DEX

On the cover of the winter, 1980 issue of this journal there was a picture of "Dex", HB9BRQ/K3KUJ, and the tag line was, "Our Man in Geneva." "Dex" is Dexter Anderson, the call sign is now W4KM, and the 10-10 number is 06271.

Dex works for the U. S. Department of State, and 10-10 has much for which to thank him. I don't know if he still holds the HB9 call sign, but he does get over there occasionally, and it was through his efforts that 4ULITU, in Geneva, was assigned 10-10 number 11111.

Some time back Dex performed another service for 10-10. He had before him a copy of the Postal Service Zip + 4 Directory, and took the trouble to type out the Zip + 4 codes for just about everyone whose name and call sign appears in the News. This had to be quite a chore, because some do not have their addresses listed, and these had to be found. At any rate, we now have the information, and will use it when we are in a position to do so.

Here's another item: In the U. S. S. R. there are magazines devoted to radio. Dex subscribes to these, and does summary translations of the articles so that his translations may be reproduced and distributed to an I. A. R. U. mailing list. I won't pretend that I understand everything I read in these translations, but sometimes run across something that could have application to 10-10. In the translation of Radio for July, 1987 I ran across this bit: "Thought also needs to be given to sport ethics. Attention should be focussed on 'phony champions' . . . and the practice of 'earning' certificates by simply exchanging QSL cards without taking the trouble to make the [underlying] contacts." I have no idea whether this happens among 10-10 members, but I suppose it could.

And again: back in December I received from Dex a copy of the cover and some pages from RadioRivista, which is subtitled, "Organo Ufficiale Della Associazione Radioamatori Italiani." I don't read or speak Italian, but anyone ought to be able to figure out what that means.

The inside pages have the general heading, "Ten & Ten-Ten", and a sub-title, "La banda negletta." The contents of the two pages are articles by F3CY, Mike Deffay, 10-10 No. 22872 and at the lower right

corner of the first article, which was in the August issue of RadioRivista, there was a large reproduction of the 10-10 logo.

The second article, which appeared last September, was accompanied by a full page listing of 10 meter beacon stations, apparently taken from a German magazine.

I started this account by thanking Dex, and am ending it by thanking Mike Deffay, F3CY, who is a staunch supporter of 10-10 in France, and, indeed, in all of Europe. I do wish that the band would open between here and France so that I could thank him in person.

A VOICE FROM THE PAST

Those of you who read what I write will recall that I have said I had some phonetic alphabet and time conversion cards, supplied by Bert Ayers, W6CL, No. 17762, and that I would send a set to anyone who sent me an SASE.

Last week I received a request from Harry Young, W6YRJ. There was a note which read, "Our first QSO was on 10 meter FM, July 11, 1948. I used your #4509 on Dec. 3, 1975 with nine other numbers to submit to Morrie, W6EHM for my #11911." Harry's address was in Solvang, California, which is well out of ground wave range from this area.

I sent Harry the cards, and included a note in which I asked him a couple of questions. It turned out that both he and I were at different addresses in 1948, so the contact wasn't impossible. Further, he included a copy of his file card, which listed ten contacts over the years, plus a lot of personal information which I must have given him during those ten contacts.

About that FM contact: I didn't believe it at first, but thought a while and realized that, at one time, I had built a modulator to hang on the side of the Meissner Signal Shifter I used for frequency control. That gave me a Narrow Band FM signal - a cheap way of getting on the phone bands. The Signal Shifter drove a couple of TZ-40's, and Harry's note says

that I was running 275 watts, and my receiver was a surplus BC-348R. I don't recall much about the 348, except that it was a good solid receiver and that it probably wasn't much good above 20 meters. Under those circumstances, I used a crystal-controlled converter for ten, and the receiver became a tuned I.F. At that time, 'phone' meant AM, and to receive NBFM (narrow-band frequency modulation) you tuned off on the slope of the passband. It worked!

Harry's card also listed the other rigs I had been using over the years - a 15520, a TS820S, and a TS 830S. I still have the 830 as a standby rig, but the one I use most often is a 15940S.

It also turns out that Harry is a former co-worker of Norm Lefcourt, W6IRT, No. 14901, who is 10-10's V. P. Norm also runs the QRP Chapter net on Tuesday evenings at 8:00, Pacific time. When I check in next week, I'll pass Harry's greetings along. Give a listen; maybe you'll want to join us.

