

OFFICIAL 10-10 CORPORATE NEWS

At a meeting of the board of directors on March 18, 1987, a resolution was adopted to amend the Articles of Incorporation and to file same with the Secretary of State, State of California. At a general meeting in Long Beach, CA on June 7, 1987 the resolution was presented to the members present. After discussion the changes were adopted. In August 1987, a properly signed document was forwarded to the State for recordation. On October 13, 1987 the approval was received. We definitely expect to have the scholarship fund set up and in operation by early 1988.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION as amended (abbreviated version)

The name of this corporation is: 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NET, INC.

The objectives of the corporation are: To promote amateur radio activity on the 10 meter band, to handle traffic, and to assist all amateurs in improving their technical skills and operating procedures. To operate exclusively for charitable, educational and scientific purposes entitling 10-10 to exemption under the provisions of section 501 (c)(3) of the IRS code of 1954, as amended, and more specifically to promote interest in amateur radio communications and the advancement of the electronic art, making use of the reservoir of knowledge and experience represented within the membership of 10-10 for the benefit of all radio amateurs and the furtherance of the public welfare through amateur radio communications; to provide a scholarship fund for worthy students who are radio amateurs.

No part of the income of 10-10 shall be used to the benefit of any member, director or officer of 10-10 or any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for 10-10 affecting one or more of its purposes), and no member, director or officer of 10-10 or any private individual shall be entitled to share in the distribution of 10-10's assets on dissolution of 10-10.

No part of the activities of 10-10 shall include participating in or intervening in (including the publication or distribution of statements for) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office or engaging in any substantial way, directly or indirectly, in carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation.

The corporation (10-10) is organized pursuant to the general nonprofit corporation laws of the State of California.

The County of Los Angeles is the location of the principal office for the transaction of the business of 10-10.

The qualifications of membership, voting and other rights and privileges of members, their liability to dues and assessments and the collection thereof, shall be set forth in the bylaws.

Authority is granted to the members of 10-10 entitled to vote, to change the authorized number of directors of 10-10 by a duly adopted amendment of the bylaws of 10-10.

PROPOSED BYLAWS, 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NET INC.

ARTICLE I: ORGANIZATION NAME

The name of this organization is: 10-10 International Net, Inc. Another form of the name may be Ten-Ten International Net, Inc. The name may also be abbreviated, for example, 10-10, 10-10 Net, Ten-Ten, Ten-X. In these bylaws, the abbreviation "10-10" will be used.

ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

The purposes of 10-10 are to promote activity on the 10 meter amateur band, to handle traffic, and to assist radio amateurs in improving their technical skills and operating procedures. In addition the operation of 10-10 shall be for charitable, educational, and scientific purposes related to amateur radio.

ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP

Section 1.

Any licensed amateur radio operator may qualify for membership. The requirements shall be established by the Board of Directors and published in the quarterly 10-10 news. Section 2.

Membership in 10-10 shall be cancelled upon:

(a) The revocation, cancellation or suspension of his amateur radio license privileges.

(b) The dues becoming deligerent more than

(b) The dues becomming delinquent more than three months following the renewal due date. Section 3.

The five classes of membership for 10-10 are:

- (a) U.S. MEMBER
- (b) INTERNATIONAL MEMBER
- (c) FAMILY MEMBER
- (d) LIFE MEMBER
- (e) HONORARY MEMBER

Section 4.

Classes of membership are defined as follows:
(a) 1. U.S. Members are those members residing within a United States postal sip code area.

