





Words from the President

SOME OF YOU MAY REMEMBER THAT SIX MONTHS AGO the XYL and I had planned a trip to Australia which we had to cancel in favor of a hospital sojourn for me. Well, we finally made it, spending more than a month in kangaroo-land and finishing up with five days lolling on the beach in Fiji.

A day after we arrived in Sydney (14 hours non-stop from LAX), I called Les Olsen, whose call sign is now VK2JLO (he upgraded), and who is 10-10's Manager down there. I told Les that we would be leaving Sydney the next day to go to the barrier reef area, but that I would like to meet him when we returned to Sydney about a week later. Les kindly offered to meet us at the airport and take us to our hotel. However, it turned out that our flight was delayed several hours (a baggage-handlers' strike, what else!) and we took a cab instead. I did manage to meet with Les the next day, however. He took time off from work and showed up at our hotel. We went across the street to an establishment where we were able to enjoy a pot of Foster's lager together. I took a couple of (it turned out) out-of-focus pictures of Les, and maybe, if Jim Michaels and Bert Ayers can work magic, one of them will appear elsewhere in this issue.

On our way home from the airport, I had the cab driver stop at the post office so I could get the mail they had been holding for 35 days. Apparently when the mail being held gets beyond a certain volume they begin to toss it in a large basket, and it was one of these baskets that the young lady staggered out to the counter with. I took it out to the cab and carried it home, where I dumped it on the floor. Edith and I spent some interesting evenings sorting it out. Two issues (November and December) of a lot of magazines, a ton of junk mail, and a bundle of letters from 10-10 members responding to my offer in the last issue of a copy of the official ARRL-ICAO phonetic alphabet, plus a time conversion chart to anyone who would send me an SASE. Incidentally, that offer still holds, so if you forgot to write and ask for one, you can still get it by sending an SASE to me at my address, which is 5872 W. 77 Place, Los Angeles, CA 90045.

SHORTLY AFTER I RETURNED HOME, I received a telephone call from Willie Madison, WB7VZI. For some time, now, Willie had been doing double duty. He is 10-10's Manager for the 7th Call Area, and he has also been handling the applications for Bars from 100 to 900. Some of you may recall that last issue I commented on the problem he and other award managers have with members who don't read the rules for awards and send in their applications without the required proof of current membership. Willie was most outspoken on the matter, and I had a couple of letters expressing some indignation that members should be scolded for not following directions. I also had some commending Willie's point of view. I wish that the indignant ones would try handling one of these volunteer jobs for a while. It might open their eyes.

At any rate, Willie has decided that enough is enough, and has asked to be relieved of the Bar Award job. Knowing how hard it is to get volunteers to do anything, Willie found a replacement. It is Bobbie Vaughan, WB7NUU, who lives near him, and who knows the 10-10 ropes, having been 7th Call Area Manager herself a few years back. Willie will continue as 7th Call Area manager, and I certainly thank him for the hard work he has done the past few years. Willie has all the 10-10 membership data on his computer now, and sends out reminder cards to those whose memberships have expired. He gets about a 10% favorable response. Bobbie's picture was on the cover of the fall, 1980 issue of this journal, and her address appears on page 30 of this issue, along with other information about Bars.

A FEW ISSUES BACK, I WROTE ABOUT MY DISSAPPOINTING effort to take a look at the ham station aboard HMS Belfast, which is a floating museum in the Thames. The station has a 10-10

number, which made it particularly interesting to me. I saw parts of the station through glass, but the door was locked. A nearby placard carried the name and address of the chief op. Although I tried to telephone and subsequently wrote a letter, I had no luck. Now my complaint has been answered by means of an apologetic letter from Bob Barton, G3PQH, who is on the Committee of the London Group of the Royal Navy Amateur Radio Society. That is the group which operates GB2RN, the station on the Belfast. Bob mentions the difficulty of obtaining volunteers to operate the station, and also tells me that Chief Operator Don Walmsley G3HZL, was spending quite a bit of time in hospital at that time. Believe me, Bob and Don, I know exactly what you are talking about, on both counts.

