



Words from the President

IN THE LAST TWO ISSUES, I have mentioned 10-10 members who held important positions in ARRL. That information was not difficult to get. Not so easy, however, is it possible to learn of what's going on in similar organizations in other lands. To our rescue has come a communication from LABRE -- Liga De Amadores De Radio Emissao, in Brazil. It is indeed good news to learn that another 10-10 member, PT2FR, Francisco Jose de Querioz, has been elected President of that organization. His 10-10 number is 32924.

AFTER WRITING THE ABOVE PARAGRAPH and re-reading the letter, I was not astonished to learn that there were a couple of accents I had not been able to include, for which I hope Francisco will forgive me. Fact of the matter is that typewriters intended for use in the English language simply do not accommodate themselves to the variations often found in other languages unless there has been some substantial modification. Further fact, however, is that when I bought this machine, the wily salesman sold me another daisy wheel which does contain many of them, including the ones I would have needed in the preceding paragraph. Further fact is that my younger daughter teaches fourth grade in a school in which the pupils come from a wide variety of ethnic backgrounds. When I bought her a typewriter like mine, I threw in the foreign language daisy wheel as a bonus, figuring that she would need it more than I. It has helped her, but I can see that it may create problems for me. Maybe I'll have to buy another one.

THERE ARE SOMETIMES THINGS I HAVE DEEP FEELINGS ABOUT, but which I hesitate to mention on these pages for fear of being thought of as more of an old grouch than I really am. One of these is the practice of some operators of reeling off a string of chapter numbers, upgrades, and the like, when just being asked to check in. As I said, I have a feeling that this is inappropriate, but hadn't mentioned it until I got a letter the other day which had these sentences, "I personally don't think this is the way to go with 10-10 numbers. Speaking as a net control operator, it's difficult enough nowadays to get people checked in with just their basic 10-10 info before the band changes again." It was reinforced for me when I heard a 2 trying to check in the other day. By the time the next chap had finished with his string of numbers, the 2 was gone.

SOMETIMES THINGS GET STARTED FOR NO APPARENT REASON, and with no source that one can pin down. A couple of weeks ago I heard a local calling CQ on 28.6. He made a contact and suggested that they move up ten since 28.6 was a 10-10 calling frequency. That was news to me. A few days later I had an opportunity to talk with the chap who had made that statement and asked him where he got his information. As I suspected, it was from someone else, whose name and call he could not recall. Just the other day I received a letter in which appears this sentence, "I was once told that 28.6 was a general hailing frequency for ten meters . . ." That's a bit more like the fact of the matter. I well recall that back during the last propagation slump, any contact one might get was likely to be at 28.6, plus or minus 25 or so.

SPEAKING OF CONTACTS reminds me that I still haven't heard anything much below 28.5. I suppose one excuse is that there are a lot of rigs like mine which tune, basically, from 28.5 to 29.0. If I want to go lower or higher than that, more than 40 or 50, I have to do some switch punching or twisting and re-tuning. I do it -- sometimes, but probably not often enough.

WHEN I WAS ABOUT THREE-FOURTHS OF THE WAY through the preceding page, the red telephone on my desk rang. It was Jo Moise, K6AYU, who is 10-10's Roster Manager. She didn't have a dire emergency, but she did have a wholly reasonable request, which was that I say something about how your Roster orders get processed. What brought this on, if I heard her correctly, was that she received a letter asking why the Roster ordered back in 1983 had never been received. 1983 indeed! Anyone who waits that long doesn't have anything to complain about.

Nevertheless, here's how it works: Your order for a Roster (cost, \$4.50 in the U. S., Canada, Mexico, \$6.50 by air elsewhere) goes to your District Manager. The Manager prepares a mailing label, with your name, address, etc., and sends it to Jo at the same time he sends in his regular monthly report. Jo has the Rosters already in their mailing envelopes with stamps on them - 95¢ worth - and all she has to do is put on the mailing label she has been sent and drop it in the mail box. It is sent at third class rate and doesn't get returned if it cannot be delivered.

The only person who has a record of whether your order was received and the mailing label sent to Jo is the Manager to whom you sent it. If you don't receive the Roster within two months after you have ordered it, check with that Manager.

HANDLING THOSE ROSTER ORDERS is just one of the many things a District Manager does. An issue or so back I had a paragraph or two about the LIARS FLYER, and mentioned that Larry Berger, WA2SUH had written an article about all the things a Manager does. I was tempted to a bit of cutting here and there and just use Larry's article, since it is apparent that not too many 10-10 members are familiar with the operation. It's a fairly long article, however, so I'll just mention some do's and don'ts: Use the order form on p. 31 of the News or a copy of it. Check your order carefully for accuracy and to be sure the check you send is correct and has your name, your call sign, and your 10-10 number on it. Yes, Junior, there is room for these last two items at the bottom of the check somewhere, usually on a printed line. Don't leave them out! Never send cash. Make the check out to 10-10, not to the Manager. And, for Pete's sake, when you are giving out 10-10 membership information on the air, have a copy of p. 31 in front of you so that you don't give out the wrong information.

