



NEWS *from the* Directors

MOST OF THE INFORMATION OF ONE KIND OR ANOTHER that comes in to Editor Jim Michaels or to me or to most other 10-10 officers and managers comes by mail, which means that we don't have any immediate way of asking questions to clear up points that puzzle us. For example, one of my regular correspondents signs his notes with his handle, knowing that I have his full name, call sign, and address safely filed away. But there are others who sign their notes the same way, leaving me not a clue as to who sent me the correspondence.

Jim has a comparable problem. He gets, for example, nice clear pictures which he would like to use, but the information supplied is insufficient for identification. Of course, the whole picture is complicated by the call sign confusion. Someone in a picture is identified by a 1 x 2 or 2 x 1 call sign, but no such call sign appears in the 10-10 records. The reason, of course, is that the individual so identified has upgraded but hasn't notified 10-10.

Here's another one I picked up one day on a local net. Ham A received a packet of materials from Ham B in another part of the state, with the request that he forward the materials to Ham C, who was identified by first and last names. The problem was that Ham A simply didn't know anyone by those names. He was stopped dead in his tracks, but, being a good, resourceful ham, he asked if anyone on the net knew anyone by those names. It turned out that someone recognized the names and the problem was solved.

Those three paragraphs were a sort of long-winded way of saying, "Better too much rather than too little". If you send me a letter about something, or send Jim or Connie Hauck a letter, or send a photograph to Jim, include all the information about everyone, and remember that those upgraded call signs often leave us more puzzled than enlightened. If you know the earlier call signs, include them, too.

LAST TIME I WROTE THE FIRST PAGE of my three on my old typewriter, then switched over to this one, which I had just bought. I pointed out that I would doubtless make many errors, and that I counted on you to point them out to me. Since then I have had quite a bit of practice, none of which does very much to make it possible for a typist who is strictly hunt-and-peck to get up to speed on an electronic device which has a personality, not to say a mind, of its own. This machine has a correction tape which lifts off the ink when I make an error. It will give you some idea of where I stand when I tell you that I have already used up one correction tape and am well into another. I guess I'd better go out and buy a spare.

TOWARD THE END OF WHAT I WROTE LAST TIME, I mentioned that if President Carl Winter had finalized matters with Wes Emerson, WB6GWS, Wes would be listed on p. 2 as Supply Manager. All went as we had supposed it had, and Wes has things well in hand. He has managed to get the printing done, has a supply of various items at his disposal, and has sent packages to the various managers who have been hurting for supplies. And, by the way, if you look up Wes' call sign in the Call Book, you'll find that it refers to him as Grahame W. Emerson, Don't let that fool you. His handle is Wes.

BACK DURING THE SUMMER I RECEIVED a copy of the LIARS FLYER, which is the newsletter of the LIARS Chapter. At the time I didn't know who had sent it to me, but it turned out to be Rich Levy, WB2MAN, who was 10-10's second district manager at one time, and who is now CH of the LIARS Chapter.

Anyhow, the reason I mention this is because this little publication must surely be regarded as a gem by those who receive it around the New York metropolitan area. It has more information and other useful stuff packed into it than one would think possible for such a small publication. Cast your eyes over this list of goodies: an article on the 10-10 summer QSO Party, another on the Metro Net, which is a joint undertaking of the six NYC metropolitan area chapters, another on the 10-10 contest history of those same chapters, and a third, written by Larry Berger, WA2SUH, who is the second district manager for 10-10, detailing the many facets of his job. And in addition to all that, there is a listing of 10 meter beacon stations throughout the world, a listing of all the local nets, and an ARRL-type dupe sheet. My copy also had a separate sheet which was a contest log!

As I said, I didn't at first know who had been so kind as to send me the FLYER, but a few weeks later a letter came from Rich, in which I discovered that he had sent it. Rich also pointed out that the mailing labels carry a line that reads, "10-10 Expiration." Before each mailing, he and Larry go over Larry's records and update this line. Rich also said that they mail out about 250 copies, including a number of complimentary copies, and of these, 102 were paid-up 10-10 members.

