

You can collect numbers and become eligible to receive chapter upgrades.

We had our 3rd Convention in Arlington, TX. I had a very good time. No one said they did not have a good time. We all enjoyed the Texas hospitality. Republic of Texas Chapter hosted the affair. Tom and Ray did a great job for 10-10.

The first Board of Directors meeting under the new bylaws was also held at Arlington. The Board meeting took place Saturday all day. The scheduling turned out faulty, since we were not available to the membership for rag chewing etc. We will try to arrange it better next time. Our Recording Secretary, Marge, WA6ZPX was not able to have the complete Board meeting minutes prepared in time for insertion in this issue. I list the Board meeting highlights here. The next issue of the News will have the complete minutes printed.

Highlights of the Board of Directors meeting.

A proposal by W6YLJ regarding the sponsorship of hardship membership was discussed and sent to committee.

A system of information bulletins will be set up to get official 10-10 information out more rapidly.

The Planning committee was asked to investigate adding to the bylaws a section regarding the removal of officers from office. A member petition was received regarding this.

The bylaws were modified to separate the post of Corporate Secretary from the Treasurer. This was necessary because 10-10 is a California Corporation and the state of California requires that the Corporate Secretary reside in California. This is for the purpose of service or for some form of official communication. I therefore volunteered to serve in this position.

The bylaws were modified to address the filling of Director vacancies. It was decided that since we have an election every two years, we would leave the vacancies open until the next election.

A new class of membership was added to the bylaws: Club stations. A club station was defined as a unique government issued call. A club station will not vote or be able to apply for family or Life membership. Existing individual calls which already qzhave been issued a second number may continue their membership. A member petition was received regarding this subject. Since the vote by the Board covered this the petition was deemed moot.

The need for liability insurance at all official functions was discussed. The appropriate committee will investigate and report.

The Board of directors approved the selection of Tom Henderson, K4CIH as Head of the Nominating Committee for the upcoming election.

A plan for a general manager was discussed in depth, an Ad-Hoc committee was appointed. The committee is to report back at the 1992 Meeting.

Judy Long, a 10th District manager resigned. The Board voted to accept the request by Debby Peterson to take over the entire 10th District.

It was reported that combined, the VK and ZL areas represent less than 1000 paid up members.

An official guide will be published. It will be called an AWARDS guide. Jack Ford, KB7DUX will be editor of this new publication. There were several rules set by the Board.

Dues were increased, effective next January 1. New or renewal membership US will be \$7.00 per year. DX will be \$9.00 per year. Life membership US will be \$175.00. DX Life \$225.00. US Senior Life \$60.00, DX Senior Life \$75.00.

The next meeting of the Board of Directors will be in Seattle WA.

Air Capital chapter in Wichita, KS offered to host the 1993 10-10 Convention.

There will be a revised version of the By Laws. The new version will be available as soon as we get it updated to reflect the changes made at the 1991 Board meeting.

The board also discussed (off the record) some other items: Members operating ethics on-the-air, the 500 year Puerto Rico celebration of Columbus sailing, contest scoring, advertising in the News, speeding up delivery of the News, etc.

That covers the Board meeting. There was no petty squabbling by anyone before, during or after the meeting. The heated controversy over several ltems before the meeting apparently didn't amount to very much. Everyone at the Board of Directors meeting had the best interests of 10-10 at heart. And we all feel that the best interests of 10-10 were served.

The new AWARDS guide will be successful if all the Chapters send useful and timely information directly to KB7DUX. Jack will soon be in direct touch with each chapter.

You may notice the word advertisement at the top of page 30 and 31, this was included to help us qualify for 2nd class mailing privileges. Gerry, WASPOZ is working on this change.

A correction has been made on page 31: The 3rd district Manager, Chester, N3GZE, had his ZIP code changed. His new ZIP code is now 21042.