Aside from the Roster mailing labels, the Manager makes two monthly reports. One is a financial report, which goes to Treasurer Gerry Gross, WA6POZ, and the other is a membership report to Records Manager Lee Pasewalk, WB6MGM. Lee is also the one who issues 10-10 numbers to the Managers in blocks of 100. Issuing blocks of numbers that way means that it is quite possible for your buddy in a different call area to become a member after you do and yet get a lower 10-10 number.

THE WAY IN WHICH THIS JOURNAL is arranged, using whole page widths, rather than columns means that vertical space is at a premium. Sometimes Editor Jim Michaels gets a page of typed material and an accompanying letter which says, in effect, "Publish this." When you look at the material you may find that it is double-spaced and has right hand margins that approach two inches. It may have some passing interest, but it simply takes up too much of a page to be usable. It could be re-written, but neither Jim nor I can find that kind of time. If you submit something, go by the rules Jim has on p. 2, and be sure it is camera-ready. Remember, too, that what you have written may be deathless prose to you, but meaningless to anyone else.

THIS THIRD PAGE OF MY REPORT is being written on Saturday, December 15, which is a noteworthy date for two reasons: it is Editor Jim Michaels' deadline for copy and it is my birthday. I can do something about the former, but, unfortunately, nothing about the latter. Because I accumulate information over a period of weeks, I generally do the first two pages ahead of time, and leave the last page for clean-up of last minute information.

MOST IMPORTANT IS THE LETTER FROM CARL SCHOEN, W4NJS, who has been DX Manager for some time. Carl has been ill and must relinquish the assignment, so we are in need of a candidate. We first heard of this indirectly about December 8 and have been trying to find someone, preferably on the East Coast, but no luck thus far. The need is great and if you wish to be considered, please write me at 5872 W. 77 Place, Los Angeles, CA 90045, or call (213) 645-7205. If, by the time this issue goes to press, we have found someone, it will be announced in Jim's, "From the Desk Of . . ." on the last page. Jim writes that material just before going to press. And, lest I forget it, we all owe a great debt of gratitude to W4NJS, who has handled this assignment so very well.

DECEMBER IS CHRISTMAS CARD TIME, and I have a lovely one from Juergen Wenck, DL2HAJ, No. 36111, who wishes all Ten-Tenners a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

ON THE PRECEDING PAGE I MENTIONED THE ROSTER and how one gets a copy. Since I wrote that, some disturbing information has come to light, namely, that fewer than half the copies printed have been sold. Printing a Roster is an expensive proposition because most of the costs -- computer preparation, paste-up, photography, plate-making, press set-up, and postage -- are fixed, regardless of the number printed. If the Roster isn't wanted (read that 'bought') by members, there is no reason to do it. As of this writing, it looks as though we may not be able to afford one this spring. And, by the way, Jack Smothers, KD7XI, does a quarterly update which he sells for a buck. His address is Box 425, Turner, OR 97392.

THIS IS A GOOD TIME FOR YOU TO TAKE A LOOK at Page 2, left hand side. The first eight names listed constitute 10-10's Board of Directors, which is composed of the elected officers (first four names) and the appointed Directors (last four). There have been some changes since last year. Ten-Ten is facing some hard sledding because of the propagation conditions, and the postage increase coming up January 17 will not help the situation. It's going to cost 13.8% more just to mail the News to you, and of course first class postage is up 2¢, which doesn't sound like much, but works out to 10%. Remember that when you send an SASE.

SOMEWHERE OUT THERE IS A PUBLICATION CALLED MONITORING TIMES. It doesn't appear to be known to librarians or to magazine dealers, so it is probably much like this 10-10 News and only goes to members or subscribers. Anyhow, we are indebted to it because it apparently mentioned 10-10 favorably, if a bit inaccurately. Editor Jim has received a number of letters inquiring about 10-10 membership, some from SWL's, some from hams, and some from former members wishing to re-up. elected unanimously



CHECK 28.050 MHz ON THE HOUR, 28.150 MHz ON THE HALF HOUR!


Hearing South American CB-type 'phone stations in the c.w. portion of the ten-meter band brought to mind the main reason for TEN-TEN's existence: To increase the amateur service's usage of the band and to discourage encroachment by others. Being adjacent to the 27 MHz wasteland, the lower part of the c.w. portion is the most vulnerable.