I also received a very nice and most welcome letter from Eddy Waddington, G4CIZ, who has been spending a lot of time catching up on Bars since 10 has been so stinko. He was very complimentary with respect to Willie Madison's help and prompt response when he submitted his numbers 200 at a time, which I understand is OK with respect to DX members. Eddy also says that he is managing to keep up with some of his stateside contacts by using other bands. Don't give up on 10, however. Some strange things are happening from time to time!

A LETTER CAME FROM RICHARD E. "JACK" FROST, in which he says, "I understand the problem of typing the 1000 numbers. I had to give it a try with the help of a computer." He enclosed a very nice page of all the 1000 numbers, plus a suitable heading. I'll pass it along to Editor Jim Michaels, just in case he needs something to fill up a page some time. Jack's call is NF7V, and he is No. 14945. In the same mail I had another letter, written to ask for the phonetic alphabetic and time chart cards, but also saying, "Also enclosed is a short basic program which will generate the list of numbers from 1 to 1000." I sent the cards, but sorry, Charles, you forgot to enclose the program. I'm not mentioning your last name or call sign here, but I think you will identify yourself. If you want to send the program along, it will be most welcome.

WILLARD "BEN" BENTON, N6EZB, NO. 39085, lives in San Diego, reports that he had two great days during the phone contest. Ben has been licensed since 1929 and became 82 in December. Most amazing thing is that Ben is a runner with the San Diego Track Club. He competes in the 80 year old bracket, can still do the mile in seven minutes, runs 25 miles a week in training, and somewhat apologetically says that his limit at one time is fifteen miles. Holy smoke!

ANOTHER LETTER CAME FROM RUDDY, W1MME, who holds No. 4695. That number must, like my 4509, date back to 1972. Ruddy asked for the two cards I said I would send out, but says he will have trouble converting from the Able, Baker, Charlie, Dog sequence. No need to, Ruddy, unless you want to. As I have pointed out in the past, it really doesn't matter which alphabetic equivalents you use. Just don't get cutesy about it. When you do that, no one can tell what you mean. Ruddy also said that on the evening he wrote the letter (November 12), the Minute Man Chapter would hold its 510th consecutive on-the-air meeting.

I ALSO HAD A LETTER FROM GLENN YERBY, ND9Y, who had a question relating to finances, which I cannot answer. Maybe Treasurer Gerry Gross can, and I'll try to remember to ask him, although he is so busy with various activities I can rarely get him on the telephone. Glenn also had some suggestions regarding the contest scoring responsibilities. His principal idea is that all chapters be held responsible for contest scoring on a rotating basis, and that after each contest, every chapter be responsible for the scoring of its own members, forwarding the completed tally to the one chapter designated to total all submitted scores. This suggestion is really in Harry Syring's department, but I can see a couple of problems. First is that many who participate do not belong or assign their scores to chapters. Another is that not all chapters have the facilities to handle the chore. However, maybe Harry will see merit in it.

AS YOU MAY HAVE CONCLUDED FROM READING THE two pages which precede this one, I rely on my mail to provide almost all the "inspiration" for what I write. And I only have to do these pages once every three months. Not so fortunate is Chuck Imsande, W6YLJ, who does a monthly column about 10-10 in Worldradio. Chuck has a problem: he is running out of material, especially material about people who are involved with 10-10. I imagine that most of you feel as I do -- Who wants to read about me? Well, I think that the answer to that is that many people do. Not all of you by any means, but a good many. I ask you, therefore, to send Chuck (and me as well) interesting material about yourself, your family, your background, the job you hold (or retired from), and anything else you can think of. Notice that I used the word, 'interesting'. Don't presume to be your own judge of what is interesting. Chuck or I will judge that. What you think may be uninteresting may, in our judgment, turn out to be interesting and useful. And don't be disappointed if neither of us uses what you send. WHEN I WAS A YOUNGSTER, AWAY BACK IN THE DARK AGES, my mother and grandmother used to read the obituary portion of the daily newspaper. I wondered why. It held no interest for me. Now, however, I know why they read those notices. It is just one of those changes of interest that come as one grows older. When I returned from being away for five weeks, I learned that we had lost one of our real old timers - a bedrock of 10-10 almost from its inception, Hans Tromholt, WB6YYI. It was news that all of us around here had been expecting, but dreading, for some time. Elsewhere in this issue you will find a more formal notice of his passing. Read it. He was one of the best, and we will miss him.