2. U.S. Members shall hold full rights and privileges of membership including receipt of the quarterly 10-10 NEWS.

- (b) 1. International Members are all members whose mailing address is not within a United States postal sip code mailing address.
- 2. International Members shall hold full rights and privileges of membership with the exception of receiving the 10-10 NEWS.
- 3. Publications may be purchased upon payment of an amount established periodically to cover the cost of printing and mailing. (c) 1. Family Membership consists of a primary member (U.S., International or Life member) and one or more relatives who could otherwise qualify for 10-10 membership and who reside at the same location and postal address.
- 2. Family Members shall hold full rights and privileges of membership, with the exception that only the primary member shall receive the quarterly 10-10 NEWS if applicable.
- 3. Family Membership shall run concurrently with that of the primary member.
 (d) 1. Life Membership will be granted to those members whose dues have been paid for life, or granted by action of the Board of Directors.
- 2. Life Members shall hold full rights and privileges of membership including receipt of the quarterly 10-10 NEWS.
- (e) 1. Honorary Membership may be granted by action of the Board of Directors in recognition of outstanding services rendered to 10-10.
- 2. Honorary membership shall include receipt by the member of the quarterly 10-10 NEWS.

ARTICLE IV: DUES

The Board of Directors will establish dues for the various membership classes, which will be published in the quarterly 10-10 NEWS.

ARTICLE V: GOVERNMENT

Section 1.

The general management of the affairs of 10-10 shall be vested in the Board of Directors.

Section 2.

The officers of 10-10 shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. Section 3.

The Board of Directors shall consist of: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and 10 Directors.

Section 4.

The President shall be a member ex officio of all committees except the nominating committee.

Roberts Rules of Order shall govern all regular meetings as well as meetings of the Board of Directors and of 10-10 in all cases applicable.

ARTICLE VI: BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors shall control the property and affairs of 10-10 and shall establish its policies. It shall have the power to hold meetings and take all necessary and effective steps to carry out the purposes of 10-10 and promote its best interest. It shall have the authority to hire employees as may be considered necessary and fix their compensation. Section 2.

No officer or Director shall receive remuneration for his services to 10-10. This does not preclude a reimbursement for documented, approved and reasonable 10-10 expenses. Section 3.

Each officer and Director shall serve for a term of four (4) years or until his successor is duly elected and installed in office.

No Director shall hold a position on the Board of Directors if his business activities or income are such that he could conceivably gain financially or further his own aims or those of his employer because of his position in 10-10. Section 5.

The Board of Directors shall hold a meeting at least once each year and at the call of the President. At least 50 % of the board members shall be present to constitute a quorum. Section 6.

Special occasional meetings of the Board of Directors may, at the call of the President, be convened. Action taken may be by mail or telephone communications as necessary.

ARTICLE VII: MEETINGS

Section 1.

10-10 shall hold an annual general membership meeting during the second half of the year at a time and place to be designated by the Board of Directors.

Section 2.

The purpose of the annual general membership meeting shall be a report of the Board to the general membership, and any other business as may be deemed necessary.

ARTICLE VIII: OFFICERS' DUTIES Section 1.

The President shall preside at all meetings of 10-10 and of the Board of Directors. He shall carry out the directives of the Board of Directors. He shall appoint such committees as he or the Board of Directors shall consider expedient or necessary. Section 2.

In the absence of the President, the Vice President shall perform his duties. In the absence of both the President and Vice President, the Board of Directors shall select a member of the Board of Directors to assume the duties of the President. Section 3.

The Secretary shall record the proceedings of regular meetings of 10-10 and meetings of the Board of Directors. He shall promptly furnish copies of all minutes of these meetings to all members of the Board and publish a summary in the quarterly 10-10 NEWS. Section 4.

The Treasurer/Corporate Secretary shall be responsible for the funds of 10-10 and shall be accountable to the Board of Directors. He shall prepare a proposed operating budget for submission to the Board of Directors prior to each annual regular meeting of the Board of Directors. He shall be responsible for maintaining the corporate status of 10-10 filing all state and federal corporate reports, documents and certificates as required.

Upon the termination of his term of office, each officer shall send to his successor, within 30 days, all property, correspondence and records belonging to 10-10 in his custody.

ARTICLE IX: ELECTION PROCEDURE

Section 1

The election of officers and one-half of the Board of Directors shall take place every four years in an even numbered year. The election of the other half of the Board of Directors shall take place the following even numbered year.

Section 2.

No member may qualify for nomination to be an Officer or Director of 10-10 unless he has been a member in good standing for more than two (2) years immediately preceding his nomination.

Section 3.

