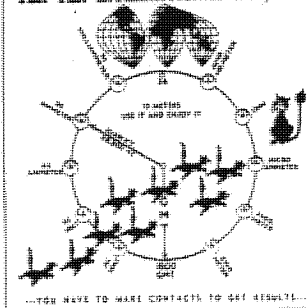

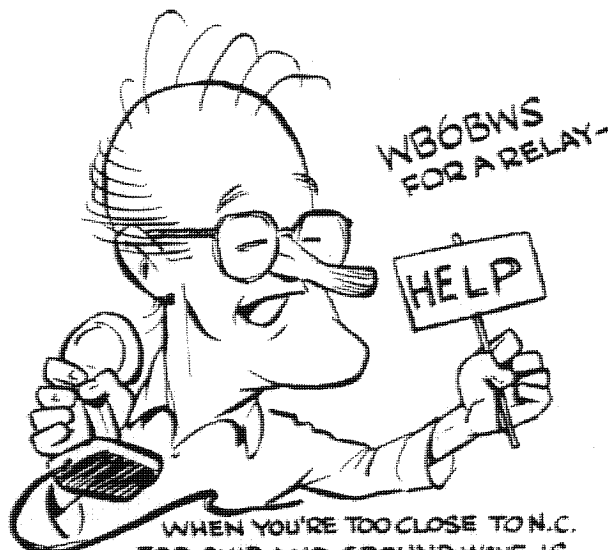

ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS IN THE PAST I have written of operators who passed along 10-10 numbers that turned out to be figments of their imaginations. Once I even figured out how it might happen in a sort of innocent, semi-legitimate fashion, and offered that as a possibility. Now they are back with us again, and my theory doesn't wash.

On the Monday after the winter QSO Party, I was called by a friend on the east coast who asked about a certain station and the number he had given. It was unreasonably high, and my friend questioned it, and rightly so. It turned out to be illegitimate. After talking with Jim Cass, AA6K, who prepared the rules, I sent letters to Tom Gilbreath, WD5BFO, who headed up the checking crew, and to Harry Syring, WBLFTQ, who was also concerned. Both confirmed my concern.

In a situation like this, a false number is relatively unimportant except in those instances in which there may be but a one point score difference between the winner and the second place operator. If the winner had used this or another false number in arriving at his score, problems arise, and call for a careful check of both logs. Tom's reply to me indicated that he had been informed, not only of the one I told him about, but of another who had used an impossibly high number, as well as an additional instance of a chap using several different numbers over a period of time.

During the years I have been a ham, I have seen numerous instances, as have many of you, of the operators who deliberately set out to mess up the operations of other individuals or groups. These days they are especially prevalent on two meters, although my observation is that the situation there is much less difficult than it was a few years back. There have been a number of license revocations.

As members of 10-10, there isn't much we can do about the fakers, except to recognize them for what they are. I know that both of the Bar award managers are alert to them. Sooner or later, any faker gives himself away.

THERE IS ANOTHER SITUATION THAT ANNOYS ME, especially when the offending operator is a 10-10 member, because he should know better. It's the one we have almost every day on 28,800 at 1800Z. It's the chap who is so greedy for certificate numbers and upgrades that he is operating on that frequency at that time because there are a lot of 10-10 members listening. He doesn't want to bother to check in with the 10-10 daily net because to do so would take him away from his chosen mission in life - papering the walls of his shack.

The chap who isn't a member has a right to the frequency, and net control moves off to one side to give him some operating room. The chap who is a member has a technical right to the frequency, too, but he knows, or should know, that he's abusing that right. Of course, those of you who bother to read this know that there's a cure for this kind of thoughtlessness. It is simply to give him a call and suggest that the two of you move off net frequency to exchange the requested numbers. I tried it a few weeks back, with a chap who had a strong signal on 28,800.2 -- close enough to cause net control some problems. It worked fine, up to a point. I left the frequency and so did he. But I never did hear him check in or ask for a relay. Maybe I hurt his feelings.

IF WE ARE LUCKY, WE MANAGE TO SELL OUT our stock of the Roster before its obsolescence forces a new version. That's what has happened this time, so there will be a new, updated version about May 1. So far as we can tell in advance, the price of \$3.50 per copy will not change, although the new book will be longer in its contents. However, that price is a tentative matter, and maybe the weight will increase postage costs too much.

As always, you order the Roster through your District Manager, using the order form on Page 31, and it will be mailed to you.

