



from the Directors

THOSE OF US WHO CHECK IN WITH THE 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NET REGULARLY find that the net control operator each Tuesday is Al Lee, W6RNX, No. 92. That low number shows that Al is an old-timer with 10-10. Elsewhere in this issue is a picture of Al at his operating position, holding his faithful 10-10 model cornet. As you may guess from the uniform, Al is a member of a Salvation Army Band. When I last spoke with him at an eyeball during the 10-10 quarterly meeting, Al told me he couldn't even guess what he was looking up toward when the picture was taken, except that he had set up the camera on the timer and had to pose himself.

Al's musical career goes all the way back to his school days. As a youngster he played in a band which gave a concert under the direction of the legendary bandmaster, John Philip Sousa. After he became a member of a Salvation Army band, he was, for fifteen years, the first chair cornetist. He has marched and played in parades all up and down the Pacific Coast. Al is retired from the Southern Pacific Railroad, and lives in Palmdale, California.

THERE IS SOME OTHER NEWS ABOUT net control operators, too. Saturday is normally a rather busy day on the 10-10 net, when the band is open, and for a long time the NCO for Saturday was Bud Bostick, back in Nashville, Music City. Bud became ill some months ago, and has had a long, slow recovery. His stint as NCO has been taken over by others of the Music City Chapter. Bud would welcome your letters or cards, and can be reached either at his Call Book address, where mail is picked up regularly, or at the address to which he has moved while recuperating, which is 548 Ocala Drive, Nashville, TN 37211.

I DON'T KNOW WHAT THE CURRENT LIST WILL SHOW as the Friday NCO, but the last issue indicated that it was Connie Hauck, K6EXQ. Back during last winter's desperate months, most of the country was preoccupied with the weather, and this part of California was no exception. What hit us here was wind, a nasty blow called a Santa Ana, which we have when there is low pressure off the coast and high pressure inland. It whistles down through the passes in the San Gabriel Mountains and gets hotter and faster.

In this case it had it in for Connie. At the last quarterly meeting, she told us that she had spent that time in dread, hoping and praying that the tower would land on her house, rather than a neighbor's. I don't know where the tower landed, but it did, and so did the other antennas. She will get back on the air, but she doesn't quite know how or when. Be patient; you'll hear her voice again, maybe by the time this appears. One thing I know about Connie: you can't keep her down for long. Of course, you also know that Connie is 10-10's Chapter Coordinator, and her happy news about chapters appears further along in this issue.

HAVING WRITTEN ABOUT CONNIE'S ANTENNA DISASTER reminds me that a year or so back I had a silly thing happen to mine during a similar blow. When things had calmed down, Edith, the XYL, informed me that 'Something is wrong with one of those antennas.' So it was. The reflector was at about a 45° angle with respect to the other elements.

It wasn't much trouble to lower the antenna (when I finally got around to it), and when it was within reach, I grabbed the boom with one hand and the reflector with the other and tried to get it straight so I could tighten up on the U-bolt. The element moved all right, but so did the boom. How could that happen when the other elements didn't move?

What I discovered was that I had been trapped by my own inexperience. Every other antenna I have used has had a one-piece boom. This one didn't. It had a boom fabricated from three pieces of tubing (for reasons of easy shipment, I suppose). The center section was slotted at each end, and there was a good stainless steel clamp provided for fastening in each end piece. My inexperience had led me to place one clamp too close to the bottom of the slot, where its effectiveness was inade-quate. The fix took less than a minute. Getting the antenna up again was something else. However, I had the satisfaction of the antenna surviving this last blow - the one that did in Connie's tower, without any further twisting.

YOU MAY HAVE NOTICED THAT THE FOURTH CALL AREA is somewhat of an anomaly among the various 10-10 districts, in that it not only has a Manager, but also three sub-Managers, each of whom handles two or three states. For many years, Clint Paine, KLEKX, who lives in Port Richey, Florida, has been the Manager for the fourth, and has also handled Florida and Puerto Rico.