A nominating committee to select eligible candidates for the offices of President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Director positions shall be appointed by the President, with approval of the Board of Directors, no later than July of the year preceding the election year. The nominating committee shall develop a slate of candidates. Nominations by this committee shall be announced in the last quarterly 10-10 NEWS of that year. Section 4.

Petitions for officer and Director candidates may be submitted by 10-10 members, signed by at least 50 members in good stand-ing. Call for petitions will be made in the second issue of the 10-10 NEWS of the year preceding the election year. Such petitions shall be submitted to the Secretary, to arrive no later than December I of that year. Upon receipt, the Secretary shall verify the validity of the petition and the eligibility of the candidates, and place the names of the candidates on a ballot with those submitted by the nominating committee. The list of eligible candidates shall be published in the first issue of the 10-10 NEWS of the election year. Section 5.

Bach eligible candidate shall be requested to submit a brief biographical outline to the Secretary. This biographical outline shall be printed in the second issue of the 10-10 News of the election year.

Section 6.

Election shall be by written ballot. Ballots shall be mailed the first week of July during an election year to each member in good standing. The polls shall close August 31 of that election year. Ballots received after August 31 will be invalid and the envelopes will not be opened or counted in any way. Section 7.

The President, with the approval of the Board of Directors, shall appoint two or more tellers to count the ballots. The tellers shall certify to the Secretary, in writing, results of the ballot count for each office. A plurality of the votes cast for each office will determine the candidate elected for each office. Section 8.

All candidates shall be notified by the Secretary of the results of the balloting via telephone within 48 hours of the certification by the Secretary. Results of the election will be published in the fourth issue of the 10-10 NEWS. Section 9.

Officers' and Directors' terms of office shall commence the first of January following their election.

ARTICLE X: CHAPTERS

Chapters may be formed from time to time. The requirement for a chapter shall be established by the Board of Directors and be published in the quarterly 10-10 NEWS.

ARTICLE XI: FINANCIAL DEBTS

Any and all obligations incurred by shall be solely corporate obligations no personal liability whatsoever shall be attached to, or be incurred by, any member, Officer, or Director of 10-10 by reason of any corporate obligations.

ARTICLE XII: AMENDMENTS

Section 1.

These bylaws may be amended, as deemed necessary, by a two-thirds vote of the Board of Directors at any annual or special meeting of the Board of Directors.

Section 2.

Petitions to change the bylaws may be submitted to the Secretary upon signature of at least 20 members in good standing. The Board of Directors must consider and vote upon said petition at the next succeeding meeting of the Board of Directors. Section 3.

The members of 10-10 shall be notified of any amendment or changes in these bylaws. The next quarterly 10-10 NEWS following the Board action resulting in changes shall carry such notification.

ARTICLE XIII: SEX-DISCLAIMER

In these bylaws, wherever the masculine pronoun is used (he) it shall also mean and include the feminine gender (she).

ARTICLE XIV: EFFECTIVE DATE

This revision of the bylaws was adopted at a regular membership meeting held on 1988

and shall become effective according to the implementation schedule as adopted.

CHANGES, CHANGES, CHANGES

There are a couple of things in this issue which I urge you to read very carefully, and to express your reactions. Let me go back and explain.

Many months ago, the Planning Committee started work on a number of facets of 10-10. One was a change in 10-10's corporate status, so that 10-10 could become a non-profit educational, scientific and cultural orgenization. To assist in this, 10-10 proposed that we award annual scholarships. That change in status has now been accomplished, and the scholarship funds are in place for the first such awards. There is an announcement with full details on another page of this issue of the News. Give it your full attention. Any applicant must be recommended by a paidup member of 10-10. In your area prospective applicants may not know any such member. Maybe you'll have to go looking for an applicant. In any case, the funds will be there and you can help in finding suitable applicants.

The other matter I recommend you examine closely is the proposed new Bylaws. They also are in this issue, and they embody quite a few totally new concepts, such as at-large election of officers and directors, family memberships, changes in the rights of DX members, changes in the establishment of the dues structure, and many others.

Give this document your close attention. Write and comment on the things you do or don't like. Send your comments to Norm Lefcourt, W6IRT, 7713 Wilkinson Ave., North Hollywood, CA 91605.