MUCH OF THE WORK on the new listings has been done by Records Manager Lee Pasewalk, WB6MGM, who is an unsung hero of 10-10. Lee has the job of keeping complete records on all membership changes. Most of these are sent to him by District Managers, but he picks up many from various other sources, especially Silent Keys and call sign changes. Lee tells me that this new Roster will be completely updated as per the very latest information, including the 1983 Call Book.

When all of this information has been assembled into one listing each quarter, it goes to the computer facility that handles 10-10's work. One of Lee's recent covering notes to the facility indicated that he was sending 679 new members, 1382 dues renewals, 64 call sign changes, 132 address changes, 18 changes of call sign and address, 64 silent keys, and 9 name changes, for a total of 2368 entries.

One of the products of the computer run is what is called the Directory. It is a complete listing of all information on each member. Lee keeps a set of these on file, and if we need information about some member back in an earlier year, it is Lee who can unearth the information, given a bit of time for the research. Considering that he holds a full-time responsible job, and likes to get in some running time on a near-by track each day, the amount of 10-10 work he gets done is incredible.

IN THE LAST ISSUE, I OBSERVED that things were likely to happen on or after the deadline for a News issue. This time, there was a bit of notice, but things got difficult for other reasons. About a week prior to the deadline, I received a telephone call from Harry Syring, WB1FTQ, who has been 10-10's DX Manager for several years. Harry had been trying to get Carl Winter, 10-10's President, to no avail. Good reason. Carl was out of town, visiting a daughter up in Ogden, Utah, and not expected back for several days. Harry called me because he had my number, and knew I could probably get hold of people locally.

Everyone recognizes the great job Harry has done for 10-10, but circumstances have combined to make it very difficult for him to continue. Harry did find a replacement, however, who is just as widely known as he is, and who is willing to take on an exacting job. He is Carl Schoen, W4NJS, who lives down in Winston-Salem NC, and who holds No. 13196.

The actual transfer of responsibility will not be totally effective until June 1, 1983, but between now and then, Harry and Carl will be transferring materials and ideas, and everything will be in operation by that date. Carl lives at 2616 Glenhaven Lane, Winston-Salem NC 27106. He is CH of the Old North State Chapter, and active on a number of nets. You'll also find him listed on pages 2 and 31.

THAT'S ABOUT IT FOR THIS TIME, so we'll close with this plea: if you want me or Carl Winter or Jim Michaels, or any other News contributor to write about something of interest to you, write a letter. There is only so much any of us can write about without your help. Our addresses are in the Call Book.

