POST BOARD MEETING



OFFICIAL MINUTES, 10-10 BOARD of DIRECTORS MEETING 1991 ARLINGTON, TX.

The Board of Directors convened at 9 AM, June 8, 1991, in Arlington, Texas in a closed meeting. A moment of silence was observed to remember our Silent Keys.

All officers and directors were present with the exception of Don Weaver, KØJPW, due to an eyesight condition. Officers attending were President Norm Lefcourt, W6IRT; Vice President Hugh Sullivan, WA4QZU; Secretary Marge Smothers, WA6ZPX; and Treasurer Gerry Gross, WA6POZ. Directors attending were Peggy Pinnell, G4MAE; Elaine Nickoloff, N8CBE; Linda Barnes, KJ4FM; Gary Ward, KD7UZ; Jim Michaels, W6PGM; Dave Prichard, KA5OVO; Pete Matson, KC1CP; Jack Miller, W9WYN, and Mary Hagan, WB2SJQ.

The minutes of October 20, 1990, were approved.

Hugh had nothing to report as Vice President. As Chapter Coordinator he reported there are 149 affiliated chapters.

Gerry discussed the four pages of his Financial Report.

Elaine reported there are 87 VK, 30 VE, and 30-40 ZL paid up members. She reported that Judy Long, WDØDHH, had resigned as Ø land area manager for CO, KS, MO, and NE. Norm recommended that Debbie Peterson be okayed to take the entire Ø district.

Peggy made a motion, seconded by Pete, that we accept Tom Henderson, K4CIH, as the Head of the Nominating Committee to receive nominations for the upcoming election. Unanimously approved.

Jack discussed the need for liability insurance for 10-10 to cover any possible lawsuits arising. He moved, seconded by Marv, and unanimously approved, that "An Ad-Hoc Committee be appointed to study liability insurance needs to cover all activities against any possible lawsuits for personal injury and advertising injury, including libel, slander, and defamation of character, suit for liability resulting from food or beverage served at club banquets or hospitality occasions." The Finance Committee is to check on this.

Jack presented a plan for a General Manager. The general increase in membership and resulting delay in service to the membership due to the many hands through which information must now pass, it is in our best interest to develop a more businesslike method of operation. It was moved by Jack, seconded by Gary and unanimously passed that "An Ad-Hoc Committee be appointed to study the feasibility of adopting a General Manager type operation plan to better serve the membership. They shall also enumerate duties, responsibilities of said manager, and prepare a report for the 1992 Board meeting." The committee consists of Elaine, Dave, Linda, Pete, and Gerry.

The resolution regarding the Directors' Net was withdrawn.

A proposal was received from W6YLJ, Chuck Imsande, with regard to a DX Membership Sponsor Program. It was referred to the Operations Committee.

Discussion was held regarding considerable delay in the distribution of 10-10 information. It was moved by Jack, seconded by Marv, and unanimously approved that an official bulletin program be introduced. Bulletins shall be mailed to each officer, director, district manager, and the 10-10 International Net Manager for on-the-air announcements, plus regular publication in the 10-10 News.

Resolutions were presented to amend the bylaws as follows.

ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP

The following motions on this Article were made by Jack, seconded by Marv, and unanimously approved:

Section 1. Add a sentence "However, no individual member shall be issued more than one 10-10 number."

Section 2. The word "five" was deleted from the sentence. A new Section "(f) Club Station" is to be added.

Section 3. (f) Club Station.

- 1. Effective June 8, 1991, Club Stations with a unique government issued call may apply for membership subject to the restrictions in 3 and 4 of this section.
- 2. Club Stations authorized for membership prior to June 8, 1991 may continue their membership subject to the restrictions in 3 and 4 of this section.
- 3. Club Stations will not be entitled to vote.
- 4. Club Stations will not be eligible for Family or Life Memberships.

ARTICLE V: GOVERNMENT

The following motions on this Article were made by Gerry, seconded by Elaine, and unanimously approved:

Section 2. Remove the word "and", insert a comma after Treasurer, delete the "/" and add "and a" before Corporate Secretary.

Section 3. Delete the "/Corporate Secretary" and insert "the immediate past President ex-officio, of 10-10 for 2 years after he is succeeded".

Add a new Section 4. "The Corporate Secretary shall reside in the State of California." The California Corporation law requires that the Corporate Secretary reside in the state for purposes of process of service. Norm agreed to serve in this capacity.