BEFORE I GET TO THE END OF THIS PAGE, I want to say something about the 10-10 Roster. It's been nearly two years since we last printed a Roster, and the reason is that of the last printing of 1,000 (of which about 75 went to officers, managers, and net control stations), we have not sold all copies. Indeed, I venture to say that if we do a new one early in 1986, we will still have unsold copies of the last issue.

As I have previously reported, the actual printing is the least of the Roster expenses. Prior to printing there are (1) the computer work to supply the original copy, (2) the assembly of the computer product into a form which lends itself to subsequent operations, (3) photographing all these pages, (4) making the plates for the printing operation, (5) putting the plates on the presses, and (6) doing the actual printing. Once (1) through (5) have been accomplished, it makes little difference whether we print one copy or 1000 copies, or even more. The point of all this recital is to answer those who ask why we don't print 500 copies, rather than 1000, so we would sell them faster and print a new issue sooner. The answer is that the price (\$4.50) is based on the cost of printing and mailing 1000 copies, and assumes that we will sell all of them. If we were to print only 500, it would be necessary to raise the price so that the costs could be recovered.

It should be noted that those who have been clamoring for a new Roster make a noise all out of proportion to their numbers. This organization has more than 40,000 calls listed, but fewer than one fortieth of that number have bought Rosters. From the inquiries and questions, one might be tempted to assume (if he did not know otherwise) that everyone wanted one. And I'm sure that many of those who ask haven't bothered to buy updates from Jack Smothers, KD7XI (P.O.B. 425, Turner, OR 97329).

Let me lay it on the line. If you want only 500 printed, for the reason stated above, it's going to cost more per copy. If that is agreeable with you, let me know. Don't send any money, either to me or to your Manager, just drop me a note or a card. I'm listening. Do I hear anything out there?

THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY VICE PRESIDENT NORM LEFCOURT, W6IRT, IN ABSENCE OF PRESIDENT HOWARD BOWMAN, W6QIR, WHO WAS VACATIONING IN AUSTRALIA!!

THE FOLLOWING OFFICERS WERE IN ATTENDANCE:

VICE PRESIDENT-----NORM LEFCOURT, W6IRT

FOLLOWING THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE, A MOMENT OF SILENCE WAS OBSERVED WITH SPECIAL RECOGNITION TO WB6YYI, HANS TROMHOLT (#181), WHO BECAME A SILENT KEY NOV. 28, 1985. HANS WAS PAST EDITOR OF THE 10-10 NEWS AND ACTIVE IN PROMOTION OF THE 10-10 NET.

A REPORT PROVIDED BY THE TREASURER, FOR THE QUARTER ENDING SEPT., SHOWED AN INCOME OF \$10,108 AND EXPENSES OF \$4856 GIVING A NET OF \$5252. YEAR TO DATE NET, HOWEVER, WAS \$5210. TOTAL ASSETS WAS REPORTED AS \$64,638 WITH INTEREST BEING ACCUMULATED AGAINST THIS AMOUNT.

CHAPTER COORDINATOR, CONNIE HAUCK, K6EXQ, REPORTED ON CHAPTER ACTIVITIES AND INTRODUCED A NEW CHAPTER "AMERICAN EAGLE" AS BEING FORMED IN NOKESVILLE, VA. SOME CHAPTERS NOW REQUIRE PROOF OF PAID-UP 10-10 ANNUAL DUES BEFORE ISSUING CERTIFICATES. IN ADDITION, SOME ARE GIVING 'BONUS' POINTS TO MEMBERS WHO SHOW PROOF OF PAID-UP 10-10 DUES. CONNIE ALSO REPORTED ON NEED FOR MEMBERS TO BE MORE ACTIVE IN GETTING ON THE AIR RATHER THAN JUST LISTENING. AFTER ALL, RECEIVERS DO NOT MAKE THE CONTACTS, SHE STATED. BAND OPENINGS HAVE INCREASED WITH SURPRISING RESULTS FOR THOSE VENTURING TO EXERCISE THEIR TRANSMITTERS!!

CHUCK IMSANDE, W6YLJ, REPORTED ON COLUMN HE WRITES FOR THE "WORLD RADIOPHILATELIC" PUBLICATION CONCERNING 10-10 MATTERS. FROM THIS, HE RECEIVES A VARIETY OF CORRESPONDENCE. A RECENT ONE WAS FROM ARRL WITH REQUEST FOR UPDATED INFORMATION ON 10-10 AWARDS FOR INCLUSION IN REVISION TO ARRL'S "OPERATION MANUAL". THIS REQUEST HAS BEEN FORWARDED TO HOWARD, W6QIR, FOR HIS REVIEW AND DISPOSITION. OTHER CORRESPONDENCE CONCERNED WHY 10-10 DID NOT HAVE ADDITIONAL AWARDS. IN SUPPORT OF THIS, CHUCK REPORTED ON HIS RECOMMENDATION FOR A 10-10 WORKED ALL CONTINENTS (WAC) AWARD. HIS PROPOSAL FOR THIS HAS BEEN SENT TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS WITH BREAKDOWN OF COST AND ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATIONS. THIS INFORMATION WAS REVIEWED AND CONSIDERABLE DISCUSSION FOLLOWED REGARDING CERTIFICATE COST AND NEED FOR QSL CARD SUBMITTAL. A MOTION WAS MADE BY CHUCK (W6YLJ), AND SECONDED, FOR THE 10-10 BOARD OF DIRECTORS TO AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE OF THE WAC AWARD. THIS MOTION RECEIVED UNANIMOUS APPROVAL.

Ten-Ten QSO Parties are open to all amateurs but only paid-up members are eligible for awards or chapter assignment of scores. They are conducted to encourage Ten-Meter operation and interest in the Net. Non-members may use numbers collected to qualify for membership; members use them for awards.

RULES:

1. All contacts must take place between 28.0 and 28.2 MHZ.
2. Exchanges: Call sign, name, city, state, and 10-10 number.
3. A station may be counted only once.
4. Single operator stations only are acceptable.
5. CW and RTTY modes are acceptable.
6. All Contacts must take place within the 48 hour contest period.
7. QRP class has been discontinued due to low activity.
8. Logs must be kept in UTC (Zulu Time).
9. A Dupe sheet is required of all participants submitting logs.
Indicated computer duping O.K.
10. Chapter assignment of scores may be only by a paid-up member, belonging to that chapter as a local member, and able to work that chapter Net via groundwave from the location of the station working the contest.
11. Illegible or improperly submitted logs will be rejected. See below for log submission requirements.
12. Failure to comply with any of these rules or their intent may result in disqualification.

SCORING:

1. Two points for each contact with a 10-10 number exchange.
2. One point for each contact without a 10-10 number exchange.

AWARDS:

First place certificates to all U.S. Call areas; KL7 included with 7th area. Also Canada, South America, Central America, Caribbean (including Bermuda), Europe, Africa, Asia, and the Pacific, (Including KH6, all Pacific Islands, New Zealand and Australia). Individual and chapter scores are published in the NEWS. Paid members only are listed.

LOG SUBMISSION:

Logs are accepted from 10-10 members only and must be legible, in UTC, and complete. Each line entry must show Callsign, time, name, QTH, and 10-10 number (if any). A Cover Sheet is required showing your name, callsign, QTH, 10-10 number, membership expiration date, chapter assignment, total contacts and total points claimed. A cover sheet can be found on page 32. A Dupe Sheet must accompany all logs. Logs must be Postmarked no later than June 1, 1986, and mailed to: Lilac City Chapter, c/o Al Lafky, K7YY, P.O. 

Send list to your Call Sign Area Manager (see p. 31) with \$1 Registration Fee (except Novices), plus \$4 for first year's dues. You will receive a certificate and be assigned a permanent 10-10 number. You must pay dues annually to remain in good standing and participate fully.

AWARDS If you apply for ANY of the following 10-10 awards, you MUST include proof of paid-up membership - a copy of your membership card or the address label from the News. Your application will be rejected if you fail to comply.