DX. I have agreed to join a local group that plan to operate from BELIZE during the CQ WORLDWIDE DX Contest, October 25 through 27th. I applied for a Belizian Call and I was issued license: V31-RV. During the contest I will be using the group DX call. But, I do intend to operate 10 meters as much as possible. I will attempt to use my 10-10 number during the contest if allowed. I will try to operate close to 28.400 and close to 28.600 +/-.

Speaking of 28.500, Joe, KA3UBG has begun a campaign to get more operation on the upper end of 10 meters. He has started a chapter which will meet on 29.200 MHz. Joe also is advocating a quiet zone (no contesting) somewhere around 28490 to 28510. Personally I like the idea. What if it should catch on? If it worked, maybe QST and CQ would adopt a similar plan. Hams that do not wish to contest will have a place to visit and not get so upset.

News Items

A proposal by Janet Whitney (an SWL in Alexandria, VA) to permit Novice and Technician class operators a larger chunk of voice privileges on 10 meters was turned down by the Federal Communications Commission. The FCC feels that the allocation already in place (28.3 to 28.5 Mhz.) is sufficient and that to allocate additional spectrum would reduce the incentive for Novice and Technician class operators to upgrade license classes.

The Genealogy Net meets on ten meters on a frequency of 28.335 at 2000Z. The net will move UP 3 KHZ if there is QRM on the normal frequency. The net combines two hobbies, amateur radio and genealogy (family history) research. Informal exchanges of information is encouraged and includes research info, how-to hints, computer genealogy program info local resources and much more. Net control is Kim Danielsen KB7IMC.

The Crazy Eights Chapter on-theair meeting info in the April 1991 issue was incorrect. GETTING STARTED ON 10: THE PORTABLE, ROTATABLE DIPOLE


Newcomers need a good first antenna for 10; old timers often need a temporary or portable antenna. Beam ads usually make the dipole appear to be a second-rate antenna. Often, we cannot think of dipoles without also thinking of wires fixed in one position. It may be time to change our thinking.

Having changed QTHs, I needed a temporary antenna until I could get the beam back up. A portable dipole-in-a-tube I made for vacation use went up against the new house: 20 feet high at best. The excellent results surprised me until I ran the dipole through ELNEC, an excellent antenna modelling program by W7EL. Here are the computer results and the antenna.

Dipoles in Free Space and Over Real Ground

Dipoles have gotten a burn rap because in free space they show only a 2 dB plus gain over the theoretical isotropic source. However, over real ground, they perform much better. In the 20 to 40 foot height range, dipoles show a 7 to 8 dB gain over isotropic in a peanut shaped horizontal pattern. Gain exceeds 8 dBi at 20 and 40 feet, dropping to 6.9 dBi at 30 feet. I used 20 feet as a matter of convenience, which gave a broad elevation lobe (12 to 39 degree half power points) with only a small vertical component. At 30 and 40 foot heights, more power radiates at higher (including vertical) angles.

How good is 8 dBi? For comparison, a 2 element Yagi computes to 10 to 11 dBi, while several 3 element Yagi designs show around 14 dBi. At 6 dB per S unit, the dipole is very competitive except where you need the beam's front-to-back ratio to hold down QRM or where you need to work the weakest signals. The dipole has allowed me to maintain regular contact with old 10-X friends in Europe, and the VKs and ZLs I used to work can still hear me if the path is open at all.




The trick in using a dipole effectively is to release our brains from the fixed wire design. A rotatable dipole for 10 is feasible, cheap, and beneficial. The front to side ratio can be up to 12 dB, which makes the antenna very bi-directional and cuts side QRM. A light weight rotatable dipole requires little more than some aluminum, some PVC, and a length or two of TV mast. Hand turning a couple of times per day as the skip patterns change saves the cost of a rotator. For portable, temporary, or beginner use, these advantages add up to an effective low cost antenna that will still be useful when the high tower, long boom, many element Yagi replaces it for home station use.

