

IF YOU LOOK ON THE LEFT SIDE OF PAGE 2, you'll find a listing of 10-10 officials, and after the word "Editor" you'll see an unfamiliar name. Back in the spring of 1982, Jim Michaels, W6PGM, took over as Editor on a 'temporary' basis. The understanding was that we would undertake a search for a permanent Editor, and that Jim would do the job until we found one. It has taken four years, what with correspondence and telephone calls, but we finally found one. He is Joseph F. Williams, WA9TSG, 10-10 No. 310.

Joe lives in Milwaukee, his native city, and entered the Air Force upon high school graduation. He has worked on the base newspaper and radio and television stations, and attended various universities. Upon discharge, he went back to school full time and completed work in Business Management. He is a Quality Assurance Representative for the U. S. Government, is married, and has four children. He has been in ham radio since 1966, and a 10-10 member since 1968. He was a co-founder of the Milwaukee Chapter.


It is not easy to be a new editor of any kind of periodical. There are just a lot of things to learn, and that takes time. Jim Michaels has been in communication with Joe and has sent him loads of material and passed along all the layout hints and information about sources that he has accumulated in the four years he has held the job. One problem we can foresee is that, by virtue of his geographic location, Joe will not have the intimate knowledge of how 10-10 operates that Jim had. Time will remedy that, and meanwhile, Jim and I will be Joe's sources when he needs information.

BACK A COUPLE OF YEARS AGO, I wrote about an unsuccessful attempt to visit GB2RN, No. 25937, which is located in the bowels of H.M.S. Belfast, tied up in the Thames as a naval museum. GB2RN is operated by the Royal Navy Amateur Radio Society. At the time of our visit, GB2RN was locked up. I found a note containing a name, address, and telephone number, but was unable to make contact, even though I tried both telephone and, later on, a letter.

After I wrote about my visit, I received a very nice letter from Bob Barton, G3PQH. Bob apologised for my lack of success, and gave me his number to call when we were next in London. Well, we were there for a couple of weeks in September. I had written Bob, giving him the name of our hotel and the dates involved, and called him a couple of days after we arrived. To my surprise, I learned that he was aware we were in town. He had called the hotel and ascertained that we had arrived, but decided that we were too much involved in getting over jet lag to want to talk. Anyhow, we made a date to come to the Belfast, met all the gang, and enjoyed a pint of bitter in the rec room.

The group on the Belfast have a most complete photographic history of everything that has happened on the ship and on the river around it, all in albums, plus various souvenirs up on the walls, plus a variety of equipment ranging from old original shipboard gear to modern ham equipment. The station is manned (and womaned) entirely on a volunteer basis, and the chief op is Don Walmsley, G3HZL. If you plan to be in London and want to visit the Belfast, take the tube to Tower Hill station, walk across the Tower Bridge (from which you can see the vessel), then proceed along the river front to the ship itself. I suggest that you call Bob Barton first at 01-648-7448, just to be sure when the station will be open.


LAST ISSUE I WROTE THAT THE LUCKY 13 management was being taken over by Bobbie Vaughan, who also issues the 500 Bars, which makes it a natural association, since you must at-

tain the 500 Bar and become an Honorary V. P. before you can participate in the Lucky 13 activity. For those of you who don't know about it, the Lucky 13 activity involved working another V. P. at (or near) each of the 100 kHz points, from 28.5 to 29.7. That was before. Before, that is, the lower 'phone band edge was moved from 28.5 to 28.3. What to do? There were now 15 possible 100 kHz points, rather than 13, and Lucky 15 wouldn't have much meaning, the tenacity of superstition being what it is.

After a lot of letter writing between Grace Dunlap, K5MRU, who heads up the International 500 of the World, Bobbie Vaughan, and myself, we hit upon a compromise, which was to retain the name, but loosen things up a bit by allowing the thirteen contacts to be spread over all fifteen points. Of course, that meant that we had to do the forms over, but that chore has been accomplished, and Bobbie has a supply. If you need one you you can get it from Bobbie. Her address is 8323 W. Roma Ave., Phoenix AZ, 85037. Be sure that if you write her about that or anything else you include a business size SASE, which will save 10-10 some postage.

THERE IS ANOTHER AWARD FOR HONORARY V.P.s, and this one has some extra reasoning behind it, which is that the extreme edges of our band of choice appear to have low occupancy. Of course, finding few signals below 28.5 may be due to a number of factors, one of which is that many rigs don't cover anything below 28.5 without re-tuning. My TS830S is like that. In order to promote occupancy of the low and high ends of the 10 meter band, the rules for the V. P. Award have been altered somewhat. The basic objective is to work as many other V. P.s as possible, and those who work 100 or more find their achievement acknowledged on the Awards page of this journal.

The change is this: You must make such contacts between 28.3 and 28.550 mHz, or above 28.9 mHz, and each such contact must be maintained for at least five minutes. Prepare your list in numerical order of \underline{V} . P. numbers. List the frequency used or a statement that all contacts were made according to the rules, and send your list to Grace Dunlap, K5MRU, Box 445, La Feria, TX 78559. Now, here's a special instruction for you: \underline{Do} not send an SASE. Instead, send a first class stamp, and, if you are overseas, send $\overline{3}$ IRCs. The reason for this is that the certificate requires an envelope of a different size, so an ordinary SASE won't do it. Remember to send that first-class stamp or the IRCs, along with your proof of paid-up 10-10 membership.

