

Words from the President

OVER THE YEARS, 10-10 HAS NEITHER ENCOURAGED OR DISCOURAGED multi-year memberships. From time to time, members have concluded that trying to remember to renew each year gets to be an iffy proposition, and renew for several years all at one fell swoop. My own expiration date is 0688, so I imagine I sent W6ANK a check for three years' dues last time I renewed. However, this can lead to problems. Recently, a member sent in a check which would have carried his membership well over into the next century. It could not be accepted. There just wasn't any way in which existing computer programming could handle it.

At its last meeting, in mid-August, the Board of Directors reviewed the problem and came to the conclusion that 10-10 should not accept renewals for more than five years. It wasn't just a matter of computer programming, either. The Directors have no crystal balls, and know of no way in which 10-10's operating costs can be predicted. It was deemed expedient to provide some time during which the computer problems may be resolved and we will have a better handle on costs, hence the five year limitation. Just so you won't bug me about it, let me say that a ten year limitation was considered and discarded. That would carry us to 1996, which is just getting too close to the crucial dates, which are 1999 and 2000.

In connection with this decision, all District Managers have been alerted and are prepared to handle the situation. Who knows, maybe a lot of you will elect to re-up for five years. And, by the way, don't get the idea that you can send in for a five year renewal now, and another one next year. It won't be accepted.

CHUCK IMSANDE, WHO WRITES A COLUMN ON 10-10 FOR WORLDRADIO called me to ask about W60I. W60I is the call sign of the late Jim Paine, who held 10-10 No. 109. That low a number indicates that Jim was one of the "founding fathers" of 10-10. He was also 10-10's Treasurer and Recording Secretary for a good many years. His name and call sign were printed on my earliest membership card, dated May 12, 1972 - not just stamped or handwritten, and so it was up to 1977, when Jim passed away.

That call sign, W60I, is now issued to 10-10, with Morrie Goldman, W6EHM, as trustee. It is available for use at 10-10 special event stations upon application to Morrie. It hasn't been used for some time -- band conditions have precluded many operations -- but it is available.

A PART OF THE INTERNATIONAL 500 OF THE WORLD IS THE LUCKY 13. For some years it has been administered by Mark Morris, KØWZX. For personal reasons, Mark has found it necessary to pass this job on to someone else, and that 'someone' will be Bobbie Vaughan, WB7NUU, who already administers the Bar program up through the 900 Bar. Since it is Bobbie who hands out the 500 Bars, the assignment is a natural. It is attainment of the 500 Bar that gets you an Honorary VP number and makes you eligible for activities for the VP's. Mark has done a fine job and deserves everyone's thanks, especially mine. Incidentally, Grace Dunlap, K5MRU, who is 5th District Manager, is also President of the International 500 of The World, which was founded by the late Frank Orcutt, W4JO, who, for many years, was 10-10 Awards Manager. That was when 10-10 was a small organization. Now the awards are managed by half a dozen people.

ONE OF THE THINGS THAT INTRIGUES ME MOST ABOUT 10-10 is the diversity of interests among its members. There are those who are mostly interested in working new numbers so as to

get Bars, those who are into the Honorary V. P. activities, the QRP addicts, and those whose main interest is paper chasing, plus many other interests. Among the paper chasers there are those who believe that all is lost and life isn't worth living unless they have a 100% correct absolutely up-to-date list of 10-10 numbers and the call signs associated with them. They complain that the 10-10 Roster is "obsolete" when published (true), and believe that they should be able to obtain quarterly updates of the numbers issued. The fact that such updates are themselves "obsolete" for the same reason that applies to the Roster doesn't bother them.

The late Jack Smothers, KD7XI, published such a quarterly update, and his records were taken over by Gary Ward, KD7UZ. However, Gary has now withdrawn from that activity and has refunded any money sent for subscriptions to the service. Quarterly updates are still available from "Corky" Cochran, W3FQN. Corky puts the info into his computer, makes a copy, and can provide the data on an $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" sheet. To get it, send him a business size SASE and tell him in a covering note just what it is you want. Remember, by the time you read this there will be two quarters of updates. If you want the copy flat it will cost you more - 394 plus a nickel for the envelope. For those whose bifocals don't quite do the trick, Corky also has an expanded type version for the 39 + 5 rate. In both cases, the 54 should be in stamps, which will save Corky some trips to the post office. The printout you receive will not list SK's, which are elsewhere in the News anyhow, but will have an indicator for call sign changes. Corky's address is 4221 Harcourt Road, Baltimore, MD 21214.