YOU MAY REMEMBER THAT IN THE LAST ISSUE I called your attention to the high proportion of paid-up 10-10 members on the 'regular check-in' list of an unnamed chapter. I said that I would mention the records of other chapters if you would send them in. The mailing list of those who receive the LIARS FLYER doesn't really qualify for comparison with the other chapter I wrote about because the data sources were quite different. Nevertheless, I can only wish that 10-10 in general did as well as that LIARS mailing list indicates.

In listening around locally, I cannot help having observed that there is a local chapter which includes dates in the stuff members give out when passing numbers around. I am not a member of the chapter, and have no idea of the purpose of the dates, but having heard it gives me an idea. Suppose that every chapter net control officer asked that members, when checking in, read out also their 10-10 expiration dates. Maybe that would put some social pressure on those who have been lax and let their 10-10 memberships lapse. Of course, I realize that if the chap checking in doesn't have a recent copy of the News, he probably won't know his expiration date, but that lack of knowledge, in itself, is sufficient to tip everyone off to the fact that here is someone we need to work on. Just remember, unless we have renewals, 10-10 is not likely to survive. And, in case you are wondering, the copy of the LIARS FLYER that came to me didn't have my expiration date. That was because Larry and Rich had no way of knowing what it was. Just to satisfy everyone's curiosity, it is 0685.

And now that I have invited letters, not only from chapter heads and net control officers, it occurs to me that I haven't given you my address this time. It is in the city of Los Angeles, where I survived the Olympic Games, thank you, and at 5872 W. 77 Place (not street), and the Zip is 90045.

LAST ISSUE I WROTE ABOUT ARRL OFFICIALS who were also 10-10 members, and there were a lot more I didn't write about. For example, Pete Kemp, KA1KD, No. 28125, is Section Manager for Connecticut and an Assistant Director. More important: he is the 1983 winner of the Herbert S. Brier Instructor of the Year Award. For a full report, plus a photo of Pete, see QST, September, 1984, p. 44. Congratulations, Pete!

WHEN I BECAME A 10-10 MEMBER, back in 1972, there were a lot of reasons why I didn't make 10-10 contacts very rapidly. It took me more than a year to get my first 100 contacts and send the list off to Frank Orcutt, W4JO, who handled all Bar awards, plus WAS.

By the time Frank became a Silent Key, in 1978, I was up to 1200 and had my WAS. Frank had been unable to work on his records for some time, and his passing created a real emergency. His family shipped all the materials out to California, and several of us teamed up to get the pending Bars issued, each of us taking the applications for a particular Bar - 200 or 300, or whatever. That was when Bill Risher, WB6OMH, took over as Awards Manager.

Over the next few years, 10 was hot, 10-10 grew rapidly, and the job Bill had taken on became one that one man couldn't handle, so WAS and the Bars up to 900 were spun off. That left Bill with the Bars from 1000 up, plus the plaques, and a set of records that is unbelievable. Some he inherited from W4JO, but most of them are his own work over a period of more than six years.

Bill has decided that the time has come for him to pass the job along to someone else. A lot of thought went into that decision. Bill has put so much into that job that it was difficult for him to give it up. It is also difficult for me to find words to express what 10-10 owes to Bill for those six+ years of dedicated service. For one thing, I won't get to discuss with Bill those odd-ball cases we both have run into over the years. Oh, I'll get to talk with the Old Man of the Mountain, all right. He puts in a good signal down here with that long wire he has strung up between the pine trees, but he will not have all that information at his finger tips any more.

All of the data Bill has gathered over the years will go to his successor, who is Chuck Busby, KC5FX, No. 21872, who lives at 4621 Catchin Drive, Fort Worth, TX 76118. Incidentally, it was Bob Hartley, W6WPY, former 10-10 President and at present one of the 10-10 Directors, who arranged this with Bill and Chuck.