A Portable, Rotatable Dipole

The elements of my dipole-in-a-tube are aluminum rod. Each side consists of a 4 1/2-foot section of 1/4-inch rod and the remainder of 3/16-inch rod. A threaded coupling holds them tight, but permits disassembly and storage. The 1/4-inch rod is threaded and mounts to a 10-inch section of Schedule 40 1 1/4-inch diameter PVC, as the sketch shows. The 1/4-inch nuts hold the elements securely, but stress the PVC, so I added a #10 stove bolt in line with and above the elements to restore the round shape of the PVC.

Some #20 aluminum, cut and bent as shown in the sketch provides a coax connection. The shield side bends with the PVC and is locked by the element. The center conductor uses a short wire with a ring connector that locks under the other element. Trim the 3/16-inch aluminum to minimum SWR at your favorite spot on 10 and you are in business.



I nest the 10 inch PVC section over a 1-inch diameter, 5-foot long section of PVC. A single #10 stove bolt locks them. This section fits inside another 1 1/4-inch diameter PVC pipe, again with a locking bolt. If I need more height, I add 5-foot sections of TV mast. Everything here fits loosely. For longer term installation, I added electrical tape to the mast sections to get a tighter fit.

A small Radio Shack House bracket attached to an eave holds the mast at the 12-foot level, while an old steel car wheel/rim anchors the base. The house bracket is only semitight, which permits hand turning the antenna. Adjust the house bracket until the average wind does not turn the antenna.

And that is all there is to it. For a first antenna, this (or any mechanical variation) will do the job. For a temporary or portable antenna, the rotatable dipole works exceptionally well. The elements of this version store in the nested PVC tubes (with spray can caps as end lids). The center hub and miscellaneous hardware fit in a small plastic bag. Everything goes into the trunk without stealing room from luggage. At home, the basement does not even notice the storage space for the antenna. Try a dipole. You may like it.

TenX DX News



Mike Davidson KC5CP

I just completed some research on the local DX packet cluster in Houston using the past 6 months of data reported on Ten. 105 TenX countries were reported and 135 non-TenX for a total of 240 DX countries. The bad news is our summer months have been bad for DX, a record number of major solar flares during May-June have caused disruptions in propagation. Conditions will improve in four months when we get back to the Fall season but the summer skip will be Equitorial and N-South skip to S. America from the US. We are past the peak of the cycle and conditions will be declining for the next five years which means there is lots of stuff to work yet. I expect the August QSO Party will provided us with lots of contacts and some DX.

The Arlington Convention was well done by the Rep. of Texas chapter. I want to thank them for inviting me to talk about DX. Topics included DX basics, QSLing, Computers, Propagation and the DX packet cluster. Someone asked me about the info in my column if all of the stations are TenX members. I answered YES and commented that I had said this in my first two columns. So here again, unless I say non-member, all are members! One of the things that motivated me to write this column was a DX article in the News that only talked about non-members. Well this made me mad so I agreed to write this DX column. The President announced at the convention that all TenX articles will have a two page limit. This has caused me to change the format of my article and photos will have to go elsewhere to stay in the two page limit.

Well it is time to crank up the tower as high as possible and lets see what DX is lurking.

Feature DX Station for June 1991:

KA8FTP/HZ is Ron Hendershot a veteran of Operation Desert Storm in Saudi Arabia. Ron was on Special Naval Detachment in Riyadh. He received permission from Navy CENCOM to operate his 25 watt Ten Meter rig to a dipole. Time and restrictions prevented him from getting the Saudi Arabian OK to operate. Many will say that portable operation from HZ is illegal. The ARRL DXCC desk will have the final say. I met Ron in May and a picture is on another page. Ron had 435 contacts from Feb 16 to Apr 28 and he worked the US on Apr 11 & 13. QSL to 10230 Waldron Way, San Diego, CA 92124. There was at least three other portable operations that I know of and one of these was PA3EQU/HZ on Mar 17 at 1400. The others were non-members.