OVERSEAS MEMBERS CONTINUE TO HAVE PROBLEMS with paying their dues. Carol Hugentober, K8DHK, says that most manage to send cash, despite the hazards. Treasurer Gerry Gross tells one horror story of a member sending a check which still hadn't gone through the mill when that same member sent another check for the next year's dues! ARRL says, "Foreign remittances should be by international postal or express money order or bank draft negotiable in the US and for an equivalent amount in US funds." (QST, p. 3, any recent issue). A few members send IRC's, which are redeemable for 37¢ each in stamps. As you can see, it gets complicated. Carol says she gets more cash than anything, and that some chaps behind the Iron Curtain send mint stamps in payment. Happily, Carol and OM John (N8FU) are stamp collectors, so they buy them for their collection. Carol says that the cash is easiest to handle - a lot easier than some of the 'funky' checks she gets and has to pass along to Gerry.

BACK A COUPLE OF PARAGRAPHS I WAS WRITING ABOUT aid for distressed paper chasers. There is another item which, in my judgment, is more important than a Roster update, and that is Jim Beswick's "10-X Certificate Guide." It contains everything you ever wanted to know about 10-10 and chapter awards and certificates. Jim hasn't sent me any up-to-date pricing information, but you can get that from him directly for an SASE.

Main reason for the importance of what Jim does is that there is just a whale of a lot of misinformation floating around on the band, even misinformation about as simple a thing as becoming a member of 10-10. Anyhow, if you want to know about Jim's Guide, his address is as follows: Jim Beswick, W4YHF, Rt. 5, Box 77B, Ellijay, GA 30540.

YOU MAY HAVE NOTICED THAT, FROM TIME TO TIME, this journal publishes a 10-10 Net Guide. It is laid out by days of the week, and tries to list the various chapters that have nets on each day, showing times and frequencies. These days it has a high level of inaccuracy. Reason: net officers aren't reporting changes and deletions to Bob Wille, NZ5E, who puts it together. If Bob doesn't get the correct dope, he can't put it in the Guide. Simple as that. Connie Hauck has promised to put a reminder in her next letter to Chapter Heads, and I hope they take heed. Bob's address is 804 Colleyville Ter., Colleyville, TX 76034

A WEEK BEFORE COPY DEADLINE FOR THIS JOURNAL, the ARRL National Convention was held in San Diego. We were there, along with dozens of other ten-tenners. Traffic at the booth was heavy, and we did a land-office business in renewals and Rosters. Our deepest thanks go to Dick Gird, K6PZE, who was our man on the spot in San Diego, handling all preliminary arrangements, getting things set up, going out to get some printing done when we ran out of application forms on the first day, and otherwise doing a great all-around job. Our thanks also to the dozen or so others who rallied around to man (and woman) the booth in shifts, so that we had complete coverage from opening to closing. And, while I am at it, I can't forget the other groups around the country who represent 10-10 at hamfests and conventions. They do a great job, and, if your chapter intends to represent 10-10 at such an event, Supply Manager Jim Forsyth, AF6O, has a convention packet you can get.

TVE REPORTED BEFORE ON THESE PAGES THAT MY LOCATION is about four miles from the Pacific Ocean, and about 60 feet above sea level. When the band is in good shape, I have trouble checking in on the daily net because my signal is overwhelmed by those coming from east of the Rockies. That has meant I had to rely on a relay, and one of the most reliable was Frank Cembruch, KA4DDY, No. 26110, in Clearwater, Florida. On the first daily net after we got home from San Diego, Connie Hauck, K6EXQ, brought us the distresing news that Frank had become a Silent Key. I never did get a chance to thank him for all the favors he had done for me, and I regret that. 73, Frank, and thanks.