One other thing: Don't expect that things are going to happen overnight. It just takes time, and a lot of it, especially when government agencies are involved, as they are. A lot of things must fall into place before these Bylaws can become fully effective. Your speedy reactions can help accelerate the process. Let's have them!

FIVE FOR FOLE

If you were a baseball player, there would be no way you could go five for four - not at the bat, anyway. Maybe you could do it with errors, though -- the kind of situation where you make two errors on the same play.

I've had new members complain to me something like this: "I just joined 10-10 and the Area Manager didn't send me a copy of the News with my membership card and certificate. How am I supposed to know what's going on?"

Well, you find out the same way you got interested in 10-10 in the first place - by getting on the band, working others, asking questions, checking in on nets, and doing all the other things 10-10 members do. But there is a payoff. You get five for four.

Five what? Five issues of the News, that's what. You send in your four bucks for a year's dues and you get on the books so that you get an issue of the News every three months - a total of four issues.

But wait, there's more to come. What if you don't renew at the end of that year? You still get another issue of the News! You get an extra free quarter in
which to remember that you haven't paid your dues.
In other words you get five issues of the News for
the price of four. Those who complain are asking for
six for four - and that's too much of a good thing!

CHECKS AND BALANCES

Most membership renewal and new member payments come to 10-10 by means of checks, and thereby, for some, hangs, not a tale but a problem. Maybe twelve bucks worth of problem.

Consider this: Your pay day is on the first of the month, and you have deposited your check in the good old checking account. You write checks to pay some bills, and decide it's time to renew your 10-10 membership, so you write another check for four bucks and ship it off to your area manager. He duly records the payment and puts the check with the others he has stacked up to send to Treasurer Gerry Gross. On the 24th of the month he completes his reports to Gerry and to Records Manager Lee Pasewalk and sends them off. By now three weeks or so have elapsed.

Every month, Gerry gets a large number of checks from the managers, and it takes time to record everything, endorse the checks, and get them to the bank. By now a couple of more weeks have elapsed.

Meanwhile, back at the ranch, you have written some more checks, mostly to local firms, and they get turned in promptly. Also, maybe you haven't

done a good job of keeping your check record up to date, or you have moved and changed banks, or something else has happened to deplete the account.

Back in California again, the check has been deposited and is starting its slow and painful route back to your bank, and if things go as they have with quite a few checks, a reversal of that route so that it gets back to our bank with those fateful words "Not Sufficient Funds" stamped on it.

Like most banks, ours is willing to go along with the game and send the check in once more, in the hope that you have managed to put some more money in the kitty. But you haven't, and once more the check comes back.

Meanwhile, our bank has charged us \$6.00 for the first shot, and now adds to that by charging us another \$6.00 for the second attempt. That leaves 10-10 out \$12.00, plus an unpaid renewal or new membership, and starts a long trail of cancellation of your membership, both on the computer record and with your area manager. It's painful and unnecessary. And, given the way 10-10 operates, there's not much we can do about it except to ask you to be careful when you write 10-10 a check and make sure there's still money to pay for it when it gets back to home plate. Just think!

ALL BOUND UP

Many of you will recall that I have, from time to time, asked you to look back in your 10-lo files and find for me copies of old issues of the 10-10 News, or its predecessors, and send them to me - either as they are, or copies of them - so that I could assemble a complete set for binding. Well, after a few years of trying, I have concluded that I have all that I am likely to get. There is still one missing - the Fall, 1975 issue - if, indeed, it ever existed.

To replace it, I inserted a sort of disclaimer which says, in effect, that no one appears to know if there ever was such an issue. According to Morrie Goldman, WBEHM, who was President at the time, it was a period of some turmoil, in which there was a change of editors, and it is quite possible that the issue never met the light of day.

I did, however, receive a good deal of material from the early days, most of which I didn't know existed. Some of it came as copies, but most was sent me as originals. Those of you out there who sent me such originals will not see them again un-

less you come to visit me, but you are memorialized in the bound copies, because the mailing labels are still on them.

