Time goes FAST!.....Yet another quarter has gone by and with it the Summertime (for the US) storms and static on 18 and the other bands. The propagation conditions are getting much better with 18 being open quite frequently and the DX is better than ever. With the completion of major antenna work at the N2JEU shack in the next few weeks, I hope to talk with lots of folks over the next few months on 18 meters. Don't forget the "So I worked the Editor" special certificate. All it takes is one on-the-air contact with me and a OSL card from you confirming the contact. Since I haven't been very active these past few months they're very rare indeed. I'm working on an upgrade to General this month so look for me above 28.5 if I pass the tests!

Old News Update.....l asked for LOTS of comments to several ideas I presented in the last issue but the mail didn't come pouring in as I had hoped. Still, I am encouraged at the number of responses sent in. Maybe apathy hasn't crept into 18-18 yet as it seems to have done in the rest of the hobby.

In the last issue I suggested a cassette based audio news service for use by Chapters and individuals in local nets. The only response, from Betty KBbAN, suggested that the regular quarterly Ten-Ten International News be provided on audio cassette for the blind and limited sight hams in our ranks. A good idea but one that I can't implement in a timely manner all by myself. Any suggestions on how to do it along with the costs involved will be passed along to the board for their consideration. Is there a service available for this type of publication? Maybe a member knows.

Lots of people responded on packet radio to the Ten-Ten International News Service I tried to start there but very few people responded with additional news items that I could use. As a result, the packet news service is in temporary limbo until sufficient news and interest becomes available. Also, the packet network here in upstate New York is undergoing some traumatic times with the shutdown of a major packet BBS and several major nodes. It's very hard to get

traffic into and out of the area reliably at the present time.

The main success from last issue seems to be the Random Access dial-up BBS that I announced then. It's nice to know so many of you have computers and modems available and are willing to use them. Since we're getting into Fall here in the USA, the frequency of thunderstorms in upstate New York has decreased and should allow almost 24 hour a day operation of the system. You'll find details on it on page 2 under the Editor information paragraph. More details on the BBS in a few more paragraphs. I've added a few things!

Additional details have popped up on the possibility of a net below 28.5 Mhz. You'll remember from last issue that I said that it was a Novice/Tech net. True, Novices and Techs will be able to participate but no net controls have yet been chosen nor have any decisions on schedule been made. They'll be talking everything over at the upcoming board meeting at the end of the month. See the President's column for details on the meeting. More details on the net and the board meeting in the next issue.

On-Line 18-18 databases....On-line versions of the above database and additional information concerning Ten-Ten are now available on the Random Access dial-up BBS. MA6POI's Ten-Ten number cross reference, a current list of affiliated chapters and a net day/time database are available for use. Use the (D)ATABASE MANAGER option on the system to access these files. You'll be able to search the massive (over 1,000,000 bytes) number cross reference, current chapter list and net references with just a few keystrokes. For additional help while you're in the database area use the question mark (?) command for help. The BBS number and hours are listed under the Editor information on page 2.

Where are they NOW?....A letter from David D. Buschow ND4MPG (the 4th district manager) asks if there is space available for lists of members we've lost touch with due to address changes. The hope is that members reading the News will tell the folks we're looking for that their address isn't current. Yes, it is possible as long as these conditions are met.

1) Only requests from official 18-18 area **anagers or our records **anager will be accepted and 2) space is available in an issue to publish the list. If I get swamped with lists we'll have to find some other way to handle the problem but let's try it this way first.

A Broadcast Invasion?....A letter from Chuck Albrecht NBCKW reports the reception of some music and non-English language announcements in the upper end of 18 meters near 29.234 Mhz. Anyone else heard these signals and if so when? There is a good possibility that these are test transmissions from international broadcasters. Be on the lookout and report anything you find to the FCC after completely logging the signals and if possible, tape recording them. My FCC rulebook shows that 18 meters (28.1 to 29.7 Mhz.) is a worldwide band allocated exclusively to Amateur Radio. Another IRU conference comes up in 1991 and WARC meets again in 1992. It's possible that the broadcasters will ask for a chunk of 18 meters for their own use so let's protect the band if we can.

Election Results....They're in and available. The winners are listed on page 6 in the President's column. Page 7 contains a list of the final totals for each candidate. Note that where no results are listed on page 7 that the respective winner(s) on page 6 ran unopposed. I've received a flood of letters from the new board members wanting to thank the membership for their votes and pledging continued strong support and guidance for Ten-Ten International. There were just too many letters to reprint them so please accept this as a big thanks from all of the winners.

Phantom of Dayton?.....In Don Weaver's (K0JPW) letter of thanks to the membership he said that he heard my call (N2JEU) on the parking lot net at Dayton '70. I'd like to know if anyone else heard me there or saw me. Maybe I went and didn't know it. I thought I was here in upstate NY at that time. Can anyone enlighten me as to what went on???????

Warbles Again....Red W7LOU reports the warbler on a trip to Canada in July 1998. Red was on 48 meter phone and noted the warbler there too. The Canadian hams called it "American low level radar". He also reports hearing the same warbles on 18 meters from his home OTH. Is anyone else hearing these especially by ground wave?