MANAGERS WHO HANDLE AWARDS CONTINUE TO HAVE PROBLEMS, mostly because people don't take the time to read the rules. Some months back I had a large envelope delivered to me. It was from a member who was in high dudgeon because he had submitted data for a Bar award and it was rejected because he didn't send proof of paid-up membership. He was so upset that he sent me everything connected with 10-10 - membership card and certificate, chapter award certificates, and everything else he could think of. One chap applied for his first five 100 Bars all at once so he could get a 500 Bar and a VP Number. He followed almost none of the rules.

Look at it this way. Those managers are volunteers who sacrifice lots of operating time so they can help you. Give them a break. Follow the rules. Enclose an SASE and help 10-10 save on postage. Be sure you also enclose proof of paid-up membership (a copy of your current membership card or of the News address label will do), so that we will know you are not free-loading on that membership you took out ten years ago and have never renewed since. Just a few weeks ago, I applied to Chuck Imsande, W6YLJ, for the new WAC Certificate, and I had to enclose a copy for proof. If I can't get away with leaving it out, neither can you. Be a good sport — follow the rules, no matter which 10-10 award you are applying for.

ELSEWHERE IN THIS ISSUE, YOU WILL FIND AN ANNOUNCEMENT of a 10-10 International Convention, which is being sponsored by the Red River Valley Chapter, the Shreveport Amateur Radio Association, and the Shreveport-Bossier Convention and Tourist Bureau. It is scheduled to be held in Shreveport, Louisiana on August 8 and 9 of 1987. Its dates do not conflict with those planned for the Reno, Nevada meeting of paper chasers.

That convention plan brings up a larger question, which is, should 10-10 have an annual convention of its own? In a large city or a middle-sized city? Which local chapters would like to sponsor such a convention in, say, 1988? We here have no way of knowing your feelings about such matters unless you tell us. SUBJECT: MEETING OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS DATE: AUGUST 13, 1986 LOCATION: WAGIR QTH, LOS ANGELES, CA



SUBJECT MEETING WAS CALLED BY THE PRESIDENT (WAQIR) TO DISCUSS ITEMS PERTI-NENT TO THE OPERATION OF THE ORGANIZATION. DIRECTORS IN ATTENDANCE INCLUDED: PRESIDENT (W6QIR), VICE-PRESIDENT (W6IRT), TREASURER (WA6POZ), RECORDING SECRETARY (W6WPY), DIRECTORS W6EHM, W6AGP, & W6OAW. IN ADDITION. 10-10 NEWS EDITOR, JIM MICHAELS (W6PGM) WAS INVITED TO ATTEND. DISCUSSION ITEMS:

1) CANDIDATES FOR ELECTIVE OFFICE:

DISPOSITION: AFTER REPEATED REQUESTS (VIA 10-10 NEWS AND VARIOUS MTGS) FOR MEMBERS TO SUBMIT NAMES FOR THIS NOVEMBERS ELECTION OF OFFICERS. PRESIDENT, VICE-PRESIDENT, TREASURER, & RECORDING SECRETARY, NONE HAVE BEEN RECEIVED BY THE PRESIDENT TO DATE. AN EXCEPTION TO THIS IS THE CURRENT TREASURER (WASPOZ) AGREEING TO ACCEPT ANOTHER TERM AS TREASURER AND THE CURRENT RECORDING SECRETARY DECLINING TO BE CANDIDATE FOR OFFICE OF SECRETARY. ONE PERSON HAS VOLUNTEERED FOR THE SECRETARY OFFICE POSI-TION, HOWEVER.

2) CANDIDATES FOR BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

DISPOSITION: PER LATEST 10-10 BY-LAWS (JAN 1, 1981), A COPY OF WHICH WAS PRINTED IN THE WINTER, 1983 ISSUE OF THE 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NEWS, THE BOARD SHALL CONSIST OF EIGHT MEMBERS. FOUR OF THESE SHALL BE THE ELECTED OFFICERS AS DESCRIBED ABOVE (ITEM 1). THE IMMEDIATE PAST PRESI-DENT SHALL BE A MEMBER, EX-OFFICIO. THREE MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MAJORITY VOTE OF THE MEMBERS PRESENT AT ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING. AS THE TERM OF OFFICE OF APPOINTED DIRECTORS DO NOT RUN CONCURRENT, TWO DIRECTORS SHALL BE APPOINTED AT THE NOVEMBER BUSINESS MEETING.