Although the effective date has been set for November 15, 1984, please don't expect that the change can be made overnight. Bill and Chuck have been working on it for more than a month, now, but these things take time. After November 15, applications for Bars and plaques in the 1000+ range should go to Chuck, but I know darned well that some will continue to be sent to Bill. He will forward them, but there will be delay. Meanwhile, let's give Chuck a break. He has to learn a job that Bill could do in his sleep.

Incidentally, Chuck is retired from the FAA, has been a ham since 1977 and a 10-10 member since 1978. He has his 2000 Bar and is an active paper chaser. He has held ARRL appointments as NCS and ORS, and Net Manager of the Southwest Traffic Net.

THIS CANNOT BE CONSTRUED AS HOT NEW INFORMATION, but as of September 1 the low frequency limit of the 10 meter 'phone band has been 28,300. I only mention it because I have listened down there a few times and have yet to hear anyone. But then, I don't hear much of anyone on the rest of the band, either. Phooey!

Notes and Miscellaneous

This first quarter report is a little different then past first quarter reports (even though the monetary amounts look similar). Because of my extended vacation this report reflects only two months' activity (April and May), and if you look back at 1983-84 Year-End report, I stated that some postage and printing charges were deferred until this fiscal year. Well half were paid in May and the rest in August.

I would like to thank the Fort McHenry, White House, and Ocean State Chapters for the warmth and friendliness they shared with me and my family during my visit to their corner of the US. Also, thanks for the 10-10 Certificates they bestowed upon me. It's not often that the Treasurer gets noticed unless he does something wrong (see below). Also to John, N8FU; Judy, KDBKU; Phyllis, K1QFD; and Bob, N3BGY, for the enjoyable times I spent visiting with them and other 10-10ers at their homes. And to the dozens of contacts made on 10 while on the road, thanks for the twenty new numbers, soon now another bar. In total we spent 37 days (8,800 miles, 27 states, Mexico and Canada) on the road. We spent the nights in many cities, but because time seemed always short we were not able to visit with as many 10-10ers as I had wanted. We're already thinking about our next trip (maybe 1986).

I said I erred. Last November I rearranged the ham furniture to make room for the computer furniture. So as not to lose mail I set aside a 'safe' place to store mail for 10-10. During April and May I began receiving hate mail because of unprocessed checks. After a search I discovered my 'safe' storage and quickly deposited the checks. 

Based on formulas found in the ARRL Antenna Book the following table was prepared. These figures assume flat, open terrain. To determine if two stations can 'see' each other, add the horizon distances for both stations and compare this to distance measured on a map. Horizons are in miles.




Ten-Ten QSO parties are open to all amateurs but only paid-up members are eligible for awards or chapter assignment of scores. They are conducted to encourage Ten Meter operation and interest in the Net. Non-members may use numbers collected to qualify for membership; members use them for awards.

RULES

1. All contacts must take place between 28.5 and 29.4 Mhz.
2. Exchange: Callsign, Name, City, State, and 10-10 number.
3. A station may be counted only once.
4. Single operator stations only are acceptable.
5. SSB, FM or AM modes are acceptable.
6. All contacts must take place within the 48 hour contest period.
7. QRP class limit is 10 watts output.
8. Logs must be kept in UTC (Zulu time)
9. A Dupe Sheet is required of all participants submitting logs.
10. Chapter assignment of scores may be only by a paid-up member, belonging to that chapter as a local member, and able to work that chapter Net via groundwave from the location of the station working the contest.
11. Illegible or improperly submitted logs will be rejected. See below for log submission requirements.
12. Failure to comply with any of these rules or their intent may result in disqualification.

SCORING

1. Two points for each contact with a 10-10 number exchange.
2. One point for each contact without a 10-10 number exchange.

AWARDS

First place certificates and first place QRP class certificates to all U.S. Call areas; KL7 included with 7th-area. Also Canada, South America, Central America, Caribbean (Including Bermuda), Europe, Africa, Asia, and the Pacific, (including KH6, all Pacific Islands, New Zealand and Australia). Individual and chapter scores are published in the NEWS.