IF YOU LOOK ON PAGE 10 OF THE LAST ISSUE, you'll see an announcement of the Phone QSO Party, to be held on February 7 and 8 of 1987, and you'll observe that the announcement was written by Harry Syring, WB1FTQ, who is Chairman of the Rules and Ethics Committee. Now, please don't ask me how that committee got its name, because there really isn't any committee, and what Harry does is arrange the various 10-10 contests and get volunteer chapters to do the scoring and prepare the results for publication in the News.

It is that last part that is the stumbling block. Harry is in good shape for volunteer chapters through 1987, but in need of some for 1988. Ideally, there should be two chapters involved, one for the 'phone parties and one for the CW parties. Please talk this over with your chapter group and determine if you can handle one or both of these assignments. If you can, and want to volunteer, please do not write Harry. Instead, write to me, Howard Bowman, W6QIR, 5872 W. 77 Place, Los Angeles, CA 90045, or to Connie Hauck, K6EXQ, 794 W. 23 St., Upland, CA 91786. There is a good reason why it would not be advisable for you to write directly to Harry, so, please, send your letter to Connie or to me. Either of us will be able to see that it gets to Harry.

THAT OLD BUSINESS OF UNIDENTIFIABLE CALL SIGNS continues to rear its ugly head (or should I say voice). I heard a chap the other day - a $2x^2$ call sign type who was a 10-10 member - and I absolutely could not decipher the second letter of his call sign. The only way I knew he was a 10-10 member was that he was calling "CQ 10-10." Apparently no one else could understand that second letter either -- he went unanswered.

We used to have a supply of the official ARRL-ICAP phonetic alphabet cards, as well as some handy-dandy time charts, courtesy of Bert Ayers, W6CL, No. 17762. I sent out a lot of them to members who sent me an SASE, and the rest of them disappeared at the San Diego ARRL Convention, so we are temporarily out of stock. However, Bert has told me that he will print us some more, so if you want a set, send me an SASE. My address is on the preceding page.

By the way, through chance I learned that some of our members do not know what "SASE" means. At least, it appears that way, since they don't send one when writing me or one of the managers a letter which requires a reply. "SASE" means stamped self-addressed envelope. If you write a letter which requires a reply, please enclose a stamped, self-addressed envelope. That accomplishes a couple of things. First, it ensures that you will get a reply. Second, it ensures that the addressing of the reply envelope will be as good as you make it. You'd be surprised how difficult it is to decipher some of the names and addresses that come in the mail.

WRITING OF THINGS THAT COME IN THE MAIL BRINGS TO MIND a Christmas card we received from England. It was addressed to my wife and myself, and, oddest of all, incorporated in our street address was our telephone number. Now, the catch to all this is that neither of us recognizes the name signed to the card — a woman's name. Was it from a ham? There was no call sign, so we can't tell. Was it someone we met casually in London? The card didn't come from London, or even from near London, but from the west of England. Biggest puzzle of all: How did our telephone number get incorporated into the address?

SOME TIME BACK I HAD A LETTER FROM ANDY ANDERSON, N5CUQ, No. 00040, in which he told me a lot about various computer programs which he and Bob Young, WlMXI, had developed. Wouldn't it have been wonderful if Bob's call sign, which translates from Roman numerals to Arabic as 1011, had also been his 10-10 number? Sorry, it was not to be. His 10-10 number is 17800.

Anyhow, their stuff is for the Commodore 64 and 128, and they are willing to share. I suggest you write Andy (Rt. 3, Box 245, Fredericksburg TX 78624) for more information. According to Andy, he is the idea man and Bob is the genius who actually dopes out the programs for such things as a fast Bar list, a VP list, a net membership directory, and programs for a certificate file, chapter contacts, 10-10 contests (including a dupe program), WAS, and maybe now for WAC, and on and on and on. I can't possibly describe all the programs here, but if you write Andy (remember that SASE) he'll give you the dope on what is available and how you can get it. Maybe some time Editor Joe (who is also a computer user) will be able to squeeze in some space for listing other computer info and sources. Don't all write at once, but maybe you have some ideas on the subject. If you do, send me a letter.

LAST TIME WE MENTIONED THE 10-10 INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION that is planned for Shreveport, Louisiana this coming August, and asked if there were other groups that wanted to plan for similar gatherings in coming years. No responses thus far. Elsewhere in this issue there is further information about the 1987 convention. Can't predict how this will work out, but first returns, according to Mel Sojka, KD5DE, look very good.

PROPAGATION BEING WHAT IT IS, about the only way I get info as to what is happening around the net is from your letters. Please write me as you find time. My address is 5872 W. 77 Place, Los Angeles 90045. And, again, if you want a reply, send an SASE. I welcome your letters and postal cards and more than welcome the information you can give me.