Some months back, Clint decided to hang 'em up, and looked for a replacement. He found a good one. Dave Buschow, WDLMPO, No. 26258. Dave lives in Virginia and is a very active 10-10 member. You'll find his complete address back on P. 31. He will be the head Manager for the fourth call area, and will take care of members in Florida and Puerto personally.

There is also a change in one of the sub-areas, where Doug Henry, WALSFN, has been taking care of members in Kentucky and Tennessee. Doug resigned and has been replaced by Ollive C. Justice, who lives in Pikeville, KY. His call is NAIT.

MENTIONING DAVE BUSCHOW REMINDS ME THAT some time back he volunteered to maintain a computer program clearing house specializing in 10-10 information. Dave said, "More and more Ten-tenners are procuring and using home computers for the retention of 10-X information, such as 10-X numbers, certificate numbers and all other info pertaining to our organization. Everyone is looking for good solid programs that can be used for the many different brands of computers." Get in touch with Dave on the air, or at 7725 Fisher Drive, Falls Church, VA 22043.

I HAVE NO IDEA WHAT HAPPENED WITH RESPECT TO MAIL DELIVERY OF THE LAST ISSUE of this publication. All I can say for sure is that they went to the post office on January 20, as verified by the postmark on the mailing receipt. On February 21 I heard from a member in Florida that he had not yet received his. My own copy didn't get here for more than three weeks - a distance of about 15 miles. So far as I can see, there is no rational relationship between the distance to be traveled and the time it takes to get there. If there is someone among our members who has the lowdown on how and why this happens, I'd like to know about it.

John Wessels, VK6NWS, who lives in Western Australia, says he wishes there were some way to speed up delivery of the News to overseas members. So do I, John. Indeed, the way things went last time, I'd settle for some way to speed them up to members right here in the U. S.

In connection with the speed of mail delivery, I had a note from a member who suggested that the cut-off date for contests be that upon which the entry was mailed, rather than that upon which it was received by the contest committee. This sounds like one of those ideas that would be 'nice' but is a tad impractical. The contest rules have this provision already, but I suspect the scoring group may find that it complicates things. We'll see.

THIS IS THE TIME OF THE YEAR WHEN WE begin to make plans for a new edition of the Membership Roster. It's always a battle between keeping it legible on the one hand, and reasonable in price on the other. This year's Roster turned out to be a vast improvement over previous ones, mainly because the computer facility that does 10-10's work suggested using a different printer to produce the original. This doesn't eliminate errors, of course, but it does make it easier to decide if any found are really errors or just poorly formed letters or numbers.

When the new Roster does come out, probably around May 1, it will be a larger book than the current edition, and a larger book weighs more, which is just a sneaky way of saying that it will probably cost more to print and bind and to mail. The current Roster sells for \$3.50 postpaid in the U. S., and I would guess that the new price will probably be at least a dollar more. If there's more precise information at press time, it will appear on Page 31 on the Order Form.

One thing I can guarantee is that there will be some gripes because call signs have been omitted from the new edition. If you've become a member, or changed your call sign, and all this has been properly reported so that you are included by the end of March, there should be no hitch. Problems arise because people join after the area managers have submitted their March reports, and the call signs of these people just don't get included. Most years a few of these tardy ones find their way into the hands of Records Manager Lee Pasewalk. He advises me, and I type up the call signs and paste them up on the copy. You can identify these after the book is printed because the type style is the same as you are reading now, rather than the style that is typical of the rest of the book.

A LETTER CAME FROM WARREN WHELAN, WB20NA, who says he was not aware of the objections some members who participate in the 10-10 contests have to dupe sheets. Warren, who has taken part in many contests, says that if people were aware of what great timesavers dupe sheets are, they likely wouldn't complain. Maybe so, but I remain skeptical. It seems to me, without doing any counting of letters, that most people who have written are new members who haven't heretofore taken part in any contests and simply don't know what is meant by a dupe sheet.

A copy of Warren's letter went to Harry Syring, WBIFTQ, who is chairman of the Rules Committee, and maybe Harry can find some way of incorporating into contest announcements a sentence making members aware of Warren's offer, which is to send to anyone who asks for it and sends an SASE, a copy of such a sheet. Harry's address is P. O. Box 1h2, Sayreville, NJ 08872. Don't forget the SASE!