KH3AF is Richard on Johnson Island. Richard is a 48 yr old paramedic who recently changed his call from NH6YG. He has a TS440, 100 watts, to a 70 ft high tribander. Look for him on 28490 at 0200. Johnson Isl is located 800 miles SW of Hawaii where he received his TenX as NH6YG. There are six hams on the island and two of them are TenX. John Ballet is KH3AE received his number in March 91. Richard will be on the island about 6 more months. Your QSL will need to be an SASE and US postage.

3B8CA is Jack on Mauritius Island. Jack likes to be on the Brazil DX Net on 28530 at 1400 in the morning for US. This was a new country for me and is the only TenX member on the island! Look for him on the weekends.

VP2EOH is Bob K8BL on Anguilla. Scott KO8O was also on the trip about May 1-8. QSL direct with an SASE to K8BL address in the call book.

9J2CF is Frosty in Lusaka Zambia. He can be found on 28310 on Sundays at 1900. Frosty is K5LBU but all QSL go to Baptist Mission of Zambia, Box 50599, 15101 Ridgeway, Lusaka, Zambia

LA2GC is Gary G0FWX in Oslo, Norway. He is with the British military and will be there until mid 92. Look for him on 28518 at 1545 on the weekends.

RB0GG is Victor RB7GG in the Ukraine. We have worked several times and he recently sent me a nice letter with Russian postage stamps wanting to exchange them for US dollars. They have a hard time getting dollars to use for dues, etc. QSL to Victor Tkachenko, Box 73, Kherson, 325000, USSR.

DA2FY is Steve who I met at the Convention and has moved back to Texas. Steve would have been another Desert Storm vet but a leg injury kept him stateside. Steve is N5RKJ and QSL to 1602 Edgefield, Killeen, TX 76542.

VK6PP is Tony in W.Australia. Tony sent me a letter and photo along with a QSL. They have good DX conditions as he listed 14 TenX countries worked recently including KA8FTP/HZ. Tony has a list of certificates and is looking for N.Dakota with a TenX to complete WAS. Hope someone can set a schedule and give him ND. QSL to 11 Manxton Way, Lynwood 6155, W. Australia. Photo elsewhere.

S83H is Harry in Transkei. Transkei for DXCC purposes counts as S.Africa. Harry had the call S85H before it was changed to S83H. We talked on 28555 at 1500.

UG6JJ is Serge our only member in Armenia. Serge is a good CW op as I first worked him in ARRL Ten Mtr contest and twice since. His letter explained the long time it takes for his mail to get to him, from 1-10 months! K8DHK has sent him 3 membership certs and he finally got them and all had been opened. He likes to collect certificates and is looking forward to many TenX certs. All of his equipment is home brew including his vertical antennas. He runs a 100 watt amp and works all bands. He has a special call UG1700JJ and will be available every January until 2001. QSL to Serge Mnatsakanyan, 9A/33, 2 Norki Massiv, Yerevan 375062, Armenia. Use two green stamps for airmail return postage.

UD6DFA is Ruslan from Azerbaijan. Ruslan is a 20 year old seaman when he is not talking on his homebrew transceiver that puts out only 40 watts to a ground plane antenna. He heard me one day and tried to call me but he told me I never heard him. I missed another new country! He sent me his SWL card and a letter describing his station and other information. He likes to operate on 28380 at 12-1400. QSL Ruslan Bunyat-Zade, Box 825, Baku 370129, Azerbaijan, USSR and include return postage.

PYOSK is Karl PS7KM on St.Peter & Paul Rocks along with two non-members. The other call PYOSR goes to PP5JD. They were active about ten days in May for this DXPedition. A comment by Karl indicates it now takes 2 green stamps for a QSL return. All others will get returned back through the bureau. QSL to Karl Leite, Box 385, 59000 Natal, RN, Brazil.