THE CITY HEADACHE

City names can be a pain in the neck. Let's say that I have an exceptional stroke of DX luck and hook up with someone in Ouagadougou, which is the capital city of Upper Volta. He starts off by giving me the spelling of his city in phonetics, like this: OSCAROSCARUNIFORMUNIFORMALFAALFACOLFCOLFALFA . . . All the while I am dutifully writing it down and wind up with NOUANOUCAR . . . before I get wise to the fact that he's giving each letter's phonetic equivalent twice.

It's not quite that bad in a contest, where most of the contacts are apt to be stateside, hence more intelligible to us, but it's bad enough, what with everyone trying to make as many contacts as possible.

You may have noticed that Harry Syring's announcements of 10-10 contests no longer require that you log the city name. But, what of us who want to use the contacts for Bars? Well, city names are no longer required for Bars either. I have checked with both Bobbie Vaughan (Bars, 100-900) and Russ Wirtz (Bars, 1000 and up, and Plaques) and they don't insist on city name either.

Mentioning Russ Wirtz up above reminds me that, as of the publication of this issue, Russ will no longer handle those upper-level Bars and Plaques.

Russ' job has changed, and now requires a lot of moving around from place to place, which means that he will no longer be home enough to handle the 10-10 assignment.

The new Manager for Bars 1000 and up, and Plaques will be Buehren D. "Andy" Anderson, N5CUQ. Andy is involved in a lot of other things as well, but tells me he will make time for the good of 10-10. His address is Rt. 3, Box 245, Fredericksburg, TX 78624.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Last issue we carried an announcement of the two 10-10 scholarships that are being offered. Unfortunately, it got somewhat buried, and maybe a lot of you didn't see it. Anyhow, 10-10 is providing the funds for two \$750.00 Scholarships, and they are being administered by the Foundation for Amateur Radio (FAR).

The Foundation administers scholarships for a number of amateur radio organizations, and elsewhere in this issue there is a full-page announcement which gives all the details.

It is important for 10-10 chapters and individual members to be active in supporting these scholarships by assisting in finding suitable candidates. There are a lot of them around, but they may never hear of the scholarships unless someone tells them. That's part of our job.

Even more important: What about the Scholarship Fund? Treasurer Gerry Gross has set up a special account for scholarship support. Anyone can contribute to it, and you are urged to do so, even if it's only a buck. Dues to 10-10 are as low as any we know of for a ham radio organization. That ought to mean you have something left over for incidentals. Make the Scholarship Fund your "incidental". Send a check to Gerry, and make sure it's made payable to '10-10 Scholarship Fund'. And, if things work out as we hope and expect, it may even turn out to be tax-deductible. We'll let you know.

TAKE HIM AT HIS WORD

On Page 23 of the last issue, Editor Joe Williams wrote as follows: "I received two complaints since I took over as editor, and word that quite a few were received in California. I don't mind receiving comments or criticism about my work, but send them to me. As editor of the 10-10 News, I am





Ten-Ten QSO Parties are open to all amateurs but only paid-up members are eligible for awards and chapter assignment of scores. They are conducted to encourage Ten-Meter operation and interest in the Net. Non-members may use numbers collected to qualify for membership; members may use them for awards.

RULES

1. All contacts must take place on the Ten-Meter phone band.
2. Exchange: Callsign, Name, State, and Ten-Ten Number.
3. A Station may be counted only once.
4. Single operator stations only are acceptable.
5. SSB, AM, or FM modes are acceptable.
6. All contacts must take place during the 48 hour contest period.
7. Logs must be kept in UTC.
8. A Dupe Sheet is required of all participants. Computer duping is OK. (Send SASE to me for copy of typical dupe sheet.)
9. Chapter assignment of scores may be only by a paid-up member belonging to that chapter as a local member, and be able to work that chapter net via groundwave from the location of the station working the contest.
10. Illegible or improperly submitted logs will be rejected. See below for log submission requirements.
11. Failure to comply with any of these rules or their intent may result in disqualification.

SCORING

1. Two points for each contact WITH a Ten-Ten number exchange.
2. One point for each contact WITHOUT a Ten-Ten number exchange.

AWARDS

First Place certificates to all U.S. call areas; KL7 included with 7th area. Also Canada, South America, Central America, Caribbean (including Bermuda), Europe, Asia, Africa, and the Pacific (including KH6, all pacific islands, New Zealand and Australia.) Individual and chapter scores are published in the NEWS. Paid members only are listed.

LOG SUBMISSION

Logs are accepted from 10-10 members only and must be legible, in UTC, and complete. Each line entry must show callsign, time, name, State, and 10-10 number if any. A cover sheet is required showing your name, callsign, QTH, 10-10 number, membership expiration date, chapter assignment if any, total contacts, and total points. A cover sheet can be found on the rear page of the 10-10 NEWS. A Dupe Sheet must accompany all logs.