The Annual Corporate Meeting of 10-10 International was convened, business was discussed, reports were made, and the Election of Officers and Members of the Board of Directors was conducted on Sunday November 16, 1986.

After the call to order by Howard Bowman, President (W6QIR), the Pledge of Allegiance was followed by the recognition of Silent Keys. All Officers and Directors of 10-10 International were introduced, then all those in attendance introduced themselves. 






TRANSMITTER POWER BOOSTER

If your CB or Hamrig is a little shy on talk power, this 10 dB talk power booster will give your signal that extra edge through the QRM (noise). The input impedance is high enough to handle anything from a low impedance dynamic mike to a crystal or ceramic model. You can run the booster into just about any rig; chances are it will work. Since it's so easy and inexpensive to try out a breadboard model, don't bother worrying about the input impedance of your rig; it's faster to give it a try.


Potentiometer R4 serves as the volume control into your rig; it is adjusted for optimum modulation, as indicated on a modulation meter or oscilloscope.

Jacks J1 and J2 match your existing microphone and transmitter connectors. Battery B1 can be the type used for small transistor radios as the current drain is but a few milliamperes. Capacitor C3 must be used regardless of what you use for a power supply. A metal cabinet is suggested to keep hum and RF out of the microphone system.


CODE PRACTICE OSCILLATOR



Ten-Ten lost a dedicated officer on December 6, 1986, when Robert O. "Bob" Hartley became a Silent Key. Bob held No. 14949, issued in mid-1977, when this organization was growing rapidly. His abilities were speedily recognized, and he served as Sixth District Manager until he was elected President, serving the then one-year term of 1979. 10-10 INFORMATION AND AWARDS

MEMBERSHIP

Work 10 members on 10 meters (Novices, DX, 5 only). Log each 10-10 number, call sign, op's name and QTH. Send list to your Call Sign Area Manager (see P. 31) with \$1 Registration Fee (except Novices), plus \$4 for the first year's dues. You will receive a certificate and permanent 10-10 number. You must pay dues annually to remain in good standing and participate fully.

AWARDS

If you apply for any of the following 10-10 awards, you MUST include proof of paid-up membership -- a copy of your membership card or of the address label from the News. Your application will be rejected if you fail to comply.

BARS AND PLAQUES

Log the 10-10 numbers of members you work on 10 meters, all bona-fide number exchanges. List 100, no more, no less, thus:

INTERNATIONAL 500 OF THE WORLD

With your 500 Bar comes an Honorary V. P. Number, membership in the international 500 of the World, and added activities including the following two awards:

- 1. The V. P. Certificate. Certificates go to members who work 100, 200, and so on, other V. P. s But contacts must be made between 28.3 and 28.55 mHz, or above 28.9 mHz. The purpose is to promote band-edge occupancy. Each contact must be maintained for at least 5 minutes. Send your list in order of V. P. numbers to Grace Dunlap, K5MRU, Box 445, LaFeria, TX 78559. You must also include the 10-10 number of each V. P. on your list. Do not send an SASE. A special envelope is required, so send a first-class stamp. Overseas members send 3 IRC's. Include proof of your paid-up 10-10 membership.
- 2. The Lucky 13. There are 15 100 kHz points between 28.3 mHz and 29.7 mHz. Work 13 of them and you qualify for the Lucky 13 Award. Contacts must be other V, P,'s. Forms and rules are available from Bobbie Vaughan, 8323 W. Roma Ave., Phoenix, AZ 85037. Send a 4" x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " SASE.

This certificate is awarded to 10-10 members who can show proof of having worked a 10-10 member in each of the six continental areas - North and South America, Europe, Africa, Asia, and Oceania. A., payable when you apply with QSL proof of contacts, and includes return postage.

WORKED ALL STATES

Work and get QSL confirmation from one 10-10 member in each of the 50 states. List states alphabetically with full data on each contact. Mail cards and list to Susan Brackeen, KAICAD, P.O. Box 7081, Johnston, Rl 02919.DX members save by sending non-returnable copies of cards. All pertinent data must show, but more than one card per sheet is OK. Also include state list with all information, plus \$2.60 U. S. funds for certificate and return postage. Be sure to include your own name, call sign, address, 10-10 number, and proof of paid-up 10-10 membership. Do not send cash!

COUNTRIES AWARD

The Countries Award is given for confirmation (QSL's) of QSO's exchanging 10-10 numbers with members in 25 or more contries. Cost is \$5, U. S. funds. For complete rules and application form, send a 4" x 91 SASE to Alan Sherman, KIAS, RR4, Box 422, Danielson, CT (6239, U. S. A.

Make any checks payable to 10-10 international Net, inc. Foreign applicants use International Postal Money Order. NEVER SEND CASH. Canadian, Australian, New Zealand members are reminded that dollar amounts quoted are U.S. dollars. Your bank has exchange rate information.

Remember, award applicants must include proof of paid-up membership - a copy of your membership card or the address label on your most recent cupy of the News. If you fail to show such proof, your application will be returned without action. Either the membership card or the label shows the expiration date of your membership.