LOG SUBMISSION

Logs are accepted from Ten-Ten members only and must be legible, in UTC, and complete. Each line entry must show the Callsign, Time, Name, QTH, and 10-10 number (if any). A cover sheet is required showing your name, Callsign, QTH, 10-10 number, membership expiration date, chapter assignment (if any), total contacts and total points claimed. Please indicate if QRP and list output power. A cover sheet can be found on the rear page of the 10-10 NEWS. A Dupe Sheet must accompany all logs. 







CHECK 28.050 MHz ON THE HOUR, 28.150 MHz ON THE HALF HOUR!

Hearing South American CB-type 'phone stations in the c.w. portion of the ten-meter band brought to mind the main reason for TEN-TEN's existence: To increase the amateur service's usage of the band and to discourage encroachment by others. Being adjacent to the 27 MHz wasteland, the lower part of the c.w. portion is the most vulnerable.

This consideration, plus the desirability of attracting novices and technicians into TEN-TEN, are my main reasons for suggesting that ten-tenners, as well as those desiring to qualify for a ten-ten number, listen -- and if nothing is heard call CQ TEN/TEN -- on 28.050 MHz on the even hour UTC and on 28.150 MHz thirty minutes after the even hour UTC. 

10-10 INFORMATION

How to become a Ten-Ten Member

Work 10 present members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, date worked, op's name, location. Send list to your Call Sign Area Manager, with \$1 Registration Fee, \$4 for first years dues (foreign \$5, U.S.). Novices, foreign applicants need work only 5 present members; novices pay no Registration Fee. You will receive a Certificate, and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the News, and participate fully in all activities.

How to earn Bars and Plaques

Log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters, all bona-fide number exchanges on the air. Then list 100, no more, no less, no duplicates, thus:

1. List in serial order of 10-10 numbers. Show call, handle and location.
2. Submit only one list of 100 at a time.
3. Log books or copies of log book pages are not acceptable.
4. Give your name, address, call sign, 10-10 number, and state which Bar you are requesting (i.e., 100 Bar, 200 Bar etc.)
5. Enclose a large size SASE (20¢ First Class).
6. Mail as follows: 100-900 Bars, Willie E. Madison, WB7VZI, 10512 W. Butler Dr., Peoria, AZ 85345. 1000 Bar and up, Charles L. Busby, KC5FX, 4621 Catchin Drive, Fort Worth, TX 76118.

With your 500 Bar comes an honorary V.P. Number, and other activities. A 500 Certificate costs \$1. Plaques are awarded for 1000, 2500 and 5000 contacts, and cost \$3 each plus 37¢ postage. Make checks payable to 10-10 Int'l Net, Inc. Please do not send cash.

How to earn WAS

After working and getting QSL card confirmation on one 10-10 member in each of 50 states, prepare an alphabetical list by states with full data on each contact. Mail cards and list to Susan Brackeen, KALCAD, P.O. Box 7081, Johnston, RI 02919. U. S., Canadian, Mexican members send \$2.42, U.S. funds, for certificate cost and return postage. Overseas members may save about half the postage cost by sending non-returnable copies of QSL cards (Fax, Xerox, etc.). More than one card per sheet is OK, but all required information must appear, including 10-10 number. Show both sides of card only if necessary for complete information. Also include alphabetic list of states with full information on each contact, your own complete information, including 10-10 number, and \$2.60 U.S. funds for cost of certificate and return postage. Address application to KALCAD, as shown above. Please do not send cash.

Countries Award

The Countries Award is given for confirmation (QSL's) of QSO's exchanging 10-10 numbers with members in 25 or more countries. Cost is \$5.00, U.S. funds. For complete rules and application form, send business size (#10) SASE to Alan Sherman, K1AS, RR#2, Box 662, Danielson, CT 06239, U.S.A.