The present Section 4 in Article V now becomes Section 5.

ARTICLE VI: BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A motion by Peggy, seconded by Marge, and approved with the exception of Pete, amended Article VI to add a new Section 7. "In the event of a vacancy on the Board of Directors, that vacancy shall remain until the next election. The five regular Directors will be elected and the vacancy(ies) filled by the next candidate(s) with the highest votes for the unexpired term(s)."

ARTICLE VIII: OFFICERS' DUTIES

The following motions on this Article were made by Dave, seconded by Marv and unanimously approved:

Section 4. Delete "/Corporate Secretary". Delete the last sentence.

Add a new Section 5. "The Corporate Secretary shall be responsible for maintaining the Corporate status of 10-10. The Corporate Secretary will not be a member of the Board of Directors."

The present Section 5 in Article 8 now becomes Section 6.

ARTICLE IX: ELECTION PROCEDURE

A motion by Marv, and seconded by Dave unanimously approved adding a new Section 10.

"Section 10. The President, with the approval of the Board of Directors, shall appoint the Corporate Secretary."

ARTICLE XIII: EFFECTIVE DATE

It was moved by Jack, seconded by Dave and unanimously approved to change this article to read "These revised bylaws were adopted by the Board of Directors in session on June 8, 1991, and shall become effective immediately."

A petition submitted by KBGON was discussed. SUBJECT: To change the bylaws to include a provision for removal of 10-10 officials from office. It was moved by Jim and seconded by Dave that this be referred to the Planning Committee. Unanimously approved. The Committee will report back.

Linda discussed the following recommendations for an Awards Guide.

- 1. The guide should be an AWARDS guide rather than a certificate guide.
- The format should be changed to 8½xll and contain the same information that was in the previous guide, along with all 10-10 awards including their requirements.
- 3. Payment should be in the form of check or money order payble to 10-10.
- 4. All 10-10 officers and directors with their names and addresses should be listed in the guide. Telephone numbers are optional.
- 5. 10-10 should put up the dollars to get the guide off the ground, and should also provide costs for a first-time notification to all CM's and/or CH's requesting the latest information concerning their chapter.
- 6. All chapters should be listed alphabetically.
- 7. Updates will be mailed out for reception during the first week of each month.
- 8. List clearly somewhere at the beginning that each chapter has the right to establish their own requirements and rules, and that 10-10 is in no way responsible for the accuracy of the information printed, or the timeliness of the chapter's response.
- 9. The guide should not be used as a forum to air the gripes of the publisher.
- 10. Jack Ford, KB7DUX, should be awarded the right to publish the first truly official 10-10 Awards Guide.

The following motion by Pete, seconded by Gerry, was passed with Jim and Gary opposing. "That the 10-10 Awards Guide be instituted as an official publication of 10-10 with KB7DUX being the editor and following the recommendations set forth by the Communications Committee and discussed here at this meeting."

A petition submitted by KBGON regarding amending Article 7 regarding Club Stations is redundant as it has already been resolved.

It was voted unanimously to increase the dues as follows, effective January 1, 1992.

TenX DX News



Mike Davidson KC5CP

Here in N. America we have just entered our Fall season and the Europeans are all over the band with their WAE contest. It is great to hear them back after the summer doldrums. The Sun continues to produce flares & storms that cause problems for signals on Ten but conditions are improving. During the Summer QSO Party the band sounded almost dead, but I scraped out a little over 300 contacts, averaging a station every 6 minutes, which equates to a boring weekend. However, I predict the next six months will have improving Winter conditions for N. America. Solar flux levels will average 20 points less than last year. We still have several years of DX remaining in the band, so look forward to working a lot more DX.

Thanks to all the stations that sent me info that was used here, especially photos. I get a lot of my info from working members on the air, from DX bulletins and the DX Packet Cluster here in Houston. Packet radio is excellent for DX info since the cluster links in many listening stations into a central location where a computer saves the data for retrieval. I made an analysis of the first half of 91 of TenX stations. This data was presented at the Convention and showed 105 TenX countries reported up to June. These stations will be active this fall and I expect to see that many before year end. Just think, DXCC TenX in 6 months!