REMEMBER THAT IF YOU WANT TO SEND ME a letter with a gripe, a suggestion, a question, a statement of principle, or just a plain old friendly chat about anything at all, my address is 5872 W. 77 Place, Los Angeles, CA 90045.

A LETTER ALSO CAME FROM GUY BUCKLAND, WALDUG, who holds 10-10 No. 214. Buck is retired after years on the road working nothing but QRP mobile with about 10 watts of power. His chief complaint is that he doesn't often find anyone who will relay his signal to 10-10 net control. Don't let that throw you, Buck. I often have the same problem with about 90 watts. Things are getting better in that department, though, even if conditions haven't been the best this last winter.

Buck's low 10-10 number suggests I should remind recent members that the lowest numbers don't necessarily reflect the order in which hams became 10-10 members. The organization had several hundred members before some one had the idea of issuing numbers, and numbers for those who were members at the time were assigned by lot.

Treasurer WA6PDZ- Gerry Gross informed us there is sometimes a delay of 60 days on membership checks because of handling. 10-10 monies have been consolidated and he is awaiting printing and UPS billing.

K6AYU-Jo is awaiting the printing of new rosters due about May and reports because of third class mailing normally rosters are not returned to her for incorrect addresses, etc.

W6EHM- Morrie credits W6CL Bert Avers for the survival of 10-10 in the lean times because of his help in the beginning.

W6WPY- Bob Hartley calls for new volunteers saying normally the same people have volunteered their time for five or seven years.

W6GIR- Howard Bowman reminds us the principal place of business for 10-10 must be in California and WB6YYI- Hans mentioned that Officers for 10-10 can be in othersections of the country excluding the office of treasurer.

W6GIR- Howard is working on the layout of the new roster, due about May. Again the question as to whether we will raise the cost of the roster because the additions will add to the cost of printing and therefore put us over the 6 ounce rate of printed matter.

K6EXQ- Connie Hauck reports her beam down in three pieces because of high winds. She wonders if the bands are really going down because there's always someone out of state responding. She reports Bud- W4WHM will soon have a beam up at his apartment so he can get on the air.

K6PTF- Sherm, International Net Manager reports the primary purpose of the 10-10 net is checkins and welcomes chit-chat to keep the frequency active while waiting for check-ins. He suggested the board take some responsibility from Bert for printing to help get supplies out to District Managers.

WB60MH- Bill Risher brought regards from WINC who couldn't make the dinner!! Bill reports four people over their 10,000 bars!

W6IRT- Norm Lefcourt reports code practice on 28.888 - 24 hours. Says there's no one on the air before the 10-10 net but there are plenty of out of state check-ins when least expected.

WB6YJJ- Jack suggested a quarterly update for the roster and has volunteered to take over the project of a new numbers list only. Jack is considering ways to accomplish this and requests 3 S.A.S.E.'s PLUS \$3.00 to cover the cost of printing. Jack is taking this on as an individual endeavor.





Ten-Ten QSO parties are open to all amateurs but only paid-up members are eligible for awards or chapter assignment of scores. They are conducted to encourage Ten Meter operation and interest in the Net. Non-members may use numbers collected to qualify for membership; members use them for awards.

RULES

- 1. All contacts must take place between 28.5 and 29.4 Mhz.
- 2. Exchange: Callsign, Name, City, State, and 10-10 number.
- 3. A station may be counted only once.
- 4. Single operator stations only are acceptable.
- 5. SSB, FM or AM modes are acceptable.
- 6. All contacts must take place within the 48 hour contest period.
- QRP class limit is 10 watts output.
 Logs must be kept in UTC (Zulu time)
- 9. A Dupe Sheet is required of all participants submitting logs.
- 10. Chapter assignment of scores may be only by a paid-up member, belonging to that chapter as a local member, and able to work that chapter net via groundwave from the location of the station working the contest.
- 11. Illegible or improperly submitted logs may be rejected.
- 12. Failure to comply with any of these rules or their intent may result in disqualification.