There were problems with the early materials, mostly because there was some lack of uniformity as to size. One issue was printed on what looks to be paper about 10" long, rather than 11". Another was on 14" paper. The 10" issue wasn't much of a problem, but the 14" one was: it had to be cut and folded.

Anyhow, I want to express my appreciation to, among many others, Alan Hedrick, No. 699, Bill Johnson, No. 2630George Papalias, No. 7968, and to everyone else who sent me material. The names mentioned are those who made it into the bound copies, along with Leonard Rice, No. 3979, and myself, because my own file went into it, too.

The result is three nicely bound volumes, 1969 - 1979, 1980 - 1983, and 1984 - 1987. They are in a marcon binding, with the title, "10-10 International News" and the dates stamped in gold both on the spine of each volume and on the front cover.

PHONETICS REVISITED

Back a few years I carried on a sort of campaign to get members to use phonetics when giving their call signs. Most of us don't realize how easy it is to confuse letters, especially those with an "E" sound, such as 8, C, D, E, G, and all the rest. Another joker is trying to understand the difference between a "K" call and a "KA" call. The letter in the latter tend to run together, simply because they sound alike.

Anyhow, as a part of that campaign, I was provided with a stack of phonetic alphabet cards and another stack of time conversion cards by Bert Ayers, W6CL, who is a long-time 10-10 member, and a commercial printer. They are available to anyone who wants to write me at 5872 W. 77 Place, Los Angeles, CA 90045, and enclose an SASE. It doesn't need to be a large envelope - the regular letter size will do.

I should caution you that having these cards will automatically make you a better operator or even give you any information you don't already have. Both are in the ARRL Log Book and also in the Ham Radio log book. However, in each case you have to turn to the right page to find them. The ones I have are post-card size, handy to stick ip at the operating position. If you want them, write me and I'll send them to you, as long as the supply lasts.

ROTTEN RADIO

Back in the early days of ham radio, and the early days of <u>QSI</u> as well, there were, from time to time, pieces written by T.O.M., who was, most likely, Hiram Percy Maxim, then President of ARRL. I never read any of those original columns, so far as I can recall, but I've heard of them over the years, just as I've heard of the Wouff-Hong and the Rettysnitch, two instruments of torture invented to take care of those who practice "Rotten Radio."

There's some "Rotten Radio" going on on ten meters right now, and it interferes with our enjoyment of our favorite band. I hear operators who are hitting it so hard there are "pops" up and down the band around their frequencies. There are also the guys who have the mike gain opened so far that they distort badly, and sometimes one can't even copy the call sign, much less a 10-10 number or a QTH.

One of my favorite "rotters" is the chap who tunes up on 28.8 just after the 10-10 net convenes. It is difficult to believe he can't hear the frequency is occupied, there are so many stations checking in these days.

Now, don't get me wrong. 10-10 doesn't have a certificate giving us exclusive right to operate at 28.8 every day at 1800 hours. If someone wants to tune up on that frequency at that time and call CQ he has every right to do so. However, unnecessary interference is also frowned upon, and there are certainly a lot of stations to be interfered with these days, with the band in better shape than it has been for some years.


THOSE TEN BLACK CATS

Gerry Gross, Treasurer, WA6POZ, presented his report (elsewhere In the NEWS) and indicated we have had about 4,000 new Ten-Ten members during the past six months. 12,000 copies of the Ten-Ten NEWS have been printed the last two issues. Norm Lefcourt, W6 IRT, presented a Planning Committee Report (elsewhere in the NEWS). A number of changes are being considered, and the recommendations from many conversations while at Shreveport are being given serious consideration. Morrie Goldman, W6EHM, reported that the State of California approved our non-profit tax-exempt Corporation Change. Morrie also reviewed the "Scholarship Program" and it was approved unanimously to send \$1,500 to the Foundation for Amateur Radio to fund two \$750 scholarships. First Award will be in August 1988. (A motion was passed setting up a separate account for the Scholarship, to be funded by \$3,000, from which the \$1,500 will be sent to the Foundation.) Howard Bowman, President, W6QIR, thanked the Planning Committee for all their work to date. He also pointed out that there must be a mechanism for keeping all the activities of Ten-Ten International Net going, if Planning Committee recommendations are adopted that result in Directors being located all over the United States. An Implementation Plan will be drafted by the Planning Committee to address this problem in detail. The next Quarterly Ten-Ten luncheon will be held on Sunday February 21, 1988, and it is hoped there will be a much larger membership turnout.


