

Words from the President

HOWARD BOWMAN W6QIR #4509



LAST ISSUE I HAD A LEAD PARAGRAPH which was a sort of 'then and now' piece about ten. Last Sunday, listening around, I heard a faint signal - a chap in Texas working someone I could not hear. When they finished, I called and worked the Texas station. Signals weren't good, but we managed to finish things with some fills.

Thinking about these poor conditions moved me to get down my 1985 ARRL Handbook and look at what they had to say about propagation. It turns out that the average length of the sunspot cycle is eleven years, but don't let that fool you, because the cycles have varied from nine to thirteen. The one we're in now surely isn't a 'nine', so maybe its going to turn out to be a 'thirteen'. Anyhow, making the assumption that eleven is about as good a guess as I can make, I looked up an old log book - the one for the spring and summer of 1975.

I was amazed to discover a wealth of contacts on ten. The 10-10 numbers were noted for most of them, and I had worked into all call areas except the first. That's a lot different from my log book these days! The only reasonable explanation that occurs to me is that I'm getting on the air less these days than I was then. And, by the way, this current sunspot cycle is supposed to bottom out in late 1986 or early 1987. Guess we'll have to wait and see.

One other thing — can it be that conditions are better in some parts of the country than they are out here in California. I have no way of knowing, but if anyone wants to express an opinion, be my guest. Write me at 5872 W. 77 Place, Los Angeles, CA 90045. And, if you enclose a small size SASE, I'll send you both the ARRL-IARU phonetic alphabet and a handy time conversion table. Now, that's an offer you can't refuse!

One day recently I received a letter from Newsy, WIFFT, and, later the same day, a telephone call from Al Kaiser, NIAPI. Both had the same message, that John Schmitt, WAIZLK, had become a Silent Key. Last issue I mentioned that John, who had taken over as first district Manager when Earle White, WINC, became ill, had himself fallen ill and turned the reins over to NIAPI. John was a long-time, dedicated ten-tenner, and we will miss him.

I THINK THAT MOST OF YOU ARE AWARE that these remarks don't all get written at the last minute, just before Editor Jim Michaels, W6PGM, is putting the issue to bed. Mostly, I start a couple of weeks after each issue appears, and try to get a couple of pages written long enough before the deadline so that I can use the third page to catch up on late developments, if any. Right at the bottom of the last issue is a box which warns everyone that the deadline for the next issue, which is scheduled to be published in July, is June 15. I am writing this on May 15, so I have, theoretically, a month to do the next two pages. However, in this case that isn't true, since we plan to leave for a little trip on June 6 and will not return until after the deadline. Jim tells me that so long as I give him my three pages camera-ready by, maybe, a week or two after deadline, he will not complain. However, I must admit that I am somewhat compulsive about deadlines.

SOME YEARS AGO, I ASKED MANAGERS around the country and elsewhere to give some serious consideration to backup. None of us is exempt from the vagaries of fate, and the sudden inability of a manager to function may go far beyond creating problems for his or her family. If there is a 10-10 backup available who can take over in an emergency, it will relieve the Manager's mind of that little bit of concern.

Now, how does the Manager find someone who may function as a substitute or even take over the operation entirely. That is where you come in. Make yourself known to your call area Manager. Show interest in the operation. Learn something about it. Let the Manager know that you are willing and able to act for him or her. 3

I DON'T KNOW OF ANYONE WHO PUTS FORTH MORE TIME AND EFFORT on 10-10 matters than does Lee Pasewalk, WB6MGM, who is Records Manager. If you look at the back cover of this issue (and every issue), you'll see Lee's name and address there. He is the center post of the whole tent, so to speak.

Managers send Lee all their update information - new members, renewals, name, address and call sign changes - and Lee puts it all together to go to the computer file every quarter. From that computer file, all 10-10 matters flow. Annually, following the December update, we get copies of the "Directory", which is a complete listing of all 10-10 members, with full data on each. It comes in two versions, one in order of 10-10 number, the other by district, with call signs arranged alphabetically within the district. A copy of this last one is broken down by Lee and forwarded to the respective managers.

The other three quarters of the year (March, June, September), we get only what we call a "bob-tailed" version of the Directory. It contains data only for those members whose dues are not more than three months in arrears. You may deduce from this that if you join 10-10 and pay dues for one year only, you actually get five quarters of membership, not just four. Of course, this "bob-tailed" version of the Directory is only a fraction as large as the complete version, hence costs less to have run and to mail to managers.

WHEN WE ALSO PLAN TO PUBLISH A ROSTER, as we did last time, we get, additionally, the copy for the Roster (done on a laser printer for clarity), but also a "reverse" Roster, which lists members by call sign within each district. The Roster copy has to be separated page by page and "pasted up" so that two pages as they came from the computer result in one page when printed. With this done, one may then determine how many pages there are to be in the complete publication (it must be a number divisible by four), number the pages, get the cover copy made up, and send the whole mess off to the printer.