Special Treatment?....Dick WV7C asks if the Top Ten listings can be highlighted on the results pages. I realize that many folks are extremely interested in those results but so are other people interested in the other results and awards. If I were to highlight or specially prepare the results for one group or class then I would out of respect have to do it for all and it wouldn't be any easier to find than it is now. Anyway, I take the listings directly as sent by the various managers for accuracy. I don't want to rekey everything and have points or number errors creep into the listings. If there is an error at least it was sent to me that way!

Alternate Cover Sheets....Jenifer Patashnick KB2IPW requests that the cover letter now on the back of the News be wodified for "generic" contest use in other Ten-Ten official contests. She wanted to enter one of the contests but only had the cover sheet available from the last issue. There is an alternative. Simply hand write a cover sheet using the one on the back cover as a guide and include a photocopy of the back cover of the most recent issue of the News (the mailing label is the key) or a photocopy of your membership card. Either will serve as proof of paid-up membership in Ten-Ten for contest purposes.

Crazy *8* Chapter QSO Party.....8ob Ross KA3AVB sent along details on that chapter's 11th annual QSO party scheduled to take place on Nov. 18 (8000z) to Nov. 11th (2400z), 1990 (48 Hrs total).Log the call, name, time 18-10 number and Crazy *8* number if any. Score one point per QSO, one point per 18-10 number, and one point per Crazy *8* number for a possible total of 3 points per contact. All contacts to be on 10 meters phone or CM. The award is a red seal and two points for your Crazy *8* certificate to the winner in each call area in the USA and Canada plus a DX award. Send logs to Bob Ross KA3AVB, 2431 Hampton Ave., Allison Park, Pa. 15101 by December 18, 1990.

Counting the Ballots....Tom Gilbreath WD58FO sends these details on the ballot counting process in the recent election -

"Prior to making the decision to use my address as the central collection point for the ballots, I had a meeting with my postman. I asked if I needed to rent a P.O. Box or make any changes after telling him we could expect between five and ten thousand letters over the two months of June/July and July/August with the bulk coming the first two weeks.

After about five seconds of deep thought, he said that he would deliver them to my address. He then alerted his supervisor concerning the receipt of large quantities of mail to be delivered. We received 'top-drawer treatment' from the US Postal Service and a super postman.

We received 4789 ballot envelopes thru 31 August 1990. The envelopes contained: one (1) ballot, as many as four (4) ballots, call sign changes, address changes, address corrections, checks for membership dues (without ballots), stamps to help defray costs, notices of silent keys and many notes of thanks from 10-10 ers.

We rejected 25 ballots because eleven (11) or more directors were voted for (Only 10 were up for election - Editor). The President and secretary votes were counted in each case. We received one (1) ballot that voted for both presidential candidates. Some votes for President and Secretary only.

The envelopes were counted and divided into stacks of one-hundred (180) each and assigned a lot number. We have lot one (1) thru lot fourty-seven (47) with the respective score sheet attached and maintained on file.

A VP-WAS Award?.....Hiram Wolf N4NNP sends this interesting news along.

"Thanks to Roy VE4ROY this can become a reality with his untiring determination and search of the 1998 call book for states that have 18-10 members with VP numbers. There is now proof of VP numbers in all 58 states, maybe not as many as we would like in some states but never the less there are calls and current mailing addresses in all of them.

The VP-WAS award was discussed at the Milwaukee convention and the assignment of establishing of the rules to Susan and myself. No response from Susan on her part, so have a temporary set of rules drawn up but still welcome suggestions and ideas.

This award will be more difficult to achieve than the 18-18 WAS due to the limited number of VP numbers (2300) in comparison of 10-18 numbers (56000 plus). Therefore, I suggest that rules be more lenient in the start up of the certificate. This will not be a race of who will be first from a predetermined starting date but more of a bonus for the person that has the 100 certificates or is working on them and wants the extra award for the exchange of the VP numbers. International Magazine listing..... I know that this is

A chat with Ed Juge M5TOO at Tandy HO revealed the fact that a few new haw radio products will appear. Check out the 1991 catalog and take a look at the new SMR meter for 144 thru 448 Mhz and the heavy duty lightning arrestor (note the higher power ratings for haw radio use!).

Contest Logging Software....A <u>deao</u> version of a Ten-Ten OSO Contest logging package is available from James Hardy K4HAV \$17685 at Hardy Data Systems, 386 Frances St., Sylvester, GA 31791. It's for IBM and compatible systems only. This demo version is limited to 25 contacts in the log.

Wrapping things up.....I've just about run out of things for this issue and the time is rapidly nearing when this master copy must head out to California for printing and mailing. Thanks for the many comments you've sent in so far. Keep those pictures and news items coming in too. I'd like to see more news and pictures from the DX members too. 

The Fall DX season has begun with the change of season here in North America. We can hear Europe and Asia with more regularity. Signals are improving and I expect the Solar Flux will average 175 during the next six months and the A Index may get too high causing high absorption and bad skip. Stronger signals will help when the flux is below 175 and the A above 25. Check with WWV for the Solar Flux numbers at 18 min after the hour for the latest numbers. You receive WWV best on 15.0 Mhz. So get the antennas up as high as possible and lets see what DX is lurking.