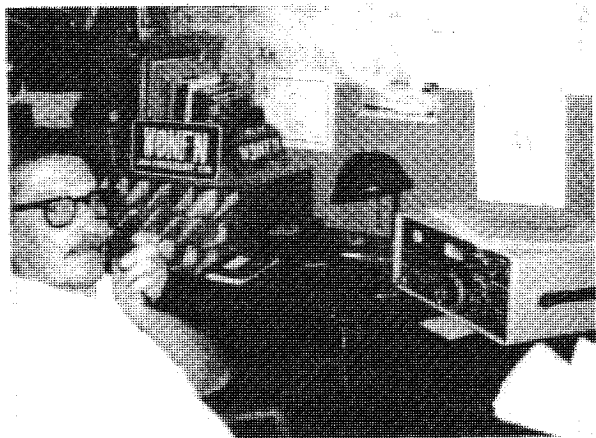

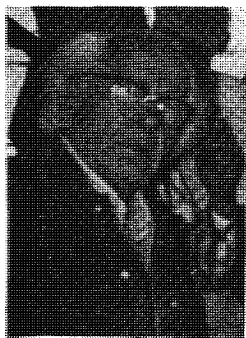

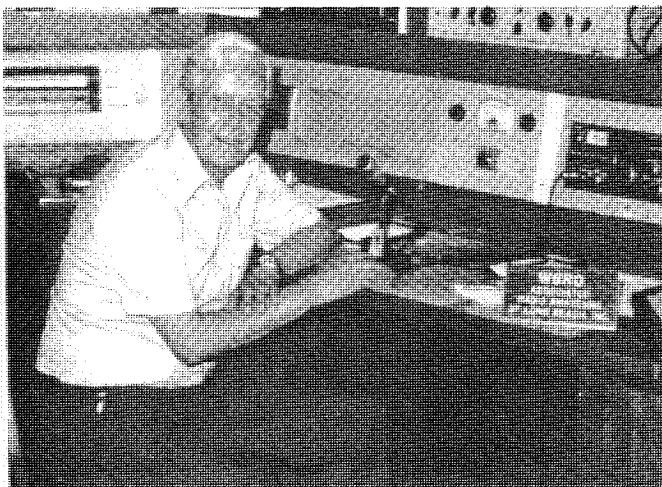

Cost of the certificate is given for stateside and DX should add enough money to the basic for return postage. All of this and much more is in the certificate directory available from W4YHF/Jim Beswick Rt. 5 Box 778 Owltown Mt., Ellijay, GA. 30540. Cost is \$3.50 +3FCS stateside and \$4.50 for DX. It really is a must for all who collect certificates.

Some of the chapters have been adding nets without checking to see if the frequency is available. I assign more than one chapter to the same frequency but not the same time and day so you could easily land on another net. PLEASE follow the guidelines that were sent you and check before you move. Just in case that some of the new chapter heads have not gotten the guidelines, I will mail them out to all so that you will have the chapter head guidelines.

The information given in the Closed Contest had two mistakes in it. KE6ID should read K6EID and LU1BT should be LU1ABT. Sorry for the goof.

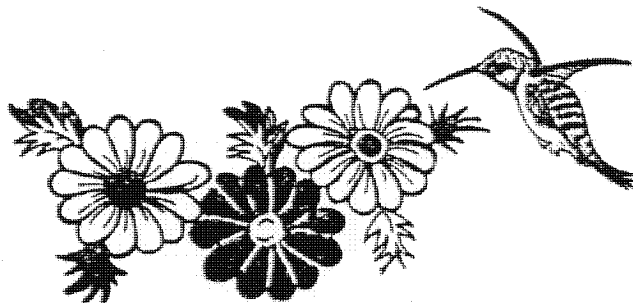

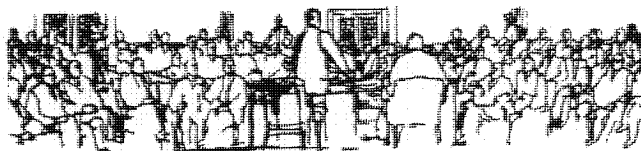

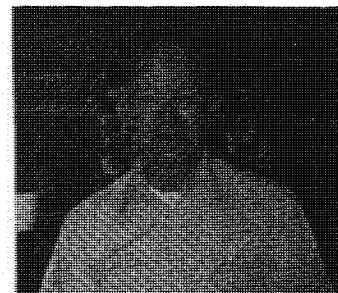

How to become a Ten-Ten Member

Work 10 present members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, date worked, op's name, location. Send list to your Call Sign Area Manager, with \$1 Registration Fee, \$4 for first years dues (foreign \$5). Novices, foreign applicants need work only 5 present members; novices pay no Registration Fee. You will receive a Certificate, and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the News, and participate fully in all activities.

How to earn Bars and Plaques

Log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters, all bona-fide number exchanges on the air. Then list 100, no more, no less, no duplicates, thus:

1. List in serial order of 10-10 numbers. Show call, handle and location.
2. Submit only one list of 100 at a time.
3. Log books or copies of log book pages are not acceptable.

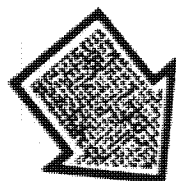

After working and getting QSL card confirmation on one 10-10 member in each of 50 states, prepare an alphabetical list by states with full data on each contact. Mail cards and list to Susan Brackeen, KALCAD, P.O. Box 7081, Johnston, RI 02919. U. S., Canadian, Mexican members send \$2.42, U.S. funds, for certificate cost and return postage. Overseas members may save about half the postage cost by sending non-returnable copies of QSL cards (Fax, Xerox, etc.). More than one card per sheet is OK, but all required information must appear, including 10-10 number. Show both sides of card only if necessary for complete information. Also include alphabetic list of states with full information on each contact, your own complete information, including 10-10 number, and \$2.60 U.S. funds for cost of certificate and return postage. Address application to KALCAD, as shown above. Please do not send cash.

Countries Award

The Countries Award is given for confirmation (QSL's) of QSO's exchanging 10-10 numbers with members in 25 or more countries. Cost is \$5.00, U.S. funds. For complete rules and application form, send business size (#10) SASE to Alan Sherman, KLAS, RR#2, Box 662, Danielson, CT 06239, U.S.A.