AT THIS POINT YOU MAY BE WONDERING WHY we bother to have these various computer outputs done both by 10-10 number and by call sign. Wouldn't one or the other be sufficient? The answer to that question is a resounding "No!" Members forget their 10-10 numbers and we can only trace through call signs - sometimes through several changes brought about by residential moves, upgrades, and other factors. Occasionally we get one that we can't trace, but it is a rare thing. Several years ago we had a spate of situations in which a ham claimed a number for which we could find no attachment to his call sign. I don't know exactly how it happened in these cases, but there is a way in which it could happen. It goes like this: Ham A (a member) works Ham B (not a member), and asks him if he is a 10-10 member. Getting a negative answer, Ham A says, "It's easy to become a member. Let me give you my number." Ham B assumes that he has been given a 10-10 number and proceeds to use it as his number, which ultimately leads to all sorts of confusion.

ONE PROBLEM THAT 10-10 HAS IS MISINFORMATION on the air. I heard a chap the other evening who said, in all seriousness, that 10-10 started by a group of hams getting together on the air, deciding that they needed some additional identification, and proceeding to hand out I.D. numbers on the air. Now, that has some small basis of truth, but is mostly misinformation, in that it is woefully incomplete. Worst of all, the chap who said it had a low 10-10 number and should have known better. I can think of only one legitimate way in which one can get a 10-10 number on the air. Let's say you have completed all the requirements and sent off an application to your district manager, along with a check. You don't hear anything for a couple of days and get antsy. Then you happen to work your manager and ask him if he has received your application. He answers that he has, that he has mailed everything to you and you should have it in a day or two, and if you are that antsy, here's the number you have been assigned. Now, that would be legitimate.

A COUPLE OF PAGES BACK I MENTIONED THAT these three pages weren't all going to be written at one shot. There has been a time gap immediately preceding this page, during which XYL Edith and I went off to Alaska. It wasn't practical to take 10 meter gear along, so I compromised by taking a 2 meter hand-held, hoping to make contacts in Anchorage and Fair-banks, where there seemed to be more repeaters than in other locations. My results? Zilch! I did meet one other ham, however, whom Edith spotted on the cruise from Whittier to Vancouver. He was a 7 from down Arizona way who, when asked if he worked 10, replied in the negative, but told me that there was some kind of a CW group on 10, and that they had an organization. It turned out that he was talking about 10-10. I don't know what CW group he was referring to.

AS USUAL, THERE WAS A BOX OF MAIL WAITING AT THE POST OFFICE, most of which turned out to be of the junk variety. I'll get to the rest, but it will take time to get to it. This page comes first, or Editor Jim Michaels will not be so genial with me.

BY THE TIME YOU GET THIS ISSUE, THOSE OF YOU WHO HAVE ORDERED ROSTERS will have received them, providing the Postal Service cooperates. We had hoped that the Roster would be out by late May. However, even though I hurried and got the copy in very early, a combination of circumstances threw a monkey wrench into the works, so that delivery by June 6 was the earliest we could get. When I arrived home on the 16th and had no copy in the mail, I was really concerned, but a couple of calls straightened things out, and as of this writing, Dee Gilbert, KA6HQJ, who is Roster Manager, has things well in hand. And, by the way, if things go wrong on your Roster order, don't write Dee! She has no information about your order. Your order should go to your District Manager, who receives and accounts for the money you have sent (\$4.50). Your Manager then sends a mailing sticker to Dee, who affixes it to an envelope and mails out the Roster. She has no records of what is sent out, hence cannot answer questions. And, by the way, if you have not yet ordered your Roster, do it now. The quantity is limited, and, if we sell out early, we can get a new edition in the works.

WHEN I MENTIONED AN ISSUE OR TWO BACK THAT WE MIGHT GET TO ENGLAND in the early fall, it elicited some letters from G-land, and they were most welcome. One came from Geoff Simpson, G3WYI, No. 27933. Geoff is the son of the late Joe Simpson, G4JS, No. 969, whose picture was on the cover of the Winter, 1983 issue of this journal, and whom many of us had met when he was visiting the U. S. during the summer of the previous year.

Geoff was especially concerned with the late delivery of the News to DX members, and asked if the old practice of air delivery for an additional fee might be reinstituted. To answer Geoff and other DX members who have asked the same question would take more space than I have available. A short answer is that there are a number of factors involved, and they deal with almost every aspect of mailing the News. Most important among them, however, is that if we do this for a limited number of DX members (and there never were more than twenty or so who requested and paid for this service) someone has to do it. That is, someone has to take all pieces to the post office, have them weighed and pay the appropriate postage (which varies with distance), and get them into the mail.

Geoff reports that the Pendle Witch and Laurel Mancunium Chapters are going great guns, but that they are having problems with people who send them IRC's which are unstamped by country of origin, and hence unnegotiable, as well as those who send checks in Canadian and U. S. dollars, which cost more to cash than they are worth. Incidentally, Treasurer Gerry Gross has mentioned the same problem. The answer is, don't send a check, send an International Postal Money Order.

AND A LETTER FROM PHIL DYKES, G4XYX says that he runs 10 w. P.E.P on SB and 1 watt on CW, and has collected thus far in 1986 14 new numbers. His complaint - I hear stations in the U. S. faintly, but can't break them because they don't pause long enough to listen!

THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY THE PRESIDENT, HOWARD BOWMAN, W60IR. FOLLOWING THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE, A MOMENT OF SILENCE WAS OBSERVED FOR OUR SILENT KEYS. OFFICERS IN ATTENDANCE WERE INTRODUCED AND INCLUDED: VICE-PRESIDENT, W6IRT (NORM); TREASURER, W64POZ (GERRY); RECORDING SECT., BOB (W6WPY); DIRECTORS, MORRIE (W6EHM) AND DON (W6AGP); SUPPLY MGR., JIM (AF6Ø). CHAPTER OFFICERS PRESENT WERE KEYSTONE/KEYSTONE STARS C.H. KD6JC (LOVERGNE) AND C.M. W46KFT (W4YNE), AND QRP C.H. W6IRT (NORM)

THE PRESIDENT REPORTED THAT CORRESPONDENCE HAS OCCURRED BETWEEN HIMSELF AND SOME OF THE AREA MANAGERS CONCERNING THE SELECTION OF ALTERNATES FOR AREA MANAGER POSITIONS. THIS IS FOR BACK-UP PURPOSES IN THE EVENT REPLACEMENT BECOMES NECESSARY. IN THIS REGARD, HE REPORTED THAT THE VE, VO AREA MANAGER FUNCTION IS BEING TRANSFERED TO CAROL HUGENTOBER (K8DHK). CAROL WILL NOW HAVE ALL DX AREAS EXCEPT VK AND ZL. FUTURE CORRESPONDENCE CONCERNING VE, VO MATTERS ARE TO BE SENT TO CAROL.

REGARDING THE REVISED EDITION OF THE 10X ROSTER, HOWARD RE-PORTED THAT DELIVERY FROM THE PRINTER IS SCHEDULED FOR 6 JUNE AND THAT MAILINGS SHOULD OCCUR VIA ROSTER MGR. (DEE, KA6HQJ) SHORTLY THEREAFTER.

AN APPEAL WAS MADE BY HOWARD FOR ALL MEMBERS TO HELP IN IDENTIFYING CANDIDATES FOR THIS FALLS ELECTION OF OFFICERS FOR THE 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NET. THESE POSITIONS ARE FOR TWO YEARS AND THE OFFICES ARE FOR PRESIDENT, VICE-PRESIDENT, TREASURER, AND RECORDING SECRETARY. AS IN THE PAST, VOLUNTEERS DO NOT VENTURE FORWARD AND VIABLE CANDIDATES ARE URGENTLY NEEDED.

THE TREASURER (GERRY, WA6FOZ) REPORTED ON FINANCIAL STATUS OF THE ORGANIZATION WHICH CONTINUES TO BE HEALTHY. GERRY AGAIN STRESSED THE NEED FOR MEMBERS TO MAKE CHECKS PAYABLE TO 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NET, INC. RATHER THAN THE AREA MANAGERS. ALL CHECKS ARE DEPOSITED IN CALIFORNIA VIA GERRY. HE ALSO STATED THAT MEMBERS SHOULD BE AWARE THAT FROM 6-8 WEEKS ELAPSE BEFORE CHECKS ARE CLEARED. ALSO REPORTED WAS THAT A STATE OF CALIFORNIA RESALE LICENSE HAS BEEN OBTAINED THUS EXEMPTING TAXES PAID FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THE 10-10 NEWS. WHILE IN JORDAN RECENTLY, GERRY REPORTED HE WORKED AS JYBGO MAKING 1718 CONTACTS 120 OF WHICH WERE ON 10 METERS.

THE MEETING CONCLUDED WITH THE DRAWING OF NUMBER ASSIGNMENTS FOR THE WORKED ALL CONTINENTS (WAC) AWARD. CHUCK (W6YLJ), WHO DEVELOPED THE CERTIFICATE PROGRAM, CONDUCTED THE DRAWING WITH WA3GLQ (GEORGE BRADBURN) BEING ISSUED CERTIFICATE #1.

Several years ago I responded to a question as to why it takes 6 weeks for a check made payable to 10-10 to clear. Recently I have had several checks return unpaid because of 'closed account' or 'non-sufficient funds' both checks were within a week of being 6 weeks from 'date of issue' to the date of 'demand for payment'. A quick review: Area Managers send me monthly all checks received. I deposit them within a week. It can take a week for the check to work its way back to the bank for payment. PLEASE allow 6 weeks for processing (its your float). Also checks should always be made payable to '10-10 International Net, Inc.', not the Area Manager.

As far as Jordan, the call issued to me was JY860, I made 1718 total contacts, 122 on 10 meters, 104 countries (36 on 10), and 5 new 10-10 numbers. For the CQ-WPX I made 1268 contacts, 459 prefixes, for a total of 1,989,306 points, 3 more prefixes and I would have had 2 million points.

I returned to find I was going to spend the week of my wedding anniversary, number 18, in Hawaii. Anyway with all the traveling I'm a running late producing the year-end reports, they'll be ready for the next issue of the NEWS.




Ten-Ten "Worked All Continents" Certificates Issued




OKIB RELAYS