News Flash:

Our newest member is T77C Tony from San Morino near Italy. Tony has worked many of us but had never sent in for a number. I organized an effort to get his number and soon had his application in to K8DHK Carol. Look for Tony on weekends between 28460-510 at 1600 to 2200 on SSB.

I HATE EDITORIALS BUT.......... Since I have been in 10-10, there have been instances (remember the "3" in CA?) where (1) amateurs have operated outside allowed frequencies without a control operator or (2) have not precisely adhered to the rules even with control operators. The problem is multi-faceted, 10-10 does not officially intervene in Chapter problems and, how Chapters react to this type situation is the right of each Chapter to determine. And they should have this right without fear of organized retribution! But. please remember that part of the growth and prosperity of amateur radio is due to self-discipline and I feel that continued growth and prosperity is dependent, in part, to the continuance of that practice. So, are we doing our best for the order if we KNOWINGLY allow someone to operate

illegally (I suggest going thru official channels and submitting proof) and wait for another to solve the problem? You have to answer that; I can't answer for you! But, if the equine is deceased, is additional chastisement beneficial? (Don't beat a dead horse)

GOING - GOING - If a Chapter can't file the minumum of 1 quarterly report per year, why should the membership believe that it will respond to certificate and upgrade applications? And what evidence do I have that the Chapter is fulfilling its obligations to 10-10? On the other hand, maybe I watch too carefully - or maybe all requirements should be eliminated; then each person could determine for himself, after several applications, which Chapters respond slowly (or not at all)! Meanwhile, if I don't receive a report by 1 January 1991, the following will no longer be affiliated Chapters of 10-10: Aftershock, Bluebonnet, Harborites, Land of Legend. Mad Swingers. Michigan Robins, Nor'easter, North Star 49ers, Okie Relays, Phoenix Valley, QRP, River City, Santa Fe Trail, Scarborough Bluff, Thunderbird. VK4 Gold Coast and War Eagle, Maybe the reason for non-compliance was explained to me in Reno - very few paperchasers read this column or the rules! Tnx -I needed that.



10-10 QSO Parties are open to all amateurs, but only paid-up members are eligible for awards and chapter assignment of scores. They are conducted to encourage 10 meter operation and interest in the Net. Non-members may use numbers collected to qualify for membership; members may use them for awards.

RULES:

- 1. PHONE. Contacts must be in the Ten meter Phone band, on SSB, AM, or FM. CW. Contacts must be in the Ten meter band on CW or RTTY.
- 2. Exchange: Callsign, name, state, and 10-10 number.

3. A station may be counted only once.

- 4. Single operator stations only are acceptable.
- 5. All contacts must take place within the 48 hour contest period.

6. Logs must be kept in Universal Coordinated Time.

- 7. A DUPE SHEET IS REQUIRED OF ALL PARTICIPANTS. Computer duping is OK. SASE to me for dupe sheet sample.
- 8. Chapter assignment of scores may be made only by a paid-up member belonging to that chapter as a local member and able to work its Net via groundwave from the contest station.
- 9. Illegible or improperly submitted logs will be rejected. See below for log requirements.
- 10. Failure to comply with these rules or their intent may result in disqualification.
- 11. SCORING: Two points per contact WITH a 10-10 number exchange; One point per contact WITHOUT a 10-10 number exchange.

AWARDS: First Place certificate to each U.S. Call Area (Area 7 includes KL7); also Canada, South America, Central America, Caribbean (incl. Bermuda), Europe, Africa, Asia, and the Pacific (inclAustralia, New Zealand, KH6, and all Pacific islands). Also top ten finishers in the contest overall will receive a certificate. Paid-up individual and chapter scores are listed in the NEWS.



BARS AND PLAQUES

QSL confirmation of QSOs with a 10-10 member in each of the six continental areas. For detailed rules application form and cost send a 4° X 9° SASE to: Chuck Imsande W6YLJ 18130 Browley St., Tarzana, CA 91356.

VP CERTIFICATE INFORMATION

The VP Certificate goes to members who have worked 188, 288, and so on other VP members on the frequencies between 28.3 and 28.55 Mhz or above 28.9 Mhz for a period of five minutes and have exchanged 18-18 and VP numbers. The list of numbers must include VP number, 18-18 number, call, name, and OTH of every VP number on the list and they are to be in numerical order. Include a statement that all contacts were made within the designated frequencies and for the length of time required. Proof of paid-up membership and one firstclass stamp for the special envelope. Do not send SASE. Overseas members send 3 IRC's. For where to send the list see address above under International 588 of the Morld.

Limits for Requests Eased

At least for the time being limits for the number of awards which can be applied for have been eased. Send in your blocks of numbers 288 maximum at a time. Remember when you send in a block of numbers to check the postage rate. For those of you with computers, if you put in your request, you may authorize just sending back the authentication for the multitude of Bars and just ask for the Bar and the Authentication Stamp.
