Enclose a large size SASE (20¢ First Class).
6. Mail as follows: 100-900 Bars, Willie E. Madison, WB7VZI, 10512 W. Butler Dr., Peoria, AZ 85345. 1000 Bar and up, Bill Risher, WB6OMH, P.O. Box 277, Twin Peaks, CA 92391.

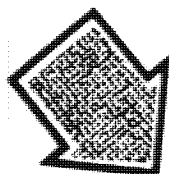

Also include alphabetic list of states with full information on each contact, your own complete information, including 10-10 number, and \$2.60 U.S. funds for cost of certificate and return postage. 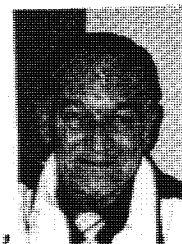