SCORING

- 1. Two points for each contact with a 10-10 number exchange.
- 2. One point for each contact without a 10-10 number exchange.

AWARDS

First place certificates and first place QRP class certificates to all U.S. call areas, KL7, KH, all VE Districts, So. America, Central America Caribbean (including Bermuda), Europe, Africa, Asia, Australia, New Zealand and the South Pacific. Individual and chapter scores are published in the 10-10 NEWS.

LOG SUBMISSION

Logs are accepted from Ten-Ten members only and must be legible, in UTC, and complete. Each line entry must show the Callsign, Time, Name, QTH, and 10-10 number (if any). A cover sheet is required showing your name, Callsign, QTH, 10-10 number, membership expiration date, chapter assignment (if any), total contacts and total points claimed. Please indicate if QRP and list output power. A cover sheet can be found on the rear page of the 10-10 NEWS. A Dupe Sheet must accompany all logs. Logs must be postmarked no later than September 1, 1984 and mailed to:



When the band was hot and DX was plentiful, getting up into the high numbers for the DX AWARD was no problem, says Alan Sherman, KlAS, who administers the program. Current band conditions have made it tough to qualify for increments in groups of ten, as was originally planned, so Al has come up with an idea based on many suggestions from members who have qualified.

Starting about May 1, 1984, the DX AWARD will operate as at present up to 75 contacts, but thereafter will make incremental awards based on five contacts rather than ten. That should make it easier for everyone to have tangible evidence of progress into the stratospheric regions.

10-10 INFORMATION

How to become a Ten-Ten Member

Work 10 present members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, date worked, op's name, location. Send list to your Call Sign Area Manager, with \$1 Registration Fee, \$4 for first years dues(foreign \$5,U.S.). Novices, foreign applicants need work only 5 present members; novices pay no Registration Fee. You will receive a Certificate, and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the News, and participate fully in all activities.

How to earn Bars and Plaques

Log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters, all bona-fide number exchanges on the air. Then list 100, no more, no less, no duplicates, thus:

1. List in serial order of 10-10 numbers. Show call, handle and location.

2. Submit only one list of 100 at a time.

- 3. Log books or copies of log book pages are not acceptable.
- 4. Give your name, address, call sign, 10-10 number, and state which Bar you are requesting (i.e., 100 Bar, 200 Bar etc.)
 5. Enclose a large size SASE (20¢ First Class).

6. Mail as follows: 100-900 Bars, Willie E. Madison, WB7VZI, 10512 W. Butler Dr., Peoria, AZ 85345. 1000 Bar and up, Bill Risher, WB60MH, P.O. Box 277, Twin Peaks, CA 92391.

With your 500 Bar comes an honorary V.P. Number, and other activities. A 500 Certificate costs \$1. Plaques are awarded for 1000, 2500 and 5000 contacts, and cost \$3 each plus 37¢ postage. Make checks payable to 10-10 Int'1 Net, Inc Please do not send cash.

How to earn WAS

After working and getting QSL card confirmation on one 10-10 member in each of 50 states, prepare an alphabetical list by states with full data on each contact. Mail cards and list to Susan Brackeen, KAlCAD, P.O. Box 7081, Johnston, RI 02919. U. S., Canadian, Mexican members send \$2.42, U.S. funds, for certificate cost and return postage. Overseas members may save about half the postage cost by sending non-returnable copies of QSL cards (Fax, Xerox, etc.). More than one card per sheet is OK, but all required information must appear, including 10-10 number. Show both sides of card only if necessary for complete information. Also include alphabetic list of states with full information on each contact, your own complete information, including 10-10 number, and \$2.60 U.S. funds for cost of certificate and return postage. Address application to KAICAD, as shown above. Please do not send cash.

Countries Award

The Countries Award is given for confirmation (QSL's) of QSO's exchanging 10-10 numbers with members in 25 or more countries. Cost is \$5.00, U.S. funds For complete rules and application form, send business size (#10) SASE to Alan Sherman, KlAS, RR#2, Box 662, Danielson, CT 06239, U.S.A.