VK9NS is Jim Smith who had a disappointing trip to Bangladesh. Jim had been working with the government authorities for several months before his trip. At the last minute they changed their minds and did not give him an unrestricted license. After much negotiations by Jim he was finally allowed to operate on April 3 for two days using the call S21U. This is the same call used by a group from Japan last year. He made about 600 QSOs, all on SSB and every QSO was monitored by the Bangladesh authorities.

Jim spent a lot of effort trying to put this one on and he only succeeded just two days before he had to leave, which is unfortunate. As most of youknow, Bangladesh had a terrible cyclone/typhoon storm with many thousands of people dying. Their communications were almost non-existant to ask for aid. My opinion, S2 needs to revive their amateur radio and build up a national resource of hams that can help in a emergency. This was the second time S2 has had such a tragedy and loss of life. Jim Smith will return to S2 and I hope that by that time they will have some of their problems resolved and Jim will be able to put on a DXPedition with no restrictions and ham radio will begin to grow in Bangladesh once again. VK9NS has always been a good supporter of TenX whenever you ask him, so please QSL Jim with only one card per envelope and include return postage. Jim goes to many places and has many thousands of contacts in his many logs. This is why he requests one card per envelope.

TJ1CW is Silvio F6EEM in Cameroun. Silvio was on another of his DXPedition trips into Africa. Silvio always makes a lot of contacts and goes to wanted countries. Cameroun was a new one for me and Silvio wants all QSL to go to: Silvio Faurez, 4 Due Duguesclin, F-35170 Bruz, France.

CE3AF is Jim from Chile. Jim is 66 and has been a member of TenX for about 20 years with his four digit number. His original call was CE3AEZ and he is collecting VP numbers. Jim is active on weekends about 28510 at 2100.

KK5IT/HP1 is Dave near Panama City Panama. Look for Dave at 28490 at 1800 on weekends.

TZ6VV is Larry in Mali and he has a problem with either his mail or TenX records. Larry has not received any of the TenX News issues. I told him I would pass this on to Carol who would fix him up with whatever it takes, hi.







10-10 QSO Parties are open to all amateurs, but only paid-up members are eligible for awards and chapter assignment of scores. They are conducted to encourage 10 meter operation and interest in the Net. Non-members may use numbers collected to qualify for membership; members may use them for awards.

RULES:

- 1. PHONE. Contacts must be in the Ten meter Phone band, on SSB, AM, or FM. Contacts must be in the Ten meter band on CW or RTTY.
- 2. Exchange: Callsign, name, state, and 10-10 number.

3. A station may be counted only once.

4. Single operator stations only are acceptable.

5. All contacts must take place within the 48 hour contest period.

6. Logs must be kept in Universal Coordinated Time.

- 7. A DUFE SHEET IS REQUIRED OF ALL PARTICIPANTS. Computer duping is OK. SASE to me for dupe sheet sample.
- 8. Chapter assignment of scores may be made only by a paid-up member belonging to that chapter as a local member and able to work its Net via groundwave from the contest station.
- 9. Illegible or improperly submitted logs will be rejected. See below for log requirements.
- Failure to comply with these rules or their intent may result in disqualification.
 SCORING: Two points per contact WITH a 10-10 number exchange; One point per contact WITHOUT a 10-10 number exchange.

AWARDS: First Place certificate to each U.S. Call Area (Area 7 includes KL7); also Canada, South America, Central America, Caribbean (incl. Bermuda), Europe, Africa, Asia, and the Pacific (inclAustralia, New Zealand, KH6, and all Pacific islands). Also top ten finishers in the contest overall will receive a certificate. Paid-up individual and chapter scores are listed in the NEWS.

LOGS: Logs are accepted from 10-10 members only, and must be complete, legible, and in UTC. Each line entry must show Callsign, time, state, name, and 10-10 number, if any. A cover sheet is required showing your name, callsign, QTH, 10-10 number, membership expiration date, chapter assignment, if any, total contacts and total points. A cover sheet may be found on the back cover of the NEWS. A DUPE SHEET MUST ACCOMPANY ALL LOGS.