- 1. You may use any 10 meter band frequency, and any mode allowed by the terms of your license.

- 5. Any reasonable format of entry form may be used. Each entry must show, Callsign, Time, Name, QTH, 10-10, Channel, CCC, and PSW numbers of contacts for which you are claiming points. Please also list the number of contacts and points for which you are claiming credit.

SCORING

Each contact is counted as one point. One additional point may be claimed for each 10-10, Channel, CCC, and/or PSW number collected. Each contact may be worth between one and five points. There are no multipliers.

LOG SUBMISSION

Please post logs as soon as possible after the party. No log postmarked later than June 20th, will be accepted. Expedition to the Aland-Islands ($OH\emptyset$)

"It was a dark and rainy friday morning, June the 26th. as we started on our trip to the Aland-Islands. We, we are seven OM's/YL's, Harry (DL6H8T) our chief and his XYL Connie, then Lars (DF1XW), Walter (DL1HAZ), Kai (DJ5HZ), YL Beate (DL5HC8) and me, Klaus (DL5HCK). In 3 cars we stowed all our equipment.

The passage through Danmark was taken quickly. The first problems were build up by the swedish custom officers, who objected the large antennas on Kai's car. As he removed them, we could leave the border to middle-sweden. The swedish landscape is a very wounderful one and fortunately the weather changed into sun and warm temperatures. This evening seemed to be saved. Near the City of Linköping we stopped and built up our tents. We need some sleep after driving more than 16 hours in cars! Next morning (it was still sunny and warm because at summertime the sun does not sink in northern europe) we made our breakfast, then left the place with direction to Stockholm, the capitol of Sweden. There we had about 4 hours to visit the City of Stockholm and the Royal Castle, At the evenming our ferry to Aland left, so we must leave Stockholm on time. Arrived in Kappelskär, where our ferry should depart, we checked in and about 2 hours later we arrived at the destination of our expedition: the Aland Islands. There we joined ON Michael (DC5XM) and his XYL Annecke (DL6HAA) who arrived here one day before.

Next day we moved into our holiday flats. We had some nice houses near the seaside, only a few feet away. Same evening we built up our equipment and the antennas. For 10/15/20 we had a Hustler Groundplane, which we mounted direct on the water. It worked very well. Especially for 10m we mounted a 5/8 GP on a little hill beside the house and a 1-lambda-loop also for 10m only. Both antennas worked very well. The station equipment was FT757 (twice) and IC735 (for CW and RFTY operation). Unfortunately the conditions on 10m were not as good as we expected. But therefore we enjoyed the nice landscape and made a little expedition inside Aland.

We did more than 1000 Qso's, about 350 QSO's only on 10m (and one QSO in RTTY on 10m). At July 4th the conditions on 10m increased and getting better. Only Harry could work more than 200 stations in about 5 hours without a break. During the week the conditions were very poor. So we were forced to evade to the lower bands, e.g. 20m. But the week we spend on the Aland Islands was gone. We had to leave next noon, July the 5th.

All participants said, we should return some day."





- 11. Failure to comply with any of these rules or their intent may result in disqualification.

PRB-1 CHALLENGED IN COLORADO By Alice W Hathaway, NODES

Boulder County, Colorado amateurs urgently need funds to defend PRB-1, and our right to erect effective antennas! Our situation has reached crisis proportions in recent weeks.

Early in 1987, two Boulder County hams, MQOI, Doc Evans, and M6DIY, Tim Holzheimer, applied for building permits to erect 125 foot antenna towers in a rural residential subdivision of Boulder County. Both are avid 160 meter DX'ers, and both were erecting base fed 1/4 wavelength, top loaded verticals, for 160 meter work. Lot size in the subdivisions average one acre.