After twelve years of chasing DX, I finally made the ARRL Mixed Honor Roll. Last March I sent in a batch of cards to bring my total to 316. Since then the DXCC has added two new countries, Penguin IsI, effective for DXCC as of Sept 1st and North Korea effective after the first accredited operation. The DXCC Country count is now 323. Hope you worked ZS9A/1 Ian or DK9KX/ZS1 Hans on Penguin for a new one in July 1990, the other group ZS9Z/1 in Dec 90 did not have a TenX member but both are valid for the ARRL DXCC. Penguin is located 1 mile off the coast of Namibia, Africa.

FEATURE DX STATION SEPT. 1991

UG6JJ is Serge Mnatsakanyan in Armenia. We first met in Ten Meter Contest on CW and have since swapped QSL cards for SSB contacts. Serge has written me twice and included a photo by IK6DPW of Serge but sorry it was too dark. Serge is the only TenX in Armenia and the first TenX DX station to have 3 TenX membership certificates. He kept telling K8DHK about his cert being lost in the mail. Carol kept sending more to him but they were being held by someone in the mail system until all 3 arrived in Feb 91! I wonder how many people read his cert before he got it in the mail? Serge likes to collect TenX certificates/awards and has used a special callsign UG1700JJ

earlier this year. His son Alex UG6GK is not a member. Please use at least 1 green stamp for postage when you QSL to: 9A/33, 2 Norki Massiv; Yerevan, Armenia; 375062 USSR. Check 28480 at 13-1400Z.

CX9DH is Fernando Toscano in Uruguay. We only have 27 members in Uruguay and Fernando has been a member for 7 years most of which he was running QRP 10 watts. He now has an amp and runs 80 watts to his 4 element yagi. During his years of running QRP he worked 262 countries on ten and now has 283 with the amp. He likes to op on 28500-535 at 0Z. He is 50 years old and lives in Montevideo the capital. In August he worked many Europeans which is his Spring season and days of 68 degrees. Fernando told me it cost him \$26 to convert his currency into the \$6 membership fee to pay his dues. He said this is to expensive for him and the news is always late, so he stopped paying his dues two years ago. He still chases the numbers but has stopped certificates.

KA8FTP/HZ was Ron our Desert Storm vet in Saudi Arabia. Last time I told you about Ron running his 25 watt rig from Saudi having the OK from his people to operate. I called the DXCC desk at the ARRL and talked with Don Search about Ron and the possibility of DXCC credit. Don told me that only HZ callsigns count for credit and that Ron op from HZ would NOT count. If Ron had operated from Iraq then it would counts as 4U under the UN forces. Don has received cards for credit from UN stations in Iraq. PA3EQU/HZ was in Saudi but his cards will not count as well.

UM8M/W4WMQ is Murphy, president of INDEXA, was with non-mem KC4UG, Ken, in two Soviet areas for ten days just before the coup. The Soviet hams were great hosts to both and they had pileups of BY's & BV's that was fantastic. QSL to callbook with SASE to Murphy.

4U1ITU the UN Geneva Switzerland will be op by 3 Italian TenX hams in Sept. ITU has one of those easy to remember 11111 numbers. QSL to I1HAG to the callbook.

4U1UN the UN NY has a new QSL manager via Jim Tullis, 7226 Huntington Dr., Hudson, OH 44236.

TT8SA (ex TR8SA) is Christian who will be in Chad for a 1 year tour in September. Christian will be much sought after as Chad is rare, I dont have it on TenX yet. The authorization letter for Christian made a statement that amateur radio in Chad is now legal effective July 1991. Sounds like another positive step for ham radio. QSL route is unknown so listen to what he says.

K4CXY/6Y5 operated from Jamaica in Aug. QSL N4BSN. H44AP is Al Pearce, POBox 11, Honiara, Solomon Isl. S21NQ is Erik, WZ6C, in Bangladesh. QSL to W4FRU.

C56/DL8OH is Dieter Schuster who is alive and well despite the silent key listing in the call book. If you worked Dieter in the Gambia, QSL him at Kleiberstr 17, 850 Erlanger, Germany.

AA5AU Don and G0AZT Eddie will be in Antigua and Montserrat in Sep-Oct. QSL Eddie Schneider, Box 5194, Richmond, CA 94805; Don Hill, Box 625, Belle Chase, LA 70037.

KE6XJ is Les who expects to op from Tonga as A35XJ in Sept or Oct. Les likes CW but may be on SSB on all bands usually 25kc up from band edge. QSL to Les Nuhn, POBox 44, Bonita, CA 92002. SASE.