3) REPLACEMENT OF CURRENT 10-10 NEWS EDITOR JIM MICHAELS (W6PGM):

DISPOSITION: WHEN JIM TOOK ON THE ASSIGNMENT AS EDITOR OF SPRING '82 ISSUE OF 10-10 NEWS. IT WAS WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT IT WOULD BE FOR A TEMPORARY PERIOD ONLY. AFTER A REVIEW OF CANDIDATES, THE DIRECT-ORS DECIDED TO PROCEED WITH JOE WILLIAMS, WA9TSG, 10X #00310. WAPGM HAS BEEN IN CONTACT WITH JOE TO AFFECT AN ORDERLY TRANSFER OF RESPONSI-JIM WILL PREPARE HIS FINAL PUBLICATION AS EDITOR WITH THE FALL 1986 ISSUE OF THE 10-10 NEWS. THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS APPLAUDED JIM FOR HIS DEDICATED AND OUTSTANDING WORK AS EDITOR.

4) REQUEST FOR PUBLICATION OF ROSTER UPDATES IN THE 10-10 NEWS:

DISPOSITION: THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS DECIDED IT WOULD NOT BE COST EFFEC-TIVE TO INCLUDE QUARTERLY UPDATES IN THE 10-10 NEWS FOR ROSTER UPDATE PURPOSE. AN ANNUAL ISSUE OF UPDATED ROSTER IS STILL CONTINGENT UPON SALES OF CURRENT ROSTER PRINTINGS.

5) MAXIMUM ALLOWABLE YEARS OF MEMBERSHIP PREPAID:

DISPOSITION: IT WAS DECIDED THAT 10-10 CANNOT ACCEPT MULTI-YEAR MEMBER-SHIPS (OR MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS) FOR ANY PERIOD GREATER THAN FIVE YEARS. THIS DECISION WAS BASED PRIMARILY THAT NO ONE IS ABLE TO PREDICT WHAT 10-10'S OPERATING EXPENSES ARE LIKELY TO BE BEYOND THAT TIME.



Ten-Ten QSO Parties are open to all amateurs but only paid-up members are eligible for awards or chapter assignment of scores. They are conducted to encourage Ten-Meter operation and interest in the Net. Non-members may use numbers collected to qualify for membership; members use them for awards.

RULES

- 1. All contacts must take place between 28.3 and 29.4 MHZ.
- 2. Exchanges: Callsign, Name, City, State and 10-10 number.
- 3. A station may be counted only once.
- 4. Single operator stations only are acceptable.
- 5. SSB, FM, or AM modes are acceptable.
- 6. All contacts must take place within the 48 hour contest period.
- 7. QRP class has been discontinued due to low activity.
- 8. Logs must be kept in UTC (Zulu Time).
- 9. A Dupe Sheet is required of all participants. Indicated computer duping is O.K.
- 10. Chapter assignment of scores may be only by a paid-up member, belonging to that chapter as a local member, and able to work that chapter Net via groundwave from the location of the station working the contest.
- 11. Illegible or improperly submitted logs will be rejected. See below for log submission requirements.
- 12. Failure to comply with any of these rules or their intent may result in disqualification.

SCORING

- 1. Two points for each contact with a 10-10 number exchange.
- 2. One point for each contact without a 10-10 number exchange.

AWARDS

First place certificates to all U.S. call areas; KL7 included with 7th area. Also Canada, South America, Central America, Caribbean (including Bermuda), Europe, Africa, Asia, and the Pacific, (including KH6, all Pacific Islands, New Zealand, and Australia). Individual and chapter scores are published in the NEWS. Paid members only are listed.

LOG SUBMISSION

Logs are accepted from 10-10 members only and must be legible, in UTC, and complete. Each line entry must show callsign, time, name, QTH, and 10-10 number (if any). A Cover Sheet is required showing your name, callsign, QTH, 10-10 number, membership expiration date, chapter assignment (if any), total contacts and total points claimed. A Cover Sheet can be found on the rear page of the 10-10 NEWS. A Dupe Sheet must accompany all logs. good!