This consideration, plus the desirability of attracting novices and technicians into TEN-TEN, are my main reasons for suggesting that ten-tenners, as well as those desiring to qualify for a ten-ten number, listen -- and if nothing is heard call CQ TEN/TEN -- on 28.050 MHz on the even hour UTC and on 28.150 MHz thirty minutes after the even hour UTC. There would be no net and no net control. The system could be used at any time of the day or night. Dex Anderson, W4KM, #6271

JOE SIMPSON, G4JS, No. 969




RULES

1. All contacts must take place between 28.0 and 28.2 MHz.
2. Exchanges: Callsign, name, city, state, and 10-10 number.
3. A station may be counted only once.
4. Single operator stations only are acceptable.
5. CW and RTTY modes are acceptable.
6. All Contacts must take place within the 48 hour contest period.
7. QRP class limit is 10 watts output.
8. Logs must be kept in UTC (Zulu Time).
9. A Dupe sheet is required of all participants submitting logs.
10. Chapter assignment of scores may be only by a paid-up member, belonging to that chapter as a local member, and able to work that chapter Net via groundwave from the location of the station working the contest.
11. Illegible or improperly submitted logs will be rejected. See below for log submission requirements.
12. Failure to comply with any of these rules or their intent may result in disqualification.

SCORING

1. Two points for each contact with a 10-10 number exchange.
2. One point for each contact without a 10-10 number exchange.

AWARDS



The Nutmeg Chapter has enjoyed scoring the two phone contests this year. I should make note of a few points which came to our attention. First we were quite surprised at the number of logs received which did not have a dupe sheet or had an incorrectly prepared one. Secondly those who use a computer which automatically dupes as it logs should state so on the log when submitted. Ideally the program should include a "Print 'Dupe' Statement" and leave the dupes in the list but not have them counted.

When logs were received early and rejected we sent out 3X5 post cards to the member to let them know the reason for the rejection; this gave them the opportunity to make the correction and resubmit prior to the contest deadline.

Special thanks to those chapters who use a contest coordinator to check the logs before sending them in for scoring. These logs are also more likely to be correct. More chapters should adopt this approach.






10-10 INFORMATION

How to become a Ten-Ten Member

Work 10 present members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, date worked, op's name, location. Send list to your Call Sign Area Manager, with \$1 Registration Fee, \$4 for first years dues (foreign \$5, U.S.). Novices, foreign applicants need work only 5 present members; novices pay no Registration Fee. You will receive a Certificate, and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the News, and participate fully in all activities.

How to earn Bars and Plaques

Log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters, all bona-fide number exchanges on the air. Then list 100, no more, no less, no duplicates, thus:

1. List in serial order of 10-10 numbers. Show call, handle and location.
2. Submit only one list of 100 at a time.
3. Log books or copies of log book pages are not acceptable.
4. Give your name, address, call sign, 10-10 number, and state which Bar you are requesting (i.e., 100 Bar, 200 Bar etc.)
5. Enclose a large size SASE (20¢ First Class).
6. Mail as follows: 100-900 Bars, Willie E. Madison, WB7VZI, 10512 W. Butler Dr., Peoria, AZ 85345. 1000 Bar and up, Charles L. Busby, KC5FX, 4621 Catchin Drive, Fort Worth, TX 76118.

With your 500 Bar comes an honorary V.P. Number, and other activities. A 500 Certificate costs \$1. Plaques are awarded for 1000, 2500 and 5000 contacts, and cost \$3 each plus 37¢ postage. Make checks payable to 10-10 Int'l Net, Inc. Please do not send cash.

How to earn WAS

After working and getting QSL card confirmation on one 10-10 member in each of 50 states, prepare an alphabetical list by states with full data on each contact. Mail cards and list to Susan Brackeen, KA1CAD, P.O. Box 7081, Johnston, RI 02919. U. S., Canadian, Mexican members send \$2.42, U.S. funds, for certificate cost and return postage. Overseas members may save about half the postage cost by sending non-returnable copies of QSL cards (Fax, Xerox, etc.). More than one card per sheet is OK, but all required information must appear, including 10-10 number. Show both sides of card only if necessary for complete information. Also include alphabetic list of states with full information on each contact, your own complete information, including 10-10 number, and \$2.60 U.S. funds for cost of certificate and return postage. Address application to KA1CAD, as shown above. Please do not send cash.

Countries Award

The Countries Award is given for confirmation (QSL's) of QSO's exchanging 10-10 numbers with members in 25 or more countries. Cost is \$5.00, U.S. funds. For complete rules and application form, send business size (#10) SASE to Alan Sherman, K1AS, RR4, Box 422, Danielson, CT 06239, U.S.A.