In 1985, Boulder County amateurs believed they had won a major victory in the battle for effective antennas when the county specifi-

cally exempted amateur installations from the definition of a "telecommunications element" under the Boulder County Comprehensive Plan. In fact, the plan states that "Amateur antenna installations shall be exempt from height limitations." The County Zoning Resolution, the ordinances derived from the policies laid down bu the Comprehensive Plan, limits all structures in unincorporated Boulder County to 35 feet. except in agricultureal and light industrial zoned areas where structures are linited to 50 feet. The County Zoning Administrator, Robert Helmick, decided that what the hams wanted to erect were structures, not antennas, as contemplated by the plan. This was despite the fact that the towers would be base-fed verticals, using special insulating base sections.

Believing they were exempt from height limitations, the hams did not request, nor desire a variance to the County Zoning Resolution. Yet, instead of an administrative hearing before the Boulder County Board of Adjustments to dispute the Administrators interpretation, that an antenna was a structure, Helmick treated their appeals as yariance requests, and required a public hearing along with notification of all neighbors within a 500 foot radius of each ham's property. Over the span of the two sessions of the continued hearing, the ham community was admirably represented by Robert Neece, KOKR, with Marshall Quiat, AGOX, ARRL Rocky Mountain Division Director Consulting. Both are capable lawyers, who donated their time and expertise. PRB-1 was cited, as was the Comprehensive Plan itself and the fact that each entire installation was an active antenna. In addition, we cited public services performed by hams in and around Boulder County, and the purposes served by Amateur radio as outlined in Part 97, of the Communications Act. We made it quite clear that effective antennas are absolutely essential for carrying out our Federally mandated activities. Opposition was prilmarily based on esthetic grounds. The hams retained a structural engineer to allay the fears of "toppling towers" and "whipping guy lines" which were voiced.

Most of our arguments fell on deaf ears. The Board of Adjustment found that: 1. The "antennas" were "structures", and so limited to 35 feet. 2. PRB-1 did not apply to this case. The board interpreted PRB-1 as meaning that local governments cannot prohibit Amateur activity, but that they are "free to impede Amateur activities."

In addition, the board declared that this ruling now applies to all unincorporated Boulder County, which is overwhelmingly rural and mountainous. This effectively limits amateur antennas to 35 feet. The board believes this is all hams really require.

We must nowtake the case to Federal District Court to preserve our right to effective antennas. If a single case such as this is allowed to stand, it sets a dangerous precedent for all other local governments in the country. Impossibly restrictive height limitations will spread like a malignant tumkor all over the United States. Laws can, and will be changed to severly restrict our activities as local governments receive word of our demise. It has already happened in Boulder County! And, it was done by a single individual administrator!

The boulder Antenna Fund desperately needs money to take this clear-cut case to court. and defeat this collective threat. There is presently a little over \$7,000 in the fund. To retain the required leal services requires about \$15,000. We had 30 days from the Board of Adjustment ruling to file in Federal District Court. We had to file by October 22nd. Our chances of winning are exceptional, especially in light of the well known Thernes case in Kentucky. 



- 8. A Dupe Sheet is required of all participants. Computer duping is OK. (Send SASE to me for copy of typical dupe sheet if desired.)
- 9. Chapter assignment of scores may be only by a paid-up member belonging to that chapter as a local memner, and able to work that chapter net via groundwave from the location of the station working the contest.
- 10. Illegible or improperly submitted logs will be rejected. See below for log submission requirements.
- 11. Failure to comply with any of these rules or their intent may result in disqualification.

SCORING

- 1. Two points for each contact with a 10-10 number exchange.
- 2. One point for each contact without a 10-10 number exchange.

AWARDS

First place certificates to all U.S. call areas; KL7 included with 7th area. Also Canada, South America, Central America, Caribbean (including Bermuda), Europe, Africa, Asia, and the Pacific, (including KH6, all pacific islands, New Zealand, and Australia). Individual and chapter scores are published in the NEWS. Paid members only are listed.

