






Words from the President

THE PRESENT STATE OF PROPAGATION ON TEN leaves us with little sense of prospective change. While there are openings of various kinds from time to time, they seem always to happen when I am not on the air to take advantage of them. Maybe that just means that I don't get on often enough, or for a long enough time when I do get on. However, having been on ten for so many years, I am intellectually aware that things have to get better. When I was working on my WAS, most of whatever activity there was took place around 28.6, plus or minus 50. However, there was a considerable amount of north-south skip, which meant that those of us here in L. A. could work into northern California, Oregon and Washington and have an occasional contact into British Columbia. I hear little of that these days. However, the whole situation reminds me of a sign I saw back in the early thirties - during the worst part of the great depression. Having crossed San Francisco Bay on the ferry (sorry, Junior, there weren't any bridges in those days), I was driving through the downtown area and saw this large billboard, which read "dePRESSiON". Those letters capitalized were vastly larger than the others, so that the words "PRESS ON" stood out boldly. That's what we have to do about ten meters these days, just "PRESS ON".

CHUCK IMSANDE, W6YLJ, IS DOING HIS PART to keep things boiling. Chuck writes a monthly column about 10-10 for WorldRadio, and has managed to tap a whole new group of people interested in ten, beside jogging the memories of some who used to be interested enough to join 10-10, but have fallen by the wayside. The other day I received a handful of letters Chuck had found in his mailbox. He had already responded to them, but wanted me to see the kind of inquiries he is getting. He sends each one a membership application form and maybe other stuff as well. One of the byproducts was that we found a need to revise the description of 10-10 which appears on one side of the application form, as well as the list of managers' names and addresses. That revision is in the works and will be along shortly. And, by the way, if you want to write Chuck about anything that he can use in his monthly column, his address is Chuck Imsande, W6YLJ, 18130 Bromley Drive, Tarzana, CA 91356.

Along with doing all this column writing and letter answering, Chuck put his brain to work and came up with another idea: 10-10 should offer a certificate for Worked All Continents. That, too, is in the works as this is being written, and the formalities are announced elsewhere in this issue. As the award was being discussed by the Board of Directors, two points drew most of the oratory - the cost and the start-up date for contacts to qualify for the award. The matter of cost was soon settled. We kept it low enough so that it will be several years before the start-up costs are met, which is satisfactory. The other matter - the start-up date - was the one that could only be settled by compromise. On the one hand were those who wanted to say that an applicant could go back as far as he wished to find cards that would qualify him - that is, verification of contacts with 10-10 members in the several continents. As against that there were those who believed that the start-up date should coincide with the date when the award came into existence.

Those who objected to the "card file" start-up date pointed out that application would be only a matter of looking through old cards, and would do nothing to increase activity on ten. As against that, those who advocated a 1986 start-up date had to realize that it might be several years before there were any applicants, propagation being what it is. I am by no means sure that the compromise we agreed upon (out of two or three that were suggested) is the best, but it is what it is and that's what it is: a start-up date of January 1, 1981. Just to satisfy myself that it could be achieved, I looked through my 1981 log and in the first dozen or so pages found contacts with all continents.

Now, please don't get all in a stew about those contacts. All I said was that I found I had contacts with the six continents. I didn't say that they were contacts which would qualify me for the award. That wasn't what I set out to do. I only wanted to discover if it had been possible to qualify back there in 1981, and it was.

BACK A FEW PARAGRAPHS I MENTIONED that it was necessary to revise the list of managers on the application form. Changes in managers are frequent enough so that Wes Emerson, who takes care of supplies, never has a great quantity printed. Most recent change is in the first call area, where John Schmitt, WA1ZLK, who took over when we lost Earle White, W1NC, has himself been forced to resign because of ill health. He is being replaced by Alan Kaiser, N1API, No. 25468. Our deepest thanks to John, who took over at a trying time, and carried things on in a highly satisfactory manner. And, of course, welcome to Alan, who is well-equipped to do a great job, even though he works long hours six days a week. Now, that is real dedication to 10-10.

THOSE OF YOU WHO ARE 'PAPER CHASERS' know of Jack Smothers, KD7XI, and his work of making Roster updates available. Jack formerly lived in Glendora, a suburb of Los Angeles, and for two years was net control for the daily 10-10 net, on Wednesday, as I recall. Jack moved to Oregon some time back, and promptly affiliated himself with local organizations and promoted 10-10 vigorously. The last letter I had from him asked for materials for a state convention, at which he expected again to advance the cause of 10-10. It was not to be. In January, Jack became a Silent Key. 73, Jack.

IN THE LAST ISSUE I WROTE ABOUT THE ROSTER, telling how the number of copies printed was a relatively unimportant factor in the basic cost of publishing. I asked that those of you who were plugging for a smaller press run, so we would run out sooner and have to get out a new issue, to put their money where their mouths were and let me know that they were willing to pay more for more frequent issues. Today, as I write this, just one and one-half weeks before my press deadline, I haven't had a single letter or card expressing an opinion! Where are all those who have been crying, moaning, and gnashing their teeth? Damned if I know.

AT ANY RATE, WE ARE GOING TO HAVE A NEW ROSTER. It will be published (assuming that nothing goes wrong) about the end of April, and will be based on the March computer update. And, yes, of course, it will be 'obsolete' when it is published, as some complain, just as the Radio Amateur Callbook is 'obsolete' when it is published. There is just no way of avoiding a time lag between the time when the data are gathered and the date when the publication is available. It is unavoidable, so don't bug me by saying it is obsolete.

ALONG WITH THE NEW ROSTER, WE'RE GOING TO HAVE A NEW ROSTER MANAGER. For some years, now, Jo Moise, K6AYU, has faithfully applied the mailing labels sent in by area managers and put the envelopes in the mail. For the last couple of years, Jo has been swamped by her college program (it's tough to go back after a lapse of years), and the other chores she has, and has asked to be relieved. She will be replaced by Dee Gilbert, KA6HQJ, No. 30631. Dee is a long-time 10-10 activist. About a year ago she had volunteered for the job, but Jo said she would hang on until the next issue appeared. That is now. Dee will take over with the 1986 Roster.

LAST ISSUE I HAD A PARAGRAPH about a member who had written saying he was enclosing a computer program for generating the numbers 1 through 1000. Unfortunately, he hadn't enclosed the program, but he has since sent it to me. By the way, he is Charles Parmenter, KB5EA, No. 21876. The program was written for a TRS 80 Mod. I, and he used a Star printer.

IN EARLY MARCH I HEARD FROM WIDELY SEPARATED SOURCES of something that was new to me.

It had to do with DX stations sending for items in the U. S. and enclosing postage stamps of their own countries as payment. It doesn't work. The foreign stamps are useful only in the country of origin. If stamps are available, so are International Postal Money Orders, which can be cashed in. I don't know why this is happening, but it occurs to me that maybe there's some confusion over the term, 'green stamps.' Doesn't seem likely, but who knows.

I HAD AN INTERESTING LETTER FROM Paul Williams, K1SSO, who suggests News columns on other modes of communication on ten - RTTY, packet, Novice CW, SSTV, and so on. Judging from my mail, there aren't enough members involved in these to justify columns, but maybe they just don't write. Paul suggests a way of handling these matters which may be useful some day. In the meanwhile, if any of you aficionados of these modes (or others) have a burning desire to say something, write me at 5872 W. 77 Place, Los Angeles, CA 90045.

ANOTHER INTERESTING LETTER came from Ronnie Hull, WB5AIA, who practically wrote an autobiography. Of course, his four pages are much too long to put in here, but it's an interesting story of how he first got on the air and became 10-10 No. 2019 away back in 1971, and then 'fell away,' due to the intervention of "graduation, a short stay with Uncle Sam, hot rods and cowgirls." Ronnie finally made it back a couple of years ago, and says it was like coming home to make that first contact on ten. His return was due in large part to some needling by Mel Sojka, KD5DE. Incidentally, Mel telephones me every once in a while to offer his services. I wish I could take advantage of his energy and willingness, as well as that of others across the country who have made similar offers. Fact is, we most need volunteers right here in the greater Los Angeles-Long Beach area. There are about twenty volunteers in this area - more than a quarter of the national total - and we could use two or three more. If anyone in this area reads this and would like to volunteer, please call me at (213) 645-7205. Or, if you would rather write, my street address is just two paragraphs above.

JUST BEFORE DEADLINE, when I get to this point on my third page, something always changes. This time it's in the tenth call area, where long-time manager, Kevin Schleicher, WDØBXU, has found it necessary to ask for relief. Just too many hours of work and school to do the kind of job he would want to do for 10-10. However, there will be a smooth transition to the new manager, Alice Hathaway, NØDES. Alice was suggested by Chapter Coordinator Connie Hauck, K6EXQ, who knows more people than anyone can imagine. Kevin has done such a bang-up job that he has worlds of information and hints to pass along to Alice, a process that is now going on and will continue for the next few weeks. Alice's address appears on Page 31, along with those of other managers. And, to Kevin, our deepest thanks for a job well done and our best wishes for whatever he does in the future. And, by the way, this is the first time in many years that the manager has not been in Minnesota.

EDITOR JIM MICHAELS RECENTLY HANDED ME a note from Dex Anderson, W4KM, along with a copy of an article which had appeared in the November, 1985 issue of Radio Communication, which is the U. K. equivalent of QST. The article is entitled, "Discovering 28 MHz," and is by John Petters, G3YPZ, who appears not to be a 10-10 member, or, indeed, to have heard of 10-10. It's an interesting article, however, but I thought as I read it over again that maybe some of our members in G-land should let G3YPZ in on the 10-10 secret.



Ten-Ten Board of Directors Approve New "Worked All Continents" Award


New 10-10 WAC Certificate Available

Late in January at a Ten-Ten Board of Directors meeting, the Board approved a new certificate for 10-10 members. The new award, to be known as the Worked All Continents Award (10-10 WAC for short), is available to all members with paid-up dues for a certificate fee of \$2.00. This attractive certificate is printed in black on a blue certificate background with a gold seal and will be issued in serial number sequence. A starting date of January 1, 1981 has been established and all contacts must have been made subsequent to January 1, 1981. QSL cards confirming a 10-10 contact with the exchange of 10-10 numbers from each of the six continents, Africa, Asia, Europe, North America, Oceania and South America must be submitted to the Certificate Manager, Chuck Imsande, W6YLJ. WORKED ALL CONTINENTS AWARDS

* R U L E S *

1. The Ten-Ten International Net, Inc. WORKED ALL CONTINENTS AWARD (10-10 WAC) is available to all 10-10 members who show proof of paid up dues at time of application.
2. All contacts must take place on the 10-meter band and must involve a genuine exchange of 10-10 numbers.
3. All stations claimed must be contacted from the same country. Contacts must have been made on or after the dates on which both stations received their own 10-10 numbers, and must have been made on or after 1 January 1981.
4. All stations must be "land stations". Contacts with ships or aircraft stations cannot be counted.
5. The ARRL DXCC Countries List will serve as the final authority as to which continent a country is located in. This list is published by and is available from the ARRL, 225 Main Street, Newington, CT 06111, for \$1.00 US funds.
6. Stations operating "portable" will count as a contact with that continent as long as a QSL card is provided noting "portable" and the station's location.
7. APPLICATIONS:
 - A. All applications must be submitted on official forms provided by the 10-10 WAC Manager or photocopies thereof.
 - B. Confirmations (QSL's) must be submitted to the WAC Manager. Exception: DX stations outside the Continental U.S. may submit non-returnable photocopies in lieu of actual QSL cards as long as all required data is shown.
 - C. QSL's must show the 10-10 number of the station being claimed, and must show contact date of January 1, 1981 or subsequent.
 - D. The continent of residence of the applicant will count as one continent but must be claimed as any other continent.
8. Cost - The cost of the WORKED ALL CONTINENTS Award is \$2.00. This includes the cost of the 10-10 WAC Certificate and return postage for the QSL cards submitted with the application.
9. All applications must include the fee of \$2.00 in the form of US currency. Make checks or money orders payable to TEN-TEN INTERNATIONAL NET, INC. and send to the 10-10 WAC Award Manager.




Ten-Ten QSO Parties are open to all amateurs but only paid-up members are eligible for awards or chapter assignment of scores. They are conducted to encourage Ten-Meter operation and interest in the Net. Non-members may use numbers collected to qualify for membership; members use them for awards.

RULES

1. All contacts must take place between 28.3 and 29.4 MHz.
2. Exchanges: Callsign, Name, City, State, and 10-10 number.
3. A station may be counted only once.
4. Single operator stations only are acceptable.
5. SSB, FM or AM modes are acceptable.
6. All Contacts must take place within the 48 hour contest period.
7. QRP class has been discontinued due to low activity.
8. Logs must be kept in UTC (Zulu Time).
9. A Dupe sheet is required of all participants. Indicated computer duping is O.K.
10. Chapter assignment of scores may be only by a paid-up member, belonging to that chapter as a local member, and able to work that chapter Net via groundwave from the location of the station working the contest.
11. Illegible or improperly submitted logs will be rejected. See below for log submission requirements.
12. Failure to comply with any of these rules or their intent may result in disqualification.

SCORING

1. Two points for each contact with a 10-10 number exchange.
2. One point for each contact without a 10-10 number exchange.

AWARDS

First place certificates to all U.S. Call areas; KL7 included with 7th area. Also Canada, South America, Central America, Caribbean (including Bermuda), Europe, Africa, Asia, and the Pacific, (including KH6, all Pacific Islands, New Zealand and Australia). Individual and chapter scores are published in the NEWS. Paid members only are listed.

LOG SUBMISSION

Logs are accepted from 10-10 members only and must be legible, in UTC, and complete. Each line entry must show Callsign, time, name, QTH, and 10-10 number (if any). A Cover Sheet is required showing your name, callsign, QTH, 10-10 number, membership expiration date, chapter assignment (if any), total contacts and total points claimed. A cover sheet can be found on the rear page of the 10-10 NEWS. A Dupe Sheet must accompany all logs. 