They are conducted to encourage 10 meter operation and interest in the Net. Non-members may use numbers collected to qualify for membership; members may use them for awards.

RULES:

- 1. PHONE. Contacts must be in the Ten meter Phone band, on SSB, AM, or FM. CW. Contacts must be in the Ten meter band on CW or RTTY.
- 2. Exchange: Callsign, name, state, and 10-10 number.

3. A station may be counted only once.

4. Single operator stations only are acceptable.

5. All contacts must take place within the 48 hour contest period.

6. Logs must be kept in Universal Coordinated Time.

- 7. A DUPE SHEET IS REQUIRED OF ALL PARTICIPANTS. Computer duping is OK. SASE to me for dupe sheet sample.
- 8. Chapter assignment of scores may be made only by a paid-up member belonging to that chapter as a local member and able to work its Net via groundwave from the contest station.
- 9. Illegible or improperly submitted logs will be rejected. See below for log requirements.
- 10. Failure to comply with these rules or their intent may result in disqualification.
- 11. SCORING: Two points per contact WITH a 10-10 number exchange; One point per contact WITHOUT a 10-10 number exchange.

AWARDS: First Place certificate to each U.S. Call Area (Area 7 includes KL7); also Canada, South America, Central America, Caribbean (incl. Bermuda), Europe, Africa, Asia, and the Pacific (inclaustralia, New Zealand, KH6, and all Pacific islands). Also top ten finishers in the contest overall will receive a certificate. Paid-up individual and chapter scores are listed in the NEWS.

LOGS: Logs are accepted from 10-10 members only, and must be complete, legible, and in UTC. Each line entry must show Callsign, time, state, name, and 10-10 number, if any. A cover sheet is required showing your name, callsign, QTH, 10-10 number, membership expiration date, chapter assignment, if any, total contacts and total points. 

Jim is a member of ARRL and holds the WAS Award, and WAC for SSB. He is currently working on DXCC.



The N2JEU dial-up BBS has closed temporarily to permit major changes to the BBS hardware and software. Until it's back on-line use the OCC Micro Support BBS at (315) 492-6672. The system is located at an area College (I work there) and is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

A new Ten-Ten Conference is available on two bulletin board systems. The Amateur Radio CBBS run by Howard Evans at (916) 366-5531 in Rancho Cordova, CA and the above mentioned OCC Micro Support BBS in Syracuse, NY both carry the Conference with additional systems invited to join in. The conference is available to any FIDONET type BBS wanting it. Check with Howard or I for details on getting the Conference on your own local bulletin board system.

A help sheet detailing how to access the OCC Micro Support and the N2JEU BBS systems is available for a self addressed STAMPED envelope sent to the EDITOR of the News. The address is inside the front cover of this issue.

To access a bulletin board system you'll need a personal computer, a dialup telephone line type modem, and terminal software for your particular computer. Set the terminal software for no parity, 8 data bits and one stop bit. Speeds accepted for either system are 300, 1200, 2400 baud. In addition, the OCC Micro Support BBS accepts call at speeds up to 9600 baud.

We Keep Growing....

....and Another Kilestone

A count of Records Manager Lee Pasewalk, WB6MGM, monthly reports indicate that 10-10 continues to grow. A total of 1645 new members joined 10-10 during the first six months of 1991. This compares to 1597 new members during the first six months of 1990.

The largest growth was in the 6th District with 223 new members, with the 4th District close behind with 218 new members. Third place went to the DX group with 172 new members, indicating the interest in 10-10 in the DX countries.

In addition to processing new member applications, our hard working Area Managers also processed 902 changes in membership status. These were for call changes, address changes, etc. A lot of paper work requires processing for each new member, for each call change and for each change of address. A grand total of 2711 records were processed during the first six months which included 164 members noted as Silent Keys. And this grand total of 2711 records does not include the number of members re-newing their dues each month. All of this adds up to a whale of a lot of work that the Area Managers, Records Manager and the Treasurer do to keep 10-10 running smoothly. Many hours of volunteer time is spent each month just to keep our records current.

And for that new milestone, we passed the 60000 number in August. 10-10 number 60001 was issued to KB5JQJ. 10-10 keeps on growing, with more new awards and activities being added to keep interest and activity on 10 meters at an all-time high.

For those of you who are interested in the highest number issued, here it is: The highest number issued through the month of Augest 1991 was 60505 and it was issued to KA3YWW.