LOG SUBMISSION

Logs are accepted from 10-10 members only and must be legible, in UTC, and complete. Each line entry must show Callsign, time, name, QTH and 10-10 number (if any). A cover sheet is required of all logs showing your name, callsign, QTH, 10-10 number, membership expiration date, chapter assignment (if any), total contacts and total points. A cover sheet can be found on the rear page of the 10-10 NEWS. A Dupe Sheet must accompany all logs. MEET the NET OFFICIALS

Chuck Imsande, W6YLJ, 10-10#19636



Director MORRIE GOLDMAN W6EHM, #4189

Born in New York in 1920, Morrie Goldman, W6EHM, received his first Amateur Radio Licence in 1937 with the call W2JNJ. After receiving his first licence, Morrie built his first station including the antenna, tower, transmission line, and in the summer of 1937 worked Texas from New York. The receiver was a single #30 tube super-regen receiver. Morrie was a regular on 80 and 40 meter CW.

During the period of 1940 to 1944, Morrie persued a BSEE degree at Cooper Union while working as a draftsman and was in the Navy Radar Tech School until 1946. After WW II it was back to school to complete his BSEE at IIT while working in Developmental Engineering at Shure Bros. During 1951 through 1855, Morrie was helping to design the Radar and Sonar Systems for the first two atomic submarines at the Electric Boat Company. In 1955, Morrie and XYL Ellen, moved to the west coast where he joined the Engineering Department of North American Aviation where he worked on the design of the Flight Control and Avionic Systems Mobile Training Systems for such famous airplanes as the F-100, F-107, F-108 Fighter Airplanes and

the B-70 and B-1 Bombers. After leaving North American in 1978 he joined Hughes Aircraft Company. After completing the installation of a repair facility for the Ground Laser Designator in November 1986, he retired.

In 1971, while holding a scheduled contact with WB58KT, the band skip changed and ZD8D picked up both Morrie and WB58KT and served as a relay station. This began a long association between Morrie and 10 meters. One that still remains today. Soon after that 1971 W6EHM/WB5BKT and ZD8D contact, Morrie discovered 10-10 and after working his 10 contacts, received his #4189 in 1972. In 1973 he became the Call Area Manager for the 6th, 7th and 8th districts. He served as 10-10 President from 1974 through 1977 and became a Director in 1978, and still serves as a Director today. As if that is not enough 10-10 volunteer effort, Morrie is also the Trustee for the 10-10 Club Station, W60L He has also been instrumental in establishing the new 10-10 Scholarship program. He has also done all of the coordination with the Foundation For Amateur Radio, the organization that will administrator the Scholarship Award for 10-10.

How did Morrie become interested in Amateur Radio? Well, he says "loved the Morse Code as a Boy Scout and it just took off from there". Morrie's station consists of a Kenwood TS-830, and a Mini-Quad. Morrie loves to operate in the 10-10 contests and you can usually find him there as well as checking into several of the Chapter Nets.

Morrie and XYL Ellen have two daughters and two grandchildren. Daughter Kathy, works at the Rockwell International Space Division, and daughter Laura, is a documentation and publication specialist for Caldwell Banker. Morrie is the only "Ham" in the Goldman family.

The profile of another of the dedicated 10-10 Officials that volunteer so much of their time to make 10-10 the great organization that it is.

The 10-10 News more than once, has been published late. This issue is most likely no exception. This is due to the submission of late articles.



10-10 INFORMATION AND AWARDS

MEMBERSHIP

Work 10 members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, op's name and QTH. Send list to your Call Sign Area Manager (see P. 31), with \$1 Registration Fee plus \$4 for the first year's dues. You will receive a certificate and permanent 10-10 number. You must pay dues annually to remain in good standing and participate fully.

AWARDS

If you apply for any of the following 10-10 awards, you MUST include proof of paid-up membership -- a copy of your membership card or of the address label from the News. Your application will be rejected if you fail to comply.

BARS AND PLAQUES

INTERNATIONAL 500 OF THE WORLD

With your 500 Bar comes an Honorary V. P. Number, membership in the International 500 of the World, and added activities including the following two awards:
